### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (14-17) VS. BALTIMORE ORIOLES (17-12)

SUNDAY, MAY 8, 2016 — ORIOLE PARK AT CAMDEN YARDS — 1:05 P.M. EDT RHP KENDALL GRAVEMAN (1-3, 4.40) VS. RHP CHRIS TILLMAN (3-1, 2.81) CSNCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Split yesterday's doubleheader against Baltimore, winning the opener 8-4 and falling in the nightcap, 5-2...are 1-5 in May and have lost 10 of the last 14 games after winning a season-high six straight contests from April 16-22...are a season-high tying three games under .500 at 14-17 for the third time this season (also 4-7 on April 15 and 13-16 on May 4)...that is the fifth worst record in the American League...are third in the AL West and trail first place Seattle by 4 1/2 games...have spent one day in sole possession of first place this year, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, nine days in third, four days tied for third, four days in fourth and three days tied for fourth.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: Three of the A's last five losses have been by one run and they are now 5-6 in one-run decisions...are second in the American League in one-run games, are tied for third in wins and tied for fourth in losses...are 5-2 in games decided in the last at bat...are 2-0 in extra inning games and are tied for second in the AL in extra inning wins...are 3-0 when the game is tied after seven innings and 4-1 when it is tied after eight innings.

PITCHING: The A's allowed a season-high 16 hits Wednesday against Seattle...surrendered 41 hits in the three-game series against the Mariners, which were their most hits a three-game series since allowing 43 against Texas from Sept. 9-11, 2011...now have a 5.30 ERA (76 er in 129.0 ip) and .276 (139-for-503) opponents batting average over the last 15 games after posting a 2.69 ERA and .231 opponents average over the first 16 contests...rank fifth in the American League in strikeouts (245) and walks (100)...are tied for third in pickoffs (4).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 3-9 with a 6.69 ERA (55 er in 74.0 ip) and .301 (91-for-302) opponents batting average over the last 12 games after going 6-5 with a 2.88 ERA and .230 opponents batting average over the first 17 contests...are 9-14 for the season, and the losses are tied for second most in the American League...are tied for the most walks (77) and second most home runs allowed (23).

OFFENSE: Tallied a season high 15 hits in game one of yesterday's doubleheader, and scored eight runs in back-to-back games on Wednesday and Friday (game one) after tallying eight runs over the previous four games...are one of three Major League teams that have not been shutout (Colorado, Pittsburgh) and have a streak of 52 consecutive games with one or more runs scored, which is the longest active streak in the majors... have a .293 on-base percentage, which is the lowest mark in the American League...have the third fewest walks (74) and are tied for the third fewest doubles (40), but are tied for the third most triples (5).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed eight errors over the last 15 games after making 15 over the first 16 contests...lead the American League and are tied for fourth in the majors in errors (23)...have 10 unearned runs, which are tied for fourth most in the AL...rank third in double plays (36)

**HOME AND AWAY:** Yesterday began a nine-game road trip to Baltimore (1-1), Boston (three games) and Tampa Bay (three games) after being postponed Friday...this trip concludes a stretch that runs from April 19 to May 15 in which the A's are scheduled to play 19 of their 25 games on the road...went 5-5 on the last road trip to New York (3-0), Toronto (1-2) and Detroit (1-3) and are 9-6 (.600) on the road, which is tied for the third best road record in the American League...went 2-4 on the last homestand against Houston (2-1) and Seattle (0-3) and are 5-11 (.313) at home, which is the worst home record in the AL and third worst in the majors...are batting .265 (141-for-533) and are averaging 4.33 runs per game (65 runs in 15 games) on the road compared to .219 (114-for-521) with an average of 3.06 runs per game (49 runs in 16 games) at home...are averaging the second fewest runs per game at home in the AL and have the third lowest batting average.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's began the season by facing three consecutive left-handed starting pitchers but have faced righties in 26 of the last 28 games, including each of the last 13...are 13-13 (.500) in games started by a right-hander, 1-4 (.200) against lefties...the five games against lefthanded starters are tied for fourth fewest in the American League (Boston and Kansas City have four each).

TWO FOR THE PRICE OF ONE: Yesterday was the first doubleheader for the A's in exactly two years (May 7, 2014 vs. Seattle)...did not play a doubleheader last season....Friday was the A's first rainout since April 4, 2014, at home against Seattle.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 4 for their last 12 (.333) after starting the season 0-for-12...rank third in the American League in plate appearances (25) and tied for fourth in hits (4)...have gone 279 games since their last pinch home run, which is the longest active streak in the majors...the A's last pinch hit home run was by John Jaso on June 22, 2014 against Boston.

THIS AND THAT: This trip concludes a stretch that runs from April 19 to May 15 where the A's are scheduled to play 19 of 25 games in the Eastern Time Zone...after the game in Tampa Bay on May 15, the A's will have just two more series in the Eastern Time Zone, both in Ohio (at Cincinnati, June 10-12; at Cleveland, July 29-31)...the A's are 9-5 on Friday, Saturday and Sunday compared to 5-12 from Monday through Thursday...have been successful in 4-of-6 (66.7%) replay challenges, which is tied for the second best percentage in the American League...the A's designated hitter has entered the game defensively five times this year...from 1996-2015, the A's had the DH enter the game on defense a total of 11 times...the last time they did it at least five times in a season was 1995 when it happened seven times

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's reinstated Danny Valencia from the disabled list Friday, marking the first time they have reinstated a player from the DL this year...currently have seven players on the DL (H. Alvarez, R.J. Alvarez, Bassitt, Doubront, Fuld, Parker, Sogard) and have used the DL eight times this year...R.J. Alvarez, Doubront and Parker are on the 60day DL...Henderson Alvarez is on a rehab assignment...used the DL 23 times last year, which matched the 2010 club for second most in Oakland history...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. ORIOLES: The A's lost the season series last year for the second time in the last three years as they went 1-6 against the Orioles...lost two of three in Oakland and were swept in a four-game series at Baltimore... yesterday's game one win snapped a five-game losing streak against the O's, which was the A's longest against the Orioles since May 23, 1998-April 23, 1999, when they lost eight straight...had lost four straight in Baltimore, which matched the A's longest losing streak ever at Camden Yards (Sept. 11, 1993-April 26, 1994 and July 21, 1998-April 23, 1999)...are 8-14 against the Orioles over the previous three seasons...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 257-259 against the Orioles...that breaks down to 128-132 in Oakland and 129-127 in Baltimore...are 62-53 at Camden Yards... all-time, the A's are 993-939 against the Orioles/Browns/Brewers...of the other seven original AL franchises, the Orioles are the only team the A's have a winning record against.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

Josh Reddick recorded seven hits (7-for-9) in yesterday's doubleheader...went 3-for-5 in game one and 4-for-4 in game two...was his fifth career four-hit game...is 9-for-14 over his last three games after going 4-for-27 (.148) over his previous seven games...after his three-hit game in game one yesterday, Coco Crisp is a .356 (52-for-146) career hitter at Camden Yards, which is the second highest batting average in this ballpark among players with 150 or more plate appearances (Cano, .362)... Jed Lowrie is batting .385 (25-for-65) over his last 18 games after hitting .209 over his first 12 contests.

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1906 pitcher Chief Bender is inserted into the game in left field in the sixth inning and hits two inside the park home runs in a game against the Boston Pilgrims...in 1968, the A's first year in Oakland, Catfish Hunter tosses a perfect game and almost singlehandedly defeats Minnesota 4-0...he strikes out 11 and also collects three hits while driving in three of the A's four runs...in 1992 Dennis Eckersley records his 200th career save in the A's 8-6 win over New York.

#### TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Kendall Graveman (1-3, 4.40 ERA)

LAST TWO, FIRST THREE: Is 0-2 with an 8.18 ERA (10 er in 11.0 ip) and .392 (20-for-51) opponents batting average over his last two starts...has allowed a career-high 10 hits in each of his last two starts and is the first A's pitcher with at least 10 hits in back-to-back starts since Brandon McCarthy (April 16-21, 2012)...went 1-1 with a 2.04 ERA and .159 opponents average over his first three starts and surrendered 10 hits total in each of those outings...allowed four hits or fewer in each of his first three starts, joining John Odom (1969) and Mike Norris (1980) as the only pitchers in Oakland history on an Opening Day roster to allow four hits or fewer while tossing five innings or more in each of their first three starts.

**RUN SUPPORT:** Has received no run support in two of his five starts and three runs of support in his other three...his season run support average is 2.20 (7 rs in 28.2 ip)...last year, he was 1-9 in 13 starts with two runs of support or fewer, 5-0 in eight starts with three runs of support or more...his career numbers are 1-12 in 16 starts with two runs of support or fewer, 6-0 in 10 starts with three runs of support or more.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 1-1 with a 5.73 ERA (7 er in 11.0 ip) and .289 (13-for-45) opponents average in two starts on the road compared to 0-2 with a 3.57 ERA (7 er in 17.2 ip) and .246 (17-for-67) opponents batting average in three starts at home...has allowed four of his five home runs on the road.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has held left-handed hitters to a .217 (13-for-60) batting average, compared to .315 (17-for-54) against right-handers... however, has issued six of his eight walks to lefties...last year he issued 24 of his 38 walks to lefties...has allowed a .179 (5-for-28) batting average to hitters leading off an inning and has issued three walks for a .258 on-base percentage...opponents are 7-for-58 (.121) with two strikes.

THIS AND THAT: Has a 2.25 ERA (5 er in 20.0 ip) over the first four innings, a 9.35 ERA (9 er in 8.2 ip) from the fifth inning on...has walked two batters or fewer in four of his five starts this year and 20 of his 26 career starts...is scheduled to start on five days rest today for the first time this year...has made three of his first five starts on six days rest or more...is 1-8 with a 5.21 ERA (39 er in 67.1 ip) over his last 13 starts dating back to July 10, 2015...went 6-4 with a 3.20 ERA over the first 18 games, including 13 starts, of his career.

**LOSING STREAK SNAPPED:** Picked up his first win of the season April 20 at New York (AL), which snapped a career-high six-game losing streak dating back to last year...that was the longest losing streak by an A's pitcher since Tyson Ross lost eight straight from May 19 to Sept. 24, 2012... compiled a 5.04 ERA and .267 opponents batting during the streak, which spanned 10 starts from July 10, 2015 to April 12, 2016.

**FIRST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-1 loss to Chicago (AL) April 7 in Oakland...shutout the White Sox on two hits over the first five innings, but Mat Latos blanked the A's on one hit over the first six innings...the scored was tied at 0-0 when he walked Cabrera to lead off the sixth...Abreau followed with a two-run home run and Graveman left after 5.1 innings trailing 2-0.

**SECOND START:** He had a no decision in the A's 5-4 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on April 12 in Oakland...allowed just one run in 6.0 innings and it came in the second inning...walked Pujols to start the inning and Calhoun singled him over to third...Simmons then grounded into a double play and Graveman was relived by Axford to start the seventh with the A's leading 3-1...Oakland built a 4-1 lead before Madson allowed two runs in the eighth and Doolittle surrendered two in the ninth.

**THIRD START:** He was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-2 win at New York (AL) on April 20...it was his first win since July 4, 2015 against Seattle... struck out a career-high eight batters on a career-high tying 111 pitches... allowed a one-out solo home run to Gregorius in the second inning, but that was the only run he would surrender in 6.1 innings of work...struck out in the fifth inning in his first professional at bat.

**FOURTH START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-3 loss at Detroit April 25...allowed a career-high 10 hits, including a career-high tying three home runs...surrendered single runs in each of the first two innings on a Cabrera home run in the first and an Aviles RBI single in the second...then yielded a three-run home run to Cabrera followed by a solo home run by Victory Martinez in the fifth and left after 4.2 innings trailing 6-0.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-3 loss to Seattle last Monday in Oakland...allowed a career-high tying 10 hits for the second consecutive start...the A's scored a run in the second inning and he blanked the Mariners on a hit and a walk over the first three innings...then allowed a RBI single to Lind in the fourth and two more runs in the sixth on a Seager RBI double and an lanetta RBI single...yielded a one-out double

to Aoki in the seventh and was relieved by Rzepczynski who allowed Aoki to score.

2015 RECAP: The rookie right-hander went 6-9 with a 4.05 ERA in 21 starts over two stints with the A's before his season ended in late August due to an oblique injury...was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 1-2 with an 8.27 ERA in four starts before he was optioned to Nashville April 26...was brought back May 23 and went 5-2 with a 1.78 ERA over his first nine starts following his return...then went 0-5 with a 5.82 ERA over his final eight starts beginning July 10...was placed on the 15-day disabled list Aug. 24 with a strained left oblique...tied for fourth among American League rookies in games started (21), ranked fifth in innings pitched (115.2), ninth in strikeouts (77) and tied for ninth in wins...had one of seven complete games by an AL rookie.

WITH NASHVILLE: Went 2-1 with a 1.85 ERA in four starts with Nashville...allowed one home run in 24.1 innings...held the opposition to a .213 batting average, including .118 (4-for-34) against left-handed hitters compared to .267 (16-for-60) against right-handers...allowed five runs in 5.0 innings in his first start for the loss...then went 2-0 with a 0.93 ERA over his final three starts.
