OAKLAND ATHLETICS (14-18) VS. BOSTON RED SOX (18-13)

MONDAY, MAY 9, 2016 — FENWAY PARK — 7:10 P.M. EDT RHP SONNY GRAY (3-3, 4.84) VS. RHP CLAY BUCHHOLZ (1-3, 5.71) CSNCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Are 1-6 in May and are now a season-high four games under .500 at 14-18, which is the fifth worst record in the American League...have lost 11 of the last 15 games after winning a season-high six straight contests from April 16-22...are in third place in the AL West and trail first place Seattle by 4 1/2 games...have spent one day in sole possession of first place this year, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 10 days in third, four days tied for third, four days in fourth and three days tied for fourth.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: Three of the A's last six losses have been by one run and they are now 5-6 in one-run decisions... are tied for third in the American League in one-run games and wins and are fourth in losses...are 5-2 in games decided in the last at bat...are 2-0 in extra inning games and are tied for second in the AL in extra inning wins... are 3-0 when the game is tied after seven innings and 4-1 when it is tied after eight innings.

PITCHING: The A's allowed a season-high 11 runs yesterday at Baltimore (previous: 9, three times, last: May 4 vs. Seattle)...that includes six home runs, which are the most surrendered by A's pitchers since April 19, 1994 at Boston when they also allowed six home runs...now have a 5.72 ERA (87 er in 137.0 ip) and .281 (151-for-538) opponents batting average over the last 16 games after posting a 2.69 ERA and .231 opponents average over the first 16 contests...have a 4.15 ERA (131 er in 284.0 ip) overall, which is sixth highest in the American League...rank fourth in strikeouts (253) and walks (105)...are tied for third in pickoffs (4).

STARTING PITCHING: Kendall Graveman allowed four home runs yesterday at Baltimore, which are the most allowed by an A's starting pitcher since May 6, 2013 at Cleveland when Jarrod Parker also yielded four home runs...A's starting pitchers are now 3-10 with a 7.16 ERA (61 er in 76.2 ip) and .306 (96-for-314) opponents batting average over the last 15 games after going 6-5 with a 2.88 ERA and .230 opponents batting average over the first 17 contests...are 9-15 for the season and the losses are second most in the American League...have allowed the second most walks (80) and home runs (27).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .290 (42-for-145) with 21 runs scored over the past four games (5.25 runs per game) after hitting .197 with eight runs scored in the previous four games (2.00 runs per game)...that includes a season-high 15 hits in Game 1 of Saturday's doubleheader (previous: 14, April 22 at Toronto)...are one of three Major League teams that have not been shutout (Colorado, Pittsburgh) and have a streak of 53 consecutive games with one or more runs scored, which is the longest active streak in the majors...have a .293 on-base percentage, which is the lowest mark in the American League...have the third fewest walks (78) and the fourth fewest doubles (41)...however, are tied for the third most triples (5).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed eight errors over the last 16 games after making 15 over the first 16 contests...lead the American League and are tied for fourth in the majors in errors (23)...have 10 unearned runs, which are tied for fourth most in the AL...rank third in double plays (36).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-2 on this nine-game road trip to Baltimore (1-2), Boston (three games) and Tampa Bay (three games)...this trip concludes a stretch that runs from April 19 to May 15 in which the A's are scheduled to play 19 of their 25 games on the road...went 5-5 on the last road trip to New York (3-0), Toronto (1-2) and Detroit (1-3) and are 9-7 (.563) on the road, which is tied for the fourth best road record in the American League...went 2-4 on the last homestand against Houston (2-1) and Seattle (0-3) and are 5-11 (.313) at home, which is the worst home record in the AL and third worst in the majors...are batting .261 (148-for-566) and are averaging 4.25 runs per game (68 runs in 16 games) on the road compared to .219 (114-for-521) with an average of 3.06 runs per game (49 runs in 16 games) at home...have the third lowest batting average and third fewest runs scored at home in the AL.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's began the season by facing three consecutive left-handed starting pitchers but have faced righties in 27 of the last 29 games, including each of the last 14...are 13-14 (.481) in games started by a right-hander, 1-4 (.200) against lefties.

TWO FOR THE PRICE OF ONE: The A's doubleheader on Saturday at Baltimore was their first since May 7, 2014 at home against Seattle, a span of exactly two years...the A's rainout on Friday was their first since April 4, 2014, also at home against Seattle.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 4 for their last 13 (.308) after starting the season 0-for-12...rank third in the American League in plate appearances (26) and tied for fourth in hits (4)...however, have the fourth worst batting average (.160)...have gone 280 games since their last pinch home run, which is the longest active streak in the majors...the A's last pinch hit home run was by John Jaso on June 22, 2014 against Boston.

THIS AND THAT: This trip concludes a stretch that runs from April 19 to May 15 where the A's are scheduled to play 19 of 25 games in the Eastern Time Zone...after the game in Tampa Bay on May 15, the A's will have just two more series in the Eastern Time Zone, both in Ohio (at Cincinnati, June 10-12; at Cleveland, July 29-31)...the A's are 9-6 on Friday, Saturday and Sunday compared to 5-12 from Monday through Thursday...have been successful in 4-of-6 (66.7%) replay challenges...the A's designated hitter has entered the game defensively five times this year...from 1996-2015, the A's had the DH enter the game on defense a total of 11 times...the last time they did it at least five times in a season was 1995 when it happened seven times.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's reinstated Danny Valencia from the disabled list Friday, marking the first time they have reinstated a player from the DL this year...currently have seven players on the DL (H. Alvarez, R.J. Alvarez, Bassitt, Doubront, Fuld, Parker, Sogard) and have used the DL eight times this year...R.J. Alvarez, Doubront and Parker are on the 60-day DL...Henderson Alvarez is on a rehab assignment...used the DL 23 times last year, which matched the 2010 club for second most in Oakland history...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. RED SOX: The A's lost the season series last year as they went 1-5, which marked their first season series loss against the Red Sox since 2011...went 1-2 in Oakland and were swept in a three-game series in Boston...are now 16-12 against Boston since the start of the 2012 season...are 12-4 in Oakland and 4-8 in Boston over that span...are 235-286 against Boston since moving to Oakland in 1968...that includes 141-118 in Oakland, 93-167 in Boston and 1-1 in Tokyo...all-time, the A's are 877-1067 against the Red Sox.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Josh Reddick tied an A's franchise record yesterday with a hit in his eighth consecutive at bat (several times; last: Dave Magadan, Aug. 26-30, 1997) dating back to the eighth inning of Game 1 of Saturday's doubleheader...has a double, seven singles and a walk during the streak, which is ongoing...has four straight multiple-hit games and is 12-for-17 (.706) over that span, which has raised his batting average from .253 to .319...*Jed Lowrie* is batting .362 (25-for-69) over his last 19 games after hitting .209 over his first 12 contests...is 13-for-28 (.464) with runners in scoring position...leads the American League and is tied for fifth in the majors in batting with RISP...*Ryan Madson* has not allowed an earned run in his past nine games and 8.2 innings (6 h, 1 r, 4 bb, 1 ibb, 6 so)... is a perfect 8-for-8 in save opportunities and the eight saves are tied for sixth most in the American League.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1972** the A's score 10 times in the fourth inning of the first game of a doubleheader against Milwaukee...the first seven batters reach base and score in the A's 10-2 win...in **1988** Bob Welch and Dennis Eckersley combine on a four-hitter as the A's defeat Detroit 3-1 for what was then a club record 14th consecutive victory...the A's would go on to win an Oakland record 104 games and their first division title since 1981...in **2010** Dallas Braden pitches the 19th perfect game in Major League history in the A's 4-0 win over Tampa Bay on Mother's Day.

LAST THREE, FIRST THREE: Is 1-2 with a 7.88 ERA (14 er in 16.0 ip) and .302 (19-for-63) opponents batting average over his last three starts after going 2-1 with a 2.33 ERA and .225 opponents batting average over his first three starts.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has a .217 (10-for-46) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .250 (11-for-44) the second time and .318 (14-for-44) after that...has allowed a .314 (16-for-51) average with no outs, .256 (11-for-43)

with one out and .200 (8-for-40) with two outs...the opponents four and five hitters are a combined 4-for-31 (.129) against him...the eight and nine hitters are 13-for-26 (.500)...opponents are batting .353 (12-for-34) with three walks (.405 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-2 with a 4.10 ERA (12 er in 26.1 ip) in four starts at home compared to 1-1 with a 7.00 ERA (7 er in 9.0 ip) in two starts on the road...last year, he went 8-3 with a 2.63 ERA and five home runs in 16 starts on the road compared to 6-4 with a 2.82 ERA and 12 home runs in 15 starts at home...the road ERA was eighth lowest in Oakland history... it was second lowest over the last 34 years to his mark of 2.51 in 2014...is now 15-7 with a 2.75 ERA (66 er in 215.2 ip) in 33 starts on the road over the last three years compared to 16-13 with a 3.32 ERA (91 er in 246.2 ip) in 37 starts at home.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received no run support twice this year and two runs or fewer four times...is 2-0 in two starts with three runs of support or more compared to 1-3 in four starts with two runs or fewer...last year, he was 12-1 in 20 starts with three runs of support or more compared to 2-6 in 11 starts with two runs or fewer...is now 31-2 in 45 career starts with run support of three or more.

MONTH BY MONTH: Is 0-1 with a 9.00 ERA (7 er in 7.0 ip) in one start in May after going 3-2 with a 3.81 ERA in five starts in April...is now 10-3 with a 2.53 ERA in 15 career starts in April...the 10 wins are his most in any month...is a combined 14-6 with a 2.60 ERA (53 er in 183.1 ip) in 28 career starts from the start of the season through May 31.

FIRST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 2-1 victory over Chicago (AL) April 6 in Oakland, the A's third game of the season...was scratched from his scheduled Opening Day start April 4 due to food poisoning...allowed his only run in the third inning when Jackson led off with a double, went to third on an Eaton ground out and scored on a Rollins sacrifice fly...left after seven innings with a 2-1 lead.

SECOND START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-1 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on April 11 in Oakland...tossed 6.1 innings to go over the 500 innings pitched mark in his career...shut out the Angels on two hits and two walks over the first five innings but Tropeano blanked the A's on six hits and two walks in five innings...allowed three runs in the sixth inning on a Nava RBI single and a Trout two-run home run.

THIRD START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-3 win over Kansas City April 16 in Oakland...allowed a RBI single to Cain in the top of the first but the A's came back with three in the bottom of the first to give him the lead for good...also yielded a RBI single to Fuentes in the fourth inning.

FOURTH START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's 8-5 win at Toronto April 22...struck out five of the first six batters he faced and had a 4-0 lead when he allowed a solo home run to Barney in the third inning... the A's increased their lead to 6-1 before he allowed a Bautista sacrifice fly in the sixth and a Barney RBI single in the seventh.

FIFTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-4 loss at Detroit April 27...tossed 65 pitches in 2.0 innings...matched the shortest outing of his career and it was his shortest outing as a starter (pitched 2.0 innings in his first two career outings, both in relief)...allowed four runs in the second inning...Castellanos tripled to lead off the inning and scored on a Gose fielders choice...J.D. Martinez hit a three-run home run later in the inning.

LAST START: He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 8-2 loss to Seattle last Tuesday in Oakland...matched his career highs by allowing seven runs on 11 hits...allowed a two-run home run to Martin in the third and a solo home run by Cano to start the fourth...a RBI single by Marte in the seventh inning increased the Mariners lead to 4-1 and Lind added a RBI single in the eighth...was relieved by Rzepczynski with runners on first and second and no outs in the eighth and he allowed a three-run home run to Seager.

2015 RECAP: Was named to his first American League All-Star Team... went 14-7 with a 2.73 ERA in 31 starts and ranked third in the AL in ERA... also ranked second in opponents slugging percentage (.316) and OPS (.590), third in opponents batting average (.217), fourth in opponents on-base percentage (.273), eighth in innings pitched (208.0) and tied for eighth in wins...finished third in AL Cy Young Award voting...was 5-2 with a 1.78 ERA in nine starts during the day...the ERA ranked sixth lowest in Oakland history among pitchers with at least 50 day innings.

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Was 10-3 with a 2.04 ERA, .198 opponents batting average and five home runs in 18 starts before the All-Star Break compared to 4-4 with a 3.74 ERA, .244 opponents batting average and 12 home runs in 13 starts after the break...it marked the second consecutive season he had 10 wins before the break and four after the break...is now 23-9 with a 2.70 ERA (86 er in 286.2 ip) in 44 career games before the break, 13-14 with a 3.38 ERA (90 er in 239.2 ip) in 38 games after the break.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Set an Athletics single season record for putouts by a pitcher with 37...broke the previous mark of 35 set by Chick Fraser in 1901...the putouts were the most by a pitcher since Kevin Brown had 41 for the Dodgers in 1999...did not commit an error in 60 chances, which were the most in the majors and second most in Oakland history (Langford, 62 in 1979) among pitchers with no errors...they were the most errorless chances by an AL pitcher since Josh Towers had 60 for Toronto in 2005...had the second most total chances among AL pitchers.

LHP Sean Manaea (0-0, 7.20 ERA): Was selected from Triple-A Nashville April 29 and is scheduled to make his third start of the season and his career...had a no decision in his last start, a 9-8 A's loss to Seattle last Wednesday in Oakland (5.0 ip, 7 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 6 so)...was 2-0 with a 1.50 ERA in three starts with Triple-A Nashville...allowed just one run in each of his starts...allowed a .232 opponents batting average, including .077 against left-handed hitters compared to .268 against right-handers...was 1-1 with a 4.40 ERA in five games, three starts, with the A's this spring...is 16-9 with a 2.82 ERA in 42 games, all starts, in three professional seasons...has 257 strikeouts in 214.0 innings, an average of 10.81 per nine innings...was originally drafted by Kansas City as a Competitive Balance pick following the first round of the 2013 draft and was dealt to the A's just prior to the 2015 trading deadline.
