OAKLAND ATHLETICS (14-19) VS. BOSTON RED SOX (19-13)

ABOUT THE A'S: Are on a three-game losing streak, which is one short of the season-high of four (two times, last: May 1-4)...are now 1-7 in May and a season-high five games under .500 at 14-19, which is the fifth worst record in the American League...have lost 12 of the last 16 games after winning a season-high six straight contests from April 16-22...are tied for third place in the AL West and trail first place Seattle by a season-high 5 1/2 games...have spent one day in sole possession of first place this year, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 10 days in third, five days tied for third, four days in fourth and three days tied for fourth.

PITCHING: The A's allowed a season-high 14 runs last night after yielding 11 runs the day before, which was the previous season-high...it is the first time the A's have allowed 11 or more runs in consecutive games since May 17-18, 2009...allowed six home runs on Sunday at Baltimore, which are the most surrendered by A's pitchers since April 19, 1994 at Boston when they also allowed six home runs...now have a 6.27 ERA (101 er in 145.0 ip) and .288 (166-for-577) opponents batting average over the last 17 games after posting a 2.69 ERA and .231 opponents average over the first 16 contests...have a 4.47 ERA (145 er in 292.0 ip) overall, which is second highest in the American League (Minnesota, 4.71)...rank fourth in strikeouts (262) and walks (110)...are tied for third in pickoffs (4).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 3-11 with a 7.62 ERA (68 er in 80.1 ip) and .312 (104-for-333) opponents batting average over the last 16 games after going 6-5 with a 2.88 ERA and .230 opponents batting average over the first 17 contests...are 9-16 for the season and the losses are tied with Minnesota for the most in the American League...have allowed the most walks (82) and second most home runs (27)...Kendall Graveman allowed four home runs Sunday at Baltimore, which are the most allowed by an A's starting pitcher since May 6, 2013 at Cleveland when Jarrod Parker also yielded four home runs.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .290 (53-for-183) with 28 runs scored over the past five games (5.60 runs per game) after hitting .197 with eight runs scored in the previous four games (2.00 runs per game)...that includes a season-high 15 hits in Game 1 of Saturday's doubleheader at Baltimore (previous: 14, April 22 at Toronto)...are one of three Major League teams that have not been shutout (Colorado, Pittsburgh) and have a streak of 54 consecutive games with one or more runs scored, which is the longest active streak in the majors...have a .295 on-base percentage, which is the lowest mark in the American League...have the third fewest walks (81) and the fourth fewest doubles (45)...however, are tied for the third most triples (5).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed eight errors over the last 17 games after making 15 over the first 16 contests...lead the American League and are tied for fifth in the majors in errors (23)...have 10 unearned runs, which are tied for fourth most in the AL...rank third in double plays (37).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-3 on this nine-game road trip to Baltimore (1-2), Boston (0-1) and Tampa Bay (three games)...this trip concludes a stretch that runs from April 19 to May 15 in which the A's are scheduled to play 19 of their 25 games on the road...went 5-5 on the last road trip to New York (3-0), Toronto (1-2) and Detroit (1-3) and are 9-8 (.529) on the road, which is tied for the fifth best road record in the American League...went 2-4 on the last homestand against Houston (2-1) and Seattle (0-3) and are 5-11 (.313) at home, which is the worst home record in the AL and fourth worst in the majors...are batting .263 (159-for-604) and are averaging 4.41 runs per game (75 runs in 17 games) on the road compared to .219 (114-for-521) with an average of 3.06 runs per game (49 runs in 16 games) at home...have the third lowest batting average and third fewest runs scored at home in the AL.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 5-6 in one-run decisions...are tied for third in the American League in one-run games and wins and are fourth in losses...are 5-2 in games decided in the last at bat...are 2-0 in extra inning games and are tied for second in the AL in extra inning wins...are 3-0 when the game is tied after seven innings and 4-1 when it is tied after eight innings.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 4 for their last 13 (.308) after starting the season 0-for-12...rank third in the American League in plate appearances (26) and tied for fourth in hits (4)...however, have the fourth worst batting average (.160)...have gone 281 games since their last pinch home run, which is the longest active streak in the majors...the A's last pinch hit home run was by John Jaso on June 22, 2014 against Boston.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's began the season by facing three consecutive left-handed starting pitchers but have faced righties in 28 of the last 30 games, including each of the last 15...are 13-15 (.464) in games started by a right-hander, 1-4 (.200) against lefties.

THIS AND THAT: This trip concludes a stretch that runs from April 19 to May 15 where the A's are scheduled to play 19 of 25 games in the Eastern Time Zone...after the game in Tampa Bay on May 15, the A's will have just two more series in the Eastern Time Zone, both in Ohio (at Cincinnati, June 10-12; at Cleveland, July 29-31)...the A's are 9-6 on Friday, Saturday and Sunday compared to 5-13 from Monday through Thursday...have been successful in 4-of-6 (66.7%) replay challenges...the A's designated hitter has entered the game defensively five times this year...from 1996-2015, the A's had the DH enter the game on defense a total of 11 times...the last time they did it at least five times in a season was 1995 when it happened seven times.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's placed Mark Canha (retroactive to May 9) and Liam Hendriks (retroactive to May 8) on the 15-day disabled list today and currently have nine players on the DL (H. Alvarez, R.J. Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doubront, Fuld, Hendriks, Parker, Sogard)...R.J. Alvarez, Bassitt, Doubront and Parker are on the 60-day DL...Henderson Alvarez is on a rehab assignment...have used the DL 10 times this year...reinstated Danny Valencia from the disabled list Friday, marking the first time they have reinstated a player from the DL this year...used the DL 23 times last year, which matched the 2010 club for second most in Oakland history...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. RED SOX: The A's lost the first game of the season series last night...lost the season series last year as they went 1-5, which marked their first season series loss against the Red Sox since 2011...went 1-2 in Oakland and were swept in a three-game series in Boston...are now 16-13 against Boston since the start of the 2012 season...are 12-4 in Oakland and 4-9 in Boston over that span...are 235-287 against Boston since moving to Oakland in 1968...that includes 141-118 in Oakland, 93-168 in Boston and 1-1 in Tokyo...all-time, the A's are 877-1068 against the Red Sox.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Jed Lowrie is batting .356 (26-for-73) over his last 20 games after hitting .209 over his first 12 contests...is 13-for-28 (.464) with runners in scoring position...leads the American League and is tied for fifth in the majors in batting with RISP...**Ryan Madson** has not allowed an earned run in his past nine games and 8.2 innings (6 h, 1 r, 4 bb, 1 ibr, 6 so)...is a perfect 8-for-8 in save opportunities and the eight saves are tied for sixth most in the American League...**Josh Reddick** had his A's franchise record-tying streak of eight consecutive at bats with a hit snapped last night (several times; last: Dave Magadan, Aug. 26-30, 1997)...the streak, which dated back to the eighth inning of Game 1 of Saturday's doubleheader, was snapped in the first inning...**Danny Valencia** has an A's season-high tying seven-game hitting streak (dating back to April 16)...is batting .360 (9-for-25) during the streak.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1992** Jose Canseco, Mark McGwire and Mike Bordick all homered in the sixth inning of the A's 5-2 win at New York...in **1996** Ernie Young hits three home runs in the A's 15-5 win over Minnesota to tie an Oakland record...he adds a single and drives in six runs...Young, Geronimo Berroa and Brent Gates all homered in the fifth inning to tie an Oakland record...in **2007** Dan Johnson is a perfect 4 for 4 with two home runs, four RBI, four runs scored and two walks and Jack Cust also homers twice as the A's hit six home runs to defeat Kansas City, 17-3.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (0-0, 7.20 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was selected from Triple-A Nashville April 29 and is scheduled to make his third start of the season and his career...made his Major League debut April 29 against Houston after just 42 minor league appearances, all starts, in three professional seasons...became the 45th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut, the first since Dan Straily on Aug. 3, 2012 against Toronto...is the first Oakland pitcher to allow four runs or more in each of his first two career games since Bobby Chouinard (May 26-June 1, 1996)...the only pitcher in Oakland history to do that in his first three games is Vida Blue (July 20-Aug. 3, 1969).

FIRST START: He had a no decision in his Major League debut, a 7-4 A's win over Houston April 29 in Oakland...allowed a leadoff home run to Gattis in the second inning but the A's came back with two in the bottom of the second...allowed a RBI single to Gattis in the sixth to tie the game and was relieved by Doolittle with no outs and runners on first and second...Doolittle allowed both runs to score but the A's tied the game in the eighth and won it on a three-run home run by Alonso in the ninth.

LAST START: He had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 9-8 loss to Seattle last Wednesday in Oakland...shutout the Mariners on two hits and a walk over the first four innings and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed four runs in the fifth inning...Marte had a RBI double, Cano a RBI single and Cruz a two-run home run...the A's then scored six times in the bottom of the fifth to give him an 8-4 lead but the bullpen allowed two runs in the sixth inning and three more in the seventh for the blown save (Axford).

THIS AND THAT: Compiled a 1.29 ERA in the first inning, a 4.20 ERA in innings two through four and a 0.46 ERA from the fifth inning on...his teams were 10-4 (.714) in his starting assignments, including 7-0 at Midland...allowed one run or fewer in eight of his 14 starts, including no runs four times.
