OAKLAND ATHLETICS (14-21) VS. TAMPA BAY RAYS (15-17)

ABOUT THE A'S: Were swept by Boston in a three-game series at Fenway Park and now have a season-high five-game losing streak, which is their longest losing streak since Sept. 19-24, 2015 when they also lost five straight...have not lost more than five straight since Aug. 11-17, 2015 when they lost seven in a row...are now 1-9 in May, which is the worst record in the majors in the month of May, and a season-high seven games under .500 at 14-21, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...have lost 14 of the last 18 games after winning a season-high six straight contests from April 16-22...are in third place in the AL West and trail first place Seattle by a season-high 7 1/2 games for the second consecutive day...have spent one day in sole possession of first place this year, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 11 days in third, seven days tied for third, four days in fourth and three days tied for fourth.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed 11 or more runs in each of the past four games...since 1929, only four other Major League teams have allowed at least 11 runs in four or more straight games...the 1929 Phillies did so in six straight games (June 19-22; two doubleheaders) and the 1951 Pirates (May 20-23), 1986 Brewers (Sept. 3-6) and 2007 Astros (July 29-Aug. 2) each did so in four straight games...the A's have allowed 51 runs over the past four games, which ties the Oakland record for most runs allowed over a four-game stretch (Aug. 13-16, 1996)...that includes 40 runs allowed against Boston at Fenway Park, which is an Oakland record for a three-game series (previous: 38, three times: May 3-5, 1991 vs. Cleveland: Aug. 4-6, 1995 vs. Seattle; July 17-18, 2000 vs. Colorado)...now have a 7.04 ERA (126 er in 161.0 ip) and .303 (199-for-657) opponents batting average over the last 19 games after posting a 2.69 ERA and .231 opponents average over the first 16 contests...have a 4.97 ERA (170 er in 308.0 ip) overall, which is highest in the American League and fourth highest in the majors...have allowed the most home runs in the AL (46), have the third highest opponents batting average (.270) and the fourth most walks (118)...are tied for third in pickoffs (4).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have tossed fewer than six innings in each of the past seven games (34 er in 27.2 ip, 11.06 ERA), including pitching fewer than four innings in each of the past four games (25 er in 11.2 ip, 19.29 ERA)...are now 3-13 with an 8.40 ERA (80 er in 85.2 ip) and .327 (118-for-361) opponents batting average over the last 18 games after going 6-5 with a 2.88 ERA and .230 opponents batting average over the first 17 contests...are 9-18 with a 5.47 ERA (111 er in 182.2 ip) overall...the losses and ERA are the worst in the American League...have allowed the second most walks (84) and are tied for the second most home runs (30).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .295 (76-for-258) with 36 runs scored over the past seven games (5.14 runs per game) after hitting .197 with eight runs scored in the previous four games (2.00 runs per game)...are one of three Major League teams that have not been shutout (Colorado, Pittsburgh) and have a streak of 56 consecutive games with one or more runs scored, which is the longest active streak in the majors...have the second lowest on-base percentage in the American League (.298), second fewest walks (85), fourth fewest doubles (49), fourth lowest slugging percentage (.378) and are tied for the fifth fewest home runs (33)...however, are tied for the fifth most triples (5).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 10 errors over the last 19 games after making 15 over the first 16 contests...lead the American League and are tied for fourth in the majors in errors (25)...have 11 unearned runs, which are tied for fifth most in the AL...rank third in double plays (38).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-5 on this nine-game road trip to Baltimore (1-2), Boston (0-3) and Tampa Bay (three games)...this trip concludes a stretch that runs from April 19 to May 15 in which the A's are scheduled to play 19 of their 25 games on the road...went 5-5 on the last road trip to New York (3-0), Toronto (1-2) and Detroit (1-3) and are 9-10 (.474) on the road overall...went 2-4 on the last homestand against Houston (2-1) and Seattle (0-3) and are 5-11 (.313) at home, which is the worst home record in the American League and third worst in the majors...are batting .268 (182-for-679) and are averaging 4.37 runs per game (83 runs in 19 games) on the road compared to .219 (114-for-521) with an average of 3.06 runs per game (49 runs in 16 games) at home...have scored the fewest runs at home in the AL and have the third lowest batting average.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 5-6 in one-run decisions...are tied for third in the American League in one-run games and wins and are fourth in losses...are 5-2 in games decided in the last at bat...are 2-0 in extra inning games and are tied for second in the AL in extra inning wins...are 3-0 when the game is tied after seven innings and 4-1 when it is tied after eight innings.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 4 for their last 14 (.286) after starting the season 0-for-12...rank third in the American League in plate appearances (27) and are tied for fourth in hits (4)...however, have the second worst batting average (.154)...have gone 283 games since their last pinch home run, which is the longest active streak in the majors...the A's last pinch hit home run was by John Jaso on June 22, 2014 against Boston.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's began the season by facing three consecutive left-handed starting pitchers but have faced righties in 30 of the last 32 games, including each of the last 16...are 13-17 (.433) in games started by a right-hander, 1-4 (.200) against lefties.

THIS AND THAT: This trip concludes a stretch that runs from April 19 to May 15 where the A's are scheduled to play 19 of 25 games in the Eastern Time Zone...after the game in Tampa Bay on May 15, the A's will have just two more series in the Eastern Time Zone, both in Ohio (at Cincinnati, June 10-12; at Cleveland, July 29-31)...the A's are 9-6 on Friday, Saturday and Sunday compared to 5-15 from Monday through Thursday...have been successful in 5-of-7 (71.4%) replay challenges...the A's designated hitter has entered the game defensively five times this year...from 1996-2015, the A's had the DH enter the game on defense a total of 11 times...the last time they did it at least five times in a season was 1995 when it happened seven times.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have 10 players on the DL (H. Alvarez, R.J. Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doubront, Fuld, Hendriks, Lowrie, Parker, Sogard)...R.J. Alvarez, Bassitt, Doubront, Parker and Sogard are on the 60-day DL...Henderson Alvarez is on a rehab assignment...have now used the DL 11 times this year...reinstated Danny Valencia from the disabled list on May 6, marking the first time they have reinstated a player from the DL this year...used the DL 23 times last year, which matched the 2010 club for second most in Oakland history...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. RAYS: The A's lost the season series last year as they went 3-4, which marked their first season series loss to the Rays since 2010 when they were 4-5...split a four-game series at Tropicana Field in May and dropped two of three games in Oakland in August...are 10-9 against the Rays since the start of the 2013 season...all-time, the A's are 96-61 against Tampa Bay...are 53-24 in Oakland and 43-37 at Tropicana Field.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Yonder Alonso, Billy Burns and Danny Valencia have each hit safely in an A's season-high tying seven consecutive games...Alonso is batting .360 (9-for-25) during the streak, Burns is batting .344 (11-for-32) and Valencia is batting .360 (9-for-25)...**Ryan Madson** has not allowed an earned run in his past 10 games and 9.2 innings (7 h, 1 r, 6 bb, 1 ibr, 6 so)...is a perfect 8-for-8 in save opportunities and the eight saves are tied for seventh most in the American League...**Josh Reddick** is batting .556 (15-for-27) with five multiple hit-games, five runs scored, five RBI and four walks (.613 on-base percentage) over his past seven games.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1986** Dave Kingman hits a three-run homer in the bottom of the 10th inning after the A's score single runs in the seventh, eighth and ninth innings in a 6-3 win over Toronto...in **2007** the A's score five times in the bottom of the ninth inning to defeat Cleveland, 10-7...Milton Bradley hits a two-run home run to tie the game and Jack Cust hits a three-run homer for the win as he homers in his fourth consecutive game.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Rich Hill (4-3, 2.39 ERA)

LAST SIX STARTS: Is 4-2 with a 2.06 ERA (8 er in 35.0 ip) and .200 (25-for-125) opponents batting average over his last six starts...has struck out 43 batters over that span (11.06 per nine innings)...allowed four runs, two earned, in 2.2 innings in his first start on April 4 against Chicago (AL), an Opening Day assignment where he replaced an ill Sonny Gray.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 4-0 with a 1.09 ERA (3 er in 24.2 ip) and .165 (14-for-85) opponents batting average in four starts on the road compared to 0-3 with a 4.85 ERA (7 er in 13.0 ip) and .275 (14-for-51) opponents average in three starts at home...is now 5-1 with a 1.61 ERA (8 er in 44.2 ip) and .168 (26-for-155) opponents batting average in seven starts on the road over the last two years...has four 10-strikeout games in those seven starts and has fanned 59 in 44.2 road innings (11.89 per nine innings)...struck out 10 batters in each of his first two road starts this year and is the first pitcher in Oakland history with back-to-back 10-strikeout games on the road...the last A's pitcher to do it was Jim Nash in 1967 (July 8-13).

STRIKEOUTS: Is tied for sixth in the American League in strikeouts (46)...37 of those came in April, which was the fifth best April total in Oakland history and the second best over the last 15 years (Chavez, 41 in 2014)...had 10-strikeout games on April 9 at Seattle and April 21 at New York (AL) and is the first A's pitcher with two 10-strikeout games in one month since Mark Mulder in July, 2003...now has 10 career games with 10 or more strikeouts...has 142 strikeouts in 110.2 innings over the last four years (11.55 per nine innings).

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks fourth in the American League in most pitches per inning (18.3) and tied for eighth in unearned runs (3)...is tied for the Major League lead in hit batters (6) and is tied for the lead among ML pitchers in errors (2).

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 2-1 with a 1.42 ERA (3 er in 19.0 ip) in three starts on four days rest compared to 2-2 with a 3.38 ERA (7 er in 18.2 ip) in four starts on five days rest or more.

THIS AND THAT: Has allowed one earned run after the third inning (17.0 ip, 0.53 ERA)...has a 3.02 ERA (9 er in 20.2 ip) in innings 1-3...opponents are batting .244 (19-for-78) over the first three innings and .155 (9-for-58) after that...has surrendered both of his home runs and issued 15 of his 16 walks to right-handed hitters...opponents are 1-for-14 (.071) with runners in scoring position and two outs.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is scheduled to make his eighth start of the season...it will be his 12th appearance over the last two years, all starts...is 6-4 with a 2.03 ERA (15 er in 66.2 ip) and .179 (42-for-235) opponents batting average over that span...made 119 appearances from 2010-14, all in relief...appeared in 78 games, including 70 starts, over his first five seasons from 2005-09.

FIRST START: Made his first career Opening Day start April 4 against Chicago (AL) after Sonny Gray was scratched due to food poisoning...at the age of 36 years, 24 days, he was the fourth oldest pitcher to start an opener in Oakland history and the fifth oldest in Athletics history...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-3 loss...tossed just 2.2 innings, which was the fourth shortest outing by an A's starter on Opening Day and the shortest since Barry Zito lasted 1.1 innings against New York (AL) in 2006...did not allow a run over the first two innings but then surrendered four runs, two earned, while recording just one out in the third...Eaton had a RBI triple and Rollins followed with a RBI single before two runs scored on a Canha error.

SECOND START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-1 victory at Seattle April 9...struck out 10 batters and his final strikeout of Iannetta in the sixth inning was the 500th of his career...had a 2-0 lead when he allowed his only run in the second inning on a two-out solo home run by Iannetta...blanked the Mariners on two hits, a walk and a hit batter over his final four innings.

THIRD START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-2 loss to Kansas City April 15 in Oakland...yielded two runs in the first inning on a Cain RBI single and a double play...the A's got one of those runs back in the second but he allowed a RBI single to Morales in the third...was relieved by Rodriguez after tossing 106 pitches in 4.1 innings.

FOURTH START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-3 win at New York (AL) April 21...struck out 10 batters in 6.0 innings, his second 10-strikeout game of the season...allowed a RBI single to Hicks in the second inning but the A's tied the game in the fourth...yielded another run on a Romine RBI single in the bottom of the fourth but the A's tied the game in the fifth and scored twice in the seventh to give him the win.

FIFTH START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-1 win at Detroit May 1...tossed 7.0 scoreless innings and did not walk a batter...allowed just

one run base runner as far as second base...retired each of the last seven batters he faced, 11 of the last 12 and 18 of the last 20.

SIXTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-1 loss to Houston last Sunday in Oakland...allowed just two hits but issued four walks in six innings...yielded a home run to Altuve to start the game and Rasmus had a sacrifice fly in the third inning...retired 10 of the final 11 batters he faced.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 8-4 win at Baltimore last Saturday...allowed just two hits but walked three and hit a batter...yielded his only run in the sixth inning when Jones grounded into a fielder's choice to score Machado...was relieved by Dull with two outs in the sixth after tossing 103 pitches.

HILL vs. TAMPA BAY: Is 1-0 with a 4.97 ERA (12.2 ip, 13 h, 7 r, 7 er, 3 bb, 1 ibr, 20 so, 2 hbp) in 10 career appearances, including one start...that includes 1-0 with a 12.46 ERA (6 er in 4.1 ip) in six games at his home ballparks and 0-0 with a 1.08 ERA (1 er in 8.1 ip) in four games, one start, at Tropicana Field...the start came in his only appearance against the Rays last year...tossed seven shutout innings and allowed just four to reach base (1 h, 1 bb, 2 hbp) while he recorded 10 strikeouts.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 0-2 with an 11.25 ERA in four spring training starts...also pitched in minor league games on March 20 and 25...issued 15 walks in 12.0 innings...the walks matched the most by an A's pitcher over the last 19 springs (Ron Mahay, 2000; Omar Olivares, 2000)...opponents hit .293 (12-for-41)...allowed 13 runs on 10 hits and 12 walks over his first three starts (7.2 ip, 15.26 ERA) before yielding two runs on two hits and three walks in his final start (4.1 ip, 4.15 ERA).

2015 RECAP: Began the season at Triple-A Syracuse in the Washington organization and finished it by going 2-1 with a 1.55 ERA in four September starts with Boston...the starts were his first as a major leaguer since making 13 with Baltimore in 2009...struck out 36 batters in 29.0 innings (11.17 per nine innings) and walked just five for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 7.20...allowed a .141 batting average, including .138 with both of his home runs against right-handers compared to .158 against left-handers...yielded a .154 average with runners in scoring position...was signed by Washington to a minor league contract March 3 and started the season at Syracuse...was 2-2 with a 2.91 ERA in 25 relief appearances with the Chiefs when he was released June 24...went 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA in two starts with the Long Island Ducks of the independent Atlantic League before signing a minor league deal with Boston Aug. 14...compiled a 3-2 record and a 2.78 ERA in five starts with Triple-A Pawtucket before his promotion to Boston Sept. 8...combined for a 5-4 record and a 2.83 ERA in 30 games with Syracuse and Pawtucket...struck out 61 batters in 54.0 innings.

RHP Kendall Graveman (1-4, 5.74 ERA): Is 0-3 with a 10.54 ERA and .397 (25-for-63) opponents batting average over his last three starts after going 1-1 with a 2.04 ERA and .159 opponents average over his first three starts...has allowed a career-high 10 hits in two of his last three starts after surrendering 10 hits total over his first three...has received one run of support or less in three of his six starts and three runs of support in each of his other three...his season run support average is 2.87...was the losing pitcher in his last start, an 11-3 A's loss in Baltimore last Sunday (2.2 ip, 5 h, 6 r, 6 er, 3 bb, 2 so, 4 hr)...the four home runs allowed were a career-high and the most allowed by an A's starting pitcher since May 6, 2013 at Cleveland when Jarrod Parker also yielded four home runs...is 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (12.0 ip, 6 h, 0 r, 0 er, 3 bb, 9 so, 1 hbp) in two career starts against Tampa Bay.

- The A's bullpen has allowed three or more runs in six of its past seven games (33 er in 30.1 ip, 9.79 ERA) after yielding one run or fewer in 22 of its first 28 games (2.46 ERA), including 15 games where it did not allow a run.
- Has allowed 12-of-64 (18.8%) inherited runners to score, which is the third best percentage in the American League (Cleveland, 13.0%).
- Has tossed 125.1 innings, which are the most in the AL and second most in the majors (Arizona, 137.1), and allowed just 34 walks, which are the fifth fewest in the AL...is third in walks per nine innings (2.44) and in strikeouts per walk (3.44).
- Ranks second in the AL in save percentage (83.3%), tied for fourth in strikeouts (117), fourth in grounded into double plays (11) and tied for fifth in saves (10)...has recorded just one save in its last 18 games after having nine saves in its first 17 contests.
