## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (15-21) VS. TAMPA BAY RAYS (15-18)

SATURDAY, MAY 14, 2016 — TROPICANA FIELD — 6:10 P.M. EDT RHP KENDALL GRAVEMAN (1-4, 5.74) VS. RHP MATT ANDRIESE (1-0, 1.29) CSNCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Beat the Rays last night to snap a season-long five-game losing streak...were swept by Boston in a three-game series at Fenway Park and dropped the final two games in Baltimore after taking the series opener at Camden Yards...still have not lost more than five straight since Aug. 11-17, 2015 when they lost seven in a row...are now 2-9 in May, which is the third worst record in the majors in the month of May... their overall record of 15-21 (.417) is the fifth worst record in the American League...have lost 14 of the last 19 games after winning a season-high six straight contests from April 16-22...are in third place in the AL West and trail first place Seattle by 6 1/2 games...have spent one day in sole possession of first place this year, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 12 days in third, seven days tied for third, four days in fourth and three days tied for fourth.

PITCHING: Last night, the A's snapped a four-game streak during which they allowed 11+ runs per game...since 1929, only four other Major League teams have allowed at least 11 runs in four or more straight games...the 1929 Phillies did so in six straight games (June 19-22; two doubleheaders) and the 1951 Pirates (May 20-23), 1986 Brewers (Sept. 3-6) and 2007 Astros (July 29-Aug. 2) each did so in four straight games...the A's allowed 51 runs over that four-game stretch, which tied the Oakland record for most runs allowed over a four-game stretch (Aug. 13-16, 1996)...that included 40 runs allowed against Boston at Fenway Park, which is an Oakland record for a three-game series (previous: 38, three times: May 3-5, 1991 vs. Cleveland: Aug. 4-6, 1995 vs. Seattle; July 17-18, 2000 vs. Colorado)... now have a 6.83 ERA (129 er in 170.0 ip) and .296 (204-for-689) opponents batting average over the last 20 games after posting a 2.69 ERA and .231 opponents average over the first 16 contests...have a 4.91 ERA (173 er in 317.0 ip) overall, which is second highest in the American League and fifth highest in the majors...are tied for the second most home runs in the AL (46), have the fourth highest opponents batting average (.267) and the fourth most walks (125)...are tied for third in pickoffs (4).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers have tossed fewer than six innings in seven of the last games (37 er in 33.2 ip, 9.89 ERA), including pitching fewer than four innings in four of the past five (28 er in 17.2 ip, 14.26 ERA)...are now 4-13 with an 8.15 ERA (83 er in 91.2 ip) and .319 (122-for-383) opponents batting average over the last 19 games after going 6-5 with a 2.88 ERA and .230 opponents batting average over the first 17 contests...are 10-18 with a 5.44 ERA (114 er in 188.2 ip) overall...the losses and ERA are the worst in the American League...have allowed the second most walks (88) and the third most home runs (30).

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .295 (87-for-295) with 42 runs scored over the past eight games (5.25 runs per game) after hitting .197 with eight runs scored in the previous four games (2.00 runs per game)...are one of three Major League teams that have not been shutout (Colorado, Pittsburgh) and have a streak of 57 consecutive games with one or more runs scored, which is the longest active streak in the majors...have the second lowest on-base percentage in the American League (.300), second fewest walks (88), fourth fewest doubles (49), and fourth lowest slugging percentage (.386)...however, are tied for the sixth most triples (5).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed 11 errors over the last 20 games after making 15 over the first 16 contests...lead the American League and are fourth in the majors in errors (26)...have 11 unearned runs, which are tied for fifth most in the AL...rank third in double plays (38).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-5 on this nine-game road trip to Baltimore (1-2), Boston (0-3) and Tampa Bay (1-0)...this trip concludes a stretch that runs from April 19 to May 15 in which the A's are scheduled to play 19 of their 25 games on the road...went 5-5 on the last road trip to New York (3-0), Toronto (1-2) and Detroit (1-3) and are 10-10 (.500) on the road overall...went 2-4 on the last homestand against Houston (2-1) and Seattle (0-3) and are 5-11 (.313) at home, which is the worst home record in the American League and third worst in the majors...are batting .270 (193-for-716) and are averaging 4.45 runs per game (89 runs in 20 games) on the road compared to .219 (114-for-521) with an average of 3.06 runs per game (49 runs in 16 games) at home...have scored the fewest runs at home in the AL and have the second lowest batting average.

**ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS:** The A's are 5-6 in one-run decisions...are tied for fourth in the American League in one-run games, wins and losses...are 5-2 in games decided in the last at bat...are 2-0 in extra inning games and are tied for second in the AL in extra inning wins...are 3-0 when the game is tied after seven innings and 4-1 when it is tied after eight innings.

**IN THE PINCH:** A's pinch hitters are 4 for their last 14 (.286) after starting the season 0-for-12...rank third in the American League in plate appearances (27) and are tied for fourth in hits (4)...however, have the second worst batting average (.154)...have gone 284 games since their last pinch home run, which is the longest active streak in the majors...the A's last pinch hit home run was by John Jaso on June 22, 2014 against Boston.

**LEFT AND RIGHT:** The A's began the season by facing three consecutive left-handed starting pitchers but have faced righties in 31 of the last 33 games, including each of the last 17...are 14-17 (.452j) in games started by a right-hander, 1-4 (.200) against lefties.

THIS AND THAT: This trip concludes a stretch that runs from April 19 to May 15 where the A's are scheduled to play 19 of 25 games in the Eastern Time Zone...after tomorrow's game at Tampa Bay, the A's will have just two more series in the Eastern Time Zone, both in Ohio (at Cincinnati, June 10-12; at Cleveland, July 29-31)...the A's are 10-6 on Friday, Saturday and Sunday compared to 5-15 from Monday through Thursday...have been successful in 5-of-7 (71.4%) replay challenges...the A's designated hitter has entered the game defensively five times this year...from 1996-2015, the A's had the DH enter the game on defense a total of 11 times...the last time they did it at least five times in a season was 1995 when it happened seven times.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have 10 players on the DL (H. Alvarez, R.J. Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doubront, Fuld, Hendriks, Lowrie, Parker, Sogard)...R.J. Alvarez, Bassitt, Doubront, Parker and Sogard are on the 60-day DL...Henderson Alvarez is on a rehab assignment...have now used the DL 11 times this year...reinstated Danny Valencia from the disabled list on May 6, marking the first time they have reinstated a player from the DL this year...used the DL 23 times last year, which matched the 2010 club for second most in Oakland history...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. RAYS: Won the first game of the season series last night...the A's lost the season series last year as they went 3-4, which marked their first season series loss to the Rays since 2010 when they were 4-5...split a four-game series at Tropicana Field in May and dropped two of three games in Oakland in August...are 11-9 against the Rays since the start of the 2013 season...all-time, the A's are 97-61 against Tampa Bay...are 53-24 in Oakland and 44-37 at Tropicana Field.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

Yonder Alonso, Billy Burns and Danny Valencia have each hit safely in an A's season-high tying eight consecutive games...Alonso is batting .414 (12-for-29) during the streak, Burns is batting .351 (13-for-37) and Valencia is batting .379 (11-for-29)...Ryan Madson has not allowed an earned run in his past 11 games and 10.2 innings (8 h, 1 r, 7 bb, 1 ibb, 7 so)...is a perfect 9-for-9 in save opportunities and the nine saves are tied for fifth most in the American League...Josh Reddick is batting .533 (16-for-30) with five multiple hit-games, six runs scored, five RBI and six walks (.611 on-base percentage) over his past eight games.

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1941 the A's walk 19 times against St. Louis but lose 10-5...in 1988 Bob Welch tosses a five hit shutout as the A's win at Baltimore, 8-0...in 1995 Geronimo Berroa and Terry Steinbach have four RBI each in the A's 12-3 win at Minnesota...the A's hit five home runs, including two by Berroa.

### TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Kendall Graveman (1-4, 5.74 ERA)

LAST THREE, FIRST THREE: Is 0-3 with a 10.54 ERA (16 er in 13.2 ip) and .397 (25-for-63) opponents batting average over his last three starts... has surrendered 25 hits over that span, including a career-high 10 hits April 25 at Detroit and May 2 against Seattle to become the first A's pitcher to allow at least 10 hits in back-to-back starts since Brandon McCarthy (April 16-21, 2012)...went 1-1 with a 2.04 ERA and .159 opponents average over his first three starts and surrendered 10 hits total in each of those outings... allowed four hits or fewer in each of his first three starts, joining John Odom (1969) and Mike Norris (1980) as the only pitchers in Oakland history on an Opening Day roster to allow four hits or fewer while tossing five innings or more in each of their first three starts.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 1-2 with an 8.56 ERA (13 er in 13.2 ip) and .316 (18-for-57) opponents average in three starts on the road compared to 0-2 with a 3.57 ERA (7 er in 17.2 ip) and .246 (17-for-67) opponents batting average in three starts at home...has allowed eight of his nine home runs on the road.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has held left-handed hitters to a .219 (14-for-64) batting average, compared to .339 (21-for-62) against right-handers... however, has issued eight of his 11 walks to lefties...last year, he issued 24 of his 38 walks to lefties...has allowed a .207 (6-for-29) batting average to hitters leading off an inning but has issued four walks for a .324 on-base percentage...opponents are 9-for-64 (.141) with two strikes.

**RUN SUPPORT:** Has received a total of one run of support in three of his six starts and three runs of support in each of his other three...his season run support average is 2.87 (10 rs in 31.3 ip)...last year, he was 1-9 in 13 starts with two runs of support or fewer, 5-0 in eight starts with three runs of support or more...his career numbers are 1-12 in 16 starts with two runs of support or fewer, 6-1 in 11 starts with three runs of support or more.

**THIS AND THAT:** Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 1-2 with a 3.50 ERA (7 er in 18.0 ip) in three starts with six days rest or more, 0-2 with an 8.78 ERA (13 er in 13.1 ip) in three starts on five days rest or fewer... has walked two batters or fewer in four of his six starts this year and 20 of his 27 career starts...is 1-9 with a 5.79 ERA (45 er in 70.0 ip) over his last 14 starts dating back to July 10, 2015...went 6-4 with a 3.20 ERA over the first 18 games, including 13 starts, of his career.

**LOSING STREAK SNAPPED:** Picked up his first win of the season April 20 at New York (AL), which snapped a career-high six-game losing streak dating back to last year...that was the longest losing streak by an A's pitcher since Tyson Ross lost eight straight from May 19 to Sept. 24, 2012... compiled a 5.04 ERA and .267 opponents batting during the streak, which spanned 10 starts from July 10, 2015 to April 12, 2016.

**FIRST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-1 loss to Chicago (AL) April 7 in Oakland...shutout the White Sox on two hits over the first five innings, but Mat Latos blanked the A's on one hit over the first six innings...the scored was tied at 0-0 when he walked Cabrera to lead off the sixth...Abreau followed with a two-run home run and Graveman left after 5.1 innings trailing 2-0.

**SECOND START:** He had a no decision in the A's 5-4 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on April 12 in Oakland...allowed just one run in 6.0 innings and it came in the second inning...walked Pujols to start the inning and Calhoun singled him over to third...Simmons then grounded into a double play and Graveman was relived by Axford to start the seventh with the A's leading 3-1...Oakland built a 4-1 lead before Madson allowed two runs in the eighth and Doolittle surrendered two in the ninth.

**THIRD START:** He was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-2 win at New York (AL) on April 20...it was his first win since July 4, 2015 against Seattle... struck out a career-high eight batters on a career-high tying 111 pitches... allowed a one-out solo home run to Gregorius in the second inning, but that was the only run he would surrender in 6.1 innings of work...struck out in the fifth inning in his first professional at bat.

**FOURTH START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-3 loss at Detroit April 25...allowed a career-high 10 hits, including three home runs...surrendered single runs in each of the first two innings on a Cabrera home run in the first and an Aviles RBI single in the second...then yielded a three-run home run to Cabrera followed by a solo home run by Victory Martinez in the fifth and left after 4.2 innings trailing 6-0.

FIFTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-3 loss to Seattle May 2 in Oakland...allowed a career-high tying 10 hits for the second consecutive start...the A's scored a run in the second inning and he blanked the Mariners on a hit and a walk over the first three innings...then allowed a RBI single to Lind in the fourth and two more runs in the sixth on a Seager

RBI double and an Ianetta RBI single...yielded a one-out double to Aoki in the seventh and was relieved by Rzepczynski who allowed Aoki to score.

**LAST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 11-3 loss at Baltimore last Sunday...allowed six runs in 2.2 innings...yielded a career-high four home runs, which are the most allowed by an A's starting pitcher since May 6, 2013 at Cleveland when Jarrod Parker also allowed four home runs... was relieved by Dull with two outs in the third inning.

2015 RECAP: The rookie right-hander went 6-9 with a 4.05 ERA in 21 starts over two stints with the A's before his season ended in late August due to an oblique injury...was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 1-2 with an 8.27 ERA in four starts before he was optioned to Nashville April 26...was brought back May 23 and went 5-2 with a 1.78 ERA over his first nine starts following his return...then went 0-5 with a 5.82 ERA over his final eight starts beginning July 10...was placed on the 15-day disabled list Aug. 24 with a strained left oblique...tied for fourth among American League rookies in games started (21), ranked fifth in innings pitched (115.2), ninth in strikeouts (77) and tied for ninth in wins...had one of seven complete games by an AL rookie.

RHP Sonny Gray (3-4, 6.00 ERA): Is 0-3 with a 12.79 ERA and .362 opponents batting average over his last three games after going 3-1 with a 2.73 ERA and .232 opponents batting average over his first four starts...is 1-2 with a 9.95 ERA in three starts on the road compared to 2-2 with a 4.10 ERA in four starts at home...however, is 15-8 with a 3.00 ERA in 34 starts on the road over the last three years compared to 16-13 with a 3.32 ERA in 37 starts at home...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 14-7 A's loss at Boston last Monday (3.2 ip, 8 h, 7 r, 7 er, 2 bb, 2 so)...is 2-1 with a 2.81 ERA in five career starts against Tampa Bay (32.0 ip, 29 h, 11 r, 10 er, 9 bb, 21 so, 4 hr, 1 hbp)...went 2-1 with a 5.60 ERA and .311 opponents batting average in four starts during the spring...was named to his first American League All-Star Team last year...went 14-7 with a 2.73 ERA in 31 starts and ranked third in the AL in ERA.

- The A's bullpen has allowed three or more runs in six of its past eight games (33 er in 33.1 ip, 8.91 ERA) after yielding one run or fewer in 22 of its first 28 games (2.46 ERA), including 15 games where it did not allow a run.
- Has allowed 12-of-64 (18.8%) inherited runners to score, which is the second best percentage in the American League (Cleveland, 12.2%).
- Has tossed 128.1 innings, which are the most in the AL and second most in the majors (Arizona, 140.2)...is third in the AL in walks per nine innings (2.59) and in strikeouts per walk (3.30).
- Ranks second in the AL in save percentage (84.6%), third in strikeouts (122), fourth in grounded into double plays (11) and tied for fourth in saves (10)...has recorded just two saves in its last 19 games after having nine saves in its first 17 contests.
