OAKLAND ATHLETICS (15-22) VS. TAMPA BAY RAYS (16-18)

SUNDAY, MAY 15, 2016 — TROPICANA FIELD — 1:10 P.M. EDT RHP SONNY GRAY (3-4, 6.00) VS. LHP MATT MOORE (1-3, 4.83) CSNCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have split the first two games of this series but have lost 10 of their last 12 games overall...on this trip, they were swept by Boston in a three-game series at Fenway Park and dropped the final two games in Baltimore after taking the series opener at Camden Yards...are now 2-10 in May, which is the second worst record in the majors in the month of May... their overall record of 15-22 (.405) ties their low-water mark for the season and is the third worst record in the American League...have lost 15 of the last 20 games after winning a season-high six straight contests from April 16-22...are in fourth place in the AL West and trail first place Seattle by 6 1/2 games...have spent one day in sole possession of first place this year, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 12 days in third, seven days tied for third, five days in fourth and three days tied for fourth.

PITCHING: From May 8-11, the A's had a four-game streak during which they allowed 11+ runs per game...since 1929, only four other Major League teams have allowed at least 11 runs in four or more straight games...the 1929 Phillies did so in six straight games (June 19-22; two doubleheaders) and the 1951 Pirates (May 20-23), 1986 Brewers (Sept. 3-6) and 2007 Astros (July 29-Aug. 2) each did so in four straight games...the A's allowed 51 runs over that four-game stretch, which tied the Oakland record for most runs allowed over a four-game stretch (Aug. 13-16, 1996)...that included 40 runs allowed against Boston at Fenway Park, which is an Oakland record for a three-game series (previous: 38, three times: May 3-5, 1991 vs. Cleveland: Aug. 4-6, 1995 vs. Seattle; July 17-18, 2000 vs. Colorado)... now have a 6.83 ERA (135 er in 178.0 ip) and .294 (212-for-720) opponents batting average over the last 21 games after posting a 2.69 ERA and .231 opponents average over the first 16 contests...have a 4.96 ERA (179 er in 325.0 ip) overall, which is highest in the American League and fourth highest in the majors...are tied for the second most home runs in the AL (47), have the fourth highest opponents batting average (.267) and the fourth most walks (131)...are tied for third in pickoffs (4).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have tossed fewer than six innings in eight of the last nine games (41 er in 39.1 ip, 9.38 ERA), including pitching fewer than four innings in four of the past six (32 er in 23.1 ip, 12.34 ERA)...are now 4-14 with an 8.04 ERA (87 er in 97.1 ip) and .316 (128-for-405) opponents batting average over the last 20 games after going 6-5 with a 2.88 ERA and .230 opponents batting average over the first 17 contests...are 10-19 with a 5.46 ERA (118 er in 194.1 ip) overall...the losses and ERA are the worst in the American League...have allowed the second most walks (91) and the third most home runs (31).

OFFENSE: The A's were shut out last night, breaking a 57-game streak during which they scored at least one run, which was the longest active streak in the majors...were one of three teams that had not yet been shut out this season (Colorado, Pittsburgh)...despite being shut out last night, the A's are batting .276 (89-for-323) with 42 runs scored over the past nine games (4.67 runs per game) after hitting .197 with eight runs scored in the previous four games (2.00 runs per game)...have the lowest on-base percentage in the American League (.296), second fewest walks (88), are tied for the second fewest doubles (49), and have the third lowest slugging percentage (.379)...however, are tied for the sixth most triples (5).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed nine errors over their last 11 games after making just two over their previous eight contests...lead the American League and are fifth in the majors in errors (27)...have 11 unearned runs, which are tied for fifth most in the AL...rank third in double plays (39).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-6 on this nine-game road trip to Baltimore (1-2), Boston (0-3) and Tampa Bay (1-1)...this trip concludes a stretch that runs from April 19 to May 15 in which the A's are scheduled to play 19 of their 25 games on the road...went 5-5 on the last road trip to New York (3-0), Toronto (1-2) and Detroit (1-3) and are 10-11 (.476) on the road overall...went 2-4 on the last homestand against Houston (2-1) and Seattle (0-3) and are 5-11 (.313) at home, which is the worst home record in the American League and third worst in the majors...are batting .262 (195-for-744) and are averaging 4.24 runs per game (89 runs in 21 games) on the road compared to .219 (114-for-521) with an average of 3.06 runs per game (49 runs in 16 games) at home...have scored the fewest runs at home in the AL and have the second lowest batting average.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 5-6 in one-run decisions...are tied for fifth in the American League in one-run games and wins...tied for fourth in losses...are 5-2 in games decided in the last at bat...are 2-0 in extra inning games and are tied for second in the AL in extra inning wins...are 3-0 when the game is tied after seven innings and 4-1 when it is tied after eight innings.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 4 for their last 14 (.286) after starting the season 0-for-12...rank third in the American League in plate appearances (27) and are tied for fourth in hits (4)...however, have the third worst batting average (.154)...have gone 285 games since their last pinch home run, which is the longest active streak in the majors...the A's last pinch hit home run was by John Jaso on June 22, 2014 against Boston.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's began the season by facing three consecutive left-handed starting pitchers but have faced righties in 32 of the last 34 games, including each of the last 18...are 14-18 (.438) in games started by a right-hander, 1-4 (.200) against lefties...are scheduled to face a left-handed starter in each of their next four games.

THIS AND THAT: This trip concludes a stretch that runs from April 19 to May 15 where the A's are scheduled to play 19 of 25 games in the Eastern Time Zone...after today's game, the A's will have just two more series in the Eastern Time Zone, both in Ohio (at Cincinnati, June 10-12; at Cleveland, July 29-31)...the A's are 10-7 on Friday, Saturday and Sunday compared to 5-15 from Monday through Thursday...have been successful in 5-of-7 (71.4%) replay challenges...the A's designated hitter has entered the game defensively five times this year...from 1996-2015, the A's had the DH enter the game on defense a total of 11 times...the last time they did it at least five times in a season was 1995 when it happened seven times.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have 10 players on the DL (H. Alvarez, R.J. Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doubront, Fuld, Hendriks, Lowrie, Parker, Sogard)...R.J. Alvarez, Bassitt, Doubront, Parker and Sogard are on the 60-day DL...Henderson Alvarez is on a rehab assignment...have now used the DL 11 times this year...reinstated Danny Valencia from the disabled list on May 6, marking the first time they have reinstated a player from the DL this year...used the DL 23 times last year, which matched the 2010 club for second most in Oakland history...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one

A's vs. RAYS: The A's and Rays have split the first two games of the season series...the A's lost the season series last year as they went 3-4, which marked their first season series loss to the Rays since 2010 when they were 4-5...split a four-game series at Tropicana Field in May and dropped two of three games in Oakland in August...are 11-10 against the Rays since the start of the 2013 season...all-time, the A's are 97-62 against Tampa Bay...are 53-24 in Oakland and 44-38 at Tropicana Field.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Danny Valencia has hit safely in an A's season-high nine consecutive games...he is batting .375 (12-for-32) during the streak...his seventh-inning single last night was the 500th hit of his career...Ryan Madson has not allowed an earned run in his past 11 games and 10.2 innings (8 h, 1 r, 7 bb, 1 ibb, 7 so)...is a perfect 9-for-9 in save opportunities and the nine saves are tied for fifth most in the American League...Ryan Dull has stranded all 14 of his inherited runners, which are the most in the majors without allowing an inherited runner to score...Josh Reddick is batting .485 (16-for-33) with five multiple hit-games, six runs scored, five RBI and six walks (.564 on-base percentage) over his past nine games.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1958 Ned Garver tosses a seven-hit shutout and Vic Power hits a three-run home run to account for all the offense in a 3-0 Kansas City win over Chicago...in 1985 the A's set what was then a club record for margin of victory when they defeat the Brewers at Milwaukee 19-3... Mike Davis homers twice and drives in six runs and four Athletics collect three hits each.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (3-4, 6.00 ERA)

LAST THREE, FIRST FOUR: Is 0-3 with a 12.79 ERA (18 er in 12.2 ip) and .362 (21-for-58) opponents batting average over his last three starts... the three-game losing streak is one short of his career-high of four (Aug. 1-16, 2014)...went 3-1 with a 2.73 ERA and .232 opponents batting average over his first four starts.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has a .222 (12-for-54) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .283 (15-for-53) the second time and

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-2 with a 4.10 ERA (12 er in 26.1 ip) in four starts at home compared to 1-2 with a 9.95 ERA (14 er in 12.2 ip) in three starts on the road...last year, he went 8-3 with a 2.63 ERA and five home runs in 16 starts on the road compared to 6-4 with a 2.82 ERA and 12 home runs in 15 starts at home...the road ERA was eighth lowest in Oakland history.. it was second lowest over the last 34 years to his mark of 2.51 in 2014...is now 15-8 with a 3.00 ERA (73 er in 219.1 ip) in 34 starts on the road over the last three years compared to 16-13 with a 3.32 ERA (91 er in 246.2 ip)

RUN SUPPORT: Has received no run support twice this year and two runs or fewer four times...is 2-1 in three starts with three runs of support or more compared to 1-3 in four starts with two runs or fewer...last year, he was 12-1 in 20 starts with three runs of support or more compared to 2-6 in 11 starts with two runs or fewer...is now 31-3 in 46 career starts with run support of three or more.

MONTH BY MONTH: Is 0-2 with an 11.81 ERA (14 er in 10.2 ip) in two starts in May after going 3-2 with a 3.81 ERA in five starts in April...is now 10-3 with a 2.53 ERA in 15 career starts in April...the 10 wins are his most in any month...is a combined 14-7 with a 2.60 ERA (60 er in 187.0 ip) in 29 career starts from the start of the season through May 31.

FIRST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 2-1 victory over Chicago (AL) April 6 in Oakland, the A's third game of the season...was scratched from his scheduled Opening Day start April 4 due to food poisoning...allowed his only run in the third inning when Jackson led off with a double, went to third on an Eaton ground out and scored on a Rollins sacrifice fly...left after seven innings with a 2-1 lead

SECOND START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-1 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on April 11 in Oakland...tossed 6.1 innings to go over the 500 innings pitched mark in his career...shut out the Angels on two hits and two walks over the first five innings but Tropeano blanked the A's on six hits and two walks in five innings...allowed three runs in the sixth inning on a Nava RBI single and a Trout two-run home run.

THIRD START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-3 win over Kansas City April 16 in Oakland...allowed a RBI single to Cain in the top of the first but the A's came back with three in the bottom of the first to give him the lead for good...also yielded a RBI single to Fuentes in the fourth inning.

FOURTH START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's 8-5 win at Toronto April 22...struck out five of the first six batters he faced and had a 4-0 lead when he allowed a solo home run to Barney in the third inning. the A's increased their lead to 6-1 before he allowed a Bautista sacrifice fly in the sixth and a Barney RBI single in the seventh.

FIFTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-4 loss at Detroit April 27...tossed 65 pitches in 2.0 innings...matched the shortest outing of his career and it was his shortest outing as a starter (pitched 2.0 innings in his first two career outings, both in relief)...allowed four runs in the second inning...Castellanos tripled to lead off the inning and scored on a Gose fielders choice...J.D. Martinez hit a three-run home run later in the inning.

SIXTH START: He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 8-2 loss to Seattle May 3 in Oakland...matched his career highs by allowing seven runs on 11 hits...allowed a two-run home run to Martin in the third and a solo home run by Cano to start the fourth...a RBI single by Marte in the seventh inning increased the Mariners lead to 4-1 and Lind added a RBI single in the eighth...was relieved by Rzepczynski with runners on first and second and no outs in the eighth and he allowed a three-run home run to

LAST START: He lost his third straight start in the A's 14-7 loss at Boston last Monday...allowed a career-high tying seven runs for the second consecutive start...allowed a run in the second inning when Shaw scored on a wild pitch...then yielded six runs in the fourth inning...allowed a RBI double to Shaw, two-run single to Bradley Jr., RBI double to Betts and RBI single to Pedroia...was relieved with two outs and two runners on by Rodriguez, who allowed one of the runs to score.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Sean Manaea (0-1, 11.37 ERA): Was selected from Triple-A Nashville April 29 and is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season and his career...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 13-5 A's loss in Boston last Tuesday (2.2 ip, 10 h, 8 r, 8 er, 1 so, 2 hr)...has not faced Texas in his career...was 2-0 with a 1.50 ERA in three starts with Triple-A Nashville... allowed just one run in each of his starts...allowed a .232 opponents batting average, including .077 against left-handed hitters compared to .268 against right-handers...was 1-1 with a 4.40 ERA in five games, three starts, with the A's this spring...is 16-9 with a 2.82 ERA in 42 games, all starts, in three professional seasons...has 257 strikeouts in 214.0 innings, an average of 10.81 per nine innings...was originally drafted by Kansas City as a Competitive Balance pick following the first round of the 2013 draft and was dealt to the A's just prior to the 2015 trading deadline.
