### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (16-22) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (22-16)

MONDAY, MAY 16, 2016 — OAKLAND ALAMEDA COLISEUM — 7:05 P.M. PDT LHP SEAN MANAEA (0-1, 11.37) VS. LHP DEREK HOLLAND (3-2, 6.09) CSNCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME) — EN ESPAÑOL (KIQI 1010 AM)

ABOUT THE A'S: Won two of three at Tampa Bay over the weekend to snap a season-high five-game losing streak...are now 3-10 (.231) in the month of May after going 13-12 (.520) in April...have the second worst record in the majors in May (Detroit, 3-11)...went 11-19 (.367) in May last year...are now 16-22 (.421) for the season, which is the third worst record in the American League...are in fourth place in the AL West for the second consecutive day and trail first place Texas by six games...have spent one day in sole possession of first place this year, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 12 days in third, seven days tied for third, six days in fourth and three days tied for fourth.

**LEFT AND RIGHT:** The A's began the season by facing three consecutive left-handed starting pitchers but then faced righties in 32 of the next 34 games through Saturday...yesterday's game against Matt Moore marked the first time the A's faced a left-handed starter since April 23 at Toronto (J.A. Happ)...are scheduled to faced lefties in all three games of this series...are 2-4 (.333) in games started by a left-handed pitcher compared to 14-18 (.438) against righties...the A's six games against left-handed starters are tied for second fewest in the American League.

**PITCHING:** The A's have yielded 66 runs over the last seven games (9.43 runs per game)...have a 9.62 ERA (62 er in 58.0 ip) and .315 (79-for-251) opponents batting average over that span and have surrendered 18 home runs...now have a 7.54 ERA (93 er in 111.0 ip) in the month of May, which is the highest mark in the majors by more than a run (Minnesota, 6.44)... lead the majors in May home runs (26) and rank second to Texas in the American League in May walks (Tex 60, Oak 63)...now have a 4.90 ERA for the season, which is the highest in the AL and fourth highest in the majors...have the second highest opponents on-base percentage (.337) and fourth highest batting average (.265) and slugging percentage (.441)...are tied with Texas for the AL lead in home runs (50) and have issued the fourth most walks (133).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have tossed fewer than four innings in four of the last seven games and fewer than six innings in nine of the last 10...the season high is 7.0 innings (six times) and the A's are the only Major League team that has not had a starter pitch more than seven innings...the last A's starter to pitch more than 7.0 innings is Sonny Gray on Aug. 22, 2015 (8.0)...have a streak of 76 consecutive games with seven or fewer innings by the starting pitcher, which is one short of the longest such streak in Oakland history (77, July 18, 2008-April 18, 2009)...starters are 4-14 with a 7.86 ERA (90 er in 103.0 ip) and .312 (134-for-429) opponents batting average over the last 21 games...that includes 3-1 with a 2.19 ERA (6 er in 24.2 ip) in four starts by Rich Hill and 1-13 with a 9.65 ERA (84 er in 78.1 ip) by everyone else...are 10-19 with a 5.45 ERA (121 er in 200.0 ip) for the season...have the second most losses and the second highest ERA in the majors to Milwaukee (20 losses, 5.83 ERA)...rank second in the American League in most home runs (34) and most walks (93).

**OFFENSE:** The A's hit four home runs yesterday after tallying four on Friday...hit eight home runs against Tampa Bay, which were the A's most in a three-game series since hitting nine against Boston, Aug. 31-Sept. 2, 2012...had hit just six home runs over the previous 11 games...are batting .280 (101-for-361) with 49 runs scored over the last 10 games (4.90 runs per game)...however, have lost seven of those 10 contests and have been outscored 84-49...for the season, the A's have the second lowest on-base percentage (.297) and second fewest walks (90) in the American League...are tied for third fewest doubles (51) and have the fourth fewest strikeouts (263).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed 10 errors over their last 12 games after making just two over their previous eight contests...lead the American League and are tied for fourth in the majors in errors (28)...have 14 unearned runs, which are tied for second most in the AL...are tied for third in the AL in double plays (39).

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's begin a seven-game homestand tonight against Texas (three games) and New York-AL (four games)...this homestand begins a stretch where the A's will play 13 of 16 games at home... will play all 16 of those games in the Pacific Time Zone as the three road games are at Seattle...went 2-4 on the last homestand against Houston (2-1) and Seattle (0-3) and are 5-11 (.313) at home, which is the worst home record in the American League and third worst in the majors...it matches the worst record after 16 home games in Oakland history (1968, 1994, 2001, 2015)...the 1994 and 2015 clubs fell to 5-12...currently have a four-

game home losing streak...have a streak of 40 consecutive home series of three or more games without a sweep, which is the longest such streak in Oakland history (previous: 35, May 13, 1983-Aug. 1, 1984)...have not swept a series of three or more games in the Coliseum since July 3-6, 2014 against Toronto (four games)...went 3-6 on the last road trip to Baltimore (1-2), Boston (0-3) and Tampa Bay (2-1) to conclude a stretch where they played 19 of 25 games on the road...are 11-11 (.500) on the road...are batting .265 (207-for-782) and are averaging 4.36 runs per game (96 runs in 22 games) on the road compared to .219 (114-for-521) with an average of 3.06 runs per game (49 runs in 16 games) at home...have scored the fewest runs at home in the AL and have the third lowest batting average.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's defeated Tampa Bay 7-6 yesterday for their first one-run win since April 19...are now 6-6 in one-run games...are tied for third in the American League in one-run wins and tied for fourth in games...won for the first time when trailing after eight innings and improved to 6-2 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied with Tampa Bay and Baltimore for the second most last at bat wins in the majors (Seattle, 7)...are 2-0 in extra inning games and are tied for second in the AL in extra inning wins...are 3-0 when the game is tied after seven innings and 4-1 when it is tied after eight innings.

**IN THE PINCH:** Yesterday, Chris Coghlan hit the A's first pinch home run since June 22, 2014 against Boston (John Jaso)...it snapped a streak of 285 consecutive without a pinch home run, which was the longest active streak in the majors...A's pinch hitters are 6 for their last 16 (.375) after starting the season 0-for-12...rank third in the American League in hits (6) and plate appearances (29).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 0-5 on Monday and are one of three American League teams that are winless on Monday (CLE, KC)...are 5-15 from Monday through Thursday compared to 11-7 on Friday, Saturday and Sunday...the A's designated hitter entered the game defensively for the sixth time this year yesterday...from 1996-2015, the A's had the DH enter the game on defense a total of 11 times...the last time they did it at least six times in a season was 1995 when it happened seven times...have been successful in 5-of-7 (71.4%) replay challenges, which is the best percentage in the majors...the seven challenges are tied for fifth fewest in the majors

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have 10 players on the disabled list (H. Alvarez, R.J. Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doubront, Fuld, Hendriks, Lowrie, Parker, Sogard)...R.J. Alvarez, Bassitt, Doubront, Fuld, Parker and Sogard are on the 60-day DL...Henderson Alvarez is on a rehab assignment... have now used the DL 11 times this year...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's and Rangers are meeting for the first time this year...the only American League teams the A's have not faced are Cleveland and Minnesota...the A's won the series last year for the third time in the last four years...went 10-9, including 6-3 in Texas and 4-6 in Oakland... are 40-36 against Texas over the previous four years...are 332-343 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 173-164 in Oakland and 159-179 in Texas...have an all-time record of 429-425 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Ryan Madson** is a perfect 10-for-10 in save opportunities and is tied for third in the AL in saves... **Danny Valencia** had 27th three-homer game in Athletics history yesterday, the second by a third baseman (Pinky Higgins, 1935)...has a 10-game hitting streak dating back to April 16 (15-for-37, .405), which is one short of his career high (11, July 18-27, 2011).

### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1939 the first American League night game is played at Shibe Park but the A's lose to Cleveland 8-3 in 10 innings...in 1975 Vida Blue becomes the second Oakland Athletic to win 100 games as he fires a seven-hitter at Yankee Stadium in the A's 4-2 win...in 1986 Tony Phillips hits for the cycle in the A's 8-4 win at Baltimore...he has five hits, scores two runs and drives in four...it is the first cycle in Oakland history...in 1990 Jose Canseco, Mark McGwire and Ron Hassey hit consecutive homers in the fourth inning of the A's 7-6 win at Cleveland.

### TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (0-1, 11.37 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was selected from Triple-A Nashville April 29 and is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season and his career...allowed eight runs in his last start after surrendering four runs in each of his first two starts...is the second pitcher in Oakland history to allow at least four runs in each of his first three Major League appearances...the other is Vida Blue (July 20-Aug. 3, 1969)...the last A's pitcher with a longer streak is Fred Caligiuri, who had a four-game career-opening streak from Sept. 3-21, 1941.

FIRST START: He had a no decision in his Major League debut, a 7-4 A's win over Houston April 29 in Oakland...had just 42 minor league appearances, all starts, in three professional seasons...became the 45th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut, the first since Dan Straily on Aug. 3, 2012 against Toronto...allowed a leadoff home run to Gattis in the second inning but the A's came back with two in the bottom of the second... allowed a RBI single to Gattis in the sixth to tie the game and was relieved by Doolittle with no outs and runners on first and second...Doolittle allowed both runs to score but the A's tied the game in the eighth and won it on a three-run home run by Alonso in the ninth.

SECOND START: He had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 9-8 loss to Seattle in Oakland on May 4...shutout the Mariners on two hits and a walk over the first four innings and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed four runs in the fifth inning...Marte had a RBI double, Cano a RBI sngle and Cruz a two-run home run...the A's then scored six times in the bottom of the fifth to give him an 8-4 lead but the bullpen allowed two runs in the sixth inning and three more in the seventh for the blown save (Axford).

LAST START: He had the first decision of his career, a loss in the A's 13-5 loss at Boston last Tuesday...allowed a lead-off home run to Betts in the first inning and Ramirez added a two-run homer...retired the side in order in the second but then allowed five runs in the third inning while recording just two outs...Pedroia had a RBI double, Bogaerts and Young had RBI singles and Shaw chased him from the game with a two-run double.

## TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Eric Surkamp (0-3, 6.35 ERA): Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville last Wednesday for his second stint with the A's this year...started that night at Boston and was the losing pitcher in the A's 13-3 loss (2.2 ip, 4 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 3 so)...went 0-2 with a 5.59 ERA in four starts during his first stint with the A's from April 8 to 24...has a .237 opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .357 after that...has made one career appearance against Texas and it came in relief on Aug. 5, 2014 at U.S. Cellular Field while pitching for the White Sox (1.0 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 0 so)...began the season at Nashville but did not pitch prior to his first promotion to Oakland...went 1-1 with a 2.25 ERA in two starts following his option...struck out 16 batters in 12.0 innings...went 2-1 with a 3.60 ERA in six games, including two starts, this spring...combined at Triple-A last year to post a 12-3 record and a 3.39 ERA in 27 games, including 16 starts.
