WINS AND LOSSES: Texas recorded a 7-6 come-from-behind win yesterday vs. Toronto...club has won 2 straight, 4 of 5, 7 of 9, and 12 of last 18 G beginning 4/26...team has gone 12-10 since 4/22 after opening the year with a 10-6 mark... Rangers finished 4-2 on a 6-game homestand against Chicago-AL (2-1) and Toronto (2-1)...at 22-16, Texas has 4th-best overall record in the A.L. (.579)...are a season-high 6 games over .500 for the 1st time in '16...team was 16-22 after 38 G last year and this is best record at this point since 2013 (24-14)...club has won a season-best 4 straight games twice (4/16-21; 4/26-30), separated by a season-long 4-game losing skid, 4/22-25...since 5/1/15, Rangers have best record and most wins in A.L. (103-76, .575).

BACK IN FIRST: With back-to-back wins and the Mariners getting swept at home by the Angels, Texas moved past Seattle and now leads the A.L. West by a half-game...marks 1st time atop the division since 5/2, as team had been in 2nd place for 12 straight days...could match season best and increase lead to a full game over idle Seattle with a victory tonight...Texas also held at least a share of 1st place for 16 of 19 days from 4/11-5/2...team has had at least a share of 1st place for 22 days this season, including sole possession of the division lead for 15 different days...already have more days in 1st place this season than last year (21) in division title run.

SERIES STUFF: Rangers are 8-3-1 in series this season overall, winning 3 straight and 5 of last 6...win in yesterday's rubber game snapped span of 7 straight reg. season series losses to TOR, and marked 3rd time in 2016 to take a series after dropping an opener...Rangers are one of 5 ML clubs with at least 8 series wins, joining CHC (9-2-1), BAL (8-3-1), SEA (8-3-1), and PHI (8-4-0)...club has gone 2-2-1 in road series, winning last one 5/6-8 at DET but losing 2 of last 3... team is 6-1-0 in series in Arlington, winning 6 straight, longest such span since Aug. 10-Sept. 16, 2012 (also 6).

ON ROAD: Texas begins a 6-game, 7-day road trip to OAK (3 G) and HOU (3 G) tonight...has won 3 straight and 4 of last 7 road games, but has dropped 7 of 11 after opening with a 4-2 away record...team's .471 (8-9) road winning pct. ranks T9th in the A.L...of team's 9 road defeats in '16, 6 have been one or 2-run losses.

VS. OAKLAND / A.L. WEST: This series marks 1st of 19 meetings with the A's this season, last A.L. West opponent that Texas has yet to face, as both series between clubs before the All-Star break take place here at the Coliseum (other 6/13-16 - 4 G)...A's visit Arlington for a series in each of season's final 3 months...Texas was 9-10 vs. A's in 2015, as season series has been decided by a 10-9 margin in each of the last 3 years...Rangers have won 4 straight and 5 of 6... have gone 13-6 at Coliseum since start of '14, 18-10 since start of '13...Texas leads all-time series, 343-332, and A's have 173-164 edge here at the Coliseum

• This road trip begins a stretch of 9 straight vs. A.L. West opponents, 1st such games since 4/29-5/1 vs. LAA...Rangers are 10-6 vs. the West, winning 5 of 6 and 10 of last 13.

LATE DECISIONS: Matt Bush recorded his 1st ML victory yesterday in relief, as the Texas rotation now has just 3 decisions in the team's 1st 14 games in May...Rangers starters' 19 decisions in 2016 (13-6) are tied with CIN for fewest in MLB, and is lowest total in club history after 38 games (previously 20 in 2010)...Texas bullpen, however, ranks among majors' top 5 in both relief wins (T2nd, 9) and losses (4th, 10).

EARLY WIN: Matt Bush earned a relief win in his 2nd career outing, just 10th reliever in Rangers history to post a win within his 1st 2 games and the 1st since Seth Rosin in his 2nd appearance on 4/2/14 vs. PHI...Bush joins fellow rookie Tony Barnette as Rangers to record their 1st ML wins in '16...Bush has retired 7 of 8 BF over his 1st 2 ML outings, lone baserunner coming on a hit by pitch yesterday.

COMEBACKS OF LATE: The Rangers overcame a pair of 3-run deficits yesterday for a 12th come-from-behind victory, T2nd-most in MLB (BAL-13, SF-12)...5 of team's last 6 wins have been of the come-from-behind variety.

• Yesterday was Rangers' 6th win decided in the 7th inning-or-later, with 4 of team's last 5 victories coming in that fashion.

DESMOND DELIVERS: Ian Desmond's 2-out, 3-R HR in the 7th yesterday turned a 6-4 deficit into a 7-6 lead, providing the final margin in club's series-clinching victory...the only other time since 2008 that a Ranger has hit a go-ahead HR in the 7th-or-later with the club trailing by multiple runs was by David Murphy, a grand slam in the 7th on 6/11/08 at KC to turn a 5-3 deficit into a 7-5 lead.

• Since 4/19, Desmond has a .340/.406/.628/1.033 slash line with 5 HR, 10 2B, and 22 RBI...he ranks among A.L. leaders in that span in 2B (T4th), RBI (5th), SLG (5th), and OPS (6th).

YOU COULD WRECK IT WITH AN UNEXPECTED BLOW: Desmond's homer yesterday was the Rangers' 2nd go-ahead blast of the homestand with the team trailing in the 7th-or-later (also Ryan Rua in 8th on Tues. vs. CWS)...there have been just 13 HR's of that kind in MLB in 2016, and the only other clubs with more than one are TB and LAA (2 each)... Texas had just one HR of that kind in the previous 3 seasons combined from 2013-15 (Andrus on 6/12/15 vs. MIN), and only time with more than one in a season (let alone a homestand) since 2010 was when Josh Hamilton hit a pair in 2012.

ADRIAN BELTRE hit a solo HR yesterday for career RBI no. 1493, T55th all-time (see chart at left) and just 7 shy of 1500...needs just 3 RBI to tie Vladimir Guerrero for 5th-most in history by players born in the Dominican Republic.

IN THE CLUTCH: Texas batters went 3-for-7 with RISP yesterday and continue to lead MLB with a .310 (97-313) average on the season with RISP...over last 5 G (4-1 in that span), club has a .359 (14-39) avg. w/ RISP.

OFFENSE AT CATCHER: After Bryan Holaday's RBI double and walk yesterday, Texas catchers have produced a slash line of .260/.329/.488/.817 in 2016, highest OPS and 2nd-highest SLG among any position on team (.497 SLG at 2B)...the .488 SLG ranks 2nd in MLB (ARI-.575), as catchers also sit among ML leaders in RBI (3rd, 23) and HR (T4th, 6).

IT TAKES A THIEF: With a steal by Rua yesterday, Rangers have now been successful in 12 straight steal attempts since Odor was caught on 5/1 vs. LAA...club's steal pct. is 75.8% (25-for-33), 4th-best in A.L., successful on 19-of-last-21... Rangers' 14 steals in May rank 2nd in ML (HOU-15).

LEFTY-PALOOZA: From Sunday thru Wednesday, Texas is scheduled to start 4 consecutive left-handed pitchers, which would match longest such span in club history...according to STATS LLC, only time Rangers have started 4 straight LHP came in 1973: Aug. 26 (DH at CLE)-27-28 (at BAL)...starters in those 4: Jim Merritt, Mike Paul, David Clyde, Charlie Hudson. • The Rangers and A's are both slated to start all lefties in the club's 3-game series this week...STATS Inc. says there have been just 3 series of 3+ games since 1990 to feature all left-handed starting pitchers (all 3-G sets): 7/24-26/09 CLE at SEA; 6/26-28/09 PHI at TOR; and 6/4-6/90 PHI at STL...Cole Hamels also pitched in the '09 Phillies series.

SHORTS: Birthday wishes to pitching coach Doug Brocail (49) and voice of the Rangers Eric Nadel...games for Mon. and Wed. in this series are both secondary MLB Network games...markets that are blacked out for the primary game will see Rangers/A's on those 2 days...Texas is 5-5 vs. LH starters in '16, winning 3 of last 4...Rangers are 9-0 in games with multiple HR...8 of club's 19 road HR came in last away series from 5/6-8 at DET...Rangers' 17 go-ahead HR are T6th in MLB (21-SEA; 18-ARI, BAL, HOU, NYM).

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER

#45 Derek Holland, LHP
(3-2, 6.09)

TONIGHT: The 29-year-old left-hander is scheduled to make his 8th start (5th road start) of the season tonight in the series and road trip opener in Oakland... will be working on 5-days rest for the 2nd time this season (4/30 vs. LAA) after receiving the no-decision in Tuesday's rain-delayed 13-11 win against the White Sox...is the 1st Rangers starter to complete 2.2 innings-or-fewer in consecutive starts since Brandon McCarthy, 4/15-20/07...tied with HOU's Dallas Keuchel for T3rd-most earned runs in May with 15 behind only OAK's Sonny Gray's 17 and LAA's Jered Weaver's 16...is 3-0, 1.99 (5 ER/22.2 IP) in 4 starts against the A.L. West this season...had a 2.48 ERA (8 ER/29.0 IP) through 1st 5 starts before 15 earned runs in his last 2 starts increased season ERA to 6.09...has made 22 starts for Texas since returning from the DL in Sept. 2014, going 9-5, 4.23 (61 ER/129.2 IP) in those games.

LAST START: Received the no-decision in Tuesday's rain-delayed 13-11 win against Chicago-AL (2.1 IP, 8 H, 5 R, 4 ER, BB, 2 SO, 64 pitches/45 strikes)...it was his shortest non-injury related start since 5/30/12 vs. SEA (1.2 IP)...allowed one run over his first 2 innings, but surrendered 4 runs in the 3rd inning when he returned to the mound following a one hour and 18 minute rain delay...was on the mound warming up for his 3rd inning of work when the heavy rains and wind arrived...the Rangers trailed 11-5 before a 7-run 8th inning aided by a go-ahead, 3-run HR by Ryan Rua that helped Texas defeat Chicago-AL, 13-11.

VS. THE ATHLETICS/AT THE COLISEUM: Is 5-4, 3.26 (32 ER, 88.1 IP) in 18 G/13 GS in career vs. Oakland — his lowest ERA against any A.L. West opponent...is on a 2-game skid in his last 4 starts against Oakland, and has not faced the A's since 9/28/14 in Arlington out of the bullpen (2.2 IP, 3 H, 2 R, 1 ER, BB, SO, 49 pitches/28 strikes) in the Rangers' 4-0 loss...his last start against the Athletics was 9/17/14 at Oakland in the Rangers' 6-1 win (6.1 IP, 4 H, 1 R-ER, 3 BB, 5 SO, 112 pitches/72 strikes).
• Owns a 3-3, 2.95 (19 ER/58.0 IP) in 11 career appearances (9 starts) at The Coliseum with 41 SO/26 BB.

ON THE ROAD: Is 1-2, 7.40 (17 ER/20.2 IP) in 4 road starts with 12 SO/10 BB, and has lost his last 2 with his last start on the road coming on 5/5 at Toronto (2.2 IP, 11 H, 11 R-ER, 3 BB, 0 K, 1 HR, 75 pitches/44 strikes)...is 26-22, 3.99 (199 ER/449.1 IP) in 79 career road appearances (69 starts).

2016: Opponents are batting .389 (14-36) with RISP, after going 10-for-16 in last 2 outings...batters leading off an inning are 7-for-33 (.212) w/ 3 BB...opponent average by PA: .279 (17-61) in 1st PA; .346 (18-52) in 2nd PA; .222 (6-27) in 3rd PA...ERA by catcher: Nicholas (2.60 in 3 GS), Holaday (11.57 ERA in 3 GS), and Chirinos (5.40 in one GS)...is averaging 18.7 pitches per inning, highest among Texas starters, and highest in ML if he qualified...has fanned 13.1% of batters over 6 points lower than his career figure of 19.2%...opponents have swung and missed on 16.7% of swings, lowest among Texas starters...allowed 3 runs-or-less and pitched 5.0+ innings in each of his first 5 starts, joining A.J. Griffin (also 5) as 1st Rangers in season-opening rotation to pull the trick in at least 1st 5 starts since Yu Darvish (5) in 2013...also allowed 5 hits-or-less in each of his first 5 starts, longest streak by a member of the season-opening rotation since Neftali Feliz (7) in 2012.

TOUGH ON LEFTIES: Over his last 30 G/29 GS in the regular season beginning 8/27/13, has allowed just one HR in 125 PA's against left-handed batters: a Robinson Cano 3-R HR on 9/20/15 vs. SEA in Arlington...left-handed batters are 6-for-24 (.250) against Holland this season.

SUPPORT SYSTEM: Since entering the league in 2009, Holland has the 2nd-highest run support average among all qualifiers at 5.64 (COL's Jorge De La Rosa - 5.78)...Holland is 49-3, 3.27 ERA (159 ER/437.0 IP) in 67 career starts when he is supported by more than 3 runs...is 7-38, 5.42 (263 ER/436.1 IP) in the other 78 starts...has won all 3 starts in 2016 in which he's received more than 3 runs (4/12 at SEA, 4/19 vs. HOU, 4/30 vs. LAA).

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks among the Rangers' all-time career pitching leaders in shutouts (T5th, 8), strikeouts (7th, 743), starts (9th, 145), and wins (10th, 58)...his 2 K's on 4/10 vs. CWS passed Kevin Brown (742) for 7th place in club history behind 6th-place Colby Lewis (892)...only LHP in team history with more victories are Rogers (133) and Darren Oliver (60).

CAREER: Seeking his 1st full season since 2013, as his only 1st 'half' outing in 2014-15 was the '15 home opener on 4/10/15 vs. HOU (1.0 IP before leaving with subscapular strain in left shoulder)...despite limited action in 2014-15, Holland ranks among the club's all-time top 10 list for shutouts, strikeouts, and wins...signed a five-year contract extension through 2016 with two club options for 2017 and 2018 on March 20, 2012...is in his 9th professional season.

2015: Missed over 4 months after suffering an injury while warming up for his 1st start of the year, and went 4-3 with a 4.91 ERA (32 ER/58.2 IP) in 10 games/starts...started Game 4 of the Division Series vs. Toronto at Globe Life Park.

INJURY / REHAB: Was on 60-day DL from 4/11-8/18 last season with a subscapular strain in left shoulder, an injury suffered when he threw his final warmup pitch as the club's home opener was set to begin on 4/10 vs. HOU...had been healthy at end of spring...made it through the 1st inning of that start despite diminished velocity and a visit from the trainer...had several scans to evaluate the status of his injury before increasing the intensity of his rehab work...went 0-1 with a 6.00 ERA (8 ER/12.0 IP) over 4 rehab starts with Round Rock (3) and Double-A Frisco (1) beginning 7/30.
