OAKLAND ATHLETICS (17-22) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (22-17)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won two straight and three of the last four games after losing a season-high five consecutive games from May 7-11...are now 4-10 (.286) in the month of May after going 13-12 (.520) in April...have the third worst record in the American League in May and the fourth worst record for the season (17-22, .436)...are in fourth place in the AL West for the third consecutive day and trail first place Seattle and Texas by five games...have spent one day in sole possession of first place this year, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 12 days in third, seven days tied for third, seven days in fourth and three days tied for fourth.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are scheduled to face a left-handed starting pitcher for the third consecutive game today...began the season by facing three consecutive left-handed starting pitchers but then faced righties in 32 of the next 34 games...are also scheduled to face a lefty tomorrow and Friday...are 3-4 (.429) in games started by a left-handed pitcher compared to 14-18 (.438) against righties...the A's seven games against left-handed starters are tied for third fewest in the American League.

PITCHING: The A's have yielded 67 runs over the last eight games (8.38 runs per game)...have an 8.46 ERA (63 er in 67.0 ip) and .295 (83-for-281) opponents batting average over that span and have surrendered 18 home runs...now have a 7.05 ERA (94 er in 120.0 ip) in the month of May, which is the highest mark in the majors (Minnesota, 6.79)...lead the majors in May home runs (26) and rank second to Texas in the American League in May walks (Tex 62, Oak 55)...now have a 4.80 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the AL...have the fourth highest opponents on-base percentage (.334)...are tied for the second most home runs (50) and have issued the fourth most walks (135).

STARTING PITCHING: The A's are the only Major League team that has not had a starter pitch more than seven innings...the last A's starter to pitch more than 7.0 innings is Sonny Gray on Aug. 22, 2015 (8.0 ip)...have a streak of 77 consecutive games with seven or fewer innings by the starting pitcher, which matches the longest such streak in Athletics history (77, July 18, 2008-April 18, 2009)...starters are 5-14 with a 7.47 ERA (91 er in 109.2 ip) and .305 (138-for-452) opponents batting average over the last 22 games...that includes 3-1 with a 2.19 ERA (6 er in 24.2 ip) in four starts by Rich Hill and 2-13 with a 9.00 ERA (85 er in 85.0 ip) by everyone else...are 11-19 with a 5.31 ERA (122 er in 206.2 ip) for the season...have the second most losses and the second highest ERA in the majors to Milwaukee (20 losses, 5.83 ERA)...rank second in the American League in most walks (94) and third in most home runs (34).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .272 (105-for-386) with 52 runs scored over the last 11 games (4.73 runs per game)...however, have lost seven of those 11 contests and have been outscored 85-52...have hit nine home runs in the last four games after hitting just six home runs over the previous 11 contests...have a .296 on-base percentage, which is the lowest mark in the American League and fourth lowest in the majors...have the second fewest walks (92) and doubles (51) in the AL and the fourth fewest strikeouts (265) and extra base hits (98).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 28 errors, which is the most in the American League and tied for fourth most in the majors in errors...have 14 unearned runs, which are tied for second most in the AL...rank fourth in the AL in double plays (39)...A's outfielders have five assists, which is tied for third fewest in the AL.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-0 on this seven-game homestand against Texas (1-0) and New York-AL (four games)...this homestand begins a stretch where the A's will play 13 of 16 games at home...will play all 16 of those games in the Pacific Time Zone as the three road games are at Seattle...went 2-4 on the last homestand against Houston (2-1) and Seattle (0-3) and are 6-11 (.353) at home, which is the second worst home record in the American League (Los Angeles, 6-12)...it matches the third worst record after 17 home games in Oakland history (were 5-12 in 1994 and 2015)...have a streak of 40 consecutive home series of three or more games without a sweep, which is the longest such streak in Oakland history (previous: 35, May 13, 1983-Aug. 1, 1984)...have not swept a series of three or more games in the Coliseum since July 3-6, 2014 against To-

ronto (four games)...went 3-6 on the last road trip to Baltimore (1-2), Boston (0-3) and Tampa Bay (2-1) to conclude a stretch where they played 19 of 25 games on the road...are 11-11 (.500) on the road...are batting .265 (207-for-782) and are averaging 4.36 runs per game (96 runs in 22 games) on the road compared to .216 (118-for-546) with an average of 3.06 runs per game (52 runs in 17 games) at home...have scored the fewest runs at home in the AL and have the second lowest batting average (Tampa Bay, .213).

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's defeated Tampa Bay 7-6 on Sunday for their first one-run win since April 19...are now 6-6 in one-run games...are tied for third in the American League in one-run wins and tied for fourth in games...won for the first time when trailing after eight innings Sunday and improved to 6-2 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied with Tampa Bay and Baltimore for the second most last at bat wins in the majors (Seattle, 7)...are 2-0 in extra inning games and are tied for second in the AL in extra inning wins...are 3-0 when the game is tied after seven innings and 4-1 when it is tied after eight innings.

IN THE PINCH: On Sunday, Chris Coghlan hit the A's first pinch home run since June 22, 2014 against Boston (John Jaso)...it snapped a streak of 285 consecutive without a pinch home run, which was the longest active streak in the majors...A's pinch hitters are 6 for their last 16 (.375) after starting the season 0-for-12...rank third in the American League in hits (6) and plate appearances (29).

THIS AND THAT: The A's have been successful in 5-of-7 (71.4%) replay challenges, which is the best percentage in the majors...the seven challenges are tied for fourth fewest in the majors...are one of seven teams in the majors averaging under three hours a game (2:59)...are 6-15 from Monday through Thursday compared to 11-7 on Friday, Saturday and Sunday...the A's designated hitter entered the game defensively for the sixth time this year Sunday...from 1996-2015, the A's had the DH enter the game on defense a total of 11 times...the last time they did it at least six times in a season was 1995 when it happened seven times.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's added Josh Phegley to the disabled list today and now have 11 players on the DL (H. Alvarez, R.J. Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doubront, Fuld, Hendriks, Lowrie, Parker, Phegley, Sogard)...that matches the most players the A's have had on the DL at one time since at least 1989...R.J. Alvarez, Bassitt, Doubront, Fuld, Parker and Sogard are on the 60-day DL...have now used the DL 12 times this year...have had at least six players on the DL all year and at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's won the first meeting of 2016 last night after winning the season series last year for the third time in the last four years...went 10-9 in 2015, including 6-3 in Texas and 4-6 in Oakland...are 41-36 against Texas over the last five years...are 333-343 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 174-164 in Oakland and 159-179 in Texas...have an all-time record of 430-425 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Billy Burns has hit safely in each of his last nine games against Texas (13-for-38, .342)...**Ryan Madson** is a perfect 11-for-11 in save opportunities and is tied for the American League lead in saves...currently has an 11.2-inning scoreless streak, which is an A's season high...**Josh Reddick** is batting .383 (31-for-81) over his last 22 games after hitting .218 over his first 16 contests...**Marcus Semien** leads the majors in home runs while batting ninth in the order (9) and home runs in the seventh inning or later (7), ranks second in home runs by a shortstop (10) and tied for third in home runs with two strikes (5).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1959** Bob Grim pitches a two-hit shutout and Dick Williams drives in three runs as the A's defeat the Yankees in the second game of a doubleheader, 10-0...in **1963** Ted Bowsfield tosses a three-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win at Boston...in **1996** Jason Giambi homers off Boston's Tim Wakefield for the 4000th home run in Oakland A's history.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Hahn (1-1, 3.00 ERA)

FOR OPENERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville today for his second stint with the A's this year...was recalled for the first time April 30 and went 1-1 with a 3.00 ERA in two starts before he was optioned to Nashville May 8...the two starts were his first since July 1, 2015 against Colorado as he spent the final three months of the 2015 season on the disabled list with a strained right forearm.

FIRST START: He combined with Axford and Madson on a four-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win over Houston a week ago today in Oakland...tossed 6.2 innings and allowed three of the hits...faced the minimum over the first five innings as the only two base runners were erased on double plays...allowed only one base runner past first base when Correa doubled and went to third on a ground out in the seventh.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-2 loss in the night game of the day/night doubleheader at Baltimore May 7...walked a career-high tying four batters...retired six of the seven batters he faced over the first two innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 10.2 innings...then allowed four runs in the third on a Kim RBI ground out, a Jones a RBI single and a Davis a two-run home run...allowed another run in the fourth inning when Schoop scored on a grounded into double play.

HAHN vs. TEXAS: Is 0-1 with a 6.52 ERA (9.2 ip, 14 h, 7 r, 7 er, 2 bb, 3 so, 0 hr) in two career starts, both last year in Oakland...the loss came in a 3-1 decision on April 7...allowed base runners in each of his first five innings, including the third when he allowed a RBI single to Fielder...allowed two more runs in the fourth when Fielder had another RBI single and Andrus scored on a Gentry error...retired the side in order in his final inning, the sixth, and left after six innings trailing 3-1...then had a no decision in the A's 5-4 win on June 10...tossed 3.2 innings, which matched his shortest career outing as a starter (June 3, 2014 vs. Pittsburgh)...hit three batters, which tied the Oakland single game record...had a 1-0 lead after two innings but the Rangers sent nine men to the plate in the third inning and scored three times on a Fielder sacrifice fly, a Moreland RBI single and a Martin hit by pitch...also allowed a RBI single to Moreland in the fourth and left trailing 4-1.

WITH NASHVILLE: Was 1-1 with a 1.93 ERA in five starts with Nashville...did not allow a home run in 23.1 innings but issued 10 walks (3.86 walks per nine innings)...yielded a .258 opponents batting average, including .243 (9-for-37) against left-handed hitters compared to .269 (14-for-52) against right-handers...opponents were 1-for-23 (.043) with two walks (.120 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...allowed three of his five runs in the first inning for a 5.40 ERA...had a 0.98 ERA from the second inning on.

LAST MINOR LEAGUE START: Made just one start with Nashville following his May 8 option and it came last Thursday at Iowa in the Sounds 7-2 win...blanked the Cubs on two hits over the first three innings before allowing his only run in the fourth on a Dan Vogelbach RBI single...led after 5.2 innings with a 7-1 lead.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 0-1 with an 11.15 ERA in five starts...allowed 13 runs on 18 hits in 6.1 innings over his final two starts and was optioned to Nashville March 29...opponents batted .382 (26-for-68) and he issued seven walks in 15.1 innings (4.11 per nine innings).

2015 RECAP: Went 6-6 with a 3.35 ERA in 16 starts in his first season with Oakland, a campaign that was cut short due to an injury...got off to a slow start as he went 1-4 with a 4.43 ERA over his first eight starts through May 20...then tossed a four-hit shutout May 25 against Detroit and went 5-2 with a 2.42 ERA over his final eight starts...was placed on the disabled list July 11 retroactive to July 6 with a right forearm strain and missed the remainder of the season.

QUALIFICATIONS: Yielded just five home runs in 96.2 innings, an average of 0.47 per nine innings...that was the lowest mark in the American League among pitchers with 90 or more innings pitched...using the same minimum, he also ranked third in the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.324) and fifth in OPS (.623)...has now surrendered 10 home runs in 182.0 career innings (0.49 per nine innings)...seven of those 10 home runs have come with runners on base.

ERRORS AND UNEARNED RUNS: Opponents reached base on an error 14 times, which was the most in the majors, despite missing half of the season...it tied for second most by an A's pitcher over the last 29 years to Tim Hudson's 15 in 2001...tied for fifth in the AL in unearned runs allowed (10).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .238 opponents batting average, which included a .185 (33-for-178) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .286 (55-for-192) against left-handers...now has a .195 (64-for-328) career average against righties...has surrendered eight of his 10 career home runs to lefties...yielded a .215 batting average, .277 on-base percentage and .290 slugging percentage to batters leading off an inning...however, opponents hit .318 with runners in scoring position...surrendered three of his five home runs in the sixth inning when he had an 8.74 ERA...had a 2.64 ERA in all other innings.

NIGHT AND DAY: Went 4-1 with a 1.52 ERA and .169 opponents batting average in six starts during the day compared to 2-5 with a 4.72 ERA and .284 opponents average in 10 starts at night...his career numbers are 7-2 with a 1.41 ERA (11 er in 70.0 ip) during the day, 7-9 with a 4.34 ERA (54 er in 112.0 ip) at night.

DAYS REST: Went 5-4 with a 2.94 ERA in 10 starts on four days rest, 1-2 with a 4.18 ERA in six starts on five days rest or more...is 9-4 with a 2.81 ERA (30 er in 96.0 ip) in 15 career starts on four days rest compared to 5-6 with a 3.61 ERA (33 er in 82.1 ip) in 15 starts on five days rest or more.

THIS AND THAT: Was 2-0 with a 1.42 ERA in two starts against National League competition and is now 3-1 with a 1.78 ERA (5 er in 25.1 ip) in four career interleague starts...walked two batters or fewer in 14 of his 16 starts but tossed six innings or fewer 11 times...has tossed more than six innings in just nine of his 30 career starts.

WITH OAKLAND: Was credited with his first win as an Athletic in his third start April 18 at Kansas City...combined with Jesse Chavez on a seven-hit shutout in the A's 5-0 win to improve to 1-1 with a 2.12 ERA and .213 opponents batting average...left the game with one out in the sixth inning due to a blister and missed his next start...then went 0-3 with a 5.86 ERA and .278 opponents batting average over his next five starts, which matched the longest losing streak of his career (Aug. 5, 2014-April 7, 2015)...tossed his first career complete game against Detroit May 25, a four-hit shutout in Oakland...became the first A's pitcher with a shutout on Memorial Day since Dick Fowler and Joe Coleman did it both ends of a 1947 doubleheader against New York...went 3-1 with a 2.90 ERA in five starts in June...tossed 3.2 innings and hit three batters in a no decision against Texas June 10...tied the Oakland single game record for hit batters (ninth time, first since Barry Zito on April 15, 2005) and matched the shortest outing of his career as a starter...won back-to-back starts June 15 at San Diego and June 20 against Los Angeles (AL)...allowed a run on four hits in 6.0 innings for the win in his final start, a 4-1 A's victory over Colorado July 1.

LHP Rich Hill (5-3, 2.68 ERA): Is 4-1 with a 2.05 ERA and .143 opponents batting average over his last five starts after going 1-2 with a 4.15 ERA and .321 opponents average over his first three starts...is tied for fourth in the American League in strikeouts (53), tied for fifth in wins and ranks ninth in ERA...has surrendered just two home runs in 43.2 innings and his average of 0.41 home runs per nine innings is fourth lowest in the AL...is 0-3 with a 4.85 ERA in three starts at home compared to 5-0 with a 1.76 ERA in five starts on the road...has a 4.18 ERA over innings one through three, a 0.90 ERA from the fourth inning on...opponents are 1-for-17 (.059) with runners in scoring position...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 6-3 A's win at Tampa Bay last Friday (6.0 ip, 4 h, 3 r, 3 er, 4 bb, 7 so)...has no decisions and has not allowed a run in two career appearances against Texas, both in relief in 2013 (0.2 ip).

- The A's bullpen has allowed three or more runs in six of its past 11 games for a 7.62 ERA (35 er in 41.1 ip), including five games where it has allowed at least five runs...yielded one run or fewer in 22 of its first 28 games (95.0 ip, 2.46 ERA)...has a 4.03 ERA overall, which is the fourth highest in the American League.
- Has tossed 136.1 innings, which are the most in the AL and third most in the majors.
- Has allowed 13-of-69 (18.8%) inherited runners to score, which is the second best percentage in the majors (Cleveland, 13.5%).
- Leads the majors in save percentage (86.7%)...is tied for the AL lead in saves (13), tied for the second fewest losses (3), ranks third in strikeouts per walk (3.20), fourth in walks per nine innings (2.71) and grounded into double plays (11) and tied for fourth in strikeouts (131)...has the fifth highest opponents batting average (.247) and has allowed the fifth most home runs (16).

- Has allowed six runs in his past six games (7.0 ip, 7.71 ERA) after starting the season on a nine-game, 10.0-inning scoreless streak.
- Is tied for second among American League relievers in wins (3).
- Has not allowed a run in eight games and 8.1 innings with one day of rest or less...has a 6.23 ERA (6 er in 8.2 ip) in seven appearances with three days of rest or more.
- Has a 0.93 ERA (1 er in 9.2 ip) in eight games at home, a 6.14 ERA (5 er in 7.1 ip) in seven games on the road.
