WINS AND LOSSES: Texas lost last night to Oakland, 3-1... club has still won 2 of 3, 4 of 6, 7 of 10, and 12 of last 19 G beginning 4/26...team has gone 12-11 since 4/22 after opening the year with a 10-6 mark, and are 8-7 in May...Rangers are 0-1 on this 6-game, 7-day road trip to Oakland (0-1) and Houston (3 G)...at 22-17, Texas has 5th-best overall record in the A.L. (.564)...after win on Sunday, were season-high 6 games over .500 for the 1st time, seeking to match that mark with a win tonight...team was 16-23 after 39 G last year and this is best record at this point since 2013 (25-14)...club has won a season-best 4 straight games twice (4/16-21; 4/26-30), separated by a season-long 4-game losing skid, 4/22-25...since 5/1/15, Rangers have best record and most wins in A.L. (103-76, .572).

STANDINGS: Rangers enter today in tie with the Mariners for 1st place in the A.L. West, although Texas has a slightly lower winning pct...prior to a half-game lead following Sunday's win, Rangers had not been atop the division since 5/2, sitting in 2nd place for 12 straight days...Texas also held at least a share of 1st place for 16 of 19 days from 4/11-5/2...team has had at least a share of 1st place for 23 days this season, including sole possession of the division lead for 15 different days...already have more days in 1st place this season than last year (21) in division title run.

SERIES STUFF: Rangers are 8-3-1 in series this season overall, winning 3 straight and 5 of last 6...to win this series in Oakland, Rangers would need to take final 2 games tonight and tomorrow...club has won a series after losing the opener 3 times this season, including in each of the past 2 series during last week's homestand...Rangers are one of 5 ML clubs with at least 8 series wins, joining CHC (9-2-1), BAL (8-3-1), SEA (8-3-1), and PHI (8-4-0)...club has gone 2-2-1 in road series, winning last one 5/6-8 at DET but losing 2 of last 3...team is 6-1-0 in series in Arlington, winning 6 straight, longest such span since Aug. 10-Sept. 16, 2012 (also 6).

ON ROAD: Texas lost last night to snap a season-best 3-game road win streak, but have still won 3 of last 4 away tilts...club has dropped 8 of 12 after opening with a 4-2 away record...team's .444 (8-10) road winning pct. ranks 11th in the A.L...of team's 10 road defeats in '16, 7 have been one or 2-run losses.

VS. OAKLAND / A.L. WEST: A's won 1st meeting of season between the clubs last night...Rangers have still won 4 of 5 and 5 of last 7 games...A's are last A.L. West opponent Texas has faced, as both series between clubs before the All-Star break take place here at the Coliseum (other 6/13-16 - 4 G)...A's visit Arlington for a series in each of season's final 3 months...Texas was 9-10 vs. A's in 2015, as season series has been decided by a 10-9 margin in each of the last 3 years...have gone 13-7 at Coliseum since start of '14, 18-11 since start of '13...Texas leads all-time series, 343-333, and A's have 174-164 edge here at the Coliseum

• This road trip begins a stretch of 9 straight vs. A.L. West opponents, 1st such games since 4/29-5/1 vs. LAA...Rangers are 10-7 vs. the West, winning 5 of 7 and 10 of last 14.

NO LOVE: Derek Holland allowed 2 runs in 6.0 innings last night and exited the game trailing, 2-1, en route to his 3rd loss of the season...it was the MLB-high 14th quality start for the Texas rotation this season to result in a loss or no-decision.

RUNS ON THE ROAD: Last night was the 5th road game in '16 for Texas to score one or zero runs, T3rd-most in MLB (7-SD, 6-ATL, 5-MIL/NYY/TEX)...it was also the 8th time in 18 away tilts for Rangers to score 2-runs-or-less, T2nd-most in MLB to only NYY (10)...Texas has a 7-3 road record this season when scoring 3-or-more runs.

FEW HITS: Last night was 9th game in majors in '16 for both teams to have 4-or-fewer hits, and Rangers have been in 2 of those (also Opening Day, 4/4 vs. SEA).

EARLY ROUND ROCK/FRISCO GAMES: Yu Darvish made his 4th start on injury rehab assignment today, pitching in an 11am CT/9am PT for Frisco (AA) at Midland: 5.0 IP, 3 H, 1 R-0 ER, 1 BB, 6 SO, 0 HR, 18 BF, 68 pitches/47 strikes... Darvish exited in line for the win, but took a no-decision... now has a 1.29 ERA (2 ER/14.0 IP) over 4 rehab starts with 5 BB/15 SO...also today, Kyle Lohse made his 1st start for Round Rock (AAA) at Albuquerque at 1pm CT/11am PT: 5.1 IP, 6 H, 3 R-ER, 1 BB, 4 SO, 1 HR, 23 BF, 84 pitches/54 strikes...Shin-Soo Choo also started in RF for Round Rock today on rehab assignment, going 1-for-3 in 1st 3 trips.

THE ACE: Cole Hamels pitches tonight after Texas lost in the series opener...Hamels has made 5 starts following a Texas loss since being acquired by Texas (reg. season only), with the club going 5-0 in those contests...in the 5 starts, Hamels has gone 4-0, 3.15 (12 ER/34.1 IP)...he enters tonight having won a career-high 11 straight decisions, and Rangers have won 16 of Hamels' last 17 regular season starts.

NO SLOWING DOWN: Last night was the 1st Rangers game this season for Adrian Beltre to not start at 3rd base, as he had started each of club's 1st 38 games there...Beltre had played 335.1 of club's 343.1 innings in the field at 3rd...in fact, Beltre had started 130 consecutive reg. season games for Texas, all at 3rd base, since his return from the DL on 6/23/15 vs. OAK...outside of DL stints in 2015 (6/1-22) and 2014 (4/9-24), Beltre has started all 293 Texas games in which he has been on the active roster since missing games June 2 and 4, 2013 with a mild left hamstring strain...he went 1-for-4 and scored the club's lone run as the DH last night.

JACKSON JOINS CLUB: Luke Jackson was recalled from Round Rock prior to last night's game and made his season debut with Texas, finishing the game with 2.0 IP...Jackson is the 36th player used by the Rangers in '16, 3rd-most in MLB to only ATL (39) and MIN (37).

MAKING THEM COUNT: The Rangers have hit 39 home runs in 2016, and 17 of them (43.6%) have given Texas the lead...the 17 go-ahead HR are T7th-most in MLB...only Philadelphia has had a higher percentage of its home runs give the team a lead.

OFFENSE AT CATCHER: Despite an 0-for-3 by Bobby Wilson last night, Texas catchers have produced a slash line of .254/.322/.477/.799 in 2016, highest OPS and 2nd-highest SLG among any position on team (.484 SLG at 2B)...the .477 SLG ranks 2nd in MLB (ARI-.577), as catchers also sit among ML leaders in RBI (3rd, 23) and HR (5th, 6).

IT TAKES A THIEF: Rangers have been successful in 12 straight steal attempts since Odor was caught 5/1 vs. LAA... club's steal pct. is 75.8% (25-33), 5th in A.L., successful on 19-of-last-21...club's 14 SB in May rank 2nd in ML (HOU-15).

LEFTY-PALOOZA: From Sunday thru Wednesday, Texas is scheduled to start 4 consecutive left-handed pitchers, which would match longest such span in club history...according to STATS LLC, only time Rangers have started 4 straight LHP came in 1973: Aug. 26 (DH at CLE)-27-28 (at BAL)...starters in those 4: Jim Merritt, Mike Paul, David Clyde, Charlie Hudson.

SHORTS: Texas matched season high last night by starting 7 RH batters (4x)...last night was rotation's 4th decision in May (1-3), no wins in 9 straight, longest span since 14 G from 4/18/15 - 5/4/15...Rangers' 12 come-from-behind wins are T2nd in MLB (13-BAL, 12-SF/TEX)...club has errors in season-high 7 straight, longest since 8 in a row, 5/22-29/15.

TONIGHT: The 32-year-old left-hander is scheduled to make his 8th start of the season tonight in the middle installment of this 3-game series in the Bay Area... enters tonight's start riding a career-best 11-game win streak, 2nd-longest in the majors behind only CHC's Jake Arrieta (18)...has taken a no decision in 2 of his last 3 outings, including the Rangers' 6-5 win over the White Sox on Wednesday afternoon in Arlington...ranks among the A.L. leaders in ERA (11th, 2.95), wins (T12th, 4), and strikeouts (T14th, 45)...has a 3.34 ERA (11 ER/29.2 IP) over his last 5 starts to raise season ERA from 2.08 to 2.95, averaging 10.01 SO/9 over that stretch...Rangers have won 16 of Hamels' last 17 reg. season starts...did not make a scheduled start on 4/25 vs. NYY due to left groin soreness, an issue that also caused him to miss a start with Texas on 8/13/15 at MIN...joined the Rangers in a 7/31/15 trade with Philadelphia after 9 1/2 seasons with the Phillies. has been a three-time All-Star (2007, 2011, 2012), posted 200-or-more innings 7 times, had 7 different 10-win seasons...signed a six-year contract extension on 7/25/12, taking him through 2018, with a club/vesting option for 2019....will be working on regular 4-days' rest for the 3rd straight start.

THE STOPPER: Has made 5 starts following a Texas loss since being acquired by the Rangers (reg. season only), with the club going 5-0 in those contests...in the 5 starts, Hamels has gone 4-0, 3.15 (12 ER/34.1 IP).

LAST START: Took a no decision in Rangers' 6-5 win over the White Sox on Wednesday afternoon in Arlington (5.2 IP, 9 H, 5 R-3 ER, 0 BB, 9 SO, 2 HR, 111 pitches/70 strikes)...permitted season-high 9 hits, while recording a season-high 9 strikeouts for the 2nd straight...was 1st walkless start of the year...Rangers tied the game in the bottom of the 5th, but Hamels surrendered an unearned run in the 6th when Avisail Garcia reached on a throwing error and 9-hole hitter Tyler Saladino put the White Sox on top with a 2-out, RBI single...exited in line for the loss, but the Rangers scored a pair of runs in the bottom of the 6th for a comeback win...was 2nd time this season he had been saved from a potential loss, T2nd-most on the staff (Colby Lewis-3).

<u>WINNING:</u> Some notes on several active streaks Hamels carries into tonight's outing:

- Has won a career-high 11 consecutive decisions dating to 2015, 2nd-longest active win streak in MLB (Jake Arietta-18)...it matches the 2nd-longest win streak by a starter in Rangers history and is the longest by a left-hander...others with 11 in a row: Bobby Witt (12, 1990) and Hall of Famer Fergie Jenkins (11, 1978-79)...has gone 11-0, 3.07 (36 ER/105.2 IP) over his last 16 starts beg. 8/23/15, opponents .231/.303/.363/.666 in that span with 102 SO and 33 BB...has quality starts in 12 of last 17.
- The 4 straight wins to open a season are a career best, seeking to go 5-0 with another win tonight...since 2000, only 3 Texas starters have opened a season at 5-0 or better: Alexi Ogando (7-0 in 2011), Tommy Hunter (8-0 in 2010), and Scott Feldman (5-0 in 2009).
- Rangers have won 16 of Hamels' last 17 reg. season starts...Rangers' loss on 5/1 vs. LAA (Hamels-ND) snapped stretch in which team had won 14 consecutive regular season games started by Hamels from 8/17/15 to 4/20/16...it was longest team win streak in one pitcher's starts for Texas since winning 14 straight Bobby Witt starts, 6/28/90 9/6/90...only longer streak was club winning 15 straight Ferguson Jenkins starts in 1978-79 (STATS LLC).
- Has opened his Rangers career with an 11-1 record and 3.36 ERA (45 ER/120.2 IP) over his 1st 19 reg. season starts...according to Elias Sports Bureau, he is the 1st starting pitcher in Texas history to earn a win in 11-or-more of his 1st 12 decisions with the team.

<u>OAKLAND:</u> Has gone 1-1, 1.29 (2 ER/14.0 IP) over 2 career starts against the A's, including an 8-1 Texas win on 9/24/15 here in Oakland (6.0 IP, 4 H, 1 R-0 ER, 3 BB, 2 SO, 0 HR, 87 pitches/53 strikes)...induced a career-high 4 GIDP, all in the first 5 innings...is the only start of his career here at the Coliseum...only other start vs. the A's was a loss on 6/25/11 at Citizens Bank Park with PHI despite allowing just 2 R-ER over 8.0 innings of work (8 H, 2 BB, 5 SO).

ON THE ROAD: Is 5-1, 2.80 (14 ER/45.0 IP) over 7 career road starts as a Ranger, winning 5 straight...has allowed one-or-zero runs in 3 straight road starts dating back to the outing here in Oakland on 9/24/15...has won 5 straight since dropping his first road outing as a Ranger on 8/7/15 at SEA...is the longest road win streak by a Ranger since a 7-game win streak by Martin Perez, 8/5/13-4/23/14... is tied for the 7th-longest active streak in the majors.

2016: Ranks T2nd in A.L. with 4 hit batsmen, including career-high 3 HB on 4/20 vs. HOU to match a club record...hit 1st 2 BF in that start, 1st starter to do that since PHI's Jerome Williams, 9/10/14 vs. PIT...had 3 wins in April after 2 total wins over 13 March/April starts from 2013-15...leadoff batter has reached in 18 of 44 frames, batting .333 (13-39) with 4 BB and a HBP...opposition also 7-for-41 (.171) with RISP, 5th-lowest in the A.L....opponents by PA in game: batting .232 (13-56) in first PA; .276 (16-58) in 2nd PA; .200 (8-40) in 3rd PA; .000 (0-2) in 4th PA...batters in the 3rd and 4th spots in the order are a combined 5-for-38,

ALL I NEED IS THREE: Received 3 runs-or-less of support in 26 of 39 starts since the start of 2015, including zero runs in 8 outings...since the start of 2015, is 16-2 (.889) in 26 starts when receiving at least 3 runs of support...of his 313 career starts has received 3 runs of support or more in 173 of them, going 111-16 (.874) in those games...received 2 runs of support-or-less in 11 outings in 2015, but has received 3+ runs in 17 of 19 starts since joining Texas, averaging 6.06 runs of support per 9 IP in that span (85 RS/126.1 IP).
