OAKLAND ATHLETICS (18-22) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (22-18)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won three straight and four of the last five games after losing a season-high five consecutive contests from May 7-11...are now 5-10 (.333) in the month of May after going 13-12 (.520) in April...have the third worst record in the American League in May...are in third place in the AL West and trail first place Seattle by five games...have spent one day in sole possession of first place this year, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 13 days in third, seven days tied for third, seven days in fourth and three days tied for fourth.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's have won the first two game of this series...with a win today, the A's would sweep their first series of three or more games in the Coliseum since July 3-6, 2014 against Toronto (four games)...have a streak of 40 consecutive home series of three or more games without a sweep, which is the longest such streak in Oakland history (previous: 35, May 13, 1983-Aug. 1, 1984)...are 2-0 on this seven-game homestand against Texas (2-0) and New York-AL (four games)...this homestand begins a stretch where the A's will play 13 of 16 games at home...will play all 16 of those games in the Pacific Time Zone as the three road games are at Seattle...went 2-4 on the last homestand against Houston (2-1) and Seattle (0-3) and are 7-11 (.389) at home, which is the third worst home record in the American League...it matches the third worst record after 18 home games in Oakland history (were 5-13 in 1994 and 2015)...went 3-6 on the last road trip to Baltimore (1-2), Boston (0-3) and Tampa Bay (2-1) to conclude a stretch where they played 19 of 25 games on the road...are 11-11 (.500) on the road...are batting .265 (207-for-782) and are averaging 4.36 runs per game (96 runs in 22 games) on the road compared to .223 (130-for-584) with an average of 3.33 runs per game (60 runs in 18 games) at home...have the third fewest runs scored and the third lowest batting average at home in the AL.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are scheduled to face a left-handed starting pitcher for the fourth consecutive game today...began the season by facing three consecutive left-handed starting pitchers but then faced righties in 32 of the next 34 games...are also scheduled to face a lefty Friday...are 4-4 (.500) in games started by a left-handed pitcher compared to 14-18 (.438) against righties.

OFFENSE: The A's hit a season-high tying four home runs last night, their third four-homer game over the last five games...had just two games with four or more home runs over their previous 256 games dating back to July 27, 2014...have 13 home runs over the last five games after hitting just six home runs over the previous 11 contests...are batting .276 (117-for-424) with 60 runs scored over the last 12 games (5.00 runs per game)...have a .298 on-base percentage, which is the lowest mark in the American League and fifth lowest in the majors...have the second fewest walks in the AL (95) but are tied for the third most intentional walks (7)...have the fourth fewest doubles (53) and extra base hits (104) and the fourth fewest strikeouts (273).

PITCHING: The A's have yielded 72 runs over the last nine games (8.00 runs per game)...have an 8.05 ERA (68 er in 76.0 ip) and .306 (98-for-320) opponents batting average over that span and have surrendered 21 home runs...now have a 6.91 ERA (99 er in 129.0 ip) in the month of May, which is the highest mark in the majors (Minnesota, 6.86)...lead the majors in May home runs (29) and are tied for second in the American League in May walks (56)...now have a 4.81 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the AL...have the fourth highest opponents batting average (.265), on-base percentage (.335) and slugging percentage (.440)...have the second most home runs (53) and have issued the fourth most walks (136).

STARTING PITCHING: The A's are the only Major League team that has not had a starter pitch more than seven innings...the last A's starter to pitch more than 7.0 innings is Sonny Gray on Aug. 22, 2015 (8.0 ip)...have a streak of 78 consecutive games with seven or fewer innings by the starting pitcher, which is the longest such streak in Athletics history (previous: 77, July 18, 2008-April 18, 2009)...starters are 5-14 with a 7.27 ERA (94 er in 116.1 ip) and .308 (148-for-480) opponents batting average over the last 23 games...that includes 3-1 with a 2.19 ERA (6 er in 24.2 ip) in four starts by Rich Hill and 2-13 with a 8.64 ERA (88 er in 91.2 ip) by everyone else...are 11-19 with a 5.27 ERA (125 er in 213.1 ip) for the season...have the

second highest ERA in the majors (Milwaukee, 5.68) and are tied for the second most losses.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 30 errors, which is the most in the American League and tied for third most in the majors...have 14 unearned runs, which are tied for third most in the AL...are tied for third in the AL in double plays (41).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's recorded their second walk-off win of the season last night (both home runs) to improve to 7-2 in games decided in the last at bat...the seven last at bat wins are tied with Seattle for the most in the majors...are 6-6 in one-run games...are tied for third in the American League in one-run wins and tied for fourth in games...are 2-0 in extra inning games and are tied for second in the AL in extra inning wins...are 3-0 when the game is tied after seven innings and 4-1 when it is tied after eight innings.

IN THE PINCH: Stephen Vogt had a pinch hit single to start the A's ninth inning rally last night and A's pinch hitters are now 7 for their last 17 (.412) after starting the season 0-for-12...rank third in the American League in hits (7) and plate appearances (30)...on Sunday, Chris Coghlan hit the A's first pinch home run since June 22, 2014 against Boston (John Jaso)...it snapped a streak of 285 consecutive without a pinch home run, which was the longest active streak in the majors.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have been successful in 5-of-7 (71.4%) replay challenges, which is the best percentage in the majors...the seven challenges are tied for fourth fewest in the majors...are one of eight teams in the majors averaging under three hours a game (2:59)...are 7-15 from Monday through Thursday compared to 11-7 on Friday, Saturday and Sunday...the A's designated hitter entered the game defensively for the sixth time this year Sunday...from 1996-2015, the A's had the DH enter the game on defense a total of 11 times...the last time they did it at least six times in a season was 1995 when it happened seven times.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's added Josh Phegley to the disabled list yesterday and now have 11 players on the DL (H. Alvarez, R.J. Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doubront, Fuld, Hendriks, Lowrie, Parker, Phegley, Sogard)...that matches the most players the A's have had on the DL at one time since at least 1989...R.J. Alvarez, Bassitt, Doubront, Fuld, Parker and Sogard are on the 60-day DL...have now used the DL 12 times this year...have had at least six players on the DL all year and at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's have won the first two meetings of 2016 after winning the season series last year for the third time in the last four years...went 10-9 in 2015, including 6-3 in Texas and 4-6 in Oakland...are 42-36 against Texas over the last five years...are 334-343 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 175-164 in Oakland and 159-179 in Texas...have an all-time record of 431-425 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis has eight home runs in his last 13 games...leads the majors with nine home runs in May and tops Major League left fielders with nine home runs...has 11 home runs overall, which is tied for third in the American League...**Josh Reddick** is batting .376 (32-for-85) over his last 23 games after hitting .218 over his first 16 contests...**Danny Valencia** homered for the sixth time in his last five games last night...those are the most home runs over a five-game span by an Athletic since Geronimo Berroa had seven from Aug. 12-16, 1996.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1952** Bobby Shantz tosses a three-hit shutout to defeat Bob Feller 2-0 in the first game of a doubleheader at Cleveland...in **1998** Mike Blowers becomes the second player in Oakland history to hit for the cycle in the A's 14-0 win at Chicago...in **2003** the A's score three runs in the eighth inning and five in the ninth to come from behind and defeat Cleveland, 8-5...in **2014** Josh Donaldson and Brandon Moss score four runs each as the A's win at Cleveland, 13-3.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Rich Hill (5-3, 2.68 ERA)

LAST FIVE STARTS: Has allowed four hits or fewer in each of his last five starts and opponents are 15-for-105 (.143) over that stretch...has tossed at least five innings in each outing and his streak of five consecutive outings with five innings or more and four hits or fewer matches the longest such streak by an A's pitcher since at least 1913...the last A's pitcher to do it was Dallas Braden (Aug. 11-Sept. 2, 2010)...has also issued 15 walks during this five-game stretch (30.2 ip, 4.40 per nine innings)...is 4-1 with a 2.05 ERA (7 er in 30.2 ip) over his last five starts after going 1-2 with a 4.15 ERA and .321 opponents average over his first three starts.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks fourth in the American League in opponents batting average (.203) and slugging percentage (.291), tied for fifth in wins (5) and strikeouts (53) and eighth in ERA (2.68)...has surrendered just two home runs and his average of 0.41 home runs per nine innings is fifth lowest in the AL...is tied for the Major League lead in hit batters (6) and is tied for 10th in the AL in walks (20)...ranks third in the AL in most pitches per inning (18.4)...has committed two errors, which are tied for the most in the majors among pitchers.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 0-3 with a 4.85 ERA (7 er in 13.0 ip) and .275 (14-for-51) opponents average in three starts at home compared to 5-0 with a 1.76 ERA (6 er in 30.2 ip) and .168 (18-for-107) opponents batting average in five starts on the road...is tied for the American League lead in home losses and is tied for the Major League lead in road wins...is now 6-1 with a 1.95 ERA (11 er in 50.2 ip) and .169 (30-for-177) opponents batting average in eight starts on the road over the last two years...has four 10-strikeout games in those eight starts and has fanned 66 in 50.2 road innings (11.72 per nine innings)...struck out 10 batters in each of his first two road starts this year and is the first pitcher in Oakland history with back-to-back 10-strikeout games on the road...the last A's pitcher to do it was Jim Nash in 1967 (July 8-13).

INNING BY INNING: Has allowed 13 of his 16 runs over the first three innings of a game...has a 4.18 ERA (11 er in 23.2 ip), .236 (21-for-89) opponents batting average and both of his home runs in innings one through three compared to a 0.90 ERA (2 er in 20.0 ip) and .159 (11-for-69) opponents batting average from the fourth inning on.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 2-1 with a 1.52 ERA (3 er in 19.0 ip) in three starts on four days rest compared to 3-2 with a 3.65 ERA (10 er in 24.2 ip) in five starts on five days rest or more.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has surrendered both of his home runs and issued 19 of his 20 walks to right-handed hitters...both of the home runs are solo shots...opponents are 1-for-17 (.059) with runners in scoring position and two outs...have a .139 (15-for-108) batting average with two strikes...the clean-up hitter is 3-for-20 (.150) with no extra base hits.

STRIKEOUTS: Has 16 strikeouts in 17.2 innings in May after fanning 37 in 26.0 innings in April...his April strikeout total was the fifth best in Oakland history and the second best over the last 15 years (Chavez, 41 in 2014)...had 10-strikeout games on April 9 at Seattle and April 21 at New York (AL) and is the first A's pitcher with two 10-strikeout games in one month since Mark Mulder in July, 2003...now has 10 career games with 10 or more strikeouts...has 149 strikeouts in 116.2 innings over the last four years (11.49 per nine innings).

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is scheduled to make his ninth start of the season, which will tie him for the American League lead...it will be his 13th appearance over the last two years, all starts...is 7-4 with a 2.23 ERA (18 er in 72.2 ip) and .179 (46-for-257) opponents batting average over that span...made 119 appearances from 2010-14, all in relief...appeared in 78 games, including 70 starts, over his first five seasons from 2005-09.

FIRST START: Made his first career Opening Day start April 4 against Chicago (AL) after Sonny Gray was scratched due to food poisoning...at the age of 36 years, 24 days, he was the fourth oldest pitcher to start an opener in Oakland history and the fifth oldest in Athletics history...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-3 loss...tossed just 2.2 innings, which was the fourth shortest outing by an A's starter on Opening Day and the shortest since Barry Zito lasted 1.1 innings against New York (AL) in 2006...did not allow a run over the first two innings but then surrendered four runs, two earned, while recording just one out in the third...Eaton had a RBI triple and Rollins followed with a RBI single before two runs scored on a Canha error.

SECOND START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-1 victory at Seattle April 9...struck out 10 batters and his final strikeout of Iannetta in the sixth inning was the 500th of his career...had a 2-0 lead when he allowed his only run in the second inning on a two-out solo home run by Iannetta...blanked the Mariners on two hits, a walk and a hit batter over his final four innings.

THIRD START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-2 loss to Kansas City April 15 in Oakland...yielded two runs in the first inning on a Cain RBI single and a double play...the A's got one of those runs back in the second but he allowed a RBI single to Morales in the third...was relieved by Rodriguez after tossing 106 pitches in 4.1 innings.

FOURTH START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-3 win at New York (AL) April 21...struck out 10 batters in 6.0 innings, his second 10-strikeout game of the season...allowed a RBI single to Hicks in the second inning but the A's tied the game in the fourth...yielded another run on a Romine RBI single in the bottom of the fourth but the A's tied the game in the fifth and scored twice in the seventh to give him the win.

FIFTH START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-1 win at Detroit May 1...tossed 7.0 scoreless innings and did not walk a batter...allowed just one run base runner as far as second base...retired each of the last seven batters he faced, 11 of the last 12 and 18 of the last 20.

SIXTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-1 loss to Houston in Oakland on May 1...allowed just two hits but issued four walks in six innings...yielded a home run to Altuve to start the game and Rasmus had a sacrifice fly in the third inning...retired 10 of the final 11 batters he faced.

SEVENTH START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 8-4 victory in the day game at Baltimore May 7...allowed just two hits but walked three and hit a batter...yielded his only run in the sixth inning when Jones grounded into a fielder's choice to score Machado...was relieved by Dull with two outs in the sixth after tossing 103 pitches.

LAST START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's 6-3 win at Tampa Bay last Friday...the A's scored four times in the top of the first but he allowed two runs in the bottom of the first on back-to-back RBI singles by Pearce and Souza...retired 12 straight before allowing his only other run in the fifth inning on a Longoria RBI double.

HILL vs. TEXAS: Is 0-0 with a 0.00 ERA (0.2 ip, 0 h, 0 r, 0 er, 0 bb, 0 so, 0 hr) in two career appearances, both in relief in 2013 while pitching for the Indians...faced just one batter in each outing and it was A.J. Pierzynski both times...got him to fly out in the sixth inning on June 12 at Texas and line out in the seventh inning on July 26 at Cleveland.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 0-2 with an 11.25 ERA and .293 opponents batting average in four spring training starts...issued 15 walks in 12.0 innings...the walks matched the most by an A's pitcher over the last 19 springs (Ron Mahay, 2000; Omar Olivares, 2000).

2015 RECAP: Began the season at Triple-A Syracuse in the Washington organization and finished it by going 2-1 with a 1.55 ERA in four September starts with Boston...the starts were his first as a major leaguer since making 13 with Baltimore in 2009...struck out 36 batters in 29.0 innings (11.17 per nine innings) and walked just five for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 7.20...allowed a .141 batting average, including .138 with both of his home runs against right-handers compared to .158 against left-handers...was signed by Washington to a minor league contract March 3 and started the season at Syracuse...was 2-2 with a 2.91 ERA in 25 relief appearances with the Chiefs when he was released June 24...went 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA in two starts with the Long Island Ducks of the independent Atlantic League before signing a minor league deal with Boston Aug. 14...compiled a 3-2 record and a 2.78 ERA in five starts with Triple-A Pawtucket before his promotion to Boston Sept. 8...combined for a 5-4 record and a 2.83 ERA in 30 games with Syracuse and Pawtucket...struck out 61 batters in 54.0 innings.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Kendall Graveman (1-5, 5.84 ERA): Is 0-4 with a 9.31 ERA and .365 opponents batting average over his last four starts after going 1-1 with a 2.04 ERA and .159 opponents average over his first three starts...has five losses for the season, which is tied for third most in the American League...is now 1-10 with a 5.83 ERA over his last 15 starts dating back to July 10, 2015...has allowed 10 home runs, which is tied for second most in the AL...has held left-handed hitters to a .224 batting average, compared to .333 against right-handers...however, has issued 10 of his 14 walks to lefties...has received three runs of support or fewer in all seven of his starts and his season run support average is 2.43...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 6-0 A's loss at Tampa Bay last Saturday (5.2 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 4 er, 3 bb, 1 so)...is 1-0 with a 3.00 ERA (12.0 ip, 10 h, 4 r, 4 er, 5 bb, 12 so, 2 hr) in two career appearances against New York, both starts.

- Has tossed 138.2 innings, which are the most in the AL and third most in the majors.
- Has allowed 13-of-70 (18.6%) inherited runners to score, which is the second best percentage in the majors (Cleveland, 15.5%).
- Is tied for the AL lead in saves (13), ranks second in save percentage (81.3%), is tied for the second fewest losses (3), is third in strikeouts per walk (3.29) and walks per nine innings (2.66), fourth in strikeouts (135) and tied for fourth in opponents grounded into double plays (11)...is tied for the fourth most home runs allowed (17) and has the fifth highest opponents batting average (.251).
