OAKLAND ATHLETICS (19-23) VS. NEW YORK YANKEES (18-22)

FRIDAY, MAY 20, 2016 — OAKLAND ALAMEDA COLISEUM — 6:35 P.M. PDT RHP SONNY GRAY (3-4, 5.84) VS. LHP CC SABATHIA (2-2, 3.81) CSNCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME) — EN ESPAÑOL (KIQI 1010 AM)

ABOUT THE A'S: Had their four-game winning streak snapped last night...have won five of the last seven games after losing a season-high five straight and nine of the previous 10...are 6-11 (.353) in May after going 13-12 (.520) in April...are tied with Detroit for the second worst record in the American League in May (MIN, 3-13)...are 19-23 (.452) for the season, which is the fourth worst record in the AL...are in fourth place in the AL West and trail first place Seattle by five games...last year, the A's were 14-28 after 42 games and trailed first place Houston by 13½ games...swept a three-game series from Texas to start the homestand...it was the A's third sweep of the season, but their first at home...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 14 days in third, seven days tied for third, eight days in fourth and three days tied for fourth.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's added Josh Reddick to the disabled list today and now have 12 players on the DL (H. Alvarez, R.J. Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doubront, Fuld, Hendriks, Lowrie, Parker, Phegley, Reddick, Sogard)...those are the most players the A's have had on the DL at one time since at least 1979...have had at least nine players on the DL every day since May 9 and at least six all year...have now used the DL 13 times this year...R.J. Alvarez, Bassitt, Doubront, Fuld, Parker and Sogard are on the 60-day DL...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are scheduled to face their fifth left-handed starting pitcher in the last six games tonight...began the season by facing three consecutive left-handers but then faced righties in 32 of the next 34 games...are 5-4 (.556) in games started by a left-handed pitcher compared to 14-18 (.438) against righties.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .277 (135-for-488) over their last 14 games, which has lifted their overall batting average 14 points to .248...have a .299 on-base percentage, which is the lowest in the American League and fifth lowest in the majors...have the second fewest walks in the AL (99) but are tied for the third most intentional walks (7)...have the fewest doubles (54) and the fourth fewest strikeouts (286) and extra base hits (107)...have hit 15 home runs over the last seven games after hitting just six home runs over the previous 11 contests...have three four-homer games over the last seven games after tallying just two games with four or more home runs over their previous 256 contests dating back to July 27, 2014.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 2.75 ERA (11 er in 36.0 ip) over the first four games of the homestand after posting an 8.40 ERA on the last road trip...now have a 6.367 ERA (104 er in 147.0 ip) in May, which is second highest in the majors (MIN, 6.372)...lead the majors in home runs allowed in May (30) and rank second in the American League in most walks (61)...have a 4.69 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the AL... have the fourth highest opponents on-base percentage (.333)...are tied for the second most home runs (54), have issued the fourth most walks (141) and have allowed the fourth most extra base hits (134).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 3-2 with a 3.61 ERA (17 er in 42.1 ip) and .252 (41-for-163) opponents batting average over the last seven games and have tossed at least 5.2 innings in each outing...went 0-4 with a 19.29 ERA and .458 opponents average over the previous four games, tossing 3.2 innings or fewer in each appearance...the A's are the only Major League team that has not had a starter pitch more than seven innings...the last A's starter to pitch more than 7.0 innings is Sonny Gray on Aug. 22, 2015 (8.0 ip)...have a streak of 80 consecutive games with seven or fewer innings by the starting pitcher, which is the longest such streak in Athletics history (previous: 77, July 18, 2008-April 18, 2009)... starters are 12-20 with a 5.12 ERA (137 er in 225.0 ip) for the season... have the most losses and highest ERA in the AL...are tied for second in the majors in losses and are third in ERA.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 31 errors, which is the most in the American League and tied for fourth most in the majors...have 14 unearned runs, which are fourth most in the AL...are third in the AL in double plays (42).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-1 on this seven-game homestand against Texas (3-0) and New York-AL (0-1)...this homestand begins a

stretch where the A's will play 13 of 16 games at home...will play all 16 of those games in the Pacific Time Zone as the three road games are at Seattle beginning on Monday...went 2-4 on the last homestand against Houston (2-1) and Seattle (0-3) and are 8-12 (.400) at home, which is tied for the second worst home record in the American League...swept Texas to start the homestand for their first sweep of three or more games in the Coliseum since July 3-6, 2014 against Toronto (four games)...that snapped an Oakland-record streak of 40 consecutive home series of three or more games without a sweep, which is the longest such streak in Oakland history (previous: 35, May 13, 1983-Aug. 1, 1984)...went 3-6 on the last road trip to Baltimore (1-2), Boston (0-3) and Tampa Bay (2-1) to conclude a stretch where they played 19 of 25 games on the road...are 11-11 (.500) on the road...are batting .265 (207-for-782) and are averaging 4.36 runs per game (96 runs in 22 games) on the road compared to .228 (148-for-648) with an average of 3.45 runs per game (69 runs in 20 games) at home...have the third lowest home batting average in the AL and are tied for the third fewest runs scored.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's recorded their second walk-off win of the season Tuesday night (both home runs) to improve to 7-2 in games decided in the last at bat...the seven last at bat wins are tied with Seattle for the most in the majors and the .778 winning percentage is second best (Baltimore, 6-1)...are 2-0 in extra inning games...are tied for second in the AL in most extra inning wins and fewest extra inning games...are 6-6 in one-run games.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 4-1 on Friday, which is tied with Baltimore and Washington for the best record in the majors...are 11-7 on Friday, Saturday and Sunday compared to 8-16 from Monday through Thursday... have been successful in 5-of-7 (71.4%) replay challenges, which is the best percentage in the majors...the seven challenges are tied for fourth fewest in the majors...A's pinch hitters are 7 for their last 18 (.389) after starting the season 0-for-12...rank third in the American League in hits (7) and plate appearances (31)...the A's are one of eight teams in the majors averaging under three hours a game (2:58)...the A's designated hitter entered the game defensively for the sixth time this year Sunday...from 1996-2015, the A's had the DH enter the game on defense a total of 11 times... the last time they did it at least six times in a season was 1995 when it happened seven times.

A's vs. YANKEES: The A's lead the season series, 3-1...lost the first game in Oakland last night after sweeping a three-game series in New York in April...it was the first time in 10 series at the new Yankee Stadium the A's swept a series...it was their first sweep in New York since June 9-11, 2006 and that is the A's only sweep at New York over the last 22 seasons...have won each of the previous three season series and are 16-7 (.696) against the Yankees since the start of the 2013 season...that is the best record by an American League team against the Yankees over that span (Texas, 14-10)...have won 21 of their last 30 games against New York, including 12 of the last 15 in Oakland...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 242-273 against the Yankees...that includes 132-123 in Oakland and 110-149 in New York...all-time, the A's are 783-1139 against the Yankees/Orioles.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis has four home runs in his last three games, nine in his last 15, 12 in his last 26 and 32 over his last 92 dating back to Aug. 6, 2015... is tied for the American League lead in home runs this year (12)...Ryan Dull has stranded all 15 of his inherited runners, which are the most in the majors among relievers that have not allowed an inherited runner to score...Danny Valencia was reinstated from the 15-day disabled list May 6 and is 16-for-37 (.432) with nine runs, six home runs, 12 RBI and five multiple-hit games in 10 games since his return.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1977 Wayne Gross has five RBI and Earl Williams drives in four as the A's defeat Seattle 14-5...in 2005 Keith Ginter has one hit in one official at bat but drives in five runs on a three-run home run and two sacrifice flies in the A's 8-4 win at San Francisco...in 2011 Mark Ellis singles in the second inning off San Francisco's Ryan Vogelsong for his 1000th career hit to become the 12th player in Oakland history to collect 1000 hits.

WINNING PCT. (min. 60 dec

THREE-GAME LOSING STREAK: Is 0-3 with a 10.31 ERA (21 er in 18.1 ip) and .329 (27-for-82) opponents batting average over his last four starts...the losing streak is one short of his career high of four (Aug. 1-16, 2014)...has allowed at least four runs in each start, the first time in his career he has allowed four or more runs in more than two consecutive starts... has allowed at least six runs in each of his last three starts, which is the second longest streak by an A's pitcher over the last 15 years (4, Vin Mazzaro, July 18-Aug. 2, 2009)...went 3-1 with a 2.73 ERA and .232 opponents batting average over his first four starts.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Has a 5.84 ERA, which is fourth highest in the American League...also has the sixth highest opponents slugging percentage (.503)...is tied for the most wild pitches (6), tied for third in runs allowed (33) and tied for ninth in home runs allowed (8).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has faced 100 right-handed hitters and 101 left-handed hitters... has issued 15 of his 20 walks and allowed

six of his eight home runs to righties...has a 1.027 OPS against righties, .691 against lefties...the OPS against righties is the highest in the majors among pitchers that qualify for the ERA title...opponents are batting .349 (15-for-43) with four walks (.404 on-base percentage), three doubles and three home runs (.674 slugging percentage) when leading off an inning... the slugging percentage is highest in the AL, the batting average is second highest and the on-base percentage is third highest...opponents are 15-for-28 (.536) with three doubles and four home runs (1.071) slugging percentage when putting the first pitch in play...the slugging percentage is second highest in the AL and the batting average is third highest...has allowed a .457 (16-for-35) combined batting average to the opponents eight and nine hitters...has a .226 (14-for-62) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .279 (17-for-61) the second time and .333 (18-for-54) after that.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-2 with a 4.10 ERA (12 er in 26.1 ip) in four starts at home compared to 1-2 with an 8.35 ERA (17 er in 18.1 ip) in four starts on the road...last year, he went 8-3 with a 2.63 ERA and five home runs in 16 starts on the road...the road ERA was eighth lowest in Oakland history... it was second lowest over the last 34 years to his mark of 2.51 in 2014.

MONTH BY MONTH: Is 0-2 with a 9.37 ERA (17 er in 16.1 ip) in three starts in May...has surrendered five home runs, which match his most ever in a month (Aug. 2015)...has allowed 20 runs, which are one short of his most ever in a month (21, Aug. 2014)...went 3-2 with a 3.81 ERA in five starts in April...is now 10-3 with a 2.53 ERA in 15 career starts in April...the 10 wins are his most in any month

RUN SUPPORT: Has received no run support twice this year and two runs or fewer four times...is 2-1 in four starts with three runs of support or more compared to 1-3 in four starts with two runs or fewer...last year, he was 12-1 in 20 starts with three runs of support or more and is now 31-3 in 46 such starts in his career.

FIRST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 2-1 victory over Chicago (AL) April 6 in Oakland, the A's third game of the season...was scratched from his scheduled Opening Day start April 4 due to food poisoning...allowed his only run in the third inning when Jackson led off with a double, went to third on an Eaton ground out and scored on a Rollins sacrifice fly...left after seven innings with a 2-1 lead.

SECOND START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-1 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on April 11 in Oakland...tossed 6.1 innings to go over the 500 innings pitched mark in his career...shut out the Angels on two hits and two walks over the first five innings but Tropeano blanked the A's on six hits and two walks in five innings...allowed three runs in the sixth inning on a Nava RBI single and a Trout two-run home run.

THIRD START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-3 win over Kansas City April 16 in Oakland...allowed a RBI single to Cain in the top of the first but the A's came back with three in the bottom of the first to give him the lead for good...also yielded a RBI single to Fuentes in the fourth inning.

FOURTH START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's 8-5 win at Toronto April 22...struck out five of the first six batters he faced and had a 4-0 lead when he allowed a solo home run to Barney in the third inning...

the A's increased their lead to 6-1 before he allowed a Bautista sacrifice fly in the sixth and a Barney RBI single in the seventh.

FIFTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-4 loss at Detroit April 27...tossed 65 pitches in 2.0 innings...matched the shortest outing of his career and it was his shortest outing as a starter (pitched 2.0 innings in his first two career outings, both in relief)...allowed four runs in the second inning...Castellanos tripled to lead off the inning and scored on a Gose fielders choice...J.D. Martinez hit a three-run home run later in the inning.

SIXTH START: He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 8-2 loss to Seattle in Oakland on May 3...matched his career highs by allowing seven runs on 11 hits...allowed a two-run home run to Martin in the third and a solo home run by Cano to start the fourth...a RBI single by Marte in the seventh inning increased the Mariners lead to 4-1 and Lind added a RBI single in the eighth...was relieved by Rzepczynski with runners on first and second and no outs in the eighth and he allowed a three-run home run to Seager.

SEVENTH START: He lost his third straight start in the A's 14-7 loss at Boston May 9...allowed a career-high tying seven runs for the second consecutive start...had a 3-0 lead when he allowed a run to score in the second inning on wild pitch...the A's increased the lead to 4-1 before he yielded six runs in the fourth inning...allowed a RBI double to Shaw, a two-run single to Bradley Jr., a RBI double to Betts and a RBI single to Pedroia...was relieved with two outs and two runners on by Rodriguez, who allowed one of the runs to score.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 7-6 win at Tampa Bay last Sunday...allowed a career-high tying three home runs (also Aug. 22, 2015 vs. Tampa Bay)...had a 1-0 lead when he surrendered a leadoff home run to Guyer in the bottom of the first...Guyer added a three-run home run in the second and a sacrifice fly in the fourth...surrendered a leadoff home run to Longoria in the fifth and left with two outs in the sixth and the A's trailing 6-4.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Sean Manaea (1-1, 7.91 ERA): Was selected from Triple-A Nashville April 29 and is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season and his career...has held left-handed hitters to a .150 (3-for-20) batting average... right-handers are batting .379 (22-for-58) with all four of his home runs and five of his six walks...recorded his first Major League win in his last start, a 3-1 A's victory over Texas on Monday (6.2 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 3 so)... was 2-0 with a 1.50 ERA in three starts with Triple-A Nashville...allowed just one run in each of his starts...allowed a .232 opponents batting average, including .077 against left-handed hitters compared to .268 against right-handers...was 1-1 with a 4.40 ERA in five games, three starts, with the A's this spring...is 16-9 with a 2.82 ERA in 42 games, all starts, in three professional seasons...has 257 strikeouts in 214.0 innings, an average of 10.81 per nine innings.

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

7-3, 4.03 ERA (65 er in 145.0 ip) Saves/Opportunities: 13-for-16 (81.3%)

- The A's bullpen posted a 2.46 ERA over its first 28 games, yielded 34 runs over a seven-game span May 4-11 (9.79 ERA) and has a 2.75 ERA (6 er in 19.2 ip) in seven games since then...has a 4.03 ERA overall, which is the third highest in the American League.
- Has tossed 145.0 innings, which are the most in the AL and third most in the majors.
- Has allowed 13-of-71 (18.3%) inherited runners to score, which is the second best percentage in the majors (Cleveland, 17.7%).
- Is 13-for-16 (81.3%) in save opportunities...the save percentage ranks second in the AL and the saves are tied for second.
- Is tied for the second fewest losses in the AL (3), is third in walks per nine innings (2.61) and strikeouts per walk (3.31), tied for fourth in opponents grounded into double plays (11) and fifth in strikeouts (139)...is tied for the third most home runs allowed (18) and has the fifth highest opponents batting average (.246).
