TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

May 20, 1979: Tommy John tosses a 2H, 2-0 shutout at Fenway Park (9.0IP, 0BB, 5K) to improve to 9-0 on the season. John would finally suffer his first loss of the season six days later at Cleveland.

May 20, 1948: Joe DiMaggio hits for his second of two career cycles in a 13-2 Yankees win at the White Sox, going 5-for-6 with 6RBI and 2HR.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

May 21, 1930: Babe Ruth hits 3HR in a 15-7 loss at Philadelphia. It marks his only regular season three-homer game as a Yankee, though he accomplishes the feat twice in the World Series and once at the end of his career with the Boston Braves.

May 21, 1923: Colonel Jacob Ruppert buys out Colonel Tillinghast L'Hommedieu Huston for \$1.5 million, taking sole control of the New York Yankees franchise until his death in 1939.

SUNDAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

May 22, 1963: In an 8-7, 11-inning win vs. the Kansas City A's, Mickey Mantle hits a "walk-off" home run off Bill Fischer that strikes the upper deck frieze in right field. It marks the second time in his career he hit the frieze.

AT A GLANCE: Tonight the Yankees play the fifth game of a seven-game road trip to Arizona (went 1-2) and Oakland (1-0 thus far)...improved to 1-3 against the A's this season...went 7-3 on their 10G homestand which was completed on Sunday (2-1 vs. Boston, 3-1 vs. Kansas City, 2-1 vs. Chicago-AL)...will have a day off on Monday upon returning from their trip before a three-game series vs. Toronto (5/24-26) at Yankee Stadium.

- ▶ Are 9-5 in their last 14G and 10-6 in their last 16G (since 5/4).
- ▶ Are 10-7 through the first 17G of scheduled games on 20 consecutive days (5/3-22), matching the club's longest stretch of 2016 without a scheduled off day...because of a make-up game rescheduled for 6/2 at Detroit, will also play on 20 straight days from 5/24-6/12...are scheduled to play on 40-of-41 days from 5/3-6/12.
- ▶ Have held a lead in 30-of-40 games this season (are 18-12 in those games)...have come from behind in 10 of 18 wins.
- ▶ Are in the midst of a stretch of 26-of-39 games on the road (11-12 overall; 7-3 at home, 4-9 on the road).

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: On Thursday, the Yankees won their series opener at Oakland, 4-1...**Yankees pitchers** did not walk any batters and held A's batters to 0-for-6 with RISP...**RHP Ivan Nova** (6.0IP, 4H, 1ER, 0BB, 3K, 1HR) started and earned the win, to improve to 3-1 this season...induced GDPs in the fourth and fifth innings...threw just 62 pitches, becoming just the third Yankees starter over the last 25 years (since 1992) to throw as many or fewer pitches yet still be credited with a win (also A.J. Burnett-58 on 7/23/10 vs. K.C., David Wells-60 on 9/28/02 at Baltimore)...**DH Carlos Beltran** (2-for-5, 3RBI) had an RBI-double in the third and a two-run homer in the ninth...**LF Brett Gardner** (2-for-3, 2R, 2BB, 1SB) reached base safely in four of his 5PA...**RHP Dellin Betances** tossed a scoreless seventh (1.0IP, 1H, 2K)...**LHP Andrew Miller** tossed a scoreless eighth (1.0IP, 1K)...**LHP Aroldis Chapman** notched his fifth save (1.0IP, 1H, 2K).

C+C = CC: With his next victory, **LHP CC Sabathia** (106 wins w/ Cleveland; and 99 wins w/ the Yankees) will become the eighth pitcher in the modern era (since 1900) with at least 100 wins with multiple franchises joining, Grover Cleveland Alexander (Cards/Phillies), Lefty Grove (Red Sox/A's), Randy Johnson (Mariners/Diamondbacks), Greg Maddux (Cubs/Braves), Dennis Martinez (Orioles/Yankees), Mike Mussina (Orioles/Yankees), Nolan Ryan (Angels/Astros).

BUCKLE UP: RF Carlos Beltran doubled, homered and drove in three of the Yankees' four runs on Thursday at Oakland.

- ▶ Since 5/8/15, is hitting .284/.340/.507 (151-for-531) with 71R, 34 doubles, 28HR, 80RBI and 47BB in 149 games... in that span, is tied for fifth among AL outfielders in home runs, tied for fourth in doubles and ranks fifth in slugging, sixth in extra-base hits (62) and eighth in OPS (.847).

GIVE 'EM 'ELL: Since 5/1, **CF Jacoby Ellsbury** is batting .382 (13-for-34) with 9R, 4 doubles, 1 triple, 3RBI, 5BB, 4SB, .488 OBP and a 1.047 OPS...over the stretch, leads all MLB centerfielders (min: 30AB) in OBP, is third in BA and fourth in OPS.

HEAD GAMES: 3B Chase Headley has reached base safely in a season-high 11 straight games since turning 32 on 5/9, batting .343/.410/.571 (12-for-35) with 6R, 2 doubles, 2HR, 7RBI and 4BB during the streak.

CONSTANT GARDNER: LF Brett Gardner has been on base 27 times in 17G in May (8 singles, 3 doubles, 3HR, 11BB, 2HP).

- ▶ Owns a team-best .377 OBP this season and ranks second with a .783 OPS (McCann -.789).
- ▶ Has walked 22 times so far in 2016 and is on pace for a career-high 89BB (current career high is 79BB in 2010).

WHAT'S LEFT: SS Didi Gregorius is batting .343/.378/.429 (12-for-35) with 3 doubles, 7RBI and 1BB vs. left-handed pitchers this season, sixth-highest in the Majors among qualified left-handed hitters.

- ▶ Has 6H in his last 11AB vs. LHP with 3 doubles and 7RBI.
- ▶ Since 8/28/15, is batting .363/.414/.425 (29-for-80) with 5 doubles, 17RBI and 5BB in 89PA vs. left-handed pitchers...prior to that date, had been a .186 (49-for-264) hitter vs. southpaws in his Major League career (294PA).

HIGH HEAT: Per FanGraphs' PITCHf/x, **Yankees pitchers** have averaged 94.0 mph on their fastball this season, the highest average velocity in the Majors.

- ▶ **Yankees starters** have averaged 94.2 mph on their fastball this season, also best in the Majors...the Yankees rotation features two of the five hardest-throwing starters in the Majors (min. 30.0IP), with **RHP Nathan Eovaldi** (96.7 mph) and **RHP Luis Severino** (95.5 mph) ranking second and fifth, respectively.
- ▶ According to MLB Statcast, **LHP Aroldis Chapman** has thrown the 13 fastest pitches in the Majors this season, topping out at 102.8 mph in the ninth inning on Wed. at Arizona (ball to Paul Goldschmidt).

END GAME: In 17G since 5/3, **Yankees relievers** are 4-1 with a 2.08 ERA (52.0IP, 38H, 14R/12ER, 17BB, 63K, 5HR, .202 opp. BA)...marks the Majors' third-best bullpen ERA since 5/3 (Mets-1.77, San Francisco-2.00).

- ▶ Have tossed at least 3.0 scoreless innings in a game 14 times this season, including five of the last 8G.
- ▶ **LHP Andrew Miller** has recorded 16-of-22 outs since 5/6 via strikeout (7.1IP, 7H, 2ER, 1BB, 16K, 1HR, 1HP).
- ▶ **RHP Dellin Betances** (50.0%) and Miller (49.2%) are first and second, respectively, in strikeout rate among MLB relievers.

THREE HEADS ARE BETTER THAN ONE: The trio of **RHP Dellin Betances**, **LHP Andrew Miller** and **LHP Aroldis Chapman** have pitched in the same game four times this season (5/14-15 vs. Chicago-AL, Wed. at Arizona and Thurs. at Oakland), posting a 1-0 combined record with 4SV and a 1.46 ERA (12.1IP, 7H, 2ER, 2BB, 23K, 1HR) in those contests.

PITCH MEN: The Yankees have used 19 pitchers this season, tied for second-most in the AL and tied for fifth most in the Majors (ARI/ATL-21, CIN/MIN-20, BOS/MIA/NYY/OAK/TEX-19)...four Yankees pitchers have made their MLB debuts (Barbato, Cessa, Green and Mullee)...set and tied the franchise record for pitchers used (including position players) in 2014 and 2015, using 33 different pitchers in each year.

KNIGHT GAME: Rutgers University Director of Athletics Patrick Hobbs and Head Football Coach Chris Ash will throw out the ceremonial first pitches prior to Tuesday's 7:05 p.m. Yankees-Blue Jays game at Yankee Stadium...a special ticket offer for the game is available for all Rutgers alumni, fans and supporters, who can visit www.yankees.com/rutgers for details.

JOE GIRARDI, MD: On Saturday at Oakland, Joe Girardi will manage his 1,500th career game...is 831-667 (.555) in 1,498 career games...owns a 753-583 (.564) record w/NYY (2008-pres.) and posted a 78-84 (.481) record w/FLA in 2006.

- ▶ Among all-time managers with as many or more games managed (1,498), ranks 16th in career winning percentage and 13th among those who managed the majority of their games in the Modern Era (since 1900)...all but two managers with better winning percentages are in the Hall of Fame.

YANKEES at OAKLAND

OVERALL TRENDS/FACTS: The Yankees and Athletics meet seven times (1-3) in 2016...continue a four-game set in Oakland tonight after Thursday's win and being swept in 3G in the Bronx from 4/19-21...are 6-15 in their last 21G and 9-21 in their last 30 meetings...had gone 29-7 in the previous 36 matchups prior to that stretch...the Yankees' .621 winning percentage (1,027-628-5) against the Athletics franchise since 1914 is their highest vs. any AL opponent (min. 35G) in that span...**IN 2015:** Went 3-4 vs the A's, going 2-1 at home and 1-3 in Oakland...**IN SEASON SERIES:** Have lost each of the last three season series (6-13 in 19G) but are 4-2-2 vs. Oakland over the last eight season series (since 2008)...marks their longest streak of season series losses to Oakland since losing three straight from 1971-73...the Yankees have not lost the season series to the A's franchise in four consecutive years since dropping seven in a row to the Philadelphia Athletics from 1908-14...**AT OAKLAND COLISEUM:** After winning a franchise-best nine straight from 7/5/10-7/19/12, are 3-12 in the last 15 road games vs. the A's...have lost four straight series in Oakland in that span, their longest such streak since dropping 12 series in a row at the Coliseum from 8/26/85-5/1/91...are still 16-13 in their last 29G here...are 124-132 all-time at Oakland...**IN POSTSEASON:** The Yankees have won all three postseason series against the A's (2001 ALDS, 3-2; 2000 ALDS, 3-2; and 1981 ALCS, 3-0).

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: LHP CC SABATHIA (2-2, 3.81 ERA)

LHP CC Sabathia is scheduled to come off the 15-day disabled list and make his sixth start of the season tonight at Oakland...the Valjejo, Calif., native was placed on the D.L. on 5/6 (retro to 5/5) with a left groin strain...the 35-year-old last started on 5/4 at Baltimore and earned his 99th win as a Yankee by throwing 7.0 shutout innings (6H, 2BB, 6K) in a 7-0 victory...with his next win, would become the 17th pitcher to reach 100 wins as a Yankee...is one of 10 pitchers in the modern era (since 1900) to make at least 200 starts with multiple franchises (Cleveland, Yankees)...is one of 17 Yankees in franchise history to reach 200 starts with the club...is the active Major League leader in strikeouts (2,595) and complete games (38)...won the 2007 AL Cy Young Award with Cleveland...spent 2001-08 with the Indians and was traded to the Brewers on 7/7/08...signed with the Yankees as a free agent on 12/18/08...is the longest-tenured Yankees pitcher, as only Alex Rodriguez (since 2004) and Brett Gardner (since 2008) pre-date his arrival in the Bronx.

LAST START: Helped break the Yankees' six-game losing streak and earned his 99th win in pinstripes on 5/4 at Baltimore, throwing 7.0 shutout innings in the 7-0 win (7.0IP, 6H, 2BB, 6K)...marked his first scoreless start of at least 7.0IP since 4/7/13 at Detroit (7.0IP)...held O's hitters to 1-for-8 with RISP...became the eighth pitcher in Yankees history to record at least 1,200 strikeouts (1202K).

✦ Since joining the Yankees in 2009, marked his fourth start with the Yankees on a five-game losing streak (or longer)...has earned a win in all four starts, going 4-0 with a 0.86 ERA (31.1IP, 21H, 3ER, 6BB, 30K) in them.

YANKEE GREAT: With his 204th start in pinstripes tonight, will surpass Tommy John for sole possession of 15th place on the Yankees' all-time starts list...needs one win to become the 17th pitcher to reach 100 wins with the club...with 1357.2IP, needs 8.1IP to tie Tommy John (1366.0IP) for 20th place on the franchise's all-time innings pitched list...is one of eight pitchers in Yankees history with 1,200 strikeouts (1202K).

ACTIVE LEADERBOARD/CAREER MILESTONES: Leads active Major League pitchers in strikeouts (2,595), complete games (38) and quality starts (277)...ranks second in wins (216), starts (457) and innings pitched (3017.0)...is third with 12 shutouts...is in his 16th Major League season, second-most among active pitchers (Bartolo Colon, 19).

✦ Reached the 3,000.0 career inning mark on 4/22 vs. Tampa Bay...is one of three left-handers who debuted since 1990 to reach the milestone, joining Andy Pettitte (3,316.0) and Mark Buehrle (3,283.1).

✦ Ranks 25th on the all-time strikeout list with 2,595K...trails 24th-place Tom Glavine (2,607) by 12K...surpassed 26th-place Warren Spahn (2,583) on 4/22 vs. Tampa Bay and 27th-place Bob Feller (2,581) on 4/16 vs. Seattle.

TWO-TIMER: Is one of 17 pitchers (and nine left-handers) in Yankees history to make 200 starts with the club...only Andy Pettitte and Mike Mussina have reached the milestone since 1990.

✦ Has made at least 200 starts with two clubs (started 237 games for Cleveland from 2001-08)...only 16 other active pitchers have made at least 200 starts with one team.

✦ Is one of 10 pitchers in the modern era (since 1900) to make at least 200 starts with multiple franchises, joining Grover C. Alexander, Jim Bunning, Tommy John, Randy Johnson, Greg Maddux, Dennis Martinez, Mike Mussina, Nolan Ryan and Frank Tanana...is one of three pitchers on that list to reach 200 starts with the Yankees (John, also Chicago-AL; Mussina, also Baltimore)...is one of three who also won a Cy Young Award (Johnson, Maddux).

✦ With his next win, would become the eighth pitcher in the modern era (since 1900) with at least 100 wins with multiple franchises (see chart at right).

VS. OAKLAND: Is 9-11 with a 4.71 ERA (183.1IP, 96ER) in 29 career starts against the Athletics...is 6-4 with a 3.49 ERA (98.0IP, 38ER) in 14 starts with the Yankees...last faced the A's in a 5-4 victory on 7/8/15 at Yankee Stadium (5.1IP, 2ER), ending a six-start win drought against them.

✦ Is 4-7 with a 5.44 ERA (92.2IP, 56ER) in 15 career starts at the Oakland Coliseum...is winless in his last three starts here, last claiming a win on 5/26/12 (7.0IP, 2ER)...last pitched in Oakland on 5/28/15, taking the loss in a 5-4 A's victory (6.0IP, 5ER).

ROAD WARRIOR: Is 2-1 with a 2.84 ERA (19.0IP, 6ER) in three road starts this season...has quality starts in six consecutive road starts (since 8/12/15), going 3-2 with a 2.15 ERA (37.2IP, 9ER) in that span...marks his longest such streak since a seven-start streak from 6/9-8/12/10...since joining the Yankees in 2009, is 53-34 with a 3.84 ERA (721.0IP, 308ER) in 108 road starts...ranks fifth in the Majors in road wins since 2009.

ON A ROLL: Since 8/6/15, is 4-4 with a 3.20 ERA (78.2IP, 28ER) in 14 starts...during that span, has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 8-of-14 starts and 3ER-or-fewer in 12-of-14 starts...has issued 2BB-or-more in 13-of-14 starts...has held opponents to a .258 (76-for-295) batting average with just 5HR.
