## **Game Information**

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### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (19-24) VS. NEW YORK YANKEES (19-22)

SATURDAY, MAY 21, 2016 — OAKLAND ALAMEDA COLISEUM — 1:05 P.M. PDT LHP SEAN MANAEA (1-1, 7.91) VS. RHP MASAHIRO TANAKA (1-0, 3.51) CSNCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME) — EN ESPAÑOL (KIQI 1010 AM)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost two straight after winning four in a row...are now 5-3 over the last eight games after going 1-9 over the previous 10 contests...are 6-12 (.333) in May after going 13-12 (.520) in April...are tied with Detroit for the second worst record in the American League in May (Minnesota, 3-14)...are 19-24 (.442) for the season, which is the third worst record in the AL...are in fourth place in the AL West and trail first place Seattle by six games...last year, the A's were 14-29 after 43 games and trailed first place Houston by 13½ games...swept a three-game series from Texas to start the homestand...it was the A's third sweep of the season, but their first at home...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 14 days in third, seven days tied for third, nine days in fourth and three days tied for fourth.

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .270 (141-for-522) over their last 15 games, which has lifted their overall batting average 13 points to .247...have just 33 walks over that stretch for a .318 on-base percentage (5 hbp, 3 sf)... have a .297 on-base percentage for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and fourth lowest in the majors...have the second fewest walks in the AL (100) but are tied for the third most intentional walks (7)...have the fewest doubles (55) and the fourth fewest strikeouts (295) and extra base hits (109)...have hit 15 home runs over the last eight games after hitting just six home runs over the previous 11 contests...have three four-homer games over the last eight games after tallying just two games with four or more home runs over their previous 256 contests dating back to July 27, 2014.

**PITCHING:** The A's have compiled a 3.60 ERA (18 er in 45.0 ip) over the first five games of the homestand after posting an 8.40 ERA on the last road trip...now have a 6.40 ERA (111 er in 156.0 ip) in May, which is second highest in the majors to Minnesota (6.53)...rank second in the American League in most home runs (30) and most walks (67) in May...have a 4.75 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the AL...have the third highest opponents on-base percentage (.336) and fourth highest batting average (.265)...are tied for the second most hit batters in the AL (18), have the third most walks (147) and extra base hits (139) and the fourth most home runs (54).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 3-8 with a 7.18 ERA (50 er in 62.2 ip) over the last 13 games and 6-16 with a 6.92 ERA (101 er in 131.1 ip) over the last 26 contests...are now 12-21 with a 5.20 ERA (132 er in 228.1 ip) for the season...the losses are tied with Milwaukee and San Diego for the most in the majors and the ERA is third highest to the Brewers (5.42) and Rockies (5.23)...the A's are the only Major League team that has not had a starter pitch more than seven innings...the last A's starter to pitch more than 7.0 innings is Sonny Gray on Aug. 22, 2015 (8.0 ip)...have a streak of 81 consecutive games with seven or fewer innings by the starting pitcher, which is the longest such streak in Athletics history (previous: 77, July 18, 2008-April 18, 2009).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's committed a season-high three errors last night and now have 34 for the season, which is second most in the majors to St. Louis (37)...have 15 unearned runs, which are tied for third most in the American League...are tied for third in the AL in double plays (43).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-2 on this seven-game homestand against Texas (3-0) and New York-AL (0-2)...this homestand begins a stretch where the A's will play 13 of 16 games at home...will play all 16 of those games in the Pacific Time Zone as the three road games are at Seattle beginning on Monday...went 2-4 on the last homestand against Houston (2-1) and Seattle (0-3) and are 8-13 (.381) at home, which is tied for the second worst home record in the American League...swept Texas to start the homestand for their first sweep of three or more games in the Coliseum since July 3-6, 2014 against Toronto (four games)...that snapped an Oakland-record streak of 40 consecutive home series of three or more games without a sweep, which is the longest such streak in Oakland history (previous: 35, May 13, 1983-Aug. 1, 1984)...went 3-6 on the last road trip to Baltimore (1-2), Boston (0-3) and Tampa Bay (2-1) to conclude a stretch where they played 19 of 25 games on the road...are 11-11 (.500) on the road...are batting .265 (207-for-782) and are averaging 4.36 runs per game (96 runs in 22 games) on the road compared to .226 (154-

for-682) with an average of 3.43 runs per game (72 runs in 21 games) at home...have the third lowest home batting average in the AL.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's recorded their second walk-off win of the season Tuesday night (both home runs) to improve to 7-2 in games decided in the last at bat...the seven last at bat wins are tied with Seattle for the most in the majors and the .778 winning percentage is second best (Baltimore, 6-1)...are 2-0 in extra inning games...are tied for second in the AL in most extra inning wins and fewest extra inning games...are 6-6 in one-run games.

**LEFT AND RIGHT:** The A's have faced a left-handed starting pitcher in five of the previous six games...began the season by facing three consecutive left-handers but then faced righties in 32 of the next 34 games...are 5-5 (.500) in games started by a left-handed pitcher compared to 14-18 (.438) against righties...are hitting .242 against lefties, .248 against righties.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have been successful in 5-of-7 (71.4%) replay challenges, which is the best percentage in the majors...the seven challenges are tied for third fewest in the majors...A's pinch hitters are 8 for their last 19 (.421) after starting the season 0-for-12...are tied for second in the American League in pinch hits (8) and rank third in plate appearances (32)...the A's are one of eight teams in the majors averaging under three hours a game (2:58)...the A's designated hitter has entered the game defensively six times this year...from 1996-2015, the A's had the DH enter the game on defense a total of 11 times...the last time they did it at least six times in a season was 1995 when it happened seven times.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's added Josh Reddick to the disabled list yesterday and now have 12 players on the DL (H. Alvarez, R.J. Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doubront, Fuld, Hendriks, Lowrie, Parker, Phegley, Reddick, Sogard)...those are the most players the A's have had on the DL at one time since at least 1979...have had at least nine players on the DL every day since May 9 and at least six all year...have now used the DL 13 times this year...R.J. Alvarez, Bassitt, Doubront, Fuld, Parker and Sogard are on the 60-day DL...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. YANKEES: The A's lead the season series, 3-2...have lost the first two games in Oakland after sweeping a three-game series in New York in April...it was the first time in 10 series at the new Yankee Stadium the A's swept a series...it was their first sweep in New York since June 9-11, 2006 and that is the A's only sweep at New York over the last 22 seasons...have won each of the previous three season series and are 16-8 (.667) against the Yankees since the start of the 2013 season...that is the best record by an American League team against the Yankees over that span (Texas, 14-10)...have won 21 of their last 39 games against New York, including 12 of the last 16 in Oakland...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 242-274 against the Yankees...that includes 132-124 in Oakland and 110-149 in New York...all-time, the A's are 783-1139 against the Yankees/Orioles.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis has four home runs in his last four games, nine in his last 16, 12 in his last 27 and 32 over his last 93 dating back to Aug. 6, 2015... is tied for second in the American League in home runs this year (12)... Ryan Dull has stranded all 16 of his inherited runners, which are the most in the majors among relievers that have not allowed an inherited runner to score... Danny Valencia was reinstated from the 15-day disabled list May 6 and has reached base safely in each of his 11 games since his return (17-for-41, .415)...has a 15-game reaching base streak overall, which is one short of his career high of 16 (Sept. 11-29, 2015)..

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1930 Max Bishop walks five times in the first game of a doubleheader against New York and adds three more in the second game...in 1974 Reggie Jackson becomes the first Oakland Athletic to reach 200 homers when he hits a two-run homer in the seventh inning of the A's 8-1 win at Minnesota...in 1995 the A's tie a club record by turning six double plays, but still lose at Chicago, 6-4...in 1997 Jose Canseco doubles in the seventh inning of the A's 7-3 win at Texas for his 1000th hit in an Oakland uniform...he becomes the ninth Oakland player to reach 1000 hits.

### **TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (1-1, 7.91 ERA)**

FOR STARTERS: Was selected from Triple-A Nashville April 29 and is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season and his career...allowed one run in 6.2 innings in his last start for his first Major League win...surrendered at least four runs in each of his first three starts to become the second pitcher in Oakland history to allow at least four runs in each of his first three Major League appearances...the other is Vida Blue (July 20-Aug. 3, 1969).

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has held left-handed hitters to a .150 (3-for-20) batting average...right-handers are batting .379 (22-for-58) with all four of his home runs and five of his six walks...has a 1.069 OPS against righties, .390 against lefties...has surrendered three of his four home runs in his first 15 pitches of a game...opponents are 8-for-13 (.615) with a home run and eight RBI when putting the first pitch in play...has not allowed a hit to the opponents number eight (0-for-7) or nine hitter (0-for-5).

FIRST START: He had a no decision in his Major League debut, a 7-4 A's win over Houston April 29 in Oakland...had just 42 minor league appearances, all starts, in three professional seasons...became the 45th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut, the first since Dan Straily on Aug. 3, 2012 against Toronto...allowed a leadoff home run to Gattis in the second inning but the A's came back with two in the bottom of the second... allowed a RBI single to Gattis in the sixth to tie the game and was relieved by Doolittle with no outs and runners on first and second...Doolittle allowed both runs to score but the A's tied the game in the eighth and won it on a three-run home run by Alonso in the ninth.

**SECOND START:** He had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 9-8 loss to Seattle in Oakland on May 4...shutout the Mariners on two hits and a walk over the first four innings and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed four runs in the fifth inning...Marte had a RBI double, Cano a RBI sngle and Cruz a two-run home run...the A's then scored six times in the bottom of the fifth to give him an 8-4 lead but the bullpen allowed two runs in the sixth inning and three more in the seventh for the blown save (Axford).

**THIRD START:** He had the first decision of his career, a loss in the A's 13-5 loss at Boston May 10...allowed a lead-off home run to Betts in the first inning and Ramirez added a two-run homer...retired the side in order in the second but then allowed five runs in the third inning while recording just two outs...Pedroia had a RBI double, Bogaerts and Young had RBI singles and Shaw chased him from the game with a two-run double.

**LAST START:** He picked up his first Major League win in the A's 3-1 victory over Texas on Monday in Oakland...shutout the Rangers on two hits and a walk over the first six innings...had a 2-0 lead with runners on second and third and one out in the seventh inning...allowed a sacrifice fly to Stubbs and was relieved by Doolittle who got the final outing of the inning.

**NASHVILLE:** Was 2-0 with a 1.50 ERA in three starts with Triple-A Nashville...ranked second in the Pacific Coast League in ERA, fifth in strikeouts per nine innings (10.50) and tied for fifth in wins at the time of his April 29 promotion...allowed just one run in each of his starts...surrendered just one home run in 18.0 innings...allowed a .232 opponents batting average, including .077 (1-for-13) against left-handed hitters compared to .268 (15-for-56) against right-handers.

2015 RECAP: Was acquired by the A's from Kansas City in the Ben Zobrist deal at the trading deadline and went 6-0 with a 1.90 ERA in seven starts with Double-A Midland...began the year in extended spring training with the Royals and combined for a 1-1 record and a 3.69 ERA in seven starts with the Royals affiliate in the Arizona Rookie League, Single-A Wilmington and Double-A Northwest Arkansas...was 7-1 with a 2.66 ERA in 14 starts overall...struck out 90 batters in 74.1 innings (10.90 per nine innings).

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Allowed a .243 opponents batting average, including .198 (36-for-182) against right-handed hitters compared to .330 (31-for-94) against left-handers...surrendered three of his five home runs to lefties for a .511 slugging percentage...held righties to a mark of .275... opponents batted .323 with a .421 on-base percentage when leading off an inning.

**THIS AND THAT:** Compiled a 1.29 ERA in the first inning, a 4.20 ERA in innings two through four and a 0.46 ERA from the fifth inning on...his teams were 10-4 (.714) in his starting assignments, including 7-0 at Midland... allowed one run or fewer in eight of his 14 starts, including no runs four times.

MORE MINORS: Made one start with the Royals affiliate in the Arizona Rookie League on June 24 against the Reds (no decision, 1.80 ERA). was transferred to Single-A Wilmington June 29 and went 1-0 with a 3.66 ERA in four starts with the Blue Rocks...allowed a season-high seven runs on a season-high 10 hits in 3.2 innings July 9 against Frederick, but ended up with a no decision after Wilmington scored 10 times in the seventh inning for a 15-10 win...was transferred to Northwest Arkansas July 17 where he went 0-1 with a 5.14 ERA in two starts before he was traded to the A's with Aaron Brooks for Ben Zobrist and cash considerations, July 28...his six wins with Midland were the most in the Texas League following the trade...went 2-0 with a 2.89 ERA over his first three starts...then did not allow a run in three of his final four regular season starts, going 4-0 with a 1.13 ERA...tossed a season-high 7.0 scoreless innings in his first outing with Midland July 31 against Corpus Christi...allowed just three hits, did not walk a batter and struck out nine to earn Texas League Pitcher of the Week honors for the week of July 27 to Aug. 2...matched his season high by allowing 10 hits in an 8-7 win over Frisco Aug. 5...issued a season-high four walks Aug. 11 against Springfield and Aug. 22 against Tulsa...matched his season high with 7.0 scoreless innings Aug. 29 against Frisco...struck out a season-high 13 and did not walk a batter while tossing 6.0 scoreless innings in his final regular season start Sept. 3 at San Antonio and earned TL Pitcher of the Week honors for a second time (Aug. 31-Sept. 7)...finished the regular season with a 15.0-inning scoreless streak...went 1-0 with a 1.20 ERA in two postseason starts for the Texas League Champion RockHounds (15.0 ip, 10 h, 4 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 15 so)...the win came in Game 1 of the TL Championship Series against his former team, Northwest Arkansas...pitched for Mesa in the Arizona Fall League following the season and was named to the AFL Top Prospects Team after going 0-2 with a 3.86 ERA in six starts...led the league in strikeouts (33)...started for the East in the Nov. 7 Fall Stars Game (2.0 ip, 1 bb, 4 so)...was named AFL Pitcher of the Week Nov. 17 for his Nov. 13 start at Scottsdale (ND, 5.0 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 9 so).

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: Is 16-9 with a 2.82 ERA in 42 games, all starts, in three professional seasons...has 257 strikeouts in 214.0 innings, an average of 10.81 per nine innings...has surrendered just 10 home runs (0.42 per nine innings)...was originally drafted by Kansas City as a Competitive Balance pick following the first round of the 2013 draft and was dealt to the A's just prior to the 2015 trading deadline in the Ben Zobrist deal...led the Carolina League and the Royals farm system with 146 strikeouts in 2014... was rated as the Royals number six prospect by Baseball America following the 2013 and number three after 2014...was rated as the A's number two prospect following the 2015 season.

#### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Jesse Hahn (1-1, 3.38 ERA): Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville Tuesday for his second stint with the A's this year and is scheduled to make his second start since his return...was recalled for the first time April 30 and went 1-1 with a 3.00 ERA in two starts before he was optioned to Nashville May 8...has allowed three home runs in 18.2 innings this year after surrendering a career-high five home runs in 96.2 innings last year... had a no decision in his last start, an 8-5 A's win over Texas on Tuesday here in Oakland (6.2 ip, 10 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 2 so)...was the losing pitcher in his only career appearance against New York, a start in the A's 5-3 loss in Oakland last year on May 30 (6.0 ip, 7 h, 4 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 4 so)...was 1-1 with a 1.93 ERA in five starts with Nashville...did not allow a home run in 23.1 innings but issued 10 walks...went 0-1 with an 11.15 ERA in five starts this spring and was optioned to Nashville March 29

#### ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

7-3, 4.06 ERA (68 er in 150.2 ip) Saves/Opportunities: 13-for-16 (81.3%)

- The A's bullpen posted a 2.46 ERA over its first 28 games, yielded 34 runs over a seven-game span May 4-11 (9.79 ERA) and has a 3.20 ERA (9 er in 25.1 ip) in eight games since then...has a 4.06 ERA overall, which is the third highest in the American League.
- Has tossed 150.2 innings, which are the most in the AL and third most in the majors.
- Has allowed 13-of-72 (18.1%) inherited runners to score, which is the second best percentage in the majors (Cleveland, 17.7%).
- Is 13-for-16 (81.3%) in save opportunities...the save percentage is second in the AL and the saves rank third.
- Is tied for the second fewest losses in the AL (3), is third in walks per nine innings (2.63) and strikeouts per walk (3.25), tied for fourth in opponents grounded into double plays (12) and fifth in strikeouts (143)...is tied for the fourth most home runs allowed (18) and has the fifth highest opponents batting average (.248).
