OAKLAND ATHLETICS (19-25) VS. NEW YORK YANKEES (20-22)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost each of the first three games of this four-game series with New York to snap a four-game winning streak...have not been swept in a four-game series in Oakland since April 26-29, 1999 against Cleveland...have played 78 four-game series at home since then...are now 5-4 over the last nine games after going 1-9 over the previous 10 contests...are 6-13 (.316) in May after going 13-12 (.520) in April...are tied with Cincinnati for the second worst record in the majors in May (Minnesota, 4-14)...are six games under .500 at 19-25, which is one short of the season low of seven (twice, last: 15-22 on May 14)...have the third worst record in the American League...are in fourth place in the AL West and trail first place Seattle by seven games...that is ½ game short of the season high of 7½, last on May 12...swept a three-game series from Texas to start the homestand...it was the A's third sweep of the season, but their first at home...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 14 days in third, seven days tied for third, 10 days in fourth and three days tied for fourth.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's added Sonny Gray to the disabled list today and now have a Major League leading 13 players on the DL (H. Alvarez, R.J. Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doubront, Fuld, Gray, Hendriks, Lowrie, Parker, Phegley, Reddick, Sogard)...those are the most players the A's have had on the DL at one time since at least 1979...have had at least nine players on the DL every day since May 9 and at least six all year...have now used the DL 14 times this year...R.J. Alvarez, Bassitt, Doubront, Fuld, Parker and Sogard are on the 60-day DL...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .232 (60-for-259) over their last eight games after hitting .295 over the previous eight contests...have been held to one run or fewer in three of the last eight games but have scored seven or more three times...have a .296 on-base percentage this year, which is the lowest mark in the AL and fourth lowest in the majors...have the second fewest walks in the AL (102) but are tied for the fourth most intentional walks (7)...have the fewest doubles (55), are tied for the third fewest extra base hits (109), have the fourth lowest slugging percentage (.386) and the fourth fewest strikeouts (299)...have hit 15 home runs over the last nine games after hitting just six home runs over the previous 11 contests.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 3.83 ERA (23 er in 54.0 ip) over the first six games of the homestand after posting an 8.40 ERA on the last road trip...have a 6.327 ERA (116 er in 165.0 ip) in May, which is second highest in the majors to Minnesota (6.329)...rank second in the American League in most home runs (30) and most walks (70) in May...have a 4.76 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the AL...have the third highest opponents on-base percentage (.335) and fourth highest batting average (.264)...are tied for the second most hit batters in the AL (18) and have the third most walks (150) and extra base hits (141).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 3-9 with a 7.13 ERA (55 er in 69.1 ip) over the last 14 games and 6-17 with a 6.91 ERA (106 er in 138.0 ip) over the last 27 contests...are now 12-22 with a 5.25 ERA (137 er in 235.0 ip) for the season...the losses are the most in the majors and the ERA is second highest to Milwaukee (5.25)...the A's are the only Major League team that has not had a starter pitch more than seven innings...the last A's starter to pitch more than 7.0 innings is Sonny Gray on Aug. 22, 2015 (8.0 ip)...have a streak of 82 consecutive games with seven or fewer innings by the starting pitcher, which is the longest such streak in Athletics history (previous: 77, July 18, 2008-April 18, 2009).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed five errors in the last three games, including a season-high three errors on Friday...now have 35 for the season, which is second most in the majors to St. Louis (38)...have 15 unearned runs, which are tied for third most in the American League...are tied for third in the AL in double plays (44).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-3 on this seven-game homestand against Texas (3-0) and New York-AL (0-3)...this homestand begins a stretch where the A's will play 13 of 16 games at home...will play all 16 of those games in the Pacific Time Zone as the three road games are at Seattle beginning tomorrow...went 2-4 on the last homestand against Houston (2-1) and Seattle (0-3) and are 8-14 (.381) at home, which is tied with Los Angeles for the worst home record in the American League...it is tied for

the second worst record after 22 games in Oakland history (6-16 in 2015, 8-14 in 1979)...swept Texas to start the homestand for their first sweep of three or more games in the Coliseum since July 3-6, 2014 against Toronto (four games)...that snapped an Oakland-record streak of 40 consecutive home series of three or more games without a sweep, which is the longest such streak in Oakland history (previous: 35, May 13, 1983-Aug. 1, 1984)...went 3-6 on the last road trip to Baltimore (1-2), Boston (0-3) and Tampa Bay (2-1) to conclude a stretch where they played 19 of 25 games on the road...are 11-11 (.500) on the road...are batting .265 (207-for-782) and are averaging 4.36 runs per game (96 runs in 22 games) on the road compared to .224 (160-for-714) with an average of 3.32 runs per game (73 runs in 22 games) at home...are averaging the fewest runs per game at home in the AL and have the third lowest home batting average.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's recorded their second walk-off win of the season Tuesday night (both home runs) to improve to 7-2 in games decided in the last at bat...the seven last at bat wins are tied with Baltimore and Seattle for the most in the majors and the .778 winning percentage is second best (Baltimore, 7-1)...are 2-0 in extra inning games...are tied for second in the American League in most extra inning wins and fewest extra inning games...are 6-6 in one-run games.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's began the season by facing three consecutive left-handers, faced righties in 32 of 34 games from April 7-May 14 and lefties in five of six games from May 15-20...are 5-5 (.500) in games started by a left-handed pitcher compared to 14-20 (.412) against righties...are hitting .242 against lefties, .246 against righties.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have been successful in 6-of-8 (75.0%) replay challenges, which is the best percentage in the majors...the eighth challenges are tied for sixth fewest in the majors...A's pinch hitters are 8 for their last 19 (.421) after starting the season 0-for-12...are tied for second in the American League in pinch hits (8) and rank third in plate appearances (32)...the A's are one of eight teams in the majors averaging under three hours a game (2:58).

A's vs. YANKEES: The season series is even at three games each entering the final meeting today...the A's have won each of the previous three season series and have not lost one since going 3-6 in 2011 (went 5-5 in 2012)...the Yankees have won the first three games of this series...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's have been swept by New York in a four-game series five times, but just once in Oakland (July 6-8, 1979)...swept a three-game series in New York in April...it was the first time in 10 series at the new Yankee Stadium the A's swept a series...it was their first sweep in New York since June 9-11, 2006 and that is the A's only sweep at New York over the last 22 seasons...are 16-9 (.640) against the Yankees since the start of the 2013 season...that is the best record by an American League team against the Yankees over that span (Texas, 14-10)...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 242-275 against the Yankees...that includes 132-125 in Oakland and 110-149 in New York...all-time, the A's are 783-1140 against the Yankees/Orioles.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis has four home runs in his last five games, nine in his last 17, 12 in his last 28 and 32 over his last 94 dating back to Aug. 6, 2015...is tied for second in the American League in home runs this year (12)...**Ryan Dull** has stranded all 16 of his inherited runners, which are the most in the majors among relievers that have not allowed an inherited runner to score...**Danny Valencia** was reinstated from the 15-day disabled list May 6 and is 17-for-44 (.386) with nine runs, six home runs, 13 RBI and five multiple-hit games over that span.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1968** Jim Nash homers, pitches a five hit-shutout and strikes out 10 in the A's 2-0 win over Cleveland...the home run is the 5000th in the history of the A's franchise...in **1996** Geronimo Berroa hits three solo home runs and is 4 for 4 in the A's 5-1 win at New York...he would add another three-homer game later in the season to tie a ML record with two three-homer games...in **1997** George Williams, Matt Stairs and Mark McGwire deliver consecutive pinch hit singles in the A's 10-7 loss at Texas, tying the major league record for consecutive pinch hits in an inning...in **2004** Reggie Jackson becomes the third player in Oakland history to have his number retired when the A's honor him by retiring number 9.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Hahn (1-1, 3.38 ERA)

FOR OPENERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville Tuesday for his second stint with the A's this year and is scheduled to make his second start since his return...was recalled for the first time April 30 and went 1-1 with a 3.00 ERA in two starts before he was optioned to Nashville May 8...the two starts were his first since July 1, 2015 against Colorado as he spent the final three months of the 2015 season on the disabled list with a strained right forearm.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed three home runs in 18.2 innings this year after surrendering a career-high five home runs in 96.2 innings last year...has now surrendered 12 home runs in 188.2 career innings (0.57 per nine innings)...two of the three home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...six of his nine home runs entering the season came with runners on base...two of his three home runs this year and nine of 12 in his career have come against left-handed hitters.

FIRST START: He combined with Axford and Madson on a four-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win over Houston April 30 in Oakland...tossed 6.2 innings and allowed three of the hits...faced the minimum over the first five innings as the only two base runners were erased on double plays...allowed only one base runner past first base when Correa doubled and went to third on a ground out in the seventh.

SECOND START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-2 loss in the night game of the day/night doubleheader at Baltimore May 7...walked a career-high tying four batters...retired six of the seven batters he faced over the first two innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 10.2 innings...then allowed four runs in the third on a Kim RBI ground out, a Jones a RBI single and a Davis a two-run home run...allowed another run in the fourth inning when Schoop scored on a grounded into double play.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 8-5 win over Texas on Tuesday in Oakland...allowed a career-high tying 10 hits...blanked the Rangers on two hits and a walk over the first three innings and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed back-to-back home runs to Mazara and Beltre to start the fourth...surrendered one more run in the inning when Fielder scored on a double play...left after 6.2 innings with a 4-3 lead but Madson allowed two runs in the ninth before Davis hit a walk-off grand slam in the bottom of the ninth for the win.

HAHN vs. NEW YORK: Was the losing pitcher in his only career appearance, a start in the A's 5-3 loss in Oakland last year on May 30...allowed a run in the first inning on a McCann RBI single but then blanked the Yankees on one hit over the next three innings...the A's scored twice in the third and once in the fourth to take a 3-1 lead but he allowed an unearned run in the fifth on a Headley RBI single...then surrendered a two-run home run to Beltran in the sixth for the loss.

WITH NASHVILLE: Was 1-1 with a 1.93 ERA in five starts with Nashville...did not allow a home run in 23.1 innings but issued 10 walks (3.86 walks per nine innings)...yielded a .258 opponents batting average, including .243 (9-for-37) against left-handed hitters compared to .269 (14-for-52) against right-handers...opponents were 1-for-23 (.043) with two walks (.120 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...allowed three of his five runs in the first inning for a 5.40 ERA...had a 0.98 ERA from the second inning on.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 0-1 with an 11.15 ERA in five starts...allowed 13 runs on 18 hits in 6.1 innings over his final two starts and was optioned to Nashville March 29...opponents batted .382 (26-for-68) and he issued seven walks in 15.1 innings (4.11 per nine innings).

2015 RECAP: Went 6-6 with a 3.35 ERA in 16 starts in his first season with Oakland, a campaign that was cut short due to an injury...got off to a slow start as he went 1-4 with a 4.43 ERA over his first eight starts through May 20...then tossed a four-hit shutout May 25 against Detroit and went 5-2 with a 2.42 ERA over his final eight starts...was placed on the disabled list July 11 retroactive to July 6 with a right forearm strain and missed the remainder of the season.

QUALIFICATIONS: Yielded just five home runs in 96.2 innings, an average of 0.47 per nine innings...that was the lowest mark in the American League among pitchers with 90 or more innings pitched...using the same minimum, he also ranked third in the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.324) and fifth in OPS (.623).

ERRORS AND UNEARNED RUNS: Opponents reached base on an error 14 times, which was the most in the majors, despite missing half of the season...it tied for second most by an A's pitcher over the last 29 years to Tim Hudson's 15 in 2001...tied for fifth in the AL in unearned runs allowed (10).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .238 opponents batting average, which included a .185 (33-for-178) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .286 (55-for-192) against left-handers...now has a .201 (69-for-343) career average against righties...yielded a .215 batting average, .277 on-base percentage and .290 slugging percentage to batters leading off an inning...however, opponents hit .318 with runners in scoring position...surrendered three of his five home runs in the sixth inning when he had an 8.74 ERA...had a 2.64 ERA in all other innings.

NIGHT AND DAY: Went 4-1 with a 1.52 ERA and .169 opponents batting average in six starts during the day compared to 2-5 with a 4.72 ERA and .284 opponents average in 10 starts at night...his career numbers are 7-2 with a 1.41 ERA (11 er in 70.0 ip) during the day, 7-9 with a 4.32 ERA (57 er in 118.2 ip) at night.

DAYS REST: Went 5-4 with a 2.94 ERA in 10 starts on four days rest, 1-2 with a 4.18 ERA in six starts on five days rest or more...is 9-4 with a 2.81 ERA (30 er in 96.0 ip) in 15 career starts on four days rest compared to 5-6 with a 3.64 ERA (36 er in 89.0 ip) in 16 starts on five days rest or more.

THIS AND THAT: Was 2-0 with a 1.42 ERA in two starts against National League competition and is now 3-1 with a 1.78 ERA (5 er in 25.1 ip) in four career interleague starts...walked two batters or fewer in 14 of his 16 starts but tossed six innings or fewer 11 times...has tossed more than six innings in just 10 of his 31 career starts.

WITH OAKLAND: Was credited with his first win as an Athletic in his third start April 18 at Kansas City...combined with Jesse Chavez on a seven-hit shutout...tossed his first career complete game against Detroit May 25, a four-hit shutout in Oakland...became the first A's pitcher with a shutout on Memorial Day since Dick Fowler and Joe Coleman did it both ends of a 1947 doubleheader against New York...went 3-1 with a 2.90 ERA in five starts in June...tossed 3.2 innings and hit three batters against Texas June 10...tied the Oakland single game record for hit batters (ninth time, first since Barry Zito on April 15, 2005) and matched the shortest outing of his career as a starter...won back-to-back starts June 15 at San Diego and June 20 against Los Angeles (AL)...allowed a run on four hits in 6.0 innings for the win in his final start, a 4-1 A's victory over Colorado July 1.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
LHP Rich Hill (6-3, 2.54 ERA): Has allowed four hits or fewer in each of his last six starts and opponents are 18-for-126 (.143) over that stretch...has tossed at least five innings in each outing and his streak of six consecutive outings with five innings or more and four hits or fewer is the longest such streak by an A's pitcher since at least 1913...is 5-1 with a 1.96 ERA (8 er in 36.2 ip) over his last six starts...is 5-0 with a 1.76 ERA and .168 opponents batting average in five starts on the road compared to 1-3 with a 3.79 ERA and .236 opponents average in four starts at home...was the winning pitcher in his last start, an 8-1 A's win over Texas on Wednesday (6.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 6 so)...is 3-0 with a 1.78 ERA in 10 career appearances, including three starts, against Seattle...the three wins match his most against any team...was the winning pitcher in his only start this year, a 6-1 A's victory at Seattle April 9 (6.0 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 10 so).

- The A's bullpen posted a 2.46 ERA over its first 28 games, yielded 34 runs over a seven-game span May 4-11 (9.79 ERA) and has a 2.93 ERA (9 er in 27.2 ip) in nine games since then...has a 4.00 ERA overall, which is the fourth highest in the American League.
- Has allowed just 13-of-75 (17.3%) inherited runners to score, which is the best percentage in the majors.
- Has tossed 153.0 innings, which are the most in the AL and third most in the majors.
- Is 13-for-16 (81.3%) in save opportunities...the save percentage is second in the AL and the saves are tied for third.
- Is tied for the second fewest losses in the AL (3), is third in walks per nine innings (2.65) and strikeouts per walk (3.24), fourth in opponents grounded into double plays (13) and fifth in strikeouts (146)...is tied for the fourth most home runs allowed (18) and has the fifth highest opponents batting average (.248).

- Started the season on a nine-game, 10.0-inning scoreless streak, yielded six runs over a four-game span April 26-May 9 (10.80 ERA) and has not allowed a run in four games and 3.2 innings since then.
