TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

May 22, 1963: In an 8-7, 11-inning win vs. the Kansas City A's, Mickey Mantle hits a "walk-off" home run off Bill Fischer that strikes the upper deck frieze in right field. It marks the second time in his career he hit the frieze.

May 22, 1930: The Yankees and A's combine for 33R in a 20-13 Yankees win at Philadelphia, which includes the third and final career three-home run game from Lou Gehrig. The total runs remain tied for the Yankees' franchise high, accomplished two other times (5/3/12 at Philadelphia in an 18-15 loss; and 6/3/32 at Philadelphia in a 20-13 win).

May 22-23, 1980: Joe Lefebvre becomes (and remains) the only Yankee in franchise history to hit HRs in each of his first two MLB games, as he connects in two consecutive games at Toronto.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

May 23, 1962: Rookie Joe Pepitone hits 2HR in a nine-run eighth inning as the Yankees defeat the A's, 13-7, at Yankee Stadium. He remains one of four Yankees to hit 2HR in a single inning (also Joe DiMaggio, Cliff Johnson and Alex Rodriguez).

May 23, 1948: Joe DiMaggio records his second of three career three-home games in a 6-5 victory at Cleveland.

AT A GLANCE: Today the Yankees play the final game of a seven-game road trip to Arizona (went 1-2) and Oakland (3-0 thus far)... are now 3-3 against the A's this season... went 7-3 on their 10G homestand which was completed on Sunday (2-1 vs. Boston, 3-1 vs. Kansas City, 2-1 vs. Chicago-AL)... will have a day off Monday before a three-game series vs. Toronto (Tues.-Thurs.) at Yankee Stadium.

► **Have won a season-high four straight games**, marking their longest overall winning streak since taking four straight from 7/25-28/15 (all were on the road as well)... *last had a longer winning streak* from 6/1-9/15 (7G).

► With their series win at Oakland confirmed, marks their first road series win of the year (1-5-1)... a win today, would mark their first four-game sweep at Oakland since 7/6-8/79.

► Are 11-5 in their last 16G since 5/6, the Majors' third-best mark over the span (see chart above).

► Are 12-7 through the first 19G of scheduled games on 20 straight days (5/3-22), matching the club's longest stretch of 2016 without a scheduled off day... because of a rescheduled game on 6/2 at Detroit, will also play on 20 straight days from 5/24-6/12... will play on 40-of-41 days from 5/3-6/12.

► Have held a lead in 32-of-42 games this season (are 20-12 in those games)... have come from behind in 11 of 20 wins.

► Are in the midst of a stretch of 26-of-39 games on the road (13-12 overall; 7-3 at home, 6-9 on the road).

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: On Saturday, the Yankees won their third straight at Oakland, 5-1... was the 1,500th career game managed by skipper **Joe Girardi** (162 w/FLA, 1,338 w/NYY)... **Yankees batters** scored 4R in the fourth and out-hit the A's, 8-6... **RHP Masahiro Tanaka** (7.0IP, 5H, 1ER, 2BB, 4K) started and earned the win, to improve to 2-0 this season and snap a five-start streak of no-decisions... also improved to 3-0 with a 1.31 ERA (20.2IP, 3ER) in three career starts against Oakland... **DH Carlos Beltran** (2-for-4) opened the scoring with an RBI-single... **LF/RF Aaron Hicks** (0-for-3) had a sac fly... **RF Rob Refsnyder** (1-for-3) hit a two-run double in his first Major League game played this season... **2B Starlin Castro** (3-for-5) had a run-scoring double in the seventh and led the team in hits... **RHP Nick Goody** tossed 2.0IP of scoreless relief (1H).

STARTING BLOCKS: In each of the last 4G, **Yankees starters** have logged at least 6.0IP and allowed 1-or-0 runs, marking their longest such stretch since 4/24-27/11 (also 4G).

BUCKLE UP: Over his last 7G (since 5/15), **RF Carlos Beltran** has 6XBH hits (4 doubles, 2HR) and 11RBI w/ a .385 BA (10-for-26).

► With his 2H-game on Saturday at Oakland, tied Mickey Vernon (2,495) for 99th place on the all-time hits list... with 3H on Friday, broke a tie with Fred McGriff (2,490) for sole possession of 100th place.

► Leads the Yankees this season in games (41), HR (9), RBI (26), SLG (.516) and OPS (.811).

► Since 5/8/15, is hitting .289/.343/.513 (156-for-540) with 72R, 37 doubles, 28HR, 84RBI and 47BB in 151 games... in that span, is tied for fifth among AL outfielders in home runs, ranks fourth in doubles and ranks fifth in slugging, sixth in extra-base hits (65) and OPS (.855).

GIVE 'EM 'ELL: Since 5/1, **CF Jacoby Ellsbury** is batting .357 (15-for-42) with 11R, 4 doubles, 2 triples, 5RBI, 7BB, 4SB, .471 OBP and a 1.018 OPS... over the stretch, is fifth in the Majors in OBP (min: 40AB).

HEAD GAMES: **3B Chase Headley** has reached base safely in a season-high 12 straight games since turning 32 on 5/9, batting .333/.395/.538 (13-for-39) with 6R, 2 doubles, 2HR, 7RBI and 4BB during the streak.

CONSTANT GARDNER: **LF Brett Gardner** has been on base 29 times in 19G in May (9 singles, 3 doubles, 3HR, 12BB, 2HP).

► Owns a team-best .373 OBP this season.
► Has walked 23 times so far in 2016 and is on pace for a career-high 89BB (current career high is 79BB in 2010).

WHAT'S LEFT: SS Didi Gregorius is batting .343/.378/.429 (12-for-35) with 3 doubles, 7RBI and 1BB vs. LHP this season, fifth-highest in MLB among qualified left-handed hitters.

► Has 6H in his last 11AB vs. LHP with 3 doubles and 7RBI.
► Since 8/28/15, is batting .363/.414/.425 (29-for-80) with 5 doubles, 17RBI and 5BB in 89PA vs. left-handed pitchers... prior to that date, had been a .186 (49-for-264) hitter vs. southpaws in his MLB career (294PA).

END GAME: In 19G since 5/3, **Yankees relievers** are 4-1 w/ a 2.21 ERA (57.0IP, 42H, 16R/14ER, 17BB, 64K, 5HR, .203 opp. BA)... marks MLB's third-best bullpen ERA since 5/3 (Mets-1.57).

► Are 15-1 (.938) leading after six... are tied for MLB's best win. pct. leading after seven (19-0, 1.000) and eight (19-0, 1.000).

► Have tossed at least 3.0 scoreless innings in a game 15 times this season, including six of the last 10G.

► **LHP Andrew Miller** has recorded 16-of-22 outs since 5/6 via strikeout (7.1IP, 7H, 2ER, 1BB, 16K, 1HR, 1HP).

► **RHP Dellin Betances** (50.0%) and Miller (49.2%) are first and second, respectively, in strikeout rate among MLB relievers.

FOUR SCORE: The Yankees have the Majors' best winning percentage when scoring four-or-more runs (.938, 15-1).

THREE HEADS ARE BETTER THAN ONE: The trio of **RHP Dellin Betances**, **LHP Andrew Miller** and **LHP Aroldis Chapman** have pitched in the same game four times this season (5/14-15 vs. Chicago-AL, Wed. at Arizona and Thurs. at Oakland), posting a 1-0 combined record with 4SV and a 1.46 ERA (12.1IP, 7H, 2ER, 2BB, 23K, 1HR) in those contests.

► In the Yankees' wins on Friday and Saturday at Oakland *neither Betances, Miller nor Chapman appeared...* just four of the Yankees' 20 wins this season have been without an appearance by at least one of them (4/6 vs. HOU, Pineda/Nova; 5/7 vs. BOS, Eovaldi/Goody; 5/20 at OAK, Sabathia/Yates/Shreve; and 5/21 at OAK, Tanaka/Goody).

C+ C = CC: With his win on Friday at Oakland, **LHP CC Sabathia** (106 wins w/ Cleveland; and 100 wins w/ the Yankees) became the eighth pitcher in the modern era (since 1900) with at least 100 wins with multiple franchises joining, Grover Cleveland Alexander (Phillies/Cubs), Lefty Grove (Red Sox/A's), Randy Johnson (Mariners/Diamondbacks), Greg Maddux (Cubs/Braves), Dennis Martinez (Orioles/Expos), Mike Mussina (Orioles/Yankees), Nolan Ryan (Angels/Astros).

JOE GIRARDI, MD: On Saturday at Oakland, **Joe Girardi** managed his 1,500th career game... is 833-667 (.555) in 1,500 career games... owns a 755-583 (.564) record w/NYY (2008-pres.) and posted a 78-84 (.481) record w/FLA in 2006.

► Among all-time managers with as many or more games managed (1,500), ranks 15th in career winning pct. and 12th among those who managed the majority of their games in the Modern Era (since 1900)... all but two managers with better winning pctcs. are in the Hall of Fame.

YANKEES at OAKLAND

OVERALL TRENDS/FACTS: Today the Yankees and A's have their final match-up in 2016 (3-3 thus far)...the A's won the first three games in the Bronx from 4/19-21 and the Yankees have won all three in Oakland...the three-game win streak is their longest vs. the A's since a four-game winning streak that spanned two seasons (8/25/11 at Yankee Stadium, and 5/25-27 at Oakland)...are 8-15 in their last 23G and 11-21 in their last 32 meetings...had gone 29-7 in the previous 36 matchups prior to that stretch...the Yankees' .621 winning percentage (1,029-628-5) against the Athletics franchise since 1914 is their highest vs. any AL opponent (min. 35G) in that span...**IN 2015:** Went 3-4 vs. the A's, going 2-1 at home and 1-3 in Oakland...**IN SEASON SERIES:** Have lost each of the last three season series (6-13 in 19G) but are 4-2-2 vs. Oakland over the last eight season series (since 2008)...marks their longest streak of season series losses to Oakland since losing three straight from 1971-73...lost most consecutive years when they dropped seven in a row to the Philadelphia Athletics from 1908-14...**AT OAKLAND COLISEUM:** Have won three straight at Oakland, their longest win streak at the Coliseum since winning a franchise-best nine straight from 7/5/10-7/19/12...with a win on Sunday, would have their first four-game sweep at Oakland since 7/6-8/79...are 5-12 in the last 17 road games vs. the A's dating to 7/19/12...with Saturday's win, snapped a four-series road losing streak...are 18-13 in their last 31G here...are 126-132 all-time at Oakland...**IN POSTSEASON:** The Yankees have won all three postseason series against the A's (2001 ALDS, 3-2; 2000 ALDS, 3-2; and 1981 ALCS, 3-0).

UP NEXT: YANKEES vs. BLUE JAYS (Tues.-Thurs.) = OVERALL TRENDS/FACTS: The Yankees and Blue Jays meet 19 times in 2016 (9G at NYY, 10G at TOR)...are 1-2 vs. the Blue Jays thus far this season...have gone 11-20 in their last 31 meetings with Toronto (since 7/26/14) but are 43-33 in their last 76 meetings (since 7/16/12)...the home team in this series is 71-43 since the start of 2010...have lost nine of their last 11 series to Toronto since 6/23/14...**IN 2015:** The Yankees went 6-13 against the Blue Jays, their most losses ever to Toronto in one season...went 4-5 at Rogers Centre and 2-8 in the Bronx...were swept by the Blue Jays from 8/7-9 and, on 8/8 and 8/9, were shut out in consecutive games for the first time since 5/12-13/99 vs. Anaheim...**IN SEASON SERIES:** In 2015, lost their first season series vs. Toronto since 2010 (8-10)...have won 12 of the last 15 season series since 2001 (went 6-13 in 2015, 8-10 in 2010 and 9-9 in 2008)...have at least 11 wins vs. Toronto in four of the last five seasons...**AT YANKEE STADIUM:** The Yankees are 5-11 in the last 16 meetings in the Bronx...are 22-11 in the last 33 meetings in the Bronx since 9/19/12 and 31-13 in the last 44 since 5/24/11...are 44-22 vs. Toronto at the current Yankee Stadium, marking their most wins vs. any opponent at the venue...went 2-8 vs. the Blue Jays at home in 2015, the club's most home losses to any opponent in a season since going 1-8 vs. Baltimore in 1976...their seven-game home losing streak to Toronto from 4/9-9/12/15 is the longest losing streak vs. any one opponent at the current Yankee Stadium...have lost four of the last five home series (since 7/25/14) but have won 11 of the last 16 home series against the Jays (since 9/3/10)

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP MICHAEL PINEDA (1-5, 6.60 ERA)

RHP Michael Pineda will make his ninth start of the season in the finale of the Yankees' seven-game road trip on Sunday at Oakland...the 27-year-old will pitch on regular four days' rest...has at least 7K in four of his last six starts...has lost a career-high five straight decisions over seven starts since winning his season debut on 4/6 vs. Houston...his seven-start winless streak is the second-longest of his career (longest is 8G from 8/9/11-4/5/14)...has held opponents to exactly 2ER in 4-of-8 starts and allowed at least 5ER in his other four starts...spent his first six professional seasons in the Mariners organization (2006-11)...made his MLB debut in 2011, earning an All-Star selection and finishing fifth in AL "Rookie of the Year" voting...was acquired by the Yankees along with RHP Vicente Campos in exchange for C/DH Jesus Montero and RHP Hector Noesi on 1/23/12 but did not appear in a game for the Yankees until 2014 due to injury.

LAST START: Took his fifth straight loss in the Yankees' 5-3 defeat on Tue. at Arizona, yielding 5ER in 5.0IP (9H, 1BB, 9K, 1HR)...tied his season high in strikeouts...permitted 1R in the second (Ahmed RBI single), 2R in the third (RBI singles by Goldschmidt and Castillo) and 2R in the fifth (Lamb two-run HR)...Dbacks hitters went 8-for-14 on balls in play...in three previous starts in NL ballparks, had not allowed a run across 19.1IP (10H, 3BB, 22K).

✦ Marked his second start this season with at least 9K and 1BB-or-fewer, and has allowed at least 5ER in both (also 4/24 vs. Tampa Bay-5.0IP, 10H, 7ER, 1BB, 9K)...there have been only three other such starts in the Majors this season (by Clayton Kershaw, Jose Fernandez and Jordan Zimmermann).

ROAD RULES: Is 0-3 with a 5.06 ERA (16.0IP, 9ER) in three road starts this season...has received only 2R of support in road starts (1.13 RSA)...has lost a career-high four consecutive road starts since 10/4/15, the longest streak by a Yankee since Hiroki Kuroda lost seven consecutive road starts from 8/6/13-4/2/14...has not allowed multiple HRs in any of his last 28 road starts (has just one 2HR game in 38 career road starts)...has permitted just 8HR in 22 road starts (511BF) with the Yankees...went 7-5 with a 4.18 ERA (71.0IP, 33ER) in 12 road starts in 2015, ranking among AL road leaders in K/BB ratio (first, 9.43), BB/9.0IP ratio (first, 0.89) and HR/9.0IP ratio (fifth, 0.63).

PIN-POINT CONTROL: Owns a 6.31 K/BB ratio (265K, 42BB) since making his Yankees debut at the start of 2014, highest in club history (min. 200.0IP) and third-best in the Majors in that span (min. 250.0IP) behind Clayton Kershaw (8.16, 628K, 77BB) and Phil Hughes (7.68, 307K, 40BB)...led the AL (min. 150.0IP) with a 7.43 K/BB ratio (156K, 21BB) in 2015, second-best in the Majors (Scherzer-8.12)...his K/BB ratio was the highest ever by a Yankee who threw at least 150.0IP.

- ✦ His 4.59 career K/BB ratio (438K, 97BB) is the sixth-highest K/BB ratio as a starting pitcher (min. 400.0IP) in the modern era (since 1900)...trails Chris Sale (5.14), Stephen Strasburg (4.69), Corey Kluber (4.67), Curt Schilling (4.66) and Kevin Slowey (4.56).
- ✦ Has walked three-or-more batters in three starts this season after issuing 2BB-or-fewer in each of his first 41 starts as a Yankee (4/5/14-4/6/16), the longest such streak in team history, surpassing Mike Mussina, who did it in the final 37 starts of his career from 2007-08 (credit: Elias)...had the streak snapped when he allowed 3BB on 4/13/16 at Toronto...had 2BB-or-fewer in 46 consecutive starts from 8/21/11 w/ Seattle vs. Toronto (4BB) through 4/6/16, the second-longest active streak in the Majors (Phil Hughes-56) at the time it ended.

OAKLAND: Is 2-1 with a 2.25 ERA (24.0IP, 6ER) in four career starts against the Athletics, his lowest ERA against any of the 10 opponents he has faced at least three times...has thrown 6.0IP in all four starts (all QS)...has 7K in each of his last three starts...took a no-decision in the Yankees' 3-2, 11-inning loss on 4/19/16 at Yankee Stadium (6.0IP, 7H, 2ER, 1BB, 7K).

- ✦ Is 1-1 with a 3.00 ERA (12.0IP, 4ER) in two starts at the Oakland Coliseum (both in 2011 w/ Seattle).

2016: His .384 BABIP allowed is the highest in the AL and third-highest in the Majors (the Mets' Matt Harvey-.385, Milwaukee's Wily Peralta-.394)...according to FanGraphs, has induced a swinging strike on 14.1% of his pitches, the highest rate in the AL and fifth-highest in the Majors...his 10.31 K/9.0IP (50K, 43.2IP) ratio is the fifth-highest in the AL...has a 4.95 FIP and 3.60 xFIP (FanGraphs)...of his 33 runs allowed in eight starts this season, has allowed 12R/12ER in the first inning (13.50 ERA) and 21R/21ER in the first two innings (11.81 ERA).
