OAKLAND ATHLETICS (19-26) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (26-17)

ABOUT THE A'S: Were swept in a four-game series by New York (AL) to close out the last homestand after sweeping a three-game series from Texas to start the homestand...it marked the first time the A's were swept in a four-game series in Oakland since April 26-29, 1999 against Cleveland, a span of 78 four-game series at home without being swept...the four-game losing streak is the A's fourth of four or more games this year and is one short of the season high of five (May 7-11)...the sweep dropped the A's to a season-low tying seven games under .500 (third time, last: 15-22 on May 14)...it also dropped the A's a season-high eight games out of first place...are now 5-5 over the last 10 games after going 1-9 over the previous 10 contests...are 19-26 (.422) overall, which is the third worst record in the American League...are in fourth place in the AL West for the fourth consecutive day...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 14 days in third, seven days tied for third, 11 days in fourth and three days tied for fourth.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's added Sonny Gray to the disabled list yesterday and now have a Major League leading 13 players on the DL (H. Alvarez, R.J. Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doubront, Fuld, Gray, Hendriks, Lowrie, Parker, Phegley, Reddick, Sogard)...those are the most players the A's have had on the DL at one time since at least 1979...have had at least nine players on the DL every day since May 9 and at least six all year...have now used the DL 14 times this year...R.J. Alvarez, Bassitt, Doubront, Fuld, Parker and Sogard are on the 60-day DL...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

IN MAY: The A's are 6-14 (.300) in May after going 13-12 (.520) in April...are tied with Cincinnati for the second worst record in the majors in May (Minnesota, 4-15)...with one more loss, the A's will clinch a losing record in May for the second consecutive season and eighth time in the last 12 years...went 11-19 in May last year...have a 6.26 ERA (121 er in 174.0 ip), which is the highest in the majors (Minnesota, 6.15)...rank second in the American League in most home runs (32) and most walks (70) and tied for second in fewest saves (3).

OFFENSE: The A's collected six hits in each of the four games against New York (24-for-132, .182) and scored just nine runs...had scored eight runs in each of the previous two games against Texas...are now batting .224 (66-for-294) over their last nine games after hitting .295 over the previous eight contests...have gone homerless in a season-high tying three consecutive games (also April 17-20) after hitting 15 home runs over the previous seven contests...have a .294 on-base percentage, which is the lowest mark in the American League and fourth lowest in the majors...have the second fewest walks in the AL (103) but are tied for the fourth most intentional walks (7)...have the fewest doubles (58), the fourth lowest slugging percentage (.383) and the fourth fewest runs scored (173), extra base hits (112) and strikeouts (309).

PITCHING: The A's compiled a 4.00 ERA on the last homestand after posting an 8.40 ERA on the last road trip...have a 4.76 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...have the second highest opponents on-base percentage (.334) and fourth highest batting average (.264) and slugging percentage (.434)...have hit the second most batters (19), rank third in most extra base hits (144) and tied for third in most walks (150).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 3-10 with a 7.08 ERA (59 er in 75.0 ip) over the last 15 games and 6-18 with a 6.89 ERA (110 er in 143.2 ip) over the last 28 contests...are 12-23 with a 5.27 ERA (141 er in 240.2 ip) for the season...the losses are the most in the majors and the ERA is second highest to Milwaukee (5.45)...the A's are the only Major League team that has not had a starter pitch more than seven innings...the last A's starter to pitch more than 7.0 innings is Sonny Gray on Aug. 22, 2015 (8.0 ip)...have a streak of 83 consecutive games with seven or fewer innings by the starting pitcher, which is the longest such streak in Athletics history (previous: 77, July 18, 2008-April 18, 2009).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed at least one error in each of the last four games (six errors total)...now have 36 for the season, which is second most in the majors to St. Louis (39)...have 15 unearned runs, which are tied for third most in the American League...are tied for third in the AL in double plays (45).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin a brief three-game road trip to Seattle tonight...these three games mark the A's only road games over a 16-game stretch from May 16 to June 1...went 3-6 on the last road trip to Baltimore (1-2), Boston (0-3) and Tampa Bay (2-1) and are 11-11 (.500) on the road...went 3-4 on the last homestand against Texas (3-0) and New York-AL (0-4) and are 8-15 (.348) at home...have the worst home record in the American League and third worst in the majors...it is the third worst record after 23 home games in Oakland history (7-16 in 1994 and 2015)...are batting .265 (207-for-782) and are averaging 4.36 runs per game (96 runs in 22 games) on the road compared to .222 (166-for-749) with an average of 3.35 runs per game (77 runs in 23 games) at home...have the fourth highest road batting average in the AL and the third lowest home batting average...are averaging the second fewest runs per game at home...have a 5.68 ERA (120 er in 190.0 ip) on the road compared to 3.91 (90 er in 207.0 ip)...have the second highest road ERA in the AL.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's fell to 6-7 in one-run games with the loss yesterday and have now dropped four of their last five one-run decisions after winning five of the first eight...are 4-0 in one-run games on the road...are 7-2 in games decided in the last at bat...the seven last at bat wins are tied with Baltimore and Seattle for the most in the majors and the .778 winning percentage is second best (Baltimore, 7-1)...are 2-0 in extra inning games...are tied for second in the American League in most extra inning wins and fewest extra inning games

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's began the season by facing three consecutive left-handers, faced righties in 32 of 34 games from April 7-May 14 and lefties in five of six games from May 15-20...have faced righties in each of the last two games...are 5-5 (.500) in games started by a left-handed pitcher compared to 14-21 (.400) against righties...are hitting .237 against lefties, .246 against righties.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have been successful in 6-of-8 (75.0%) replay challenges, which is the best percentage in the majors...the eight challenges are tied for fifth fewest in the majors...A's pinch hitters are 8 for their last 22 (.364) after starting the season 0-for-12...are tied for second in the American League in pinch hits (8) and rank third in plate appearances (35)...the A's are one of eight teams in the majors averaging under three hours a game (2:58)...the A's designated hitter has entered the game defensively six times this year...from 1996-2015, the A's had the DH enter the game on defense a total of 11 times...the last time they did it at least six times in a season was 1995 when it happened seven times.

A's vs. MARINERS: The season series is even at three games each...the A's swept a three-game series in Seattle April 8-10 and were swept in a three-game series in Oakland, May 2-4...have won five of the last six games in Seattle but have lost seven straight in Oakland, which is the second longest home losing streak against the Mariners in Oakland history (8, July 6, 2007-April 17, 2008)...12 of the A's last 19 losses to Seattle have been by one run and 20 of the last 28 have been by two runs or fewer...the A's lost the season series last year for the third consecutive season and fourth time in the last five years...are now 47-54 against the Mariners over the last six years...all-time, the A's are 330-261 against Seattle...that includes 179-117 in Oakland, 150-143 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo...are 74-79 at Safeco Field.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis is batting .236 (17-for-72) with nine home runs and 20 RBI in 19 games in May...leads the majors in home runs in May and is tied for the lead in RBI (20)...**Ryan Dull** has stranded all 16 of his inherited runners, which are the most in the majors among relievers that have not allowed an inherited runner to score...**Danny Valencia** was reinstated from the 15-day disabled list May 6 and is 17-for-48 (.354) with nine runs, six home runs and 13 RBI in 13 games since his return.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1901** Nap Lajoie receives the American League's first ever intentional walk with the bases loaded in a game against Chicago...in **1983** it takes 17 innings and 5 hours and 17 minutes, but the A's defeat the Milwaukee Brewers 5-4 on Rickey Henderson's two out single in the 17th...Oakland leads 3-0 entering the ninth before the Brewers score four times...Davey Lopes hits his second home run of the game in the bottom of the ninth to send the game into extra innings.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Rich Hill (6-3, 2.54 ERA)

FOUR HITS OR FEWER: Has allowed four hits or fewer in each of his last six starts and opponents are 18-for-126 (.143) over that stretch...has tossed at least five innings in each outing and his streak of six consecutive outings with five innings or more and four hits or fewer is the longest such streak by an A's pitcher since at least 1913...has also issued 16 walks during this six-game stretch (36.2 ip, 3.93 per nine innings)...is 5-1 with a 1.96 ERA (8 er in 36.2 ip) over his last six starts after going 1-2 with a 4.15 ERA and .321 opponents average over his first three starts.

SIX-GAME WINNER: Picked up his sixth win of the season in his last start, which matches the second best total of his career...the six wins are his most since he won a career-high 11 games with Chicago (NL) in 2007...had five wins from 2010-15...the six wins are tied for fourth in the American League...they match the most by an A's pitcher before the end of May over the last 13 years...the last A's pitcher to have more than six wins before the end of May is Mark Mulder, who had 8 in 2003...has three wins this May and will be attempting to win four games in a month for the first time in his career.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks third in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.274), fourth in batting average (.196), seventh in ERA (2.54) and eighth in strikeouts (59)...has surrendered just two home runs and his average of 0.36 home runs per nine innings is third lowest in the AL...leads the majors in hit batters (7)...ranks second in the AL in most pitches per inning (18.3)...has committed two errors, which are tied for the most in the majors among pitchers.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 5-0 with a 1.76 ERA (6 er in 30.2 ip) and .168 (18-for-107) opponents batting average in five starts on the road compared to 1-3 with a 3.79 ERA (8 er in 19.0 ip) and .236 (17-for-72) opponents average in four starts at home...is the fifth pitcher in Oakland history to win each of his first five road games in a season...the record is six by Kevin Appier and Gil Heredia in 2000...is tied for the Major League lead in road wins...has the lowest road opponents batting average in the American League and ranks seventh in ERA...is now 6-1 with a 1.95 ERA (11 er in 50.2 ip) and .169 (30-for-177) opponents batting average in eight starts on the road over the last two years...has four 10-strikeout games in those eight starts and has fanned 66 in 50.2 road innings (11.72 per nine innings)...struck out 10 batters in each of his first two road starts this year and is the first pitcher in Oakland history with back-to-back 10-strikeout games on the road...the last A's pitcher to do it was Jim Nash in 1967 (July 8-13).

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is scheduled to make his 10th start of the season, which will tie him for the American League lead...it will be his 14th appearance over the last two years, all starts...is 8-4 with a 2.17 ERA (19 er in 78.2 ip) and .176 (49-for-278) opponents batting average over that span...made 119 appearances from 2010-14, all in relief...appeared in 78 games, including 70 starts, over his first five seasons from 2005-09.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 3-1 with a 1.44 ERA (4 er in 25.0 ip) in four starts on four days rest compared to 3-2 with a 3.65 ERA (10 er in 24.2 ip) in five starts on five days rest or more.

INNING BY INNING: Has allowed 13 of his 17 runs over the first three innings of a game...has a 3.71 ERA (11 er in 26.2 ip), .222 (22-for-99) opponents batting average and both of his home runs in innings one through three compared to a 1.17 ERA (3 er in 23.0 ip) and .163 (13-for-80) opponents batting average from the fourth inning on...over the last two years, he has a 3.72 ERA (16 er in 38.2 ip) in innings 1-3 and 0.68 (3 er in 40.0 ip) from the fourth inning on.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has surrendered both of his home runs and issued 20 of his 21 walks to right-handed hitters...over the last year, he has allowed all four home runs and issued 24 of his 26 walks to righties...both of the home runs this year are solo shots...opponents are 2-for-20 (.100) with runners in scoring position and two outs...has allowed a .130 (16-for-123) batting average with two strikes...opponents are batting .178 (8-for-45) when leading off an inning...the clean-up hitter is 4-for-23 (.174) with no extra base hits.

STRIKEOUTS: Has 22 strikeouts in 23.2 innings in May after fanning 37 in 26.0 innings in April...his April strikeout total was the fifth best in Oakland history and the second best over the last 15 years (Chavez, 41 in 2014)...had 10-strikeout games on April 9 at Seattle and April 21 at New York (AL) and is the first A's pitcher with two 10-strikeout games in one month since Mark Mulder in July, 2003...now has 10 career games with 10 or more strikeouts...has 155 strikeouts in 122.2 innings over the last four years (11.37 per nine innings).

2016 START-BY-START: Made his first career Opening Day start **April 4** against Chicago (AL) after Sonny Gray was scratched due to food poisoning...at the age of 36 years, 24 days, he was the fourth oldest pitcher

to start an opener in Oakland history and the fifth oldest in Athletics history...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-3 loss...tossed just 2.2 innings, which was the fourth shortest outing by an A's starter on Opening Day and the shortest since Barry Zito lasted 1.1 innings against New York (AL) in 2006...was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-1 victory at Seattle **April 9**...struck out 10 batters and his final strikeout of Iannetta in the sixth inning was the 500th of his career...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-2 loss to Kansas City **April 15** in Oakland...yielded two runs in the first inning on a Cain RBI single and a double play, and one run in the third on a RBI single by Morales in the third...was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-3 win at New York (AL) **April 21**...struck out 10 batters in 6.0 innings, his second 10-strikeout game of the season...was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-1 win at Detroit **April 26**...tossed 7.0 scoreless innings and did not walk a batter...allowed just one run base runner as far as second base...was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-1 loss to Houston in Oakland on **May 1**...allowed just two hits but issued four walks in six innings...yielded a home run to Altuve to start the game and Rasmus had a sacrifice fly in the third inning...retired 10 of the final 11 batters he faced...was the winning pitcher in the A's 8-4 victory in the day game at Baltimore **May 7**...allowed just two hits but walked three and hit a batter...yielded his only run in the sixth inning when Jones grounded into a fielder's choice to score Machado...was relieved by Dull with two outs in the sixth after tossing 103 pitches...won his second consecutive start in the A's 6-3 win at Tampa Bay on **May 13**...the A's scored four times in the top of the first but he allowed two runs in the bottom of the first on back-to-back RBI singles by Pearce and Souza...retired 12 straight before allowing his only other run in the fifth inning on a Longoria RBI double.

LAST START: He won his third consecutive start in the A's 8-1 win over Texas last Wednesday in Oakland...the winning streak is his longest since he won a career-high six straight from Sept. 12, 2007-June 1, 2009...shut-out the Rangers on a hit, walk and hit by pitch over the first five innings...had a 3-0 lead when he allowed his only run on a two-out RBI single by Fielder in the sixth inning.

games, two starts, at Safeco Field...the only ballpark he has more wins in is Wrigley Field (11)...is 0-0 with a 3.48 ERA (4 er in 10.1 ip) in five games, one start, in his home ballparks...is 2-0 with a 1.83 ERA (4 er in 19.2 ip) in his three starts...was the winning pitcher in his only start this year, a 6-1 A's victory at Seattle April 9...struck out 10 batters, his ninth career game with 10 or more strikeouts...his final strikeout of Iannetta in the sixth inning was the 500th of his career...had a 2-0 lead when he allowed his only run in the second inning on a two-out solo home run by Iannetta...blanked the Mariners on two hits, a walk and a hit batter over his final four innings.

RHP Kendall Graveman (1-6, 5.48 ERA): Is 0-5 with a 7.92 ERA and .361 opponents batting average over his last five starts after going 1-1 with a 2.04 ERA and .159 opponents average over his first three starts...the five-game losing streak is one short of his career high of six...is now 1-11 with a 5.64 ERA over his last 16 starts dating back to July 10, 2015...is tied for second in the American League in most losses (6) and tied for third in most home runs (10)...is 1-3 with a 7.91 ERA in four starts on the road compared to 0-3 with a 3.47 ERA in four starts at home...has surrendered nine home runs in 19.1 innings on the road...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 4-1 A's loss to New York (AL) last Thursday in Oakland (5.2 ip, 8 h, 2 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 5 so)...is 1-1 with a 2.76 ERA in four career appearances, including two starts, against Seattle...took the loss in his only start this year on May 2 in Oakland (6.1 ip, 10 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 6 so).

- The A's bullpen posted a 2.46 ERA over its first 28 games, yielded 34 runs over a seven-game span May 4-11 (9.79 ERA) and has a 2.90 ERA (10 er in 31.0 ip) in 10 games since then...has a 3.97 ERA overall, which is the fourth highest in the American League.
- Has allowed just 15-of-77 (19.5%) inherited runners to score, which is the best percentage in the AL and ranks second in the majors (New York-NL, 19.4%).
- Has tossed 156.1 innings, which are the most in the AL and fourth most in the majors.
- Is 13-for-17 (76.5%) in save opportunities...the saves and save percentage are tied for third best in the AL.
- Is tied for the second fewest losses in the AL (3), is third in walks per nine innings (2.59) and strikeouts per walk (3.31), fourth in opponents grounded into double plays (13) and fifth in strikeouts (149)...has the fifth highest opponents batting average (.250) and has allowed the fifth most home runs (18).

- Started the season on a nine-game, 10.0-inning scoreless streak, yielded six runs over a four-game span April 26-May 9 (10.80 ERA) and has not allowed a run in five games and 4.0 innings since then.
- Is tied for third among American League relievers in wins (3).
- Has not allowed a run in 10 games and 9.1 innings with one day of rest or less...has a 5.59 ERA (6 er in 9.2 ip) in eight appearances with two days of rest or more.
