OAKLAND ATHLETICS (20-26) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (26-18)

TUESDAY, MAY 24, 2016 — SAFECO FIELD — 7:10 P.M. PDT RHP KENDALL GRAVEMAN (1-6, 5.48) VS. RHP NATHAN KARNS (4-1, 3.33) CSNCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Snapped their four-game losing streak last night...are now 6-5 over the last 11 games after going 1-9 over the previous 10 contests...are six games under .500, which is one game short of the season-low of seven (three times, last: 19-26 on May 22)...are 20-26 (.435), which is the third worst record in the American League...are in fourth place in the AL West for the fifth consecutive day and are seven games behind first place Seattle...the season high is eight games back on May 22...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 14 days in third, seven days tied for third, 12 days in fourth and three days tied for fourth...were swept in a four-game series by New York (AL) to close out the last homestand...it marked the first time the A's were swept in a four-game series in Oakland since April 26-29, 1999 against Cleveland, a span of 78 four-game series at home without being swept...the four-game losing streak was the A's fourth of four or more games this year.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's added Sonny Gray to the disabled list Sunday and have a Major League leading 13 players on the DL (H. Alvarez, R.J. Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doubront, Fuld, Gray, Hendriks, Lowrie, Parker, Phegley, Reddick, Sogard)...those are the most players the A's have had on the DL at one time since at least 1979...have had at least nine players on the DL every day since May 9 and at least six all year... have now used the DL 14 times this year...R.J. Alvarez, Bassitt, Doubront, Fuld, Parker and Sogard are on the 60-day DL...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

IN MAY: The A's are 7-14 (.333) in May after going 13-12 (.520) in April... have the second worst record in the American League in May (Minnesota, 4-16)...with one more loss, the A's will clinch a losing record in May for the second consecutive season and eighth time in the last 12 years...went 11-19 in May last year...have a 5.95 ERA (121 er in 183.0 ip), which is second highest in the majors (Minnesota, 6.35)...have the second fewest saves in the AL (3) and the third most home runs (32) and walks (70).

PITCHING: The A's tossed their second shutout of the season last night and now have a 3.67 ERA (40 er in 98.0 ip) over the last 11 games after logging a 10.07 ERA over their previous eight contests...now have a 4.66 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League... have gone back-to-back games without issuing a walk but have 150 for the season, which is fourth most in the AL...rank second in most hit batters (19), third in most extra base hits (144) and highest opponents on-base percentage (.333) and fourth in highest batting average (.265) and slugging percentage (.431).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 7-18 with a 6.53 ERA (110 er in 151.2 ip) over the last 29 games dating back to April 23...that includes 5-1 with a 1.63 ERA (7 er in 38.2 ip) in six starts by Rich Hill and 2-17 with a 8.20 ERA (103 er in 113.0 ip) in 23 starts by everyone else...Hill tossed 8.0 innings last night, snapping an Athletics record streak of 83 consecutive games with seven or fewer innings by the starting pitcher dating back to Aug. 23, 2015...the A's are now 6-1 when the starter pitches at least seven innings...starters are 13-23 with a 5.10 ERA (141 er in 248.2 ip)... the losses are the most in the majors and the ERA is second highest in the American League (Minnesota, 5.19).

OFFENSE: The A's collected seven hits last night after tallying six in each of the previous four games...are now batting .185 (31-for-207) with 14 runs scored over the last five games (2.8 runs per game) after hitting .282 with 68 runs scored (5.2 runs per game) over the previous 13 contests... have a .293 on-base percentage, which is the lowest mark in the American League and fourth lowest in the majors...have the second fewest walks in the AL (106) but are tied for the second most intentional walks (8)...have the fewest doubles (59), the second lowest slugging percentage (.382), the third fewest extra base hits (114) and the fourth fewest runs scored (178) and strikeouts (317).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 36 errors, which is nine more than any other American League team and third most in the majors... have 15 unearned runs, which are tied for fourth most in the AL...rank third in the AL in double plays (48).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-0 on this three-game road trip to Seattle...these three games mark the A's only road games over a 16-game stretch from May 16 to June 1...went 3-6 on the last road trip to Baltimore (1-2), Boston (0-3) and Tampa Bay (2-1) and are 12-11 (.522) on the road...went 3-4 on the last homestand against Texas (3-0) and New York-AL (0-4) and are 8-15 (.348) at home...have the second worst home record in the American League (Minnesota, 7-14)...it is the third worst record after 23 home games in Oakland history (7-16 in 1994 and 2015)... are batting .262 (214-for-818) and are averaging 4.39 runs per game (101 runs in 23 games) on the road compared to .222 (166-for-749) with an average of 3.35 runs per game (77 runs in 23 games) at home...are averaging the second fewest runs per game at home in the AL and have the third lowest batting average...have a 5.43 ERA (120 er in 199.0 ip) on the road compared to 3.91 (90 er in 207.0 ip)...have the third highest road ERA in the AL.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's fell to 6-7 in one-run games with a 5-4 loss to New York on Sunday and have now dropped four of their last five one-run decisions after winning five of the first eight...are 4-0 in one-run games on the road...are 7-2 in games decided in the last at bat...the seven last at bat wins are tied with Baltimore and Seattle for the most in the majors and the .778 winning percentage is second best (Baltimore, 7-1)...are 2-0 in extra inning games...are tied for second in the American League in most extra inning wins and fewest extra inning games

THIS AND THAT: The A's have been successful in 7-of-9 (77.8%) replay challenges, which is the best percentage in the majors...the nine challenges are tied for seventh fewest in the majors...the A's are averaging 2 hours and 57 minutes per game, which is tied with Texas for second fastest in the majors (Toronto, 2:54)...A's pinch hitters are 8 for their last 22 (.364) after starting the season 0-for-12...are tied for second in the American League in pinch hits (8) and rank third in plate appearances (35)...the A's designated hitter has entered the game defensively six times this year... from 1996-2015, the A's had the DH enter the game on defense a total of 11 times...the last time they did it at least six times in a season was 1995 when it happened seven times.

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's lead the season series, 4-3...have won all four games in Seattle and lost all three games in Oakland...have won four straight and six of the last seven games in Seattle but have lost seven straight in Oakland, which is the second longest home losing streak against the Mariners in Oakland history (8, July 6, 2007-April 17, 2008)...12 of the A's last 19 losses to Seattle have been by one run and 20 of the last 28 have been by two runs or fewer...the A's lost the season series last year for the third consecutive season and fourth time in the last five years...are now 48-54 against the Mariners over the last six years...all-time, the A's are 331-261 against Seattle...that includes 179-117 in Oakland, 151-143 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo...are 75-79 at Safeco Field.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis is batting .224 (17-for-76) with nine home runs and 20 RBI in 20 games in May...leads the majors in home runs in May and is tied for the lead in RBI (20)...*Ryan Dull* has stranded all 16 of his inherited runners, which are the most in the majors among relievers that have not allowed an inherited runner to score...*Danny Valencia* was reinstated from the 15-day disabled list May 6 and is 18-for-53 (.340) with nine runs, six home runs and 15 RBI in 14 games since his return.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1976** Bert Campaneris sets an Oakland record when he steals five bases in the A's 12-7 win against Minnesota..the A's stole seven bases in the game and an American League record 341 for the season...in **1994** Brent Gates singles in his first four at bats against Seattle after going 4 for 4 the day before to establish an Oakland record with eight consecutive hits...in **1995** Dennis Eckersley pitches the ninth inning in the A's 5-3 win over Baltimore to become the sixth reliever in major league history to reach 300 saves...in **2009** Jason Giambi homers off Arizona's Dan Haren in the fourth inning to become the 44th player in major league history to hit 400 home runs.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Kendall Graveman (1-6, 5.48 ERA)

FIVE-GAME LOSING STREAK: Is 0-5 with a 7.92 ERA (22 er in 25.0 ip) and .361 (39-for-122) opponents batting average over his last five starts after going 1-1 with a 2.04 ERA and .159 opponents average over his first three starts...the five-game losing streak is one short of his career high of six (July 10, 2015 to April 7, 2016)...is now 1-11 with a 5.64 ERA (51 er in 81.1 ip) over his last 16 starts dating back to July 10, 2015...went 6-4 with a 3.20 ERA over his first 18 career games, including 13 starts.

LOSSES: Is tied for second in the American League with six losses...has four losses in the month of May, which are tied for the most in the majors... it is the first time he has lost four games in a month in his career...the last A's pitcher to lose five games in a month is Brian Fuentes in May, 2011... over the last 11 years, the only A's starter to lose five games in a month is Dallas Braden in Sept., 2010.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed 10 home runs, which is tied for third most in the American League...has issued 13 of his 17 walks to lefties... last year he issued 24 of his 38 walks to lefties...has a .270 (17-for-63) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .169 (11-for-65) the second time and .488 (21-for-43) after that.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-3 with a 7.91 ERA (17 er in 19.1 ip) in four starts on the road compared to 0-3 with a 3.47 ERA (9 er in 23.1 ip) in four starts at home...has surrendered nine home runs in 19.1 innings on the road but just one in 23.1 innings at home.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received no run support in three of his eight starts and three runs of support or fewer in all eight of his starts...his season run support average is 2.32 (11 rs in 42.2 ip) is third lowest in the American League among pitchers with at least 40 innings pitched...is 0-5 in five starts with two runs of support or fewer, 1-1 in three starts with three runs of support or more...is now 1-14 in 18 career starts with two runs of support or fewer, 6-1 in 11 starts with three runs of support or more.

THIS AND THAT: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 0-4 with an 6.93 ERA (19 er in 24.2 ip) in five starts on four or five days rest compared to 1-2 with a 3.50 ERA (7 er in 18.0 ip) in three starts on six days rest or more...allowed a career-high 10 hits in back-to-back starts on April 25 at Detroit and May 2 against Seattle and is the first A's pitcher with at least 10 hits in back-to-back starts since Brandon McCarthy (April 16-21, 2012)... allowed four hits or fewer in each of his first three starts, joining John Odom (1969) and Mike Norris (1980) as the only pitchers in Oakland history on an Opening Day roster to allow four hits or fewer while tossing five innings or more in each of their first three starts

SIX-GAME LOSING STREAK SNAPPED: Picked up his first win of the season April 20 at New York (AL), which snapped a career-high six-game losing streak dating back to last year...that was the longest losing streak by an A's pitcher since Tyson Ross lost eight straight from May 19 to Sept. 24, 2012...compiled a 5.04 ERA and .267 opponents batting during the streak, which spanned 10 starts from July 10, 2015 to April 12, 2016.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-1 loss to Chicago (AL) April 7 in Oakland...shutout the White Sox on two hits over the first five innings, but Mat Latos blanked the A's on one hit over the first six innings...the scored was tied at 0-0 when he walked Cabrera to lead off the sixth...Abreau followed with a two-run home run and Graveman left after 5.1 innings trailing 2-0.

SECOND START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on April 12 in Oakland...allowed just one run in 6.0 innings and it came in the second inning...walked Pujols to start the inning and Calhoun singled him over to third...Simmons then grounded into a double play and Graveman was relived by Axford to start the seventh with the A's lead-ing 3-1...Oakland built a 4-1 lead before Madson allowed two runs in the eighth and Doolittle surrendered two in the ninth.

THIRD START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-2 win at New York (AL) on April 20...it was his first win since July 4, 2015 against Seattle... struck out a career-high eight batters on a career-high tying 111 pitches... allowed a one-out solo home run to Gregorius in the second inning, but that was the only run he would surrender in 6.1 innings of work...struck out in the fifth inning in his first professional at bat.

FOURTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-3 loss at Detroit April 25...allowed a career-high 10 hits...surrendered single runs in each of the first two innings on a Cabrera home run in the first and an Aviles RBI single in the second...then yielded a three-run home run to Cabrera followed by a solo home run by Victory Martinez in the fifth and left after 4.2 innings trailing 6-0.

FIFTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-3 loss to Seattle last Monday in Oakland...allowed a career-high tying 10 hits for the sec-

SIXTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 11-3 loss at Baltimore on May 8...yielded a career-high four home runs, which are the most allowed by an A's starting pitcher since May 6, 2013 at Cleveland when Jarrod Parker also allowed four home runs...the A's scored three times in the first but he allowed a two-run home run to Machado in the bottom of the first...allowed back-to-back home runs to Alvarez and Schoop in the second and a two-run home run to Trumbo i the third...left after 2.2 innings trailing 6-2.

SEVENTH START: He lost his fourth consecutive start in the A's 6-0 loss at Tampa Bay May 14...allowed a two-run home run to Miller in the third inning...also yielded two runs in the sixth inning on a Pearce sacrifice fly and a Kiermaier RBI single...Andriese shut out the A's on two hits, no walks and a hit batter.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-1 to New York (AL) last Thursday in Oakland...allowed a RBI double to Beltran in the third inning but the A's came back to tie the game in the fourth...then allowed a RBI double to Hicks in the sixth inning and was relieved by Rzepczynski after allowing two runs in 4.2 innings.

RHP Zach Neal (0-0, 9.00 ERA): Will be recalled from Triple-A Nashville tomorrow for his second stint with the A's this year...will be making his first Major League start...was selected from Nashville May 11 and made his ML debut that night at Boston in relief (3.0 ip, 4 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 so)...was optioned back to Triple-A May 13...went 5-1 with a 2.53 ERA and .225 opponents batting average in seven starts with the Sounds...walked just four batters in 42.2 innings, an average of 0.84 per nine innings...went 5-0 with a 2.63 ERA over his final six starts, including 3-0 with a 0.84 ERA in three starts in May...was originally selected by the Florida organization in the 17th round of the 2010 First-Year Player Draft...was released March 26, 2013 and signed with the Oakland organization two days later...is 50-47 with a 3.70 ERA in 149 games, 134 starts, in seven seasons in the minors overall... has issued just 161 walks in 805.2 innings (1.80 per nine innings).

- The A's bullpen posted a 2.46 ERA over its first 28 games, yielded 34 runs over a seven-game span May 4-11 (9.79 ERA) and has a 2.81 ERA (10 er in 32.0 ip) in 11 games since then...has a 3.95 ERA overall, which is the fourth highest in the American League.
- Has allowed just 15-of-77 (19.5%) inherited runners to score, which is the best percentage in the AL and ranks second in the majors (New York-NL, 19.4%).
- Has tossed 157.1 innings, which are the most in the AL and fourth most in the majors.
