OAKLAND ATHLETICS (20-28) VS. DETROIT TIGERS (23-23)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost six of the last seven games after winning five of the previous six contests...are now a season-high eight games under .500 at 20-28 (.426)...that is tied for the second worst record in the American League...are in a tie for fourth place in the AL West and are a season-high nine games behind first place Seattle...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 14 days in third, seven days tied for third, 14 days in fourth and four days tied for fourth...were swept in a four-game series by New York (AL) last weekend...it marked the first time the A's were swept in a four-game series in Oakland since April 26-29, 1999 against Cleveland, a span of 78 four-game series at home without being swept...the four-game losing streak was the A's fourth of four or more games this year.

IN MAY: The A's are 7-16 (.304) in May and have clinched a losing record in the month for the second consecutive season and eighth time in the last 12 years...went 11-19 (.367) in May last year...have the second worst record in the American League in May (Minnesota, 5-17)...have a 6.311 ERA (140 er in 199.2 ip), which is second highest in the majors (Minnesota, 6.314)...have finished May with an ERA of 6.00 or more just once in Oakland history (6.59 in 1997)...allowed four home runs Wednesday and now have 38 in May, which is the fourth highest May home run total in Oakland history (41 in 1997, 40 in 1994, 39 in 1982)...lead the majors in home runs in May and are tied for the second fewest saves (3).

PITCHING: The A's allowed 13 runs on a season-high tying 17 hits on Wednesday...it marked the fifth time in the last 17 games the A's allowed at least 11 runs in a game and the 10th time they allowed 10 or more hits...have a 6.69 ERA (109 er in 146.2 ip), .299 (180-for-602) opponents batting average and 30 home runs allowed over that 17-game stretch, which dates back to May 8...now have a 4.88 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...also have the second highest opponents on-base percentage (.336) and slugging percentage (.443) and the third highest batting average (.270)...rank third in most extra base hits (156), tied for third in most hit batters (19) and fourth in most walks (154).

STARTING PITCHING: Zach Neal tossed 4.0 innings Wednesday night after Kendall Graveman logged 4.1 innings on Tuesday...it marks the fifth time this year A's starters have tossed fewer than five innings in consecutive games...starters are 7-19 with a 6.69 ERA (119 er in 160.0 ip) over the last 31 games dating back to April 23...that includes 5-1 with a 1.63 ERA (7 er in 38.2 ip) in six starts by Rich Hill and 2-18 with an 8.31 ERA (112 er in 121.1 ip) in 25 starts by everyone else...starters are 13-24 with a 5.25 ERA (150 er in 257.0 ip) overall...the losses are the most in the majors and the ERA is second highest in the American League (Minnesota, 5.38) and third highest in the majors (Colorado, 5.49)...Hill tossed 8.0 innings Monday night, snapping an Athletics record streak of 83 consecutive games with seven or fewer innings by the starting pitcher dating back to Aug. 23, 2015...the A's are 6-1 when the starter pitches at least seven innings.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .181 (50-for-276) with 22 runs scored over the last seven games (3.1 runs per game) after hitting .282 with 68 runs scored (5.2 runs per game) over the previous 13 contests...have a .294 on-base percentage, which is the lowest mark in the American League and fourth lowest in the majors...have the second fewest walks in the AL (109) but are tied for the third most intentional walks (9)...have the second fewest doubles (65), third fewest extra base hits (122), fourth lowest slugging percentage (.384) and fourth fewest runs scored (186) and strikeouts (331).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have not committed an error in the last three games but have 36 for the season, which is seven more than any other American League team and third most in the majors...rank third in the AL in double plays (51).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin a six-game homestand tonight against Detroit (three games) and Minnesota (three games)...went 3-4 on the last homestand against Texas (3-0) and New York-AL (0-4) and are 8-15 (.348) at home...are tied with Minnesota for the worst home record in the American League and third worst in the majors...it is the third worst record after 23 home games in Oakland history (7-16 in 1994 and 2015)...a loss tonight would tie the 2015 club for second worst after 24 games (7-17 in 1994)...this homestand concludes as a 16-game stretch from May 16 to June 1 where the A's played 13 games at home...went 1-2 on the last road trip to Seattle and are 12-13 (.480) on the road...are batting .263 (233-for-887)

and are averaging 4.36 runs per game (109 runs in 25 games) on the road compared to .222 (166-for-749) with an average of 3.35 runs per game (77 runs in 23 games) at home...are averaging the second fewest runs per game at home in the AL and have the second lowest batting average...have a 5.80 ERA (139 er in 215.2 ip) on the road compared to 3.91 (90 er in 207.0 ip) at home...have the second highest road ERA in the majors.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's had their first walk-off loss of the season Tuesday night at Seattle...are 7-3 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied for the second most last at bats wins in the majors (Seattle, 8) and have the fourth best winning percentage (.700)...are 6-8 in one-run games and have now dropped five of their last six one-run decisions after winning five of the first eight...are 2-0 in extra inning games...are tied for the second fewest extra inning games in the American League and tied for third in most wins.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's began the season by facing three consecutive left-handers, faced righties in 32 of 34 games from April 7-May 14 and lefties in five of six games from May 15-20...have faced righties in each of the last five games...are 5-5 (.500) in games started by a left-handed pitcher compared to 15-23 (.395) against righties...are hitting .235 against lefties, .247 against righties.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have been successful in 7-of-9 (77.8%) replay challenges, which is the best percentage in the majors...the nine challenges are tied for sixth fewest in the majors...the A's are averaging 2 hours and 57 minutes per game, which is second fastest in the majors to Toronto (2:54)...A's pinch hitters are 8 for their last 25 (.320) after starting the season 0-for-12...are tied for second in the American League in pinch hits (8) and tied for third in plate appearances (38)...the A's designated hitter has entered the game defensively six times this year...from 1996-2015, the A's had the DH enter the game on defense a total of 11 times...the last time they did it at least six times in a season was 1995 when it happened seven times.

THE DISABLED LIST: After reinstating Josh Phegley from the disabled list today, the A's have a Major League leading 11 players on the DL (H. Alvarez, R.J. Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doubront, Fuld, Gray, Hendriks, Parker, Reddick, Sogard)...have had at least nine players on the DL every day since May 9, including a season-high 13 from May 21-24, which are the most players the A's have had on the DL at one time since at least 1979...have had at least six players on the DL all year and have used the DL 14 times...R.J. Alvarez, Bassitt, Doubront, Fuld, Parker and Sogard are on the 60-day DL...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. TIGERS: The A's trail in the season series 1-3 after losing three of four at Detroit in April...over the previous six seasons, the A's have won two season series, lost two and split two...are 22-25 against the Tigers since the start of the 2010 season...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 250-245 against the Tigers...that includes 138-109 in Oakland, 110-134 in Detroit and 2-2 in Las Vegas...all-time, the A's are 918-998 against the Tigers.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Coco Crisp is batting .284 (29-for-102) with 17 RBI over his last 26 games after hitting .158 with one RBI over his first 12 contests...**Khris Davis** hit his 10th home run in the month of May on Wednesday, which is the most in the majors...is the first Athletic to hit 10 home runs in a month since Josh Reddick had 10 in May, 2012...the last Athletic with more than 10 home runs in a month is Jason Giambi, who hit 13 in Sept. 2000...**Ryan Dull** has stranded all 18 of his inherited runners, which are the most in the majors among relievers that have not allowed an inherited runner to score...**Danny Valencia** was reinstated from the 15-day disabled list May 6 and is 19-for-60 (.317) with 10 runs, six home runs and 15 RBI in 16 games since his return.

In **1956** Art Ditmar scatters 10-hits and shuts out the Tigers 5-0 in the second game of a doubleheader...in **1984** Rickey Henderson is 3 for 3 with three stolen bases in the A's 7-1 win over New York...in **1985** Dwayne Murphy leads off the bottom of the 10th inning with a home run to lift the A's to a 2-1 win over the New York Yankees.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (1-2, 7.62 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was selected from Triple-A Nashville April 29 and is scheduled to make his sixth start of the season and his career...the six starts will be tied for second among American League rookies...has a 7.62 ERA, which is the highest in the AL among all pitchers with at least 25.0 innings pitched and second highest in the majors (Simon, CIN 10.16)...has a 3.60 ERA (4 er in 10.0 ip) in the first two innings compared to a 10.13 ERA (18 er in 16.0 ip) from the third inning on.

LAST TWO, FIRST THREE: Is 1-1 with a 4.05 ERA (6 er in 13.1 ip) and .204 (10-for-49) opponents batting average over his last two starts after going 0-1 with a 11.37 ERA and .382 opponents average over his first three starts...has not allowed a home run over his last two starts after surrendering four over his first three...yielded at least four runs in each of his first three starts to become the second pitcher in Oakland history to allow at least four runs in each of his first three Major League appearances...the other is Vida Blue (July 20-Aug. 3, 1969).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has held left-handed hitters to a .130 (3-for-23) batting average...right-handers are batting .346 (28-for-81) with all four of his home runs and six of his eight walks...has a .944 OPS against righties, .374 against lefties...has a .250 (16-for-64) average with the bases empty, .375 (15-for-40) with runners on...has a .209 (9-for-43) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .306 (11-for-36) the second time and .440 (11-for-25) after that...has surrendered three of his four home runs in his first 15 pitches of a game...opponents are 10-for-19 (.526) with a home run and nine RBI when putting the first pitch in play...has not allowed a hit to the opponents number eight hitter (0-for-10).

FIRST START: He had a no decision in his Major League debut, a 7-4 A's win over Houston April 29 in Oakland...had just 42 minor league appearances, all starts, in three professional seasons...became the 45th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut, the first since Dan Straily on Aug. 3, 2012 against Toronto...allowed a leadoff home run to Gattis in the second inning but the A's came back with two in the bottom of the second...allowed a RBI single to Gattis in the sixth to tie the game and was relieved by Doolittle with no outs and runners on first and second...Doolittle allowed both runs to score but the A's tied the game in the eighth and won it on a three-run home run by Alonso in the ninth.

SECOND START: He had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 9-8 loss to Seattle in Oakland on May 4...shutout the Mariners on two hits and a walk over the first four innings and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed four runs in the fifth inning...Marte had a RBI double, Cano a RBI single and Cruz a two-run home run...the A's then scored six times in the bottom of the fifth to give him an 8-4 lead but the bullpen allowed two runs in the sixth inning and three more in the seventh for the blown save (Axford).

THIRD START: He had the first decision of his career, a loss in the A's 13-5 loss at Boston May 10...allowed a lead-off home run to Betts in the first inning and Ramirez added a two-run homer...retired the side in order in the second but then allowed five runs in the third inning while recording just two outs...Pedroia had a RBI double, Bogaerts and Young had RBI singles and Shaw chased him from the game with a two-run double.

FOURTH START: He picked up his first Major League win in the A's 3-1 victory over Texas May 16 in Oakland...shutout the Rangers on two hits and a walk over the first six innings...had a 2-0 lead with runners on second and third and one out in the seventh inning...allowed a sacrifice fly to Stubbs and was relieved by Doolittle who got the final out of the inning.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-1 loss to New York (AL) last Saturday in Oakland...retired each of the first nine batters he faced before allowing the first four batters to reach base in the fourth inning...yielded four runs in the fourth on a Beltrna RBI single, a Hicks sacrifice fly and a Refsnyder two-run double...also allowed a RBI double to Castro in the seventh.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 1-1 with a 4.40 ERA in five games, including three starts...struck out 16 batters in 14.1 innings...allowed a .241 (14-for-58) opponents batting average...surrendered just one run in his first three appearances (1 er in 6.2 ip, 1.35 ERA)...then yielded seven in his final two, both starts (6 er in 7.2 ip, 7.04 ERA).

2015 RECAP: Was acquired by the A's from Kansas City in the Ben Zobrist deal at the trading deadline and went 6-0 with a 1.90 ERA in seven starts with Double-A Midland...began the year in extended spring training with the Royals and combined for a 1-1 record and a 3.69 ERA in seven starts with the Royals affiliate in the Arizona Rookie League, Single-A Wilmington and Double-A Northwest Arkansas...was 7-1 with a 2.66 ERA in 14 starts overall...struck out 90 batters in 74.1 innings (10.90 per nine innings).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .243 opponents batting average, including .198 (36-for-182) against right-handed hitters compared to .330 (31-for-94) against left-handers...surrendered three of his five home runs to lefties for a .511 slugging percentage...held righties to a mark of .275...opponents batted .323 with a .421 on-base percentage when leading off an inning.

THIS AND THAT: Compiled a 1.29 ERA in the first inning, a 4.20 ERA in innings two through four and a 0.46 ERA from the fifth inning on...his teams were 10-4 (.714) in his starting assignments, including 7-0 at Midland...allowed one run or fewer in eight of his 14 starts, including no runs four times.

MORE MINORS: Made one start with the Royals affiliate in the Arizona Rookie League on June 24 against the Reds (no decision, 1.80 ERA)...was transferred to Single-A Wilmington June 29 and went 1-0 with a 3.66 ERA in four starts with the Blue Rocks...was transferred to Northwest Arkansas July 17 where he went 0-1 with a 5.14 ERA in two starts before he was traded to the A's with Aaron Brooks for Ben Zobrist and cash considerations, July 28...his six wins with Midland were the most in the Texas League following the trade...went 2-0 with a 2.89 ERA over his first three starts...then did not allow a run in three of his final four regular season starts, going 4-0 with a 1.13 ERA...tossed a season-high 7.0 scoreless innings in his first outing with Midland July 31 against Corpus Christi...allowed just three hits, did not walk a batter and struck out nine to earn Texas League Pitcher of the Week honors for the week of July 27 to Aug. 2...matched his season high with 7.0 scoreless innings Aug. 29 against Frisco...struck out a season-high 13 and did not walk a batter while tossing 6.0 scoreless innings in his final regular season start Sept. 3 at San Antonio and earned TL Pitcher of the Week honors for a second time (Aug. 31-Sept. 7)...went 1-0 with a 1.20 ERA in two postseason starts for the Texas League Champion RockHounds (15.0 ip, 10 h, 4 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 15 so)...pitched for Mesa in the Arizona Fall League following the season and was named to the AFL Top Prospects Team after going 0-2 with a 3.86 ERA in six starts...led the league in strikeouts (33).

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: Is 16-9 with a 2.82 ERA in 42 games, all starts, in three professional seasons...has 257 strikeouts in 214.0 innings, an average of 10.81 per nine innings...has surrendered just 10 home runs (0.42 per nine innings)...was originally drafted by Kansas City as a Competitive Balance pick following the first round of the 2013 draft and was dealt to the A's just prior to the 2015 trading deadline in the Ben Zobrist deal.

RHP Jesse Hahn (1-2, 4.07 ERA):	Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville May 17 for his second stint with the A's this year and is 0-1 with a 5.11 ERA in two starts since his return...was recalled for the first time April 30 and went 1-1 with a 3.00 ERA in two starts before he was optioned to Nashville May 8...has allowed five home runs in 24.1 innings this year (1.85 per nine innings) after surrendering nine home runs in 170.0 innings over his first two seasons (0.48 per nine innings)...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 5-4 A's loss to New York (AL) last Sunday in Oakland (5.2 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 4 er, 3 so)...is 2-0 with a 0.56 ERA (16.0 ip, 9 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 10 so, 0 hr) in two career appearances against Detroit, both starts last year...was 1-1 with a 1.93 ERA in five starts with Nashville...did not allow a home run in 23.1 innings but issued 10 walks...went 0-1 with an 11.15 ERA in five starts this spring and was optioned to Nashville March 29
