RECENT RESULTS: The Tigers had their four-game winning streak snapped on Wednesday as they suffered an 8-5 loss to the Phillies at Comerica Park. Cameron Maybin had a pair of hits, scored two runs and had one RBI, while Jose Iglesias was 2x4 with a run scored and a RBI. Miguel Cabrera, J.D. Martinez and Victor Martinez each added a hit and a RBI in the loss. Anibal Sanchez started for Detroit and took the loss after allowing six runs, three earned, on eight hits with one walk and five strikeouts in 6.0 innings. The Tigers begin a six-game road trip tonight with the first game of a three-game series at Oakland. Following the series vs. the Athletics, the Tigers continue their West Coast trip with a three-game series at the Los Angeles Angels.

TIGERS TO RECALL BOYD FROM TRIPLE A TOLEDO PRIOR TO TOMORROW'S GAME: The Tigers today announced that lefthanded pitcher Matt Boyd will be recalled from Triple A Toledo prior to tomorrow's game and will start tomorrow. Boyd has started eight games with Toledo and has a 1-3 record with a 2.06 ERA (48.0IP/11ER) and 41 strikeouts. A corresponding move will be announced prior to tomorrow's game.

OFFICIAL SCORING CHANGE: Following a review by Major League Baseball, the infield single by Jose Iglesias in the fifth inning of Wednesday's game vs. Philadelphia has been changed to a fielding error on Andres Blanco. The change makes two of the three runs scored in that inning unearned.

MAYBIN EXTENDS HITTING STREAK TO NINE GAMES: Cameron Maybin continued his hot start to the season on Wednesday, going 2x5 with two runs scored and one RBI. Maybin has hit safely in all nine games he's played in since being activated from the disabled list on May 16 and is batting .545 (18x33) with nine runs scored, a home run, six RBI and four stolen bases. Maybin has posted multiple hits in seven of the nine games he's played in this season.

MIGGY DRIVES 'EM IN: Miguel Cabrera had one RBI in Wednesday's game and has now driven in at least one run in four straight games and in eight of his last 11 games. Cabrera has recorded a MLB-best 17 RBI over his last 13 games dating back to May 12.

RECAPING THE HOMESTAND: The Tigers finished their recently completed homestand with a 7-2 record, going 3-0 vs. Minnesota, 2-1 vs. Tampa Bay and 2-1 vs. Philadelphia. Detroit hit .318 (98x308) as a team and averaged 6.1 runs per game over the nine games. On the mound, Tigers pitchers compiled a 4.00 ERA (81.0IP/36ER) during the homestand. Cameron Maybin hit .545 (18x33) with a home run and six RBI during the homestand, while Miguel Cabrera posted a .471 (16x34) batting average with two doubles, one triple, five home runs and 11 RBI. J.D. Martinez hit .351 (13x37) with three doubles, one triple, four home runs and nine RBI over the nine-game homestand.

TIGERS TIDBITS: Warwick Saupold pitched a scoreless inning on Wednesday and has started his major league career with 4.1 consecutive scoreless innings...Mike Aviles hit a double in the third inning of Wednesday's game for his first extra base hit of the season.

KINSLER LOOKING FOR THE LEFTY: Ian Kinsler has had success this season against lefthanded pitchers. Entering tonight's game, Kinsler is batting .421 (16x38) with one double, three home runs and eight RBI vs. southpaws. Kinsler's .421 batting average vs. lefties ranks fourth in the American League.

VMART, MIGGY ON THE MARK VS. OAKLAND: Victor Martinez and Miguel Cabrera have compiled impressive numbers in their career against the Athletics. Martinez is hitting .348 (95x273) with 25 runs scored, 22 doubles, six home runs and 31 RBI

in 74 games vs. Oakland. Cabrera is batting .343 (81x236) with 46 runs scored, 17 doubles, 19 home runs and 61 RBI in 64 career games vs. Oakland. Martinez leads all active players with a .348 batting average vs. the A's, while his .405 on-base percentage ranks second. Cabrera leads all active players with a .434 on-base percentage and a .657 slugging percentage, while he is second with a .343 batting average. Martinez enters tonight's game having hit safely in 13 of his last 14 games vs. Oakland, while Cabrera has hit safely in 23 of his last 27 games vs. the Athletics.

ON THE ROAD: The Tigers tonight begin a six-game West Coast road trip, which includes three games at Oakland (May 27-29) and three games at the Los Angeles Angels (May 30-June 1). Detroit has posted an 11-12 record on the road this season. The Tigers are hitting .264 (215x815) as a team on the road, while the pitching staff has a 4.42 ERA (197.1IP/97ER) away from Comerica Park.

NOTES ON THE SKIPPER: Brad Ausmus is in his third season at the helm for the Tigers after being named the 37th manager in Tigers history on November 3, 2013.

- Enters tonight's game with a 187-182 (.507) record as the Tigers manager.
- Led the Tigers to a 90-72 record and a postseason berth in his first year as manager in 2014, joining Hughie Jennings (1907), Mickey Cochrane (1934) and Jim Leyland (2006) in accomplishing the feat.
- Became the 14th manager in Tigers history to have also played at the major league level for Detroit, joining Alan Trammell, Dick Tracewski, Billy Martin, Bob Swift, Billy Hitchcock, Fred Hutchinson, Mickey Cochrane, Del Baker, Bucky Harris, George Moriarty, Ty Cobb, Hughie Jennings and Bobby Lowe.
- Managed Team Israel in the 2013 World Baseball Classic.
- Spent 18 seasons as a catcher at the major league level with the Padres (1993-96), Tigers (1996, 1999-2000), Astros (1997-98, 2001-07) and Dodgers (2009-10)...made eight postseason appearances as a player, including two trips to the National League Championship Series and one to the World Series.
- Ranks third all-time among catchers with 12,839 putouts, while he is ninth with 15,840.2 innings played and 10th with 1,766 games started.

LAMONT TO MANAGE TIGERS TONIGHT: Bench coach Gene Lamont will serve as the Tigers manager tonight as Brad Ausmus is away from the team due to a family matter.

THIS DATE IN TIGERS HISTORY: On this date in 1939, Charlie Gehringer hit for the cycle for the first time in his career in a 12-5 win vs. St. Louis. Gehringer hit for the cycle in order, hitting a single, double, triple and home run. On this date in 2004, Carlos Peña went 6x6 with two home runs, five RBI and four runs scored in a 17-7 win over Kansas City.

GREENE INJURY REHAB UPDATE: Righthanded pitcher Shane Greene made an injury rehab start with Triple A Toledo on Wednesday and threw 3.1 shutout innings with four hits allowed and seven strikeouts. In two injury rehab starts between Toledo and Single A West Michigan, Greene has a 0.00 ERA (6.1IP/0ER) with six hits allowed, one walk and 12 strikeouts.

ABOUT FULMER: Fulmer is making the sixth start of his major league career tonight at Oakland.

LAST TIME OUT: Fulmer earned his third win of the season on Saturday vs. Tampa Bay, allowing one run on four hits with one walk and 11 strikeouts in 7.0 innings. Fulmer became just the fourth Tigers pitcher since 1913 to strike out 11-or-more batters in one of his first five career appearances. The other pitchers to do so include Jack Morris on July 31, 1977 at Texas, Denny McLain on September 29, 1963 at Baltimore and Ralph Comstock on September 1, 1913 vs. St. Louis.

VS. OAKLAND: Fulmer is making his first career appearance against the Athletics tonight.

ON THE ROAD: Fulmer has made four road starts this season and has compiled a 2-1 record with a 6.52 ERA (19.1IP/14ER) and 22 strikeouts.

PICKING UP THE WIN IN HIS BIG LEAGUE DEBUT: Fulmer recorded the first win of his major league career on April 29 at Minnesota. Fulmer became the 41st Tigers pitcher since 1913 to earn the win in his major league debut and the first since Kyle Ryan on August 30, 2014 at Chicago (AL).

AT TOLEDO: Fulmer has made three starts at Triple A Toledo this season and has a 1-1 record with a 4.11 ERA (15.1IP/7ER) and 20 strikeouts.

PILING UP THE PUNCHOUTS: Through three starts with Triple A Toledo this season, Fulmer has struck out 20 batters in 15.1 innings. At the time of his promotion, Fulmer ranked second among International League starters with 11.74 strikeouts per nine innings.

EASTERN LEAGUE PLAYER OF THE YEAR: Fulmer was named the Eastern League Player of the Year in 2015 after compiling a 10-3 record with a 2.14 ERA (117.2IP/28ER) and 116 strikeouts in 21 starts between Binghamton and Erie. He led the Eastern League with a 2.14 ERA and a .769 winning percentage, while he was fourth with a 1.10 WHIP and a .228 opponents batting average. Fulmer led all Eastern League starters with 8.87 strikeouts per nine innings, while he was third with 10.02 baserunners per nine innings and fourth with a .228 opponent batting average. Fulmer was also selected to the Eastern League postseason All-Star Team.

TIGERS TOP PROSPECT: Fulmer was named the top prospect in the Tigers organization following the 2015 season by *Baseball America* and MLB.com. Overall, Fulmer is ranked as the 47th-best prospect in baseball by *Baseball America* and the 50th-best prospect by MLB.com. He was also named a Minor League All-Star and a Double A All-Star by *Baseball America* in 2015.

ROUGH ON RIGHTIES: Fulmer was tough on righthanded hitters in 2015, holding righties to a .212 (55x260) batting average, while lefties batted .230 (49x213) against Fulmer.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES: Fulmer was acquired by the Tigers along with Luis Cessa from the New York Mets in exchange for Yoenis Cespedes on July 31, 2015. Fulmer was originally selected by the Mets in the first round (44th overall) of the June 2011 MLB draft.

ABOUT MATT: Matt Boyd will make his second appearance overall and his first start of the season tomorrow afternoon at Oakland.

LAST TIME OUT: Boyd's only appearance with the Tigers this season came on April 24 vs. Cleveland as he threw 4.2 shutout innings in relief with two hits allowed, three walks and two strikeouts. In his most recent start with Triple A Toledo on May 20 at Lehigh Valley, Boyd received a no decision after allowing two runs on six hits with one walk and nine strikeouts in 6.0 innings.

VS. OAKLAND: Boyd will be making his first career appearance vs. the Athletics tomorrow afternoon.

AT TOLEDO: Boyd has started eight games this season with Triple A Toledo and has a 1-3 record with a 2.06 ERA (48.0IP/11ER) and 41 strikeouts. Boyd currently ranks eighth in the International League with a 2.06 ERA.

EARNING HIS FIRST BIG LEAGUE WIN: Boyd picked up the first win of his major league career in his Tigers debut on August 5, 2015 vs. Kansas City. Boyd allowed just one run on seven hits with two strikeouts in 7.0 innings vs. the Royals.

NAMED A MINOR LEAGUE ALL-STAR: Boyd was selected as a 2015 minor league all-star by *Baseball America*. In 19 starts in the minors last season, Boyd had a 9-2 record with a 1.65 ERA (114.2IP/21ER) and 108 strikeouts. He led all qualified starters in the minor leagues in WHIP (0.85) and opponent average (.176), while he was second in ERA.
