### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (20-29) VS. DETROIT TIGERS (24-23)

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have lost three straight and seven of the last eight games to fall a season-high nine games under .500 at 20-29 (.408)...that is tied for the second worst record in the American League...are tied for fourth place in the AL West and are a season-high nine games behind first place Seattle for the second consecutive day...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 14 days in third, seven days tied for third, 14 days in fourth and five days tied for fourth.

**IN MAY:** The A's are 7-17 (.292) in May, which is the second worst record in the American League (Minnesota, 6-17) and third worst in the majors (Cincinnati, 6-18)...it is currently the second worst May in Oakland history (7-20, .259 in 2005; 8-19, .296 in 1994)...have clinched a losing record in May for the second consecutive season and eighth time in the last 12 years...went 11-19 (.367) in May last year...have a 6.21 ERA (144 er in 208.2 ip), which is the highest in the majors (Minnesota, 6.12)...have finished May with an ERA of 6.00 or more just once in Oakland history (6.59 in 1997)...have allowed 39 home runs, which is tied for the third highest May home run total in Oakland history (41 in 1997, 40 in 1994, 39 in 1982)...lead the majors in home runs in May and are tied for the second fewest saves (3).

**PITCHING:** The A's have allowed 10 or more hits in 11 of the last 18 games...have a 6.53 ERA (113 er in 155.2 ip), .299 (191-for-638) opponents batting average and 31 home runs allowed over that span, which dates back to May 8...now have a 4.86 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...also have the second highest opponents batting average (.270), on-base percentage (.337) and slugging percentage (.446)...are tied for third in most walks (157) and hit batters (19).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 7-20 with a 6.61 ERA (122 er in 166.0 ip) over the last 32 games dating back to April 23...that includes 5-1 with a 1.63 ERA (7 er in 38.2 ip) in six starts by Rich Hill and 2-19 with an 8.13 ERA (115 er in 127.1 ip) in 26 starts by everyone else...starters are 13-25 with a 5.24 ERA (153 er in 263.0 ip) overall...the losses are the most in the majors and the ERA is second highest in the American League (Minnesota, 5.30) and third highest in the majors (Colorado, 5.34)...Hill tossed 8.0 innings Monday night, snapping an Athletics record streak of 83 consecutive games with seven or fewer innings by the starting pitcher dating back to Aug. 23, 2015...the A's are 6-1 when the starter pitches at least seven innings.

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .179 (55-for-308) with 23 runs scored over the last eight games (2.9 runs per game) after hitting .282 with 68 runs scored (5.2 runs per game) over the previous 13 contests...have a .292 on-base percentage, which is the lowest mark in the American League and third lowest in the majors...have the second fewest walks in the AL (110) but are tied for the third most intentional walks (9)...have the second fewest doubles (66), third lowest slugging percentage (.382), third fewest extra base hits (124) and fourth fewest runs scored (187) and strikeouts (336).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have gone a season-high tying four consecutive games without an error (April 28-May 1)...however, have 36 for the season, which is seven more than any other American League team and tied for third most in the majors...are tied for second in the AL in double plays (52).

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 0-1 on this six-game homestand against Detroit (0-1) and Minnesota (three games) and now have a season-high tying five-game home losing streak (April 7-15)...have not lost more than five straight home games since losing six in a row from April 21-May 7, 2014...went 3-4 on the last homestand against Texas (3-0) and New York-AL (0-4) and are 8-16 (.333) at home...have the worst home record in the American League and third worst in the majors...it is tied with the 2015 club for second worst after 24 games in Oakland history (7-17 in 1994)...this homestand concludes as a 16-game stretch from May 16 to June 1 where the A's played 13 games at home...went 1-2 on the last road trip to Seattle and are 12-13 (.480) on the road...are batting .263 (233-for-887) and are averaging 4.36 runs per game (109 runs in 25 games) on the road compared to .219 (171-for-781) with an average of 3.25 runs per game (78 runs in 24 games) at home...are averaging the second fewest runs per game at home in the AL and have the second lowest batting average...have a 5.80 ERA (139 er in 215.2 ip) on the road compared to 3.92 (94 er in 216.0 ip) at home...have the second highest road ERA in the AL.

**CLOSE CALLS:** The A's had their first walk-off loss of the season Tuesday night at Seattle...are 7-3 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied for the second most last at bats wins in the majors (Seattle, 8) and have the fourth best winning percentage (.700)...are 6-8 in one-run games and have now dropped five of their last six one-run decisions after winning five of the first eight...are 2-0 in extra inning games...are tied for the second fewest extra inning games in the American League and tied for third in most wins.

**LEFT AND RIGHT:** The A's began the season by facing three consecutive left-handers, faced righties in 32 of 34 games from April 7-May 14 and lefties in five of six games from May 15-20...have faced righties in each of the last six games...are 5-5 (.500) in games started by a left-handed pitcher compared to 15-24 (.385) against righties...are hitting .234 against lefties, .245 against righties.

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's have been successful in 7-of-9 (77.8%) replay challenges, which is the best percentage in the majors...the nine challenges are tied for fifth fewest in the majors...the A's are averaging 2 hours and 57 minutes per game, which is second fastest in the majors to Toronto (2:54)...A's pinch hitters are tied for second in the American League in pinch hits (8) and rank third in plate appearances (39)...the A's designated hitter has entered the game defensively six times this year...from 1996-2015, the A's had the DH enter the game on defense a total of 11 times...the last time they did it at least six times in a season was 1995 when it happened seven times.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** After reinstating Josh Phegley from the disabled list yesterday, the A's have 11 players on the DL (H. Alvarez, R.J. Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doubront, Fuld, Gray, Hendriks, Parker, Reddick, Sogard)...have had at least nine players on the DL every day since May 9, including a season-high 13 from May 21-24, which are the most players the A's have had on the DL at one time since at least 1979...have had at least six players on the DL all year and have used the DL 14 times...R.J. Alvarez, Bassitt, Doubront, Fuld, Parker and Sogard are on the 60-day DL...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

**A's vs. TIGERS:** The A's have lost the season series as they are 1-4 against the Tigers with two games remaining...lost the first game in Oakland last night after dropping three of four at Detroit in April...over the last seven seasons, the A's have won two season series, lost three and split two...are 22-26 against Detroit over that span...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 250-246 against the Tigers...that includes 138-110 in Oakland, 110-134 in Detroit and 2-2 in Las Vegas...all-time, the A's are 918-999 against the Tigers...with one more A's loss, the Tigers will be the sixth team to defeat the A's 1000 times...the only other of the original eight American League teams that has not beat the A's 1000 times is the Brewers/Browns/Orioles (940).

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Coco Crisp** extended his hitting streak to 10 games yesterday (12-for-42, .286), his 13th career hitting streak of 10 or more games...is batting .283 (30-for-106) with 17 RBI over his last 27 games after hitting .158 with one RBI over his first 12 contests...**Khris Davis** hit his 10th home run in the month of May on Wednesday, which is the most in the majors...is the first Athletic to hit 10 home runs in a month since Josh Reddick had 10 in May, 2012...the last Athletic with more than 10 home runs in a month is Jason Giambi, who hit 13 in Sept. 2000...**Ryan Dull** has stranded all 19 of his inherited runners, which are the most in the majors among relievers that have not allowed an inherited runner to score.

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1972** George Hendrick hits his first Major League home run, a walk-off shot in the A's 5-4 win over Chicago...in **1980** Dwayne Murphy and Wayne Gross both steal home in the first inning of a 6-3 win over Kansas City at the Coliseum...the A's stole seven bases in the game...in **1996** Mark McGwire hits the 9000th home run in the history of the Athletics franchise in the A's 6-2 win over Boston.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Hahn (1-2, 4.07 ERA)

**FOR OPENERS:** Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville May 17 for his second stint with the A's this year and is 0-1 with a 5.11 ERA (7 er in 12.1 ip) in two starts since his return...was recalled for the first time April 30 and went 1-1 with a 3.00 ERA in two starts before he was optioned to Nashville May 8...the two starts were his first since July 1, 2015 against Colorado as he spent the final three months of the 2015 season on the disabled list with a strained right forearm.

**THE LONG BALL:** Has allowed five home runs in 24.1 innings this year (1.85 per nine innings) after surrendering nine home runs in 170.0 innings over his first two seasons (0.48 per nine innings)...the five home runs this year match his career high from last year...four of the five home runs he has allowed this year have been solo shots...six of his nine home runs entering the season came with runners on base...four of his five home runs this year and 11 of 14 in his career have been hit by left-handed hitters.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Opponents are hitting .339 (20-for-59) with the bases empty compared to .200 (7-for-35) with runners on...they are 1-for-13 (.077) with runners in scoring position...has allowed a .360 (9-for-25) batting average to hitters leading off an inning...last year, he yielded a .215 batting average, .277 on-base percentage and .290 slugging percentage to batters leading off an inning...however, opponents hit .318 with runners in scoring position...has a .182 (6-for-33) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup this year, .344 (21-for-61) after that.

**FIRST START:** He combined with Axford and Madson on a four-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win over Houston April 30 in Oakland...tossed 6.2 innings and allowed three of the hits...faced the minimum over the first five innings as the only two base runners were erased on double plays...allowed only one base runner past first base when Correa doubled and went to third on a ground out in the seventh.

**SECOND START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-2 loss in the night game of the day/night doubleheader at Baltimore May 7...walked a career-high tying four batters...retired six of the seven batters he faced over the first two innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 10.2 innings...then allowed four runs in the third on a Kim RBI ground out, a Jones a RBI single and a Davis a two-run home run...allowed another run in the fourth inning when Schoop scored on a grounded into double play.

**THIRD START:** He had a no decision in the A's 8-5 win over Texas in Oakland on May 17...allowed a career-high tying 10 hits...blanked the Rangers on two hits and a walk over the first three innings and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed back-to-back home runs to Mazara and Beltre to start the fourth...surrendered one more run in the inning when Fielder scored on a double play...left after 6.2 innings with a 4-3 lead but Madson allowed two runs in the ninth before Davis hit a walk-off grand slam in the bottom of the ninth for the win.

**LAST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-4 loss to New York (AL) last Sunday in Oakland...the A's scored a run in the first but he allowed solo home runs to McCann in the second and Ellsbury in the third... Oakland scored twice in the fifth to take a 3-2 lead and he was relieved by Axford with runners on first and second and two outs in the sixth...Axford allowed both of the inherited runners to score for the blown save.

**HAHN vs. DETROIT:** Is 2-0 with a 0.56 ERA (16.0 ip, 9 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 10 so, 0 hr) in two career appearances, both starts last year...the Tigers are the only team he has defeated more than once in his career...tossed his first career complete game in his first outing, a four-hit, 4-0 shutout on May 25 in Oakland...walked just one batter while striking out five...tossed a career-high 112 pitches...allowed only one base runner to advance into scoring position and that was Collins, who singled to lead off the fifth, went to second on a Semien error and third on a McCann grounded into double play...was aided by three double plays...also picked up the win in a 7-5 decision at Detroit June 4...shutout the Tigers on one hit and one walk over the first five innings and had a 6-0 lead when he allowed his only run in the sixth inning...Gose and Iglesias had back-to-back two-out singles and Gose scored on a Cabrera RBI single.

**WITH NASHVILLE:** Was 1-1 with a 1.93 ERA in five starts with Nashville...did not allow a home run in 23.1 innings but issued 10 walks (3.86 walks per nine innings)...yielded a .258 opponents batting average, including .243 (9-for-37) against left-handed hitters compared to .269 (14-for-52) against right-handers...opponents were 1-for-23 (.043) with two walks (.120 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...allowed three of his five runs in the first inning for a 5.40 ERA...had a 0.98 ERA from the second inning on.

**SPRING TRAINING RECAP:** Went 0-1 with an 11.15 ERA in five starts... allowed 13 runs on 18 hits in 6.1 innings over his final two starts and was optioned to Nashville March 29...opponents batted .382 (26-for-68) and he issued seven walks in 15.1 innings (4.11 per nine innings).

**2015 RECAP:** Went 6-6 with a 3.35 ERA in 16 starts in his first season with Oakland, a campaign that was cut short due to an injury...got off to a slow start as he went 1-4 with a 4.43 ERA over his first eight starts through May 20...then tossed a four-hit shutout May 25 against Detroit and went 5-2 with a 2.42 ERA over his final eight starts...was placed on the disabled list July 11 retroactive to July 6 with a right forearm strain and missed the remainder of the season.

**QUALIFICATIONS:** Yielded just five home runs in 96.2 innings, an average of 0.47 per nine innings...that was the lowest mark in the American League among pitchers with 90 or more innings pitched...using the same minimum, he also ranked third in the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.324) and fifth in OPS (.623).

**ERRORS AND UNEARNED RUNS:** Opponents reached base on an error 14 times, which was the most in the majors, despite missing half of the season...it tied for second most by an A's pitcher over the last 29 years to Tim Hudson's 15 in 2001...tied for fifth in the AL in unearned runs allowed (10).

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Allowed a .238 opponents batting average, which included a .185 (33-for-178) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .286 (55-for-192) against left-handers...now has a .200 (69-for-345) career average against righties...surrendered three of his five home runs in the sixth inning when he had an 8.74 ERA...had a 2.64 ERA in all other innings.

**NIGHT AND DAY:** Went 4-1 with a 1.52 ERA and .169 opponents batting average in six starts during the day compared to 2-5 with a 4.72 ERA and .284 opponents average in 10 starts at night...his career numbers are 7-3 with a 1.78 ERA (15 er in 75.2 ip) during the day, 7-9 with a 4.32 ERA (57 er in 118.2 ip) at night.

**DAYS REST:** Went 5-4 with a 2.94 ERA in 10 starts on four days rest, 1-2 with a 4.18 ERA in six starts on five days rest or more...is 9-5 with a 3.01 ERA (34 er in 101.2 ip) in 16 career starts on four days rest compared to 5-6 with a 3.64 ERA (36 er in 89.0 ip) in 16 starts on five days rest or more.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
<b>LHP Rich Hill (7-3, 2.18 ERA):</b> Is 4-0 with a 1.75 ERA and .183 opponents batting average over his last four starts and has not allowed a home run... has four wins in May, marking the first time in his career he has won four games in a month...picked up his seventh win of the season in his last start, which is tied for second in the American League and is the most by an A's pitcher before the end of May since 2003 when Mark Mulder had eight...ranks ninth in the AL with 65 strikeouts...that is tied for sixth most in Oakland history before the end of May...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 5-0 A's win at Seattle last Monday (8.0 ip, 8 h, 6 so)...is 1-0 with a 3.63 ERA (17.1 ip, 15 h, 7 r, 7 er, 5 bb, 24 so, 2 hr) in 14 career appearances, including one start, against Detroit...his only start and win came in his only outing this year, a 5-1 A's victory at Detroit April 26 (7.0 ip, 4 h, 8 so).

- The A's bullpen is 2-2 with three saves, four blown saves and a 6.60 ERA (54 er in 73.2 ip) over its last 21 games dating back to May 4... logged a 5-2 record, 10 saves, one blown save and a 2.46 ERA in its first 28 games...has a 4.27 ERA for the season, which is the third highest in the American League.
- Has allowed just 15-of-83 (18.1%) inherited runners to score, which is the best percentage in the majors.
- Has tossed 168.2 innings, which are the second most in the AL (Houston, 169.0) and fifth most in the majors.
- Is tied for the second fewest losses in the AL (4), is third in walks per nine innings (2.56) and strikeouts per walk (3.27) and tied for third in opponents grounded into double plays (15)...is tied for the third most home runs allowed (22) and has the fifth highest opponents batting average (.255).
