RECENT RESULTS: The Tigers opened their West Coast road trip with a 4-1 win over Oakland on Friday night at the Oakland Coliseum. Michael Fulmer started for Detroit and earned his fourth win of the season, throwing 7.2 shutout innings with three hits allowed, one walk and three strikeouts. Offensively, Ian Kinsler finished a home run shy of the cycle, going 3x5 with a run scored, a double and a triple, while Nick Castellanos hit his 10th home run of the season and went 2x4. The Tigers and Athletics play game two of their three-game series this afternoon. Following the series vs. Oakland, the Tigers continue their West Coast trip with a three-game series at the Los Angeles Angels.

BOYD RECALLED FROM TRIPLE A TOLEDO, MOYA OPTIONED: The Tigers today have recalled lefthanded pitcher Matt Boyd from Triple A Toledo and he will start today's game. Boyd has started eight games with Toledo and has a 1-3 record with a 2.06 ERA (48.0IP/11ER) and 41 strikeouts. In a corresponding move, the Tigers optioned outfielder Steven Moya to Triple A Toledo following last night's game.

FILTHY FULMER: Michael Fulmer threw a season-long 7.2 shutout innings in last night's game, allowing three hits with one walk and three strikeouts to improve his record to 4-1. With his performance, Fulmer became just the third Tigers pitcher since 1913 to throw at least 7.2 shutout innings and allow three hits-or-less in one of his first six career starts. The other Tigers pitcher to do so are Pat Underwood on May 31, 1979 at Toronto and Earl Whitehill on September 29, 1923 vs. Cleveland. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Fulmer is the third Tigers pitcher in the last 50 years to earn at least four wins in his first six major league games, joining Kip Young in 1978 and Zach Miner in 2006.

MAYBIN EXTENDS HITTING STREAK TO 10 GAMES: Cameron Maybin went 1x3 with a run scored, a double and a RBI in last night's game to extend his hitting streak to 10 games. Over the 10 games, Maybin is hitting .528 (19x36) with 10 runs scored, one double, one home run, seven RBI and four stolen bases. Maybin's 10-game streak is tied for the longest single-season hitting streak of his career (also, July 1-10, 2015 and July 14-24, 2011) and is tied for the third-longest active hitting streak in the American League. Since being reinstated from the disabled list on May 16, Maybin leads the American League with a .528 batting average and 19 hits, while he is second with a .575 on-base percentage and tied for third with 10 runs scored.

NICK CONTINUES TO HIT: Nick Castellanos had a pair of hits, including his 10th home run of the season in last night's game. Castellanos has hit safely in 32 of his last 39 games and is batting .352 (51x145) with 20 runs scored, 11 doubles, one triple, nine home runs and 29 RBI during that stretch.

KINSLER PILING UP THE MULTI-HIT GAMES: Ian Kinsler went 3x5 with a run scored, a double and a triple in last night's game to record his 19th multi-hit game of the season, which is tied for fourth in the American League. Kinsler is also tied for the AL lead with 41 runs scored, tied for fourth with 59 hits and tied for sixth with 101 total bases.

ALL ABOUT THAT BASE: Miguel Cabrera extended his streak of reaching base safely to 14 straight games last night, drawing a pair of walks. Cabrera has posted a .468 on-base percentage over the 14-game streak. The streak is tied for the sixth-longest active streak in the American League.

TURNING IT AROUND: The Tigers enter today's game having won nine of their last 11 games. The Tigers 9-2 record is the best in the American League since May 15. Over the last 11 games, the Tigers offense has scored 65 runs, averaging 5.9 runs per game, and is hitting .316 (121x385). The Tigers pitching staff has compiled a 3.73 ERA (99.0IP/41ER) during the stretch, including a 4.02 ERA (69.1IP/31ER) by Tigers starters and a 3.03 ERA (29.2IP/10ER) by Detroit relievers.

VMART, MIGGY ON THE MARK VS. OAKLAND: Victor Martinez and Miguel Cabrera have compiled impressive numbers in their career against the Athletics. Martinez is hitting .347 (96x277) with 25 runs scored, 22 doubles, six home runs and 31 RBI in 75 games vs. Oakland. Cabrera is batting .339 (81x239) with 46 runs scored, 17 doubles, 19 home runs and 61 RBI in 65 career games vs. Oakland. Martinez leads all active players with a .347 batting average vs. the A's, while his .403 on-base percentage ranks second. Cabrera leads all active players with a .433 on-base percentage and a .649 slugging percentage, while he is second with a .339 batting average. Martinez enters today's game having hit safely in 14 of his last 15 games vs. Oakland, while Cabrera has hit safely in 23 of his last 28 games vs. the Athletics.

ON THE ROAD: The Tigers are 1-0 on their current six-game West Coast road trip, which includes three games at Oakland (1-0) and three games at the Los Angeles Angels (May 30-June 1). Detroit has posted a 12-12 record on the road this season. The Tigers are hitting .266 (226x851) as a team on the road, while the pitching staff has a 4.27 ERA (206.1IP/98ER) away from Comerica Park.

NOTES ON THE SKIPPER: Brad Ausmus is in his third season at the helm for the Tigers after being named the 37th manager in Tigers history on November 3, 2013.

- Enters today's game with a 188-182 (.508) record as the Tigers manager.
- Led the Tigers to a 90-72 record and a postseason berth in his first year as manager in 2014, joining Hughie Jennings (1907), Mickey Cochrane (1934) and Jim Leyland (2006) in accomplishing the feat.
- Became the 14th manager in Tigers history to have also played at the major league level for Detroit, joining Alan Trammell, Dick Tracewski, Billy Martin, Bob Swift, Billy Hitchcock, Fred Hutchinson, Mickey Cochrane, Del Baker, Bucky Harris, George Moriarty, Ty Cobb, Hughie Jennings and Bobby Lowe.
- Managed Team Israel in the 2013 World Baseball Classic.
- Spent 18 seasons as a catcher at the major league level with the Padres (1993-96), Tigers (1996, 1999-2000), Astros (1997-98, 2001-07) and Dodgers (2009-10)...made eight postseason appearances as a player, including two trips to the National League Championship Series and one to the World Series.
- Ranks third all-time among catchers with 12,839 putouts, while he is ninth with 15,840.2 innings played and 10th with 1,766 games started.

ABOUT BOYD: Boyd is making his second appearance overall and his first start of the season this afternoon vs. Oakland.

LAST TIME OUT: Boyd's only appearance with the Tigers this season came on April 24 vs. Cleveland as he threw 4.2 shutout innings in relief with two hits allowed, three walks and two strikeouts. In his most recent start with Triple A Toledo on May 20 at Lehigh Valley, Boyd received a no decision after allowing two runs on six hits with one walk and nine strikeouts in 6.0 innings.

VS. OAKLAND: Fulmer is making his first career appearance against the Athletics today

ON THE ROAD: Boyd has made six appearances, including five starts, in his career on the road and has a 0-3 record with an 11.32 ERA (20.2IP/26ER) and 16 strikeouts.

AT TOLEDO: Boyd has started eight games this season with Triple A Toledo and has a 1-3 record with a 2.06 ERA (48.0IP/11ER) and 41 strikeouts. Boyd currently ranks eighth in the International League with a 2.06 ERA. Boyd posted a quality start in each of his last four starts with Triple A Toledo. Over the four-start stretch, Boyd had a 0-1 record with a 1.32 ERA (27.1IP/4ER), 20 hits allowed, four walks and 21 strikeouts.

NAMED A MINOR LEAGUE ALL-STAR: Boyd was selected as a 2015 minor league all-star by *Baseball America*. In 19 starts in the minors last season, Boyd had a 9-2 record with a 1.65 ERA (114.2IP/21ER) and 108 strikeouts. He led all qualified starters in the minor leagues in WHIP (0.85) and opponent average (.176), while he was second in ERA.

EARNING HIS FIRST BIG LEAGUE WIN: Boyd picked up the first win of his major league career in his Tigers debut on August 5, 2015 vs. Kansas City. Boyd allowed just one run on seven hits with two strikeouts in 7.0 innings vs. the Royals.

MAKING HIS MAJOR LEAGUE DEBUT: Boyd made his major league debut with the Toronto Blue Jays on June 27, 2015 against Texas. Boyd took the loss in the game, allowing four runs on nine hits with seven strikeouts in 6.2 innings. Boyd's seven strikeouts tied the Toronto record for most strikeouts by a pitcher making their debut as a starter (also, Mark Rzepczynski, July 7, 2009 at Tampa Bay). Also, his 6.2 innings pitched without issuing a walk were the most by a Toronto starter making their debut.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES: Boyd was acquired by the Tigers along with lefthanded pitchers Daniel Norris and Jairo Labourt from the Blue Jays on July 30, in exchange for lefthanded pitcher David Price. Boyd was selected by the Blue Jays in the sixth round of the 2013 MLB Draft.

ABOUT PELFREY: Mike Pelfrey will make his 10th start of the season tomorrow afternoon at Oakland.

LAST TIME OUT: Pelfrey did not factor into the decision in his last start on Monday vs. Philadelphia. Pelfrey allowed four runs on 11 hits with three strikeouts in 6.0 innings against the Phillies.

VS. OAKLAND/AT OAKLAND COLISEUM: Pelfrey has made three career starts against Oakland and has a 0-3 record with an 11.05 ERA (14.2IP/18ER) and six strikeouts. Pelfrey has faced the Athletics once this season, taking the loss on April 26 after allowing five runs on nine hits with one strikeout in 6.2 innings. Tomorrow's start will mark Pelfrey's first career start at the Oakland Coliseum.

TWO FOR THE PRICE OF ONE: Pelfrey finished the 2015 season tied for the major league lead with 29 ground ball double plays. Pelfrey also ranked sixth in the AL with a 2.14 ground ball-to-fly ball ratio and 11th with 291 ground balls. In nine starts this season, Pelfrey has induced eight double play balls, which ranks tied for fourth in the American League.
