OAKLAND ATHLETICS (21-29) VS. DETROIT TIGERS (24-24)

ABOUT THE A'S: Snapped their three-game losing streak yesterday with a 12-3 win...had season highs in runs, hits (17) and margin of victory... are now 2-7 over the last nine games and 21-29 (.420) for the season... the eight games under .500 are one short of the season high (20-29 on May 27)...are tied for the second worst record in the American League... are tied for fourth place in the AL West and are eight games behind first place Seattle, which is one short of the season-high of nine (three times, last: May 27)...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 14 days in third, seven days tied for third, 14 days in fourth and six days tied for fourth.

IN MAY: The A's are 8-17 (.320) in May, which is the second worst record in the American League (Minnesota, 7-17) and third worst in the majors (Cincinnati, 7-18)...it is currently the fourth worst May in Oakland history...have clinched a losing record in May for the second consecutive season and eighth time in the last 12 years...went 11-19 (.367) in May last year...have a 6.08 ERA (147 er in 217.2 ip), which is the highest in the majors (Minnesota, 6.07)...have finished May with an ERA of 6.00 or more just once in Oakland history (6.59 in 1997)...have allowed 40 home runs, which is the most in the majors and one short of the Oakland record for home runs allowed in May (41 in 1997)...are tied for the fewest saves in the majors (3)...the offense has 49 walks, which is second fewest in the majors (Kansas City, 48)...the Oakland record for fewest walks in May is 66 in 1968.

OFFENSE: The A's scored 12 runs on 17 hits yesterday after batting just .179 with 23 runs scored over the previous eight games...raised their team batting average five points from .242 to .247...had not scored more than eight runs in a game this year...the last time the A's went more than their first 49 games in a season without reaching double figures in runs scored was in 1965 in Kansas City (79 games)...walked just once yesterday and have 12 walks over the last nine games...rank last in the American League in on-base percentage (.295) and second to last in walks (111)...have the third fewest doubles (70), are tied for the third fewest extra base hits (132) and have the fourth fewest strikeouts (343).

PITCHING: The A's have allowed 10 or more hits in 11 of the last 19 games...have a 6.34 ERA (116 er in 164.2 ip), .294 (197-for-669) opponents batting average and 32 home runs allowed over that span, which dates back to May 8...now have a 4.82 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...also have the second highest opponents on-base percentage (.336) and slugging percentage (.444) and third highest batting average (.269)...are tied for the second most home runs (64), have the third most walks (161) and are tied for the third most hit batters (19).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 8-20 with a 6.54 ERA (125 er in 172.0 ip) over the last 33 games dating back to April 23...that includes 5-1 with a 1.63 ERA (7 er in 38.2 ip) in six starts by Rich Hill and 3-19 with a 7.97 ERA (118 er in 133.1 ip) in 27 starts by everyone else...starters are 14-25 with a 5.22 ERA (156 er in 269.0 ip) overall...the losses are the most in the majors and the ERA is second highest in the American League (Minnesota, 5.34) and third highest in the majors (Colorado, 5.38)...Hill tossed 8.0 innings Monday night, snapping an Athletics record streak of 83 consecutive games with seven or fewer innings by the starting pitcher dating back to Aug. 23, 2015...the A's are 6-1 when the starter pitches at least seven innings

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's snapped their season-high tying four games errorless streak yesterday...now have 37 errors for the season, which is seven more than any other American League team and tied for third most in the majors...are tied for second in the AL in double plays (53).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's snapped their season-high tying five-game home losing streak yesterday...are 1-1 on this six-game homestand against Detroit (1-1) and Minnesota (three games)...went 3-4 on the last homestand against Texas (3-0) and New York-AL (0-4) and are 9-16 (.360) at home...have the second worst home record in the American League (Minnesota, 8-15) and fourth worst in the majors...it is tied for the third worst after 25 home games in Oakland history...this homestand concludes as a 16-game stretch from May 16 to June 1 where the A's played 13 games at home...went 1-2 on the last road trip to Seattle and are 12-13 (.480) on the road...are batting .263 (233-for-887) and are averaging 4.36 runs per game (109 runs in 25 games) on the road compared to .229 (188-

for-820) with an average of 3.60 runs per game (90 runs in 25 games) at home...have the third lowest home batting average in the AL and are averaging the fourth fewest runs per game...have a 5.80 ERA (139 er in 215.2 ip) on the road compared to 3.88 (97 er in 225.0 ip) at home...have the highest road ERA in the AL and second highest in the majors.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 7-3 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied for the second most last at bats wins in the majors (Seattle, 8) and have the fourth best winning percentage (.700)...are 2-0 in extra inning games...are tied for the second fewest extra inning games in the American League and tied for third in most wins...both extra inning games have come on the road and the A's now have a streak of 44 consecutive home games since their last extra inning game in the Coliseum (Aug. 18, 2015 vs. Los Angeles-NL)...that is the longest such streak by an A's team since a 55-game streak from Sept. 25, 1983-July 20, 1984)...are 6-8 in one-run games and have now dropped five of their last six one-run decisions after winning five of the first eight.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have been successful in 7-of-9 (77.8%) replay challenges, which is the best percentage in the majors...the nine challenges are tied for fourth fewest in the majors...are averaging 2 hours and 57 minutes per game, which is third fastest in the majors...are 6-5 (.545) in games started by a left-handed pitcher compared to 15-24 (.385) against righties...are hitting .238 against lefties, .249 against righties...A's pinch hitters are tied for second in the American League in pinch hits (8) and rank third in plate appearances (39).

THE DISABLED LIST: After reinstating Josh Phegley from the disabled list Friday, the A's have 11 players on the DL (H. Alvarez, R.J. Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doubront, Fuld, Gray, Hendriks, Parker, Reddick, Sogard)... have had at least nine players on the DL every day since May 9, including a season-high 13 from May 21-24, which are the most players the A's have had on the DL at one time since at least 1979...have had at least six players on the DL all year and have used the DL 14 times...the 14 players have combined to miss 422 games (30.1 games per stint)...R.J. Alvarez, Bassitt, Doubront, Fuld, Parker and Sogard are on the 60-day DL...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. TIGERS: The A's have lost the season series as they are 2-4 against the Tigers entering the final game today...have split the first two games in Oakland after dropping three of four at Detroit in April...over the last seven seasons, the A's have won two season series, lost three and split two...are 23-26 against Detroit over that span...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 251-246 against the Tigers...that includes 139-110 in Oakland, 110-134 in Detroit and 2-2 in Las Vegas...all-time, the A's are 919-999 against the Tigers...with one more A's loss, the Tigers will be the sixth team to defeat the A's 1000 times...the only other of the original eight American League teams that has not beat the A's 1000 times is the Brewers/Browns/Orioles (940).

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Coco Crisp extended his hitting streak to 11 games yesterday (14-for-47, .298), his 13th career hitting streak of 10 or more games...is batting .288 (32-for-111) with 19 RBI over his last 28 games after hitting .158 with one RBI over his first 12 contests...Khris Davis hit his 11th home run in the month of May yesterday, which is the most in the majors...is the first Athletic to hit 11 home runs in a month since Jason Giambi hit 13 in Sept. 2000...Ryan Dull has stranded all 19 of his inherited runners, which are the most in the majors among relievers that have not allowed an inherited runner to score...opponents are 0-for-27 with runners in scoring position and first batters faced are 0-for-19 with two walks... Danny Valencia hit his seventh home run in the month of May yesterday, which are his most home runs in a month.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1909** Frank Baker hits the first home run at Shibe Park...in **1990** Rickey Henderson breaks Ty Cobb's American League stolen base record with his 893rd career steal...in **2000** Randy Velarde turns the 10th regular season unassisted triple play in major league history but the A's lose at New York, 4-1.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Rich Hill (7-3, 2.18 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 4-0 with a 1.75 ERA (5 er in 25.2 ip) and .183 (17-for-93) opponents batting average over his last four starts and has not allowed a home run...the winning streak is the second longest of his career (6, Sept. 12, 2007 to June 1, 2009)...is now 6-1 with a 1.61 ERA (8 er in 44.2 ip) and .167 (26-for-156) opponents batting average over his last seven starts and has allowed just one home run in 44.2 innings...went 1-2 with a 4.15 ERA, .321 opponents average and one home run over his first three

IN MAY: Is 4-1 with a 1.99 ERA (7 er in 31.2 ip) in five starts in the month of May...it is the first time in his career he has won four games in a month. the last A's pitcher to win five games in a month is Sonny Gray in July of 2014...the only A's pitchers to do it in May over the last 28 years are Mark Mulder (2001) and Gil Heredia (2000)...leads the American League in ERA in May and is tied for the lead in wins.

SEVEN-GAME WINNER: Picked up his seventh win of the season in his last start, which is the second best total of his career...won a career-high 11 games with Chicago (NL) in 2007 but had just nine wins from 2008-15... his seven wins are tied for second in the American League and are the most by an A's pitcher before the end of May since 2003 when Mark Mulder had eight...with a win today, he would become the 10th pitcher in Oakland history with eight wins before the end of May...only Mulder has done that over the last 26 years.

STRIKEOUTS: Ranks ninth in the American League with 65 strikeouts...that is tied for sixth most in Oakland history before the end of May... has 28 strikeouts in 31.2 innings in May after fanning 37 in 26.0 innings in April...his April strikeout total was the fifth best in Oakland history and the second best over the last 15 years (Chavez, 41 in 2014)...had 10-strikeout games on April 9 at Seattle and April 21 at New York (AL) and is the first A's pitcher with two 10-strikeout games in one month since Mark Mulder in July, 2003...now has 10 ca-

reer games with 10 or more strikeouts...has 161 strikeouts in 130.2 innings over the last four years (11.09 per nine innings).

AMONG THE LEADERS: Leads the American League in ERA (2.18) and opponents slugging percentage (.273) and ranks fifth in opponents batting average (.206)...has surrendered just two home runs and his average of 0.31 home runs per nine innings is second lowest in the AL (Quintana, CWS. 1 hr in 65.0 ip)...is tied for the Major League lead in hit batters (7)... ranks eighth in the AL in most pitches per inning (17.6).

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is scheduled to make his 11th start of the season, which will tie him for the American League lead...it will be his 15th appearance over the last two years, all starts...is 9-4 with a 1.97 ERA (19 er in 86.2 ip) and .185 (57-for-308) opponents batting average over that span...made 119 appearances from 2010-14, all in relief...appeared in 78 games, including 70 starts, over his first five seasons from 2005-09

INNING BY INNING: Has allowed 13 of his 17 runs over the first three innings of a game...has a 3.34 ERA (11 er in 29.2 ip), .250 (28-for-112) opponents batting average and both of his home runs in innings one through three compared to a 0.96 ERA (3 er in 28.0 ip) and .155 (15-for-97) opponents batting average from the fourth inning on...over the last two years, he has a 3.3 ERA (16 er in 41.2 ip) in innings 1-3 and 0.60 (3 er in 45.0 ip) from the fourth inning on.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-3 with a 3.79 ERA (8 er in 19.0 ip) and .236 (17for-72) opponents average in four starts at home compared to 6-0 with a 1.40 ERA (6 er in 38.2 ip) and .168 (18-for-107) opponents batting average in six starts on the road...is the fourth pitcher in Athletics history to win each of his first six starts on the road in a season, joining Sam Gray (1925), Kevin Appier (2000) and Gil Heredia (2000)...is tied for the Major League lead in road wins...has the third lowest road ERA in the American League and the fourth lowest opponents batting average \ldots is now 7-1 with a 1.69 ERA (11 er in 58.2 ip) and .184 (38-for-207) opponents batting average in nine starts on the road over the last two years...has four 10-strike-out games in those nine starts and has fanned 72 in 58.2 road innings (11.05 per nine innings)...struck out 10 batters in each of his first two road starts this year and is the first pitcher in Oakland history with back-to-back 10-strikeout games on the road...the last A's pitcher to do it was Jim Nash in 1967 (July 8-13).

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 4-1 with a 1.09 ERA (4 er in 33.0 ip) in five starts on four days rest compared to 3-2 with a 3.65 ERA (10 er in 24.2 ip) in five starts on five days rest or more.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has surrendered both of his home runs and issued 20 of his 21 walks to right-handed hitters...over the last two years, he has allowed all four home runs and issued 24 of his 26 walks to righties. both of the home runs this year are solo shots...opponents are 2-for-22 (.091) with runners in scoring position and two outs...has allowed a .137 (19-for-139) batting average with two strikes...the clean-up hitter is 5-for-26 (.192) with no extra base hits.

FOUR HITS OR FEWER: Allowed four hits or fewer while tossing five innings or more in six consecutive starts from April 21 to May 18...that was the longest such streak by an A's pitcher since at least 1913...opponents went 18-for-126 (.143) over that stretch.

2016 HIGHLIGHTS: Made his first career Opening Day start April 4 against Chicago (AL) after Sonny Gray was scratched due to food poisoning...at the age of 36 years, 24 days, he was the fourth oldest pitcher to start an opener in Oakland history and the fifth oldest in Athletics history... tossed just 2.2 innings and was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-3 loss... picked up his first win as an Athletic in a 6-1 victory at Seattle *April* 9... struck out 10 batters and his final strikeout of lannetta in the sixth inning was the 500th of his career...struck out 10 batters in 6.0 innings in a 7-3 win at New York (AL) April 21, his second 10-strikeout game of the season...tossed 7.0 scoreless innings and did not walk a batter for the win at Detroit April 26...allowed just one run base runner as far as second base...was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-1 loss to Houston in Oakland on May 1 ... allowed just two hits but issued four walks in six innings ... retired 10 of the final 11 batters he faced...was the winning pitcher in the A's 8-4 victory in the day game at Baltimore May 7...allowed just two hits but walked three and hit a batter...won his second consecutive start in the A's 6-3 win at Tampa Bay on $\it May 13...$ allowed two runs in the bottom of the first on back-to-back RBI singles by Pearce and Souza and a Longoria RBI double in the fifth...won his third consecutive start in the A's 8-1 win over Texas May 18 in Oakland...shutout the Rangers on a hit, walk and hit by pitch over the first five innings.

LAST START: He combined with Madson on a nine-hit shutout in the A's 5-0 win at Seattle on Monday...tossed eight innings and allowed eight of the hits...vielded six of the hits over the first three innings and retired 14 straight at one point...loaded the bases with no outs in the second inning but escaped that jam with two strikeouts and a fielders choice.

RHP Kendall Graveman (1-6, 5.36 ERA): Is 0-5 with a 7.36 ERA and .365 opponents batting average over his last six starts after going 1-1 with a 2.04 ERA and .159 opponents average over his first three starts...the five-game losing streak is one short of his career high of six (July 10, 2015 to April 7, 2016)...is now 1-11 with a 5.57 ERA over his last 17 starts dating back to July 10, 2015...is tied for second in the American League with six losses...is 0-4 with a 6.57 ERA in five starts in the month of May...the losses are tied for the most in the AL...is 0-3 with a 3.47 ERA in four starts at home compared to 1-3 with a 7.23 ERA in five starts on the road...has surrendered nine home runs in 23.2 innings on the road but just one in 23.1 innings at home...had a no decision in his last start, a 6-5 A's loss at Seattle last Tuesday (4.1 ip, 7 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 3 so)...has never faced the Twins in his career.
