OAKLAND ATHLETICS (22-29) VS. MINNESOTA TWINS (15-34)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won two straight after losing three in a row...are now 3-7 over the last 10 games and 22-29 (.420) for the season...are tied with Houston for the second worst record in the American League (Minnesota, 15-34)...are in a tie for fourth place in the AL West for the fourth consecutive day and are 7½ games behind first place Texas...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 14 days in third, seven days tied for third, 15 days in fourth and six days tied for fourth.

IN MAY: The A's are 9-17 (.346) in May, which is the second worst record in the American League (Minnesota, 8-17) and tied with Atlanta for third worst in the majors (Cincinnati, 7-19)...it is currently tied for the fifth worst May in Oakland history...have clinched a losing record in May for the second consecutive season and eighth time in the last 12 years...went 11-19 (.367) in May last year...have a 5.92 ERA (149 er in 226.2 ip), which is second highest in the majors (Minnesota, 5.99)...have finished May with an ERA above 5.70 just once in Oakland history (6.59 in 1997)...have allowed 40 home runs, which is second most in the majors (Minnesota, 41) and one short of the Oakland record for home runs allowed in May (41 in 1997)...are tied for the fewest saves in the majors (4)...the offense has 52 walks, which is the fewest in the majors (Kansas City, 53)...the Oakland record for fewest walks in May is 66 in 1968.

PITCHING: The A's have a 6.12 ERA (118 er in 173.2 ip), .289 (202-for-700) opponents batting average and 32 home runs allowed over the last 20 games dating back to May 8...posted a 3.91 ERA, .253 opponents average and 32 home runs over the first 31 contests...now have a 4.76 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League to Minnesota (4.98)...also have the second highest opponents on-base percentage (.334) and slugging percentage (.439) and third highest batting average (.267)...have issued the third most walks (164) and allowed the fourth most home runs (64).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 9-20 with a 6.41 ERA (127 er in 178.1 ip) over the last 34 games dating back to April 23...that includes 6-1 with a 1.80 ERA (9 er in 45.0 ip) in seven starts by Rich Hill and 3-19 with a 7.97 ERA (118 er in 133.1 ip) in 27 starts by everyone else...starters are 15-25 with a 5.16 ERA (158 er in 275.1 ip) overall...the losses are the most in the majors and the ERA is second highest in the American League (Minnesota, 5.29) and third highest in the majors (Colorado, 5.48).

OFFENSE: Over the last six games, the A's have scored 23 of their 30 runs in the sixth inning or later...are batting .200 (22-for-110) in innings one through five over that stretch and .357 (35-for-98) in the sixth inning or later...are batting .263 (210-for-797) and are averaging 4.7 runs per game (107 runs) over the last 23 games dating back to May 4...hit .234 and averaged 3.4 runs per game over the first 28 contests...have walked three times or fewer in each of the last 10 games (15 walks total)...rank last in the American League in on-base percentage (.296) and second to last in walks (114)...have the third fewest doubles (71) and extra base hits (133) and are tied for the third fewest strikeouts (349).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have not committed an error in five of their last six games...have 37 errors for the season, which is seven more than any other American League team and tied for third most in the majors...are tied for second in the AL in double plays (54).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-1 on this six-game homestand against Detroit (2-1) and Minnesota (three games)...went 3-4 on the last homestand against Texas (3-0) and New York-AL (0-4) and are 10-16 (.360) at home...are tied with Los Angeles for the second worst home record in the American League (Minnesota, 8-15) and fourth worst in the majors...it is tied for the third worst after 26 home games in Oakland history...snapped their season-high tying five-game home losing streak Saturday...this homestand concludes as a 16-game stretch from May 16 to June 1 where the A's played 13 games at home...begin an eight-game road trip to Houston (three games), Milwaukee (two games) and Cincinnati (three games) on Friday...went 1-2 on the last road trip to Seattle and are 12-13 (.480) on the road...are batting .263 (233-for-887) and are averaging 4.36 runs per game (109 runs in 25 games) on the road compared to .231 (197-for-852) with an average of 3.62 runs per game (94 runs in 26 games) at home...have the third lowest home batting average in the AL and are averaging the fourth fewest runs per game...have a 5.80 ERA (139 er in 215.2 ip) on the road compared to 3.81 (99 er in 234.0 ip) at home...have the highest road ERA in the AL and second highest in the majors.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 7-3 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied for second in the majors in last at bat wins (Seattle, 8) and have the fourth best winning percentage (.700)...are 2-0 in extra inning games...are tied for the second fewest extra inning games in the American League...both extra inning games have come on the road and the A's now have a streak of 45 consecutive home games since their last extra inning game in the Coliseum (Aug. 18, 2015 vs. Los Angeles-NL)...that is the longest such streak by an A's team since a 55-game streak from Sept. 25, 1983-July 20, 1984)...are 6-8 in one-run games and have now dropped five of their last six one-run decisions after winning five of the first eight.

THIS AND THAT: Billy Butler had a pinch hit two-run single yesterday and A's pinch hitters are tied for the American League lead with six RBI...are also tied for second in hits (9) and rank third in plate appearances (40)...the A's have been successful in 7-of-9 (77.8%) replay challenges, which is the best percentage in the majors...the nine challenges are tied for third fewest in the majors...are averaging 2 hours and 57 minutes per game, which is fourth fastest in the majors...are 6-5 (.545) in games started by a left-handed pitcher compared to 16-24 (.400) against righties...are hitting .238 against lefties, .250 against righties.

THE DISABLED LIST: After reinstating Josh Phegley from the disabled list Friday, the A's have 11 players on the DL (H. Alvarez, R.J. Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doubront, Fuld, Gray, Hendriks, Parker, Reddick, Sogard)...have had at least nine players on the DL every day since May 9, including a season-high 13 from May 21-24, which are the most players the A's have had on the DL at one time since at least 1979...have had at least six players on the DL all year and have used the DL 14 times...the 14 players have combined to miss 433 games (30.9 games per stint)...R.J. Alvarez, Bassitt, Doubront, Fuld, Parker and Sogard are on the 60-day DL...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. TWINS: This is the first meeting between the A's and Twins in 2016...the only other American League team the A's have yet to face is the Indians...the A's lost the season series last year for the first time since 2010 as they went 3-4...won two of three in Oakland and lost three of four in Minnesota...have won 13 of the last 16 games in the Coliseum...are 20-10 (.667) against the Twins dating back to the start of the 2012 season...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 293-295 against Minnesota...that includes 163-128 in Oakland and 130-167 in Minnesota...are 350-364 all-time against the Twins and have a 997-1000 record against the Twins/Senators.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

The A's are 26-19 on Memorial Day since moving to Oakland in 1968...that includes 18-11 at the Coliseum and 8-8 on the road...have a three-game winning streak on Memorial Day, all at home...have faced the Twins twice on Memorial Day, both losses at Minnesota (10-7 in 1979 and 5-4 in 2012)...**Coco Crisp** had his hitting streak snapped at 11 games yesterday...is now batting .278 (32-for-115) with 19 RBI over his last 29 games after hitting .158 with one RBI over his first 12 contests...**Khris Davis** hit his 11th home run in the month of May Saturday, which is the most in the majors...is the first Athletic to hit 11 home runs in a month since Jason Giambi hit 13 in Sept. 2000...**Ryan Dull** has stranded all 20 of his inherited runners, which are the most in the majors among relievers that have not allowed an inherited runner to score...opponents are 0-for-27 with runners in scoring position and first batters faced are 0-for-20 with two walks...**Danny Valencia** hit his seventh home run in the month of May Saturday, which are his most home runs in a month...is batting .348 (25-for-72) with 16 runs, seven home runs and 16 RBI in 19 games since he was reinstated from the 15-day disabled list May 6.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1932 Al Simmons and Jimmy Dykes hit two home runs each and Lefty Grove tosses a six-hitter in a 13-2 win over Washington...in 1982 Rickey Henderson has three hits, three RBI and four stolen bases in the second game of a doubleheader as the A's defeat Detroit, 10-3...in 1988 Dave Henderson homers to lead off the bottom of the 14th inning as the A's defeat the New York Yankees, 3-2.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Kendall Graveman (1-6, 5.36 ERA)

FIVE-GAME LOSING STREAK: Is 0-5 with a 7.36 ERA (24 er in 29.1 ip) and .365 (46-for-126) opponents batting average over his last six starts after going 1-1 with a 2.04 ERA and .159 opponents average over his first three starts...the five-game losing streak is one short of his career high of six (July 10, 2015 to April 7, 2016)...is now 1-11 with a 5.57 ERA (53 er in 85.2 ip) over his last 17 starts dating back to July 10, 2015...went 6-4 with a 3.20 ERA over his first 18 career games, including 13 starts.

LOSSES: Is tied for second in the American League with six losses...is 0-4 with a 6.57 ERA (18 er in 24.2 ip) in five starts in the month of May...the losses are tied for second in the AL...it is the first time he has lost four games in a month in his career...the last A's pitcher to lose five games in a month is Brian Fuentes in May, 2011...over the last 11 years, the only A's starter to lose five games in a month is Dallas Braden in Sept., 2010.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has issued 15 of his 19 walks to lefties...last year he issued 24 of his 38 walks to lefties...has a .282 (20-for-71) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .192 (14-for-73) the second time and .489 (22-for-45) after that...the opponents one through four hitters are batting a combined .341 (31-for-91) off him while the five through nine hitters are batting .255 (25-for-98).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 0-3 with a 3.47 ERA (9 er in 23.1 ip) in four starts at home compared to 1-3 with a 7.23 ERA (19 er in 23.2 ip) in five starts on the road...has surrendered nine home runs in 23.2 innings on the road but just one in 23.1 innings at home.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received no run support in three of his nine starts and three runs of support or fewer in all nine of his starts...his season run support average is 2.30 (12 rs in 47.0 ip) is the lowest in the American League and second lowest in the majors (Shields, SD 1.95) among pitchers with at least 40 innings pitched...is 0-5 in six starts with two runs of support or fewer, 1-1 in three starts with three runs of support or more...is now 1-14 in 19 career starts with two runs of support or fewer, 6-1 in 11 starts with three runs of support or more.

THIS AND THAT: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 0-4 with a 6.52 ERA (21 er in 29.0 ip) in six starts on four or five days rest compared to 1-2 with a 3.50 ERA (7 er in 18.0 ip) in three starts on six days rest or more...allowed a career-high 10 hits in back-to-back starts on April 25 at Detroit and May 2 against Seattle and is the first A's pitcher with at least 10 hits in back-to-back starts since Brandon McCarthy (April 16-21, 2012)...allowed four hits or fewer in each of his first three starts, joining John Odom (1969) and Mike Norris (1980) as the only pitchers in Oakland history on an Opening Day roster to allow four hits or fewer while tossing five innings or more in each of their first three starts

SIX-GAME LOSING STREAK SNAPPED: Picked up his first win of the season April 20 at New York (AL), which snapped a career-high six-game losing streak dating back to last year...that was the longest losing streak by an A's pitcher since Tyson Ross lost eight straight from May 19 to Sept. 24, 2012...compiled a 5.04 ERA and .267 opponents batting during the streak, which spanned 10 starts from July 10, 2015 to April 12, 2016.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-1 loss to Chicago (AL) April 7 in Oakland...shutout the White Sox on two hits over the first five innings, but Mat Latos blanked the A's on one hit over the first six innings...the scored was tied at 0-0 when he walked Cabrera to lead off the sixth...Abreau followed with a two-run home run and Graveman left after 5.1 innings trailing 2-0.

SECOND START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on April 12 in Oakland...allowed just one run in 6.0 innings and it came in the second inning...walked Pujols to start the inning and Calhoun singled him over to third...Simmons then grounded into a double play and Graveman was relieved by Axford to start the seventh with the A's leading 3-1...Oakland built a 4-1 lead before Madson allowed two runs in the eighth and Doolittle surrendered two in the ninth.

THIRD START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-2 win at New York (AL) on April 20...it was his first win since July 4, 2015 against Seattle...struck out a career-high eight batters on a career-high tying 111 pitches...allowed a one-out solo home run to Gregorius in the second inning, but that was the only run he would surrender in 6.1 innings of work...struck out in the fifth inning in his first professional at bat.

FOURTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-3 loss at Detroit April 25...allowed a career-high 10 hits...surrendered single runs in each of the first two innings on a Cabrera home run in the first and an Aviles RBI single in the second...then yielded a three-run home run to Cabrera followed by a solo home run by Victory Martinez in the fifth and left after 4.2 innings trailing 6-0.

FIFTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-3 loss to Seattle last Monday in Oakland...allowed a career-high tying 10 hits for the second consecutive start...the A's scored a run in the second inning and he blanked the Mariners on a hit and a walk over the first three innings...then allowed a RBI single to Lind in the fourth and two more runs in the sixth on a Seager RBI double and an Iannetta RBI single...yielded a one-out double to Aoki in the seventh and was relieved by Rzepczynski who allowed Aoki to score.

SIXTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 11-3 loss at Baltimore on May 8...yielded a career-high four home runs, which are the most allowed by an A's starting pitcher since May 6, 2013 at Cleveland when Jarrod Parker also allowed four home runs...the A's scored three times in the first but he allowed a two-run home run to Machado in the bottom of the first...allowed back-to-back home runs to Alvarez and Schoop in the second and a two-run home run to Trumbo in the third...left after 2.2 innings trailing 6-2.

SEVENTH START: He lost his fourth consecutive start in the A's 6-0 loss at Tampa Bay May 14...allowed a two-run home run to Miller in the third inning...also yielded two runs in the sixth inning on a Pearce sacrifice fly and a Kiermaier RBI single...Andriese shut out the A's on two hits, no walks and a hit batter.

EIGHTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-1 to New York (AL) in Oakland on May 19...allowed a RBI double to Beltran in the third inning but the A's came back to tie the game in the fourth...then allowed a RBI double to Hicks in the sixth inning and was relieved by Rzepczynski after allowing two runs in 4.2 innings.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-5 loss at Seattle last Tuesday...tossed just 4.2 innings and allowed two runs...yielded a RBI double to Cano in the first and a RBI single to Cruz in the third...was relieved Coulombe with one out in the fifth inning and runners on first and second with the A's trailing 2-1...the A's scored four times in the fifth to get him off the hook but the Mariners scored twice in the eighth and ninth for the win.

LHP Eric Surkamp (0-3, 6.55 ERA): Will be recalled from Triple-A Nashville tomorrow for his third stint with the A's this year...will be making his sixth start...was called up the first time April 8 and went 0-2 with a 5.59 ERA in four starts before he was optioned April 25...returned for a second time May 11 and started and lost that day at Boston (2.2 ip, 4 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 3 so)...the three-game losing streak matches his career high (Sept. 24, 2011-July 23, 2013)...was optioned back to Nashville May 17...is 0-0 with a 9.00 ERA in four career appearances against Minnesota, all in relief in 2014...is 2-1 with a 3.91 ERA and .202 opponents average in four starts with Triple-A Nashville...has 28 strikeouts in 23.0 innings (10.96 per nine innings)...has held left-handed hitters to a .150 batting average while right-handers are hitting .219...was the winning pitcher in his last minor league start, a 10-4 Nashville win at Las Vegas May 24 (6.0 ip, 8 h, 4 r, 4 er, 6 so).
