OF **Mastroianni** placed on Dl LHP Boshers selected from AAA LHP Perkins transferred to 60-day DL THE TWINS: After recently completing their seven-game homestand, the Twins began their six-game west-coast roadtrip with a three-game sweep in Seattle...today, the Twins will begin a three-game series with Oakland, through Wednesday...the Twins have gone 7-19 on the road this season, compared to 8-15 at home.

SWEEPING IN SEATTLE: The Twins beat the Mariners yesterday afternoon by a score of 5-4, sweeping an opponent for the second time this season (the other being Los Ángeles-AL April 15-17)...Ricky Nolasco (2-3) was the starter and winner, allowing two runs on three hits in 6.0 innings pitched with one walk and seven strikeouts...Trevor May and Fernando Abad each earned a hold as Kevin Jepsen earned his sixth save...the offense scattered seven hits, two from Eduardo Nunez - his fourth straight multi-hit game...Joe Mauer and Miguel Sano each homered for the third consecutive game, becoming the second pair or Twins in club history (since 1961) to homer in three straight, as Harmon Killebrew and Bob Allison accomplished the feat June 26-28, 1964 against the White Sox.

TWINS AND A'S: The Twins went 4-3 against Oakland last season, out-scoring the A's 36-31...they went 3-1 at Target Field May 4-7 and 1-2 in Oakland July 17-19...the Twins haven't won a series at Oakland since recording a two-game sweep May 18-19, 2011...they are just 2-11 in this ballpark, dating back to August 21, 2012.

Rurt Suzuki was drafted by Oakland in the second round of the 2004 First-Year Player Draft...he played for A's from 2007-13, hitting .255 (653-for-2563) with 136 doubles, 59 home runs and 309 RBI in 718 games...he has hit just .128 (5-for-39) in 10 career games

against his former team...he ranks fifth on the A's franchise list in games caught (684).

Fernando Abad pitched two seasons for the A's from 2014-15, going 4-6, 2.74 ERA (105.0 IP, 32 ER) with 34 walks and 96 strikeouts in 131 games...he ranked second in appearances for the A's in that span, trailing Fernando Rodriguez...Abad has never faced the A's.

MAUER DOES WORK AT THE COLISEUM: In 34 career games at the Oakland Coliseum, Joe Mauer owns a .326 batting average (44-for-135) with eight doubles and a .364 on-base percentage...in fact, Mauer has the fifth highest average among active players at the Coliseum (Ichiro leads with a .358 career average)...Mauer has hit safely in each of his last five games vs. Oakland overall.

MINNESOTA'S GREATEST HITS: Joe Mauer recorded one hit yesterday, giving him 1,747 for his career, moving him within two of tying Kent Hrbek for fourth on the Twins all-time list (since 1961):

GIMME FIVE: A win today would give the Twins their fifth straight victory and would set a season-high...their other four-game win-streak this season came April 15-18, sweeping the Angels in three then beating the Brewers...their last five-game win-streak came August 20-26, 2015, winning six straight, a four-game sweep of Baltimore followed by two wins against Tampa Bay.

SAND HOMER STREAK: Miguel Sano has hit a home run in each of the last four games...he is the first Twins player to accomplish the feat since Trevor Plouffe homered in four straight from June 12-15, 2012...the Twins record is five straight games, done four times including three times by Harmon Killebrew...the last Twins player to homer in five straight games was Marty Cordova May 16-20, 1995.

NUNEZ BUSINESS: Eduardo Nunez is hitting .338 (51-for-151) with nine doubles and 20 RBI in 40 games this season, hitting safely in 28 of those games...he ranks fourth in the AL in batting average, trailing Xander Bogaerts (.351), Victor Martinez (.351) and David Ortiz (.339)...additionally, he leads the club in multi-hit games (15).

🔁 He is hitting .403 (31-for-77) in 21 road games this season, the third highest in baseball, trailing Victor Martinez (.438) and Adrian Gonzalez (.406).

OFFENSIVE STRIKE: The Twins have recorded double digit hit totals in four of their last six games...they are hitting .284 (59-for-208) with eight doubles, 12 home runs, 33 runs scored and 20 walks in the six-game stretch...over that same period, they are slugging .495 with a .361 on-base percentage...Mauer has gone 11-for-25 in those same six games with a .500 on-base percentage

BUXTON IL BOW: Triple-A Rochester outfielder Byron Buxton has been named International League Batter of the Week...Buxton led the league with eight runs scored, seven extra-base hits, 23 total bases, a 1.045 slugging percentage and a 1.564 OPS in six games during the period...the Baxley, GA native also tied for the IL lead with three home runs and finished tied for third with six RBI...in 22 games this month, Buxton is batting .372 (32-for-86) with seven doubles, a triple, six home runs, 23 runs scored, 14 RBI with a .443 on-base percentage...Buxton reached base safely leading off the first inning in all six games during the week and also scored in the opening inning of each game.

LAST START: Santana picked up his third loss of the season May 24 vs. Kansas City...he tossed 3.2 innings, allowing a season-high six runs on nine hits, one home run, with two walks and four strikeouts...the last time he allowed six-or-more runs in a start was August 8, 2015 at Cleveland...he has now walked at least one batter in every start this season; last start without issuing a walk was August 30, 2015 at Houston...threw 82 pitches, 50 strikes.

TAKING ON THE ATHLETICS: Santana is making his first start of the season against the Athletics and his 28th career start (30th appearance)...he is 15-6, 2.03 ERA (186.0 IP, 42 ER) with 62 walks and 141 strikeouts in his career against Oakland...last season he faced off against the Athletics once, at the Oakland Coliseum, tossing 7.2 shutout innings, allowing five hits with one walk and one strikeout and picking up the win...his 2.03 ERA against the Athletics is the lowest against any opponent in which he has made at least five starts...he has a career record of 7-2 at Oakland with a 1.93 ERA (84.0 IP, 18 ER) with 27 walks and 64 strikeouts.

<u>HOME VS. ROAD:</u> Santana has made 161 career home starts and 160 career road starts (163 road appearances)...at home, he is a career 66-50, 3.77 ERA (1057.0 IP, 443 ER) with 299 walks and 846 strikeouts, and on the road he owns a 61-58 career record with a 4.58 ERA (974.2 IP, 496 ER), 342 walks and 779 strikeouts...at home this season, he has started four games and is 0-2, 4.94 ERA (23.2 IP, 13 ER) with eight walks and 17 strikeouts...he has made four road starts this season, going 1-1, 3.12 ERA (17.1 IP, 6 ER) with eight walks and 19 strikeouts...as a member of the Twins, Santana has made 14 road starts going 6-4, 3.53 ERA (81.2 IP, 32 ER) with 27 walks and 67 strikeouts, compared to at home where he has made 11 starts going 2-4, 4.68 ERA (67.1 IP, 35 ER) with 25 walks and 51 strikeouts.

MAYDAY: Santana is 18-22, 4.62 ERA (348.1 IP, 179 ER) with 107 walks and 280 strikeouts in 56 career starts in the month of May...it is his only month, with at least five starts, that he has a losing record and the 4.62 ERA is his highest of any month...he did not pitch in the month of May last season, due to a suspension, and his last winning record during the month of May came in 2012, when he went 2-1 with the Los Angeles Angels...this season, he is 1-2, 5.14 ERA (21.0 IP, 12 ER) with eight walks and 18 strikeouts in the month of May.

TIME ON THE DISABLED LIST: Santana was reinstated May 6th from the disabled list...he was placed on the 15-day DL April 26 (retroactive to April 20) for a lower back strain...just the third time Santana has spent time on the DL and first since June 22-July 3, 2009 (right triceps inflammation)...also missed time April 4-May 14, 2009 (sprained MCL, right elbow).

THE 2,000 CLUB: In his start April 14 vs. the White Sox, Santana surpassed 2,000 innings ...nine other actives have reached 2,000 innings pitched: CC Sabathia, Bartolo Colon, John Lackey, Felix Hernandez, Jake Peavy, James Shields, Justin Verlander, Zack Greinke and Cole Hamels...just five other Dominican-born pitchers have ever reached the mark: Juan Marichal, Colon, Pedro Martinez, Pedro Astacio and Joaquin Andujar.

GRAND OPENER: Santana was the Twins Opening Day starter on April 4 at Baltimore, the first time in his career he started on Opening Day, and the ninth different Twins pitcher to start Opening Day over the last 10 seasons (since 2007)...he was limited to pitching only 2.0 innings due to a 1:10 rain delay after the second inning...he tossed two scoreless innings with two hits, two walks and three strikeouts...the 2.0 innings pitched was Santana's shortest outing since July 21, 2012, as a member of the Angels, when he went 1.2 innings.
