THE TWINS: The Twins began their six-game west-coast roadtrip with a three-game sweep in Seattle followed by a loss to the A's in the series opener yesterday...today, the Twins will continue their three-game series with Oakland...following tomorrow's game the Twins will fly home for a 10-game, 11-day homestand with Tampa Bay (June 2-5), Miami (June 7-9) and Boston (June 10-12)...the Twins will play a total of 17 home games in the month of June while playing 10 road games...additionally, they will enjoy two off days at home this month.

SERIES OPENER LOSS: The Twins lost to the Athletics in the opening game of this three game series at the Oakland Coliseum...Ervin Santana (1-4) was the starter and loser, allowing three runs on seven hits in 7.0 innings pitched with two walks and five strikeouts...the offense scattered eight hits, two from both Juan Centeno and Danny Santana...Eduardo Nunez extended his current hit-streak to six games.

TWINS AND A'S: The Twins went 4-3 against Oakland last season, out-scoring the A's 36-31...they went 3-1 at Target Field May 4-7 and 1-2 in Oakland July 17-19...the Twins haven't won a series at Oakland since recording a two-game sweep May 18-19, 2011...they are just 2-12 in this ballpark, dating back to August 21, 2012.

- ☞ Kurt Suzuki was drafted by Oakland in the second round of the 2004 First-Year Player Draft...he played for A's from 2007-13, hitting .255 (653-for-2563) with 136 doubles, 59 home runs and 309 RBI in 718 games...he has hit just .128 (5-for-39) in 10 career games against his former team...he ranks fifth on the A's franchise list in games caught (684).
- ☞ Fernando Abad pitched two seasons for the A's from 2014-15, going 4-6, 2.74 ERA (105.0 IP, 32 ER) with 34 walks and 96 strikeouts in 131 games...he ranked second in appearances for the A's in that span, trailing Fernando Rodriguez...Abad has never faced the A's.

ROSTER MOVES: Following the game yesterday, the Twins announced that they have placed outfielder Danny Santana on the 15-day disabled list with a left hamstring strain, an injury he suffered yesterday in Oakland...to replace Santana on the 25-man roster the Twins have recalled outfielder Byron Buxton from Triple-A Rochester...Buxton was named International League Batter of the Week yesterday and has hit .336 (39-for-116) with nine doubles, two triples, six home runs and 14 RBI in 29 games for the Red Wings since being optioned by the Twins on April 25.

LEFTY NOTES: The Twins are hitting .211 (64-for-298) as a team vs. left-handers this season, the lowest average among MLB teams...individuals against left-handers: Robbie Grossman is 4-for-10 (.400) with a double and a home run...Brian Dozier is 7-for-20 (.350) with a double and a home run...Eduardo Escobar is 9-for-26 (.346) with a double...Eduardo Nunez is 6-for-21 (.286) with two doubles and a home run.

- ☞ Left-handed pitcher Fernando Abad is holding left-handed hitters to a .043 (1-for-23) average with one walk and five strikeouts.
- ☞ Right-handed pitcher Tyler Duffey, today's starting pitcher, is allowing a .345 (20-for-58) average against lefties.
- ☞ Miguel Sano has walked eight times in 29 plate appearances against left-handers this season, most among MLB players.

WILD ABOUT THE WEST: The Twins are 7-3 against the AL West this season, going 3-0 at home and 4-3 on the road...the Twins swept the Angels at home (April 15-17), swept Seattle on the road (May 27-29) and went 1-2 at Houston (May 2-4)...the Twins have 18 games remaining against AL West opponents including four with Oakland, seven with Texas, three with Los Angeles and four with Houston.

☞ The Twins went 16-17 against AL West opponents in 2015.

THIS AND THAT:

- ☞ The Twins bullpen has a 2.00 ERA (18.0 IP, 4 ER) with two walks and 18 strikeouts in their last six games.
- ☞ Twins defense has turned 18 double plays in their last 12 games, turning at least one in 11 of those 12 games...additionally, the Twins bullpen has induced 12 double plays over since May 1, the most among MLB teams.

LAST START: Duffy made his sixth start of the season May 25 vs. Kansas City and picked up his second win...tossed 6.2 innings, allowing five runs on nine hits, second straight start allowing nine hits, with two walks and five strikeouts...threw 102 pitches, 65 strikes... exited in the seventh with two men on and a 6-5 lead; Trevor May struckout Lorenzo Cain for the final out...was first Twins starter to record two wins on the season...has now defeated each team in the AL Central at least once in his career.

WELCOME TO OAKLAND: Today is Duffy's first career start against the Athletics...he has only faced one Athletics hitter, who is currently on the roster, before, Jed Lowrie, who is 0-for-3 against Duffy...he has faced two of the four teams in the AL West in his career, Houston and Los Angeles...Duffy has only faced 10 different teams in his 16 career starts, nine of which are in the American League.

- Duffy has made two career starts against the AL West...both starts came last season, one at Houston and one vs. Los Angeles...he is 1-0, 1.32 (13.2 IP, 2 ER) with two walks and 15 strikeouts vs. the AL West.

GIMME FIVE: Duffy completed 5.0 plus innings for the fifth time in six starts this season... he has failed to complete 5.0 innings in just three of his 16 career outings, including a career-low in his major league debut August 5 at Toronto...the only time he did not toss 5.0 innings this year was in his season debut April 24 at Washington when he left with no outs in the fifth inning after being struck by a line drive...Duffy has thrown 7.0 plus innings four times in his career, including twice this season; his career-high 7.2 innings was August 20, 2015 at Baltimore...he has pitched the second most innings (94.2) by a Twins starter since his MLB debut August 5, 2015, trailing Ervin Santana (116.2).

RIGHT ON TARGET: Duffy is 4-2, 3.38 ERA (42.2 IP, 16 ER) with 14 walks, 37 strikeouts and a .231 (37-for-160) opponents' average in seven career starts at Target Field...he has won one of his three home starts this year and is 1-2, 5.79 ERA (18.2 IP, 12 ER) with three walks and 14 strikeouts...in nine career road starts, is 3-2, 3.46 ERA (52.0 IP, 20 ER) with 14 walks and 46 strikeouts; 1-1, 2.00 ERA (18.0 IP, 4 ER) with five walks and 16 strikeouts in three starts away from Target Field this season.

THE EARLY BIRD: Duffy has made five day starts on the season; he has only made one night start in 2016...he is 2-2, 2.90 ERA (31.0 IP, 10 ER) with seven walks and 28 strikeouts in the daytime as opposed to 0-1, 9.53 ERA (5.2 IP, 6 ER) with one walk and two strikeouts in his only night start...3-2, 2.42 ERA (44.2 IP, 12 ER) with nine walks and 43 strikeouts in seven career day starts; 4-2, 4.32 (50.0 IP, 24 ER) with 19 walks and 40 strikeouts in nine career night starts.

EARN IT: Duffy has allowed five or more earned runs in back-to-back starts for the first time in his career; only the third time in his career that he allowed more than three earned runs in a start...two of the three starts have come against the Blue Jays: August 5 at Toronto (Duffy's MLB debut) and May 20 vs. Toronto...Duffy has not allowed an earned run in three of his 15 career starts, and eight times he has allowed one or two runs.

STRIKING WHILE HOT: Duffy recorded five strikeouts last time out...he has struck out at least five batters in four of his six starts in 2016 and 10 of his 15 career starts...he has struck out eight-or-more three times, including a career-high nine May 8 at Chicago-AL... he is second on the Twins in strikeouts (83) since his MLB debut August 5, 2015, behind only Ervin Santana (97).

RIGHT APPROACH: Through his first 16 career starts, right-handers have hit just .241 (48-for-199) off Duffy with 35 strikeouts and a .291 on-base percentage...conversely, left-handers have hit .287 (48-for-167) with a .350 on-base percentage off Duffy.

SEVEN ISN'T HEAVEN: In his career, Duffy owns a 2.87 ERA (87.2 IP, 28 ER) and opponents hit just .236 (77-for-326) in the first six innings of the game...from the seventh inning on, though, Duffy's ERA is 10.29 (7.0 IP, 8 ER) and he has allowed a .475 (19-for-40) average against...Duffy's batting average against increased each time through the lineup (first time - .159, second time - .288, third time - .340, fourth time - .556).

ROCHESTER RECAP: Duffy made three starts for Triple-A Rochester where he did not allow more than two runs in any start...he went winless but posted a 1.72 ERA (15.2 IP, 3 ER) with seven walks and 13 strikeouts...April 18 vs. Pawtucket was his longest start of the year, pitching 7.0 IP, allowing seven hits, one earned run, one walk and a season-high six strikeouts...Duffy was recalled by the Twins April 23, starting in place of previously scheduled starter Ervin Santana who was placed on the disabled list April 26 (retroactive April 20) due to lower back pain.

TOMORROW'S STARTER - PAT DEAN, LHP [SEASON: 1-1, 3.43 ERA // CAREER: 1-1, 3.43 ERA]

Dean will be making his third career major league start tomorrow afternoon at Oakland...in his last start, May 27 at Seattle, Dean picked up his first major league win after going 7.0 innings, allowing two runs on four hits with no walks and eight strikeouts...the 7.0 innings and eight strikeouts were both career highs...has two career relief appearances, both coming this season, posting a record of 0-1 with a 4.50 ERA (8.0 IP, 4 ER), two walks and seven strikeouts...made his major league debut May 11 vs. Baltimore after his contract was selected from Triple-A Rochester May 7...has a career minor league record of 47-53, 3.91 ERA (814.2 IP, 354 ER) with 155 walks and 478 strikeouts...selected by the Twins in the third round of 2010 First-Year Player Draft.
