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OAKLAND ATHLETICS (24-29) VS. MINNESOTA TWINS (15-36)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won four straight after losing three in a row... have three winning streaks of four or more games this year and four losing streaks of four or more games...are 5-7 over the last 12 games and 10-8 over the last 18 contests...are 24-29 (.453) for the season, which is tied for the third worst record in the American League...are in a tie for fourth place in the AL West for the sixth consecutive day and are 7½ games behind first place Texas...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 14 days in third, seven days tied for third, 14 days in fourth and nine days tied for fourth.

ONE-THIRD OF THE SEASON: The A's will play their 54th game of the season today, which is the one-third mark of the season...have a .299 on-base percentage, which is on pace to break the Oakland record for lowest on-base percentage in a season (.302 in 1979)...have 121 walks on are on pace for 370...the fewest walks in Oakland history in a non-strike season is 433 in 1978...have 76 doubles for a pace of 232, which would be the A's fewest doubles in a non-strike season since 1992 (219)...the pitching staff has allowed 64 home runs and is on pace for 196...have allowed more than 180 home runs in a season twice in Oakland history (205 in 1996, 197 in 1997)...have a 4.70 ERA and have not finished with an ERA above 4.69 since 1998 (4.81)...Khris Davis leads the A's with 14 home runs and Oakland has not had a player with 40 home runs since Jason Giambi hit 43 in 2000...Rich Hill has eight wins and the A's have not had a 20-game winner since Barry Zito won 23 in 2002...Hill has 74 strikeouts, which puts him on pace for 226...the only pitcher in Oakland history to fan more than 205 batters in a season is Vida Blue (301 in 1971).

IN MAY: The A's went 11-17 (.370) in May, which tied for the second worst record in the American League...went 11-19 (.367) in May last year...the offense walked just 59 times, which was second fewest in the majors and the fewest by an A's team in the month of May since the 1945 Philadelphia A's had 57...it was just the second time in Oakland history the A's walked fewer than 60 times in a month of 20 or more games (43 in 24 games in July, 2015)...compiled a 5.70 ERA, which was second highest in the AL and third highest in the majors...it was the second highest May ERA in Oakland history (6.59 in 1997)...surrendered 41 home runs, which tied for third most in the AL and fell one short of the Oakland record for home runs allowed in May (41 in 1997)...it was just the second time in the last 18 years the A's have allowed at least 40 home runs in a month (48, Sept. 2015)

PITCHING: The A's have a 5.82 ERA (124 er in 191.2 ip), .289 (222-for-769) opponents batting average and 32 home runs allowed over the last 21 games dating back to May 8...posted a 3.91 ERA, .253 opponents average and 32 home runs over the first 31 contests...now have a 4.70 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League to Minnesota (5.01)...have the third highest opponents batting average (.268), on-base percentage (.334) and slugging percentage (.437)...have issued the third most walks (168) and hit the third most batters (21).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 10-20 with a 6.29 ERA (132 er in 189.0 ip) over the last 36 games dating back to April 23...that includes 6-1 with a 1.80 ERA (9 er in 45.0 ip) in seven starts by Rich Hill and 4-19 with a 7.69 ERA (123 er in 144.0 ip) in 29 starts by everyone else...starters are 16-25 with a 5.13 ERA (163 er in 286.0 ip) overall...the losses are second most in the majors (San Diego, 26) and the ERA is second highest in the American League (Minnesota, 5.33).

OFFENSE: The A's are hitting .267 (229-for-859) and are averaging 4.7 runs per game (117 runs) over the last 25 games dating back to May 4...batted .234 and averaged 3.4 runs per game over the first 28 contests...rank last in the American League in on-base percentage (.299) and second to last in walks (121)...have the third fewest doubles (76) and are tied for the third fewest extra base hits (141).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have not committed an error in seven of their last eight games...however, have 37 errors for the season, which is the most in the American League and tied for fourth most in the majors...rank third in the AL in double plays (57).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's have won each of their last four home games, which matches the longest home winning streak of the season (April 16-30)...are 4-1 on this six-game homestand against Detroit (2-1) and Min-

nesota (2-0)...went 3-4 on the last homestand against Texas (3-0) and New York-AL (0-4) and are 12-16 (.429) at home, which is tied for the third worst home record in the American League...begin an eight-game road trip to Houston (three games), Milwaukee (two games) and Cincinnati (three games) on Friday...went 1-2 on the last road trip to Seattle and are 12-13 (.480) on the road...are batting .263 (233-for-887) and are averaging 4.36 runs per game (109 runs in 25 games) on the road compared to .236 (216-for-914) with an average of 3.71 runs per game (104 runs in 28 games) at home...have a 5.80 ERA (139 er in 215.2 ip) on the road compared to 3.75 (105 er in 252.0 ip) at home...have the highest road ERA in the AL and second highest in the majors.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 7-3 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied for second in the majors in last at bat wins (Seattle, 8) and have the fourth best winning percentage (.700)...are 2-0 in extra inning games and are tied for the second fewest extra inning games in the American League...both extra inning games have come on the road and the A's now have a streak of 47 consecutive home games since their last extra inning game in the Coliseum (Aug. 18, 2015 vs. Los Angeles-NL)...that is the longest such streak by an A's team since a 55-game streak from Sept. 25, 1983-July 20, 1984)...are 7-8 in one-run games and have dropped five of their last seven one-run decisions after winning five of the first eight.

THIS AND THAT: The A's will have three off days over their next eight days beginning tomorrow...have another off day June 20 and then play 20 consecutive days without a day off leading into the All-Star Break...A's pinch hitters are tied for the American League lead in RBI (6), tied for second in hits (9) and rank third in plate appearances (41)...the A's are averaging 2 hours and 57 minutes per game, which is fifth fastest in the majors...have been successful in 7-of-10 (70.0%) replay challenges, which is the best percentage in the majors...the 10 challenges are tied for fifth fewest in the majors...are 6-5 (.545) in games started by a left-handed pitcher compared to 18-24 (.429) against righties...are hitting .237 against lefties, .253 against righties.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 14 times this year and currently have 11 players on the DL (H. Alvarez, R.J. Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doubront, Fuld, Gray, Hendriks, Parker, Reddick, Sogard)...R.J. Alvarez, Bassitt, Doubront, Fuld, Parker and Sogard are on the 60-day DL...the 14 players have combined to miss 455 games (32.5 games per stint)...have had at least 11 players on the DL every day since May 10 and at least six players on the DL all year...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. TWINS: The A's defeated the Twins yesterday, marking the 999th win for the Athletics franchise (Philadelphia, Kansas City, Oakland) against the Twins/Senators franchise...the A's have not defeated any team 1,000 times...have won the first two meetings of 2016 after losing the season series last year for the first time since 2010 as they went 3-4...won two of three in Oakland and lost three of four in Minnesota...have won 15 of the last 18 games in the Coliseum...are 22-10 (.688) against the Twins dating back to the start of the 2012 season...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 295-295 against Minnesota...that includes 165-128 in Oakland and 130-167 in Minnesota...are 352-364 all-time against the Twins and have a 999-1000 record against the Twins/Senators.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Ryan Dull has stranded all 21 of his inherited runners...opponents are 0-for-28 with runners in scoring position and first batters faced are 0-for-21 with two walks...**Danny Valencia** is 9-for-14 (.643) over his last four games and is now batting .359 (28-for-78) with 18 runs, eight home runs and 19 RBI in 21 games since he was reinstated from the 15-day disabled list May 6.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1971** Reggie Jackson homers in the third inning of the A's 5-2 win at New York to give the A's a home run in 13 consecutive games, what was then a club record...the A's hit 25 round trippers during the streak, including six by Jackson...in **2006** Barry Zito strikes out Lew Ford in the sixth inning to become the fourth pitcher in Oakland history and the eighth in Athletics history with 1000 career strikeouts.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (1-3, 7.03 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was selected from Triple-A Nashville April 29 and is scheduled to make his seventh start of the season and his career...six of those have come at home...the seven starts will be tied for second among American League rookies...has a 7.03 ERA, which is the highest in the AL and fourth highest in the majors among all pitchers with at least 30.0 innings pitched...has a 3.00 ERA (4 er in 12.0 ip) in the first two innings compared to a 9.45 ERA (21 er in 20.0 ip) from the third inning on.

LAST THREE, FIRST THREE: Is 1-2 with a 4.19 ERA (9 er in 19.1 ip) and .257 (19-for-74) opponents batting average over his last three starts after going 0-1 with a 11.37 ERA and .382 opponents average over his first three starts...has allowed one home run over his last three starts after surrendering four over his first three...yielded at least four runs in each of his first three starts to become the second pitcher in Oakland history to allow at least four runs in each of his first three Major League appearances...the other is Vida Blue (July 20-Aug. 3, 1969).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has held left-handed hitters to a .130 (3-for-23) batting average...right-handers are batting .349 (37-for-106) with all five of his home runs and eight of his 10 walks...has a .978 OPS against righties, .374 against lefties...has a .212 (11-for-52) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup...333 (15-for-45) the second time and .438 (14-for-32) after that...opponents are 13-for-23 (.565) with five doubles, two home runs and 12 RBI when putting the first pitch in play...the opponents clean-up hitter is 9-for-17 (.529) with three home runs and seven RBI...has surrendered three of his five home runs in his first 15 pitches of a game.

FIRST START: He had a no decision in his Major League debut, a 7-4 A's win over Houston April 29 in Oakland...had just 42 minor league appearances, all starts, in three professional seasons...became the 45th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut, the first since Dan Straily on Aug. 3, 2012 against Toronto...allowed a leadoff home run to Gattis in the second inning but the A's came back with two in the bottom of the second...allowed a RBI single to Gattis in the sixth to tie the game and was relieved by Doolittle with no outs and runners on first and second...Doolittle allowed both runs to score but the A's tied the game in the eighth and won it on a three-run home run by Alonso in the ninth.

SECOND START: He had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 9-8 loss to Seattle in Oakland on May 4...shutout the Mariners on two hits and a walk over the first four innings and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed four runs in the fifth inning...Marte had a RBI double, Cano a RBI single and Cruz a two-run home run...the A's then scored six times in the bottom of the fifth to give him an 8-4 lead but the bullpen allowed two runs in the sixth inning and three more in the seventh for the blown save (Axford).

THIRD START: He had the first decision of his career, a loss in the A's 13-5 loss at Boston May 10...allowed a lead-off home run to Betts in the first inning and Ramirez added a two-run homer...retired the side in order in the second but then allowed five runs in the third inning while recording just two outs...Pedroia had a RBI double, Bogaerts and Young had RBI singles and Shaw chased him from the game with a two-run double.

FOURTH START: He picked up his first Major League win in the A's 3-1 victory over Texas May 16 in Oakland...shutout the Rangers on two hits and a walk over the first six innings...had a 2-0 lead with runners on second and third and one out in the seventh inning...allowed a sacrifice fly to Stubbs and was relieved by Doolittle who got the final out of the inning.

FIFTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-1 loss to New York (AL) in Oakland on May 21...retired each of the first nine batters he faced before allowing the first four batters to reach base in the fourth inning...yielded four runs in the fourth on a Beltrna RBI single, a Hicks sacrifice fly and a Refsnyder two-run double...also allowed a RBI double to Castro in the seventh.

LAST START: He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 4-1 loss to Detroit last Friday...shutout the Tigers on three hits over the first three innings but then allowed two runs in the fourth on a RBI double by Maybin and a RBI single by McCann...also allowed a leadoff home run to Castellanos in the sixth...left after six innings trailing 3-0 as the A's were shutout on three hits over the first eight innings.

2015 RECAP: Was acquired by the A's from Kansas City in the Ben Zobrist deal at the trading deadline and went 6-0 with a 1.90 ERA in seven starts with Double-A Midland...began the year in extended spring training with the Royals and combined for a 1-1 record and a 3.69 ERA in seven starts with the Royals affiliate in the Arizona Rookie League, Single-A Wilmington and Double-A Northwest Arkansas...was 7-1 with a 2.66 ERA in 14 starts overall...struck out 90 batters in 74.1 innings (10.90 per nine innings).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .243 opponents batting average, including .198 (36-for-182) against right-handed hitters compared to .330 (31-for-94) against left-handers...surrendered three of his five home runs to lefties for a .511 slugging percentage...held righties to a mark of .275...opponents batted .323 with a .421 on-base percentage when leading off an inning.

THIS AND THAT: Compiled a 1.29 ERA in the first inning, a 4.20 ERA in innings two through four and a 0.46 ERA from the fifth inning on...his teams were 10-4 (.714) in his starting assignments, including 7-0 at Midland...allowed one run or fewer in eight of his 14 starts, including no runs four times.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: Is 16-9 with a 2.82 ERA in 42 games, all starts, in three professional seasons...has 257 strikeouts in 214.0 innings, an average of 10.81 per nine innings...has surrendered just 10 home runs (0.42 per nine innings)...was originally drafted by Kansas City as a Competitive Balance pick following the first round of the 2013 draft and was dealt to the A's just prior to the 2015 trading deadline in the Ben Zobrist deal.

RHP Jesse Hahn (2-2, 4.15 ERA): Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville May 17 for his second stint with the A's this year and is 1-1 with a 4.91 ERA in three starts since his return...was recalled for the first time April 30 and went 1-1 with a 3.00 ERA in two starts before he was optioned to Nashville May 8...has allowed six home runs in 30.1 innings this year (1.78 per nine innings) after surrendering nine home runs in 170.0 innings over his first two seasons (0.48 per nine innings)...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 12-3 A's win over Detroit last Saturday in Oakland (6.0 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 3 er, 4 bb, 5 so, 1 hr)...is 1-1 with a 2.13 ERA (12.2 ip, 8 h, 3 r, 3 er, 4 bb, 10 so, 1 hr) in two career starts against Houston...the win came in his only start this year against the Astros, a 2-0 A's win in Oakland on April 30 (6.2 ip, 3 h, 2 bb, 4 so)...was 1-1 with a 1.93 ERA in five starts with Nashville...did not allow a home run in 23.1 innings but issued 10 walks.

- The A's bullpen has a 5.71 ERA (55 er in 86.2 ip) and .270 (94-for-348) opponents batting average over its last 25 games dating back to May 4...posted a 2.46 ERA and .226 opponents average over its first 28 contests...now has a 4.01 ERA for the season, which is the fifth highest in the American League.
- Has allowed just 15-of-87 (17.2%) inherited runners to score, which is the best percentage in the majors.
- Has tossed 181.2 innings, which are second most in the AL (Houston, 182.0) and fifth most in the majors.
- Is 16-for-21 (76.2%) in save opportunities...the save percentage ranks second in the AL and the saves are tied for third.

- Is tied for third among American League relievers in wins (3).
- Has a 0.68 ERA (1 er in 13.1 ip) in 13 games at home, an 8.59 ERA (7 er in 7.1 ip) in eight games on the road.
- Has a 1.59 ERA (2 er in 11.1 ip) in 13 games with two days rest or less, a 5.79 ERA (6 er in 9.1 ip) in eight games with three days rest or more.

- Has not yielded a run in nine of his last 10 games (1 er in 9.1 ip, 0.96 ERA)...has struck out 15 and walked just one over that span...has not allowed a run in 17 of his last 19 games (3 er in 16.1 ip, 1.65 ERA) after posting a 6.75 ERA over his first six games.
- Recorded the save on Sunday, his third of the season and first since April 20 at New York.
- Is tied for fifth among American League relievers in games pitched (25).
- Has not allowed a run in 11 games and 9.2 innings on the road...has a 5.25 ERA (7 er in 12.0 ip) in 14 games at home.
- Has a .195 opponents batting average...that includes .152 (5-for-33) against left-handed hitters and .227 (10-for-44) against right-handers.
- His appearance against the Twins on Monday was his first since Aug. 8, 2014...is 1-0 with a save, no blown saves and a 2.25 ERA (2 er in 8.0 ip) in seven games in his career against Minnesota.
