THE TWINS: The Twins have gone 3-2 through five games on their six game roadtrip, sweeping Seattle in three, then losing two at Oakland...following today's series finale, the Twins will fly home for a 10-game, 11-day homestand with four against Tampa Bay (June 2-5), three against Miami (June 7-9) and three against Boston (June 10-12)...the Twins will play a total of 17 home games in the month of June while playing 10 road games...additionally, they will enjoy two off days at home this month.

TWINS HIT, BUT FALL SHORT IN OAKLAND: The Twins lost to the A's last night by a score of 7-4, suffering their 12th series loss in 2016...Tyler Duffey (2-4) was the starter and loser, allowing five runs on 10 hits in 4.2 innings pitched...Twins pitchers still combined to strikeout 12 A's, tying their season-high (April 24 at Washington)...the offense recorded 12 hits, the fourth time with double-digit hits in their last six games and third time on this trip...four different Twins had multi-hit games, including Robbie Grossman, who tied his season high with three.

ROSTER MOVE: The Twins have placed outfielder Miguel Sano on the 15-day disabled list with a left hamstring strain, an injury he suffered running to first base in the third inning last night in Oakland...to replace Sano on the 25-man roster the Twins recalled outfielder Max Kepler from Triple-A Rochester...Kepler hit .282 (31-for-110) with four doubles, six triples, one home runs and 19 RBI in 30 games for the Red Wings this season...Kepler appeared in nine games with the Twins earlier this season.
 Kepler was hitting .440 (11-for-25) in his last seven games for the Red Wings.






MAUER WINS THE WEEK: Major League Baseball announced yesterday that Joe Mauer was named AL Player of the Week for the period ending May 29...Mauer hit .440 (11-for-25) with seven runs scored, four home runs and seven RBI over six games to claim his third career AL Player of the Week Award, last winning on May 24, 2009...among AL players, Mauer finished first in total bases (23), tied for first in home runs, second in slugging percentage (.920), tied for second in runs scored, tied for fourth in on-base percentage (.500) and RBI, and tied for fifth in batting average.

NUNEZ BUSINESS: Eduardo Nunez is hitting .340 (54-for-159) with 10 doubles and 20 RBI in 42 games this season, hitting safely in 30 of those games...he is hitting .519 (14-for-27) in his last six games...he ranks third in the AL in batting average, trailing Xander Bogaerts (.350) and Victor Martinez (.343)...additionally, he leads the club in multi-hit games (16).

 He is hitting .400 (34-for-85) in 23 road games this season, the third highest in baseball, trailing Victor Martinez (.417) and Aledmys Diaz (.405).
 Nunez enters today with a seven-game hitting streak, two short of his season/career-high of nine, done April 27-May 10.

BAT MAN ROBBIE: Robbie Grossman was signed by the Twins as a minor league free agent May 17 and selected by Minnesota on May 19...he has played in 11 games for the Twins, hitting safely in seven of those and reaching base via hit or walk in 10...since playing his first game with Minnesota May 20, he ranks seventh in the AL with a .452 on-base percentage (minimum 30 plate appearances) and is tied for 13th in the AL in times on base (19).

THIS AND THAT:

-  The Twins have hit 11 home runs and have scored 5.2 runs-per-game in their last six games.
-  This season against left-handed pitching: Robbie Grossman is 6-for-13 (.462) with three doubles and a home run...Brian Dozier is 7-for-22 (.318) with a double and a home run...Eduardo Escobar is 9-for-26 (.346) with a double...Eduardo Nunez is 8-for-24 (.333) with three doubles and a home run.
-  Brandon Kintzler enters today with a 7.2-scoreless inning streak.
-  Brian Dozier has not committed an error in his last 32 games (152 total chances).
-  Triple-A Rochester finished May 19-10, the most wins by a Red Wings club in May since 1997 (also 19)...in the Twins era (2003-curent), the Wings have only won 19 games in a month twice: 20 in July, 2013 and 20 in August, 2008.

LAST TIME OUT: Dean earned his first career win in his second start May 27 at Seattle...tossed 7.0 innings and allowed just two runs and four hits with no walks and eight strikeouts...surrendered a solo home run in the first inning to Franklin Gutierrez before retiring eight of the next nine batters; set down the final 11 men he faced...the fourth time this season a Twins starter struck out eight-or-more and most since Tyler Duffey struck out nine May 8 at Chicago-AL...the third start of 7.0-or-more innings in which a Twins starter did not issue a walk...threw 93 pitches, 63 strikes.

MLB DEBUT: Dean made his major league debut May 11 vs. Baltimore, surrendering two runs, four hits and two walks while striking out three in 2.2 innings out of the bullpen...recorded his first career strikeout (swinging) in the fifth inning against Joey Rickard...was recalled May 7 from Triple-A Rochester after Tommy Milone was outrighted to Triple-A and Casey Fien was claimed by Los Angeles-NL.

NEXT MAN UP: Dean is the third Twins pitcher to make his major league debut this year...Taylor Rogers was recalled from Triple-A Rochester April 13 after Glen Perkins was placed on the 15-day with a left posterior shoulder strain (retroactive to April 11), and he debuted April 14 vs. Chicago-AL, tossing 0.2 inning of relief and allowing one hit...Jose Berrios had his contract selected from Triple-A April 26 when Kyle Gibson (retroactive to April 23) and Ervin Santana (retroactive to April 20) were both placed on the 15-day DL (Gibson - right shoulder strain; Santana - lower back strain); Berrios then debuted April 27 vs. Cleveland, taking the loss after he allowed five runs, six hits and two walks with five strikeouts in 5.0 innings of work...Alex Meyer did not make his MLB debut this season but made his first career start May 3 at Houston, taking his first career loss after surrendering three runs, three hits and three walks in 2.2 innings...Dean is the third Twin to earn his first career win this season (Michael Tonkin April 17 vs. Los Angeles-AL; Berrios May 2 at Houston)...Byung Ho Park is the only position player to make his MLB debut for the Twins in 2016, going 1-for-3 with a run and a hit-by-pitch April 4 at Baltimore.

ROCHESTER RECAP: Dean made six starts for the Red Wings prior to his promotion and went 1-3, 3.00 (36.0 IP, 12 ER) with seven walks and 20 strikeouts...lost his first three starts despite a 3.50 ERA (18.0 IP, 7 ER), including a complete game loss April 14 at Buffalo; surrendered two runs, one earned, on five hits and one walk in 8.0 innings...earned his first win in his final start for Rochester May 4 at Syracuse; tossed 6.0 innings and ceded nine hits and two runs with one walk and three strikeouts...lasted 5.0-plus innings in every start.

SPRING RECAP: Dean went 0-0, 5.40 ERA (3.1 IP, 2 ER) with no walks and two strikeouts in three relief outings in major league spring training...threw 1.0 scoreless inning March 4 at the Pirates and March 13 vs. the Orioles, but surrendered two runs and three hits in 1.1 innings March 8 at the Blue Jays...optioned to Triple-A March 14.

- Spent entire season with Triple-A Rochester.
- Named International League Pitcher of the Week April 19, going 1-0, 0.75 ERA (12.0 IP, 1 ER) with six walks and 15 strikeouts in two starts.

TOMORROW'S STARTER - KYLE GIBSON, RHP (2016: 0-3, 6.10 ERA; CAREER: 26-30, 4.50 ERA)

Gibson will make his fifth start of the season tomorrow night vs. Tampa Bay at Target Field...he is making his first start since returning from the 15-day disabled list; was placed on DL April 26, retroactive to April 23, with a right shoulder strain...last started April 22 at Washington, allowing a season-high seven runs on seven hits and two walks over 3.0 innings en route to his third loss...0-3, 6.10 ERA (20.2 IP, 14 ER) with 12 walks and 11 strikeouts in four starts this year...in four career starts against the Rays, is 0-4, 8.85 ERA (20.1 IP, 20 ER) with nine walks and nine strikeouts...Gibson is in his fourth major league season with the Twins and is 26-30, 4.50 ERA (445.2 IP, 223 ER) with 154 walks and 292 strikeouts in 77 career starts.
