OAKLAND ATHLETICS (25-29) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (25-30)

ABOUT THE A'S: Swept a three-game series from Minnesota to close out the last homestand and extend their winning streak to five games...that is one short of the longest winning streak this year (6, April 16-22)...are now 6-7 over the last 13 games and 11-8 over the last 19...are 25-29 (.463) for the season and are in third place in the American League West...trail first place Seattle and Texas by 6½ games...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 14 days in fourth and nine days tied for fourth...have three winning streaks of four or more games this year and four losing streaks of four or more games.

ONE-THIRD OF THE SEASON: The A's played their 54th game of the season Wednesday, which is the one-third mark of the season...have a .300 on-base percentage, which is on pace to break the Oakland record for lowest on-base percentage in a season (.302 in 1979)...have 123 walks on are on pace for 369...the fewest walks in Oakland history in a non-strike season is 433 in 1978...have 79 doubles for a pace of 237, which would be the A's fewest doubles in a non-strike season since 1992 (219)...the pitching staff has allowed 64 home runs and is on pace for 192...have allowed more than 180 home runs in a season twice in Oakland history (205 in 1996, 197 in 1997)...have a 4.63 ERA and have not finished with an ERA above 4.58 since 1999 (4.69)...Khris Davis leads the A's with 14 home runs and Oakland has not had a player with 40 home runs since Jason Giambi hit 43 in 2000...Rich Hill has eight wins and the A's have not had a 20-game winner since Barry Zito won 23 in 2002...Hill has 74 strikeouts, which puts him on pace for 222...the only pitcher in Oakland history to fan more than 205 batters in a season is Vida Blue (301 in 1971).

OFFENSE: The A's are 56-for-165 (.339) over their last five games, which has boosted their batting average to a season-high .251...are hitting .269 (240-for-891) and are averaging 4.7 runs per game (122 runs) over the last 26 games dating back to May 4...batted .234 and averaged 3.4 runs per game over the first 28 contests...have a .300 on-base percentage, which is second lowest in the American League...have the second fewest walks in the AL (123) but are tied with Boston for the most intentional walks (12)...have the third fewest doubles (79) and the fourth fewest runs scored (218) and extra base hits (145).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have a season-high tying four-game errorless streak and have committed just one error over their last nine games...however, have 37 errors for the season, which is the most in the American League and fifth most in the majors...are tied for second in the AL in double plays (58).

PITCHING: The A's compiled a 2.67 ERA (16 er in 54.0 ip) in six games on the last homestand...did not allow a home run in their final four games, matching their longest streak of consecutive games without a home run over the last three years...have a 5.61 ERA (125 er in 200.2 ip), .285 (228-for-800) opponents batting average and 32 home runs allowed over the last 21 games dating back to May 8...posted a 3.91 ERA, .253 opponents average and 32 home runs over the first 31 contests...now have a 4.63 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...have the second highest opponents on-base percentage (.333) and third highest opponents batting average (.267) and slugging percentage (.433)...have issued the third most walks (173) and are tied for the third most hit batters (21).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 4-0 with a 3.41 ERA (11 er in 29.0 ip) over the last five games...the four-game winning streak by starters matches their longest of the season (April 16-22)...are 11-20 with a 6.14 ERA (133 er in 195.0 ip) over the last 37 games dating back to April 23...that includes 6-1 with a 1.80 ERA (9 er in 45.0 ip) in seven starts by Rich Hill and 5-19 with a 7.44 ERA (124 er in 150.0 ip) in 30 starts by everyone else...starters are 17-25 with a 5.05 ERA (164 er in 292.0 ip) overall...the losses are tied with Minnesota for second most in the majors (San Diego, 26) and the ERA is second highest in the American League (Minnesota, 5.41) and fifth highest in the majors.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin an eight-game road trip to Houston (three games), Milwaukee (two games) and Cincinnati (three games) to-night...had the day off yesterday and have off days in Milwaukee on Monday and Cincinnati on Thursday...went 1-2 on the last road trip to Seattle and are 12-13 (.480) on the road...went 5-1 on the last homestand against Detroit (2-1) and Minnesota (3-0) and are 13-16 (.448) at home, which is

the fourth worst home record in the American League...have a season-high five-game home winning streak...have a 5.80 ERA (139 er in 215.2 ip) on the road compared to 3.66 (106 er in 261.0 ip) at home...have the highest road ERA in the AL and second highest in the majors (Cincinnati, 6.52)...are batting .263 (233-for-887) and are averaging 4.36 runs per game (109 runs in 25 games) on the road compared to .240 (227-for-946) with an average of 3.76 runs per game (109 runs in 29 games) at home.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 7-3 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied for second in the majors in last at bat wins (Seattle, 8) and best winning percentage (Baltimore, 7-2)...are 2-0 in extra inning games and are tied for the second fewest extra inning games in the American League...are 7-8 in one-run games and have dropped five of their last seven one-run decisions after winning five of the first eight.

THIS AND THAT: A's pinch hitters are tied for second in the American League in hits (9) and RBI (6) and are tied for third in plate appearances (41)...the A's are averaging 2 hours and 56 minutes per game, which is second fastest in the majors (Toronto, 2:55)...have been successful in 7-of-10 (70.0%) replay challenges, which is the best percentage in the majors...the 10 challenges are tied for fourth fewest in the majors...are 7-5 (.583) in games started by a left-handed pitcher compared to 18-24 (.429) against righties...are hitting .246 against lefties, .253 against righties.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 14 times this year and currently have 11 players on the DL (H. Alvarez, R.J. Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doubront, Fuld, Gray, Hendriks, Parker, Reddick, Sogard)...R.J. Alvarez, Bassitt, Doubront, Fuld, Parker and Sogard are on the 60-day DL...the 14 players have combined to miss 466 games (33.3 games per stint)...have had at least 11 players on the DL every day since May 10 and at least six players on the DL all year...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

IN MAY: The A's went 11-17 (.370) in May, which tied for the second worst record in the American League...went 11-19 (.367) in May last year...the offense walked just 59 times, which was second fewest in the majors and the fewest by an A's team in the month of May since the 1945 Philadelphia A's had 57...it was just the second time in Oakland history the A's walked fewer than 60 times in a month of 20 or more games (43 in 24 games in July, 2015)...compiled a 5.70 ERA, which was second highest in the AL and third highest in the majors...it was the second highest May ERA in Oakland history (6.59 in 1997)...surrendered 41 home runs, which tied for third most in the AL and fell one short of the Oakland record for home runs allowed in May (41 in 1997)...it was just the second time in the last 18 years the A's have allowed at least 40 home runs in a month (48, Sept. 2015).

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's won two of three in Oakland April 30-May 1 to open the season series...lost the season series to the Astros for the first time last year...went 9-10 last year, including 5-5 in Oakland and 4-5 in Houston...the A's lead the all-time series 42-24 (.636), which is the second best record by a Major League club against another club among teams that have played each other 40 or more times...13 of the A's 24 losses to Houston have been by one run...are 23-12 in Oakland and 19-12 in Houston.

TODAY'S TIDBITS
Ryan Dull has stranded all 21 of his inherited runners and opponents are 0-for-32 with runners in scoring position...**Danny Valencia** is 12-for-18 (.667) over his last five games and is now batting .378 (31-for-82) with 18 runs, eight home runs and 19 RBI in 22 games since he was reinstated from the 15-day disabled list May 6.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY
In **1980**, the A's trail 4-1 entering the ninth inning at Cleveland when Dave Revering, Mitchell Page and Tony Armas hit consecutive home runs to send the game into extra inning...the A's would go on to lose 6-4 in 10 innings...in **2004** the A's tie an Oakland record by playing their third straight extra inning game, a 2-1 win against Toronto in 11 innings.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Hahn (2-2, 4.15 ERA)

FOR OPENERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville May 17 for his second stint with the A's this year and is 1-1 with a 4.91 ERA (10 er in 18.1 ip) in three starts since his return...was recalled for the first time April 30 and went 1-1 with a 3.00 ERA in two starts before he was optioned to Nashville May 8...the two starts were his first since July 1, 2015 against Colorado as he spent the final three months of the 2015 season on the disabled list with a strained right forearm.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed six home runs in 30.1 innings this year (1.78 per nine innings) after surrendering nine home runs in 170.0 innings over his first two seasons (0.48 per nine innings)...the six home runs are a career high...four of the six home runs he has allowed this year have been solo shots...six of his nine home runs entering the season came with runners on base...five of his six home runs this year and 12 of 15 in his career have been hit by left-handed hitters.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has held right-handed hitters to a .237 (14-for-59) batting average while lefties are batting .321 (18-for-56)...now has a .199 (72-for-362) career average against righties...opponents are hitting .319 (23-for-72) with the bases empty compared to .209 (9-for-43) with runners on...they are 2-for-18 (.111) with runners in scoring position...yielded a .318 average with RISP last year...has allowed a .400 (12-for-30) batting average, .438 (2 bb) on-base percentage and .667 (2 2b, 2 hr) slugging percentage to hitters leading off an inning...last year, he yielded a .215 batting average, .277 on-base percentage and .290 slugging percentage to batters leading off an inning...has a .167 (7-for-42) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup this year, .342 (25-for-73) after that.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 2-1 with a 3.44 ERA (7 er in 18.1 ip) and .219 (14-for-64) opponents batting average in three starts during the day compared to 0-1 with a 5.25 ERA (7 er in 12.0 ip) and .353 (18-for-51) opponents average in two starts at night...last year, he went 4-1 with a 1.52 ERA and .169 opponents batting average in six starts during the day compared to 2-5 with a 4.72 ERA and .284 opponents average in 10 starts at night...his career numbers are 8-3 with a 1.98 ERA (18 er in 81.2 ip) during the day, 7-9 with a 4.32 ERA (57 er in 118.2 ip) at night.

FIRST START: He combined with Axford and Madson on a four-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win over Houston April 30 in Oakland...tossed 6.2 innings and allowed three of the hits...faced the minimum over the first five innings as the only two base runners were erased on double plays...allowed only one base runner past first base when Correa doubled and went to third on a ground out in the seventh.

SECOND START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-2 loss in the night game of the day/night doubleheader at Baltimore May 7...walked a career-high tying four batters...retired six of the seven batters he faced over the first two innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 10.2 innings...then allowed four runs in the third on a Kim RBI ground out, a Jones a RBI single and a Davis a two-run home run...allowed another run in the fourth inning when Schoop scored on a grounded into double play.

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 8-5 win over Texas in Oakland on May 17...allowed a career-high tying 10 hits...blanked the Rangers on two hits and a walk over the first three innings and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed back-to-back home runs to Mazara and Beltre to start the fourth...surrendered one more run in the inning when Fielder scored on a double play...left after 6.2 innings with a 4-3 lead but Madson allowed two runs in the ninth before Davis hit a walk-off grand slam in the bottom of the ninth for the win.

FOURTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-4 loss to New York (AL) May 22 in Oakland...the A's scored a run in the first but he allowed solo home runs to McCann in the second and Ellsbury in the third...Oakland scored twice in the fifth to take a 3-2 lead and he was relieved by Axford with runners on first and second and two outs in the sixth...Axford allowed both of the inherited runners to score for the blown save.

LAST START: He picked up his second win of the season in the A's 12-3 victory over Detroit last Saturday in Oakland...issued a career-high tying four walks...blanked the Tigers on three hits and a walk over the first three innings and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a run to score on a wild pitch in the fifth inning...Oakland increased its lead to 3-1 before he allowed a two-run home run to V.Martinez in the sixth...the A's then scored five times in the bottom of the sixth for the win.

HAHN vs. HOUSTON: Is 1-1 with a 2.13 ERA (12.2 ip, 8 h, 3 r, 3 er, 4 bb, 10 so, 1 hr) in two career starts...the win came in his only start this year, a 2-0 A's win in Oakland on April 30 (see first start above)...the loss came last year at Houston on May 20 in a 6-1 decision...allowed a RBI single to Marisnick in the third inning and the A's tied the game with a run in the sixth...retired the first two batters in the bottom of the sixth but Springer singled and Carter hit a two-run home run.

WITH NASHVILLE: Was 1-1 with a 1.93 ERA in five starts with Nashville...did not allow a home run in 23.1 innings but issued 10 walks (3.86 walks per nine innings)...yielded a .258 opponents batting average, including .243 (9-for-37) against left-handed hitters compared to .269 (14-for-52) against right-handers...opponents were 1-for-23 (.043) with two walks (.120 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...allowed three of his five runs in the first inning for a 5.40 ERA...had a 0.98 ERA from the second inning on.

2015 RECAP: Went 6-6 with a 3.35 ERA in 16 starts in his first season with Oakland, a campaign that was cut short due to an injury...got off to a slow start as he went 1-4 with a 4.43 ERA over his first eight starts through May 20...then tossed a four-hit shutout May 25 against Detroit and went 5-2 with a 2.42 ERA over his final eight starts...was placed on the disabled list July 11 retroactive to July 6 with a right forearm strain and missed the remainder of the season...yielded just five home runs in 96.2 innings, an average of 0.47 per nine innings...that was the lowest mark in the American League among pitchers with 90 or more innings pitched...using the same minimum, he also ranked third in the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.324) and fifth in OPS (.623)...opponents reached base on an error 14 times, which was the most in the majors, despite missing half of the season...it tied for second most by an A's pitcher over the last 29 years to Tim Hudson's 15 in 2001...tied for fifth in the AL in unearned runs allowed (10).

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
LHP Rich Hill (8-3, 2.25 ERA): Was named American League Pitcher of the Month yesterday after going 5-1 with a 2.13 ERA in six starts...led the AL in ERA and was one of three five-game winners...is 5-0 with a 1.97 ERA and .190 opponents batting average over his last five starts and has not allowed a home run...the winning streak is one short of his career high...is 6-0 with a 1.40 ERA and .190 opponents batting average in six starts on the road...is the fourth pitcher in Athletics history to win each of his first six starts on the road in a season, joining Sam Gray (1925), Kevin Appier (2000) and Gil Heredia (2000)...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 4-2 A's win over Detroit last Sunday in Oakland (6.1 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 9 so)...is 2-1 with a 2.88 ERA in nine career appearances, including five starts, against Houston...the loss came in his only outing this year, a start in the A's 2-1 loss on May 1 (6.0 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 4 bb, 4 so).

- The A's bullpen has a 0.95 ERA (2 er in 19.0 ip) and .154 (10-for-65) opponents batting average over its last six games dating back to May 27...posted a 6.75 ERA and .291 opponents batting average over its previous 20 contests...now has a 3.95 ERA for the season, which is the fifth highest in the American League.
- Has allowed just 15-of-87 (17.2%) inherited runners to score, which is the best percentage in the majors.
- Is 16-for-21 (76.2%) in save opportunities...the save percentage is tied for second in the AL and the saves are tied for fourth.
- Ranks second in the AL in walks per nine innings (2.44), is tied for the second fewest losses (4), third in innings pitched (184.2), fourth in opponents on-base percentage (.299) and strikeouts per walk (3.50) and fifth in opponents grounded into double plays (16).
