OAKLAND ATHLETICS (25-30) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (26-30)

SATURDAY, JUNE 4, 2016 — MINUTE MAID PARK — 3:10 P.M. CDT RHP KENDALL GRAVEMAN (2-6, 5.09) VS. RHP COLLIN MCHUGH (5-4, 4.82) CSNCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Had their five-game winning streak snapped last night, which was one short of the longest winning streak this year (6, April 16-22)...are now 6-8 over the last 14 games and 11-9 over the last 20...are 25-30 (.455) for the season and are in sole possession of last place in the American League West for the first time this year...trail first place Texas by 7½ games...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 14 days in fourth, nine days tied for fourth and one day in fifth...have three winning streaks of four or more games this year and four losing streaks of four or more games.

ONE-THIRD OF THE SEASON: The A's played their 54th game of the season Wednesday, which is the one-third mark of the season...have a .300 on-base percentage, which is on pace to break the Oakland record for lowest on-base percentage in a season (.302 in 1979)...have 125 walks on are on pace for 368...the fewest walks in Oakland history in a non-strike season is 433 in 1978...have 83 doubles for a pace of 245, which would be the A's fewest doubles in a non-strike season since 1992 (219)...the pitching staff has allowed 65 home runs and is on pace for 192...have allowed more than 180 home runs in a season twice in Oakland history (205 in 1996, 197 in 1997)...have a 4.77 ERA and have not finished with an ERA above 4.58 since 1999 (4.69)...Khris Davis leads the A's with 14 home runs and Oakland has not had a player with 40 home runs since Jason Giambi hit 43 in 2000...Rich Hill has eight wins and the A's have not had a 20-game winner since Barry Zito won 23 in 2002...Hill has 74 strikeouts, which puts him on pace for 218...the only pitcher in Oakland history to fan more than 205 batters in a season is Vida Blue (301 in 1971).

OFFENSE: The A's are 65-for-200 (.325) over their last six games, which has boosted their batting average to a season-high .251...are hitting .269 (249-for-926) and are averaging 4.6 runs per game (124 runs) over the last 27 games dating back to May 4...batted .234 and averaged 3.4 runs per game over the first 28 contests...have a .300 on-base percentage, which is second lowest in the American League...have the fewest walks in the AL (125) but are tied with Boston for the most intentional walks (12)...have the fourth fewest runs scored (220) and doubles (83) and fifth fewest extra base hits (150).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have a season-high five-game errorless streak and have committed just one error over their last 10 games...how-ever, have 37 errors for the season, which is the most in the American League and sixth most in the majors...rank third in the AL in double plays (58).

PITCHING: The A's allowed 12 runs last night, the sixth time they have allowed 11 or more runs this year, after compiling a 2.67 ERA in six games on the last homestand...did not allow a home run in their final four games of the homestand, matching their longest streak of consecutive games without a home run over the last three years...have a 5.91 ERA (137 er in 208.2 ip), .290 (244-for-840) opponents batting average and 33 home runs allowed over the last 24 games dating back to May 8...posted a 3.91 ERA, .253 opponents average and 32 home runs over the first 31 contests...now have a 4.77 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...have the second highest opponents on-base percentage (.336) and slugging percentage (.436) and third highest opponents batting average (.270)...have issued the third most walks (178) and are tied for the third most hit batters (21).

STARTING PITCHING: Jesse Hahn allowed seven runs in 0.2 innings last night, the shortest outing by an A's starter this year, and was charged with the loss...A's starting pitchers were 4-0 with a 3.41 ERA over the previous five games...the four-game winning streak by starters matched their longest of the season (April 16-22)...are 11-21 with a 6.44 ERA (140 er in 195.2 ip) over the last 38 games dating back to April 23...that includes 6-1 with a 1.80 ERA (9 er in 45.0 ip) in seven starts by Rich Hill and 5-20 with a 7.83 ERA (131 er in 150.2 ip) in 31 starts by everyone else...starters are 17-26 with a 5.26 ERA (171 er in 292.2 ip) overall...the losses are tied with Minnesota and San Diego for the most in the majors...the ERA is second highest in the American League (Minnesota, 5.33) and third highest in the majors (Colorado, 5.73).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-1 on this eight-game road trip to Houston (0-1), Milwaukee (two games) and Cincinnati (three games) tonight...had the day off on Thursday and have off days in Milwaukee on Monday and Cincinnati on Thursday...went 1-2 on the last road trip to Seattle and are

12-14 (.462) on the road...went 5-1 on the last homestand against Detroit (2-1) and Minnesota (3-0) and are 13-16 (.448) at home, which is the fourth worst home record in the American League...have a season-high five-game home winning streak...have a 6.08 ERA (151 er in 223.2 ip) on the road compared to 3.66 (106 er in 261.0 ip) at home...have the highest road ERA in the AL and second highest in the majors (Cincinnati, 6.52)... are batting .262 (242-for-922) and are averaging 4.27 runs per game (111 runs in 26 games) on the road compared to .240 (227-for-946) with an average of 3.76 runs per game (109 runs in 29 games) at home.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 7-3 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied for second in the majors in last at bat wins (Seattle, 8) and winning percentage (Baltimore, 7-2)...are 2-0 in extra inning games and are tied for the second fewest extra inning games in the American League...are 7-8 in one-run games and have dropped five of their last seven one-run decisions after winning five of the first eight.

THIS AND THAT: A's pinch hitters are tied for second in the American League in hits (9) and RBI (6) and are tied for third in plate appearances (41)...the A's are averaging 2 hours and 56 minutes per game, which is second fastest in the majors (Toronto, 2:55)...have been successful in 7-of-10 (70.0%) replay challenges, which is the best percentage in the majors...the 10 challenges are tied for fourth fewest in the majors...are 7-5 (.583) in games started by a left-handed pitcher compared to 18-25 (.419) against righties...are hitting .248 against lefties, .252 against righties.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 14 times this year and currently have 11 players on the DL (H. Alvarez, R.J. Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doubront, Fuld, Gray, Hendriks, Parker, Reddick, Sogard)...R.J. Alvarez, Bassitt, Doubront, Fuld, Parker and Sogard are on the 60-day DL...the 14 players have combined to miss 477 games (34.1 games per stint)...have had at least 11 players on the DL every day since May 10 and at least six players on the DL all year...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

IN MAY: The A's went 11-17 (.370) in May, which tied for the second worst record in the American League...went 11-19 (.367) in May last year...the offense walked just 59 times, which was second fewest in the majors and the fewest by an A's team in the month of May since the 1945 Philadelphia A's had 57...it was just the second time in Oakland history the A's walked fewer than 60 times in a month of 20 or more games (43 in 24 games in July, 2015)...compiled a 5.70 ERA, which was second highest in the AL and third highest in the majors...it was the second highest May ERA in Oakland history (6.59 in 1997)...surrendered 41 home runs, which tied for third most in the AL and fell one short of the Oakland record for home runs allowed in May (41 in 1997)...it was just the second time in the last 18 years the A's have allowed at least 40 home runs in a month (48, Sept. 2015).

A's vs. ASTROS: The season series is tied at two games each...the A's dropped the first game in Houston last night after winning two of three in Oakland April 30-May 1 to open the season series...lost the season series to the Astros for the first time last year...went 9-10 last year, including 5-5 in Oakland and 4-5 in Houston...the A's lead the all-time series 42-25 (.627), which is the second best record by a Major League club against an-

other club among teams that have played each other 40 or more times...13 of the A's 25 losses to Houston have been by one run...are 23-12 in Oakland and 19-13 in Houston.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Ryan Dull has stranded all 21 of his inherited runners and opponents are 0-for-32 with runners in scoring position... **Danny Valencia** is 12-for-20 (.600) over his last six games and is now batting .369 (31-for-84) with 18 runs, eight home runs and 19 RBI in 23 games since he was reinstated from the 15-day disabled list May 6.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1972** Catfish Hunter pitches a two-hit shutout in the first game of a double-header at Baltimore for his 100th career victory...the future Hall of Famer would go on to win 224 games with the A's and the Yankees.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Kendall Graveman (2-6, 5.09 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 1-1 with a 3.38 ERA (6 er in 16.0 ip) and .339 (21-for-62) opponents batting average over his last three starts...however, is 1-5 with a 6.62 ERA (26 er in 35.1 ip) and .354 (52-for-147) opponents batting average over his last seven starts and 2-11 with a 5.40 ERA (55 er in 91.2 ip) and .295 (109-for-370) opponents average over his last 18 starts dating back to July 10, 2015.

LOSING STREAKS SNAPPED: Defeated Minnesota in his last start last Tuesday to snap his losing streak at five games...had a 7.92 ERA and .361 opponents batting average during the losing streak, which spanned five starts from April 25 to May 19...the losing streak fell one short of his career high of six, which he ended with his first win of the season this year on April 20...compiled a 5.52 ERA and .276 opponents batting average during that losing streak, which spanned nine starts from July 10, 2015 to April 7, 2016...it was the longest losing streak by an A's pitcher since Tyson Ross lost eight straight from May 19 to Sept. 24, 2012.

LOSSES: Is tied for fifth in the American League with six losses...went 1-4 with a 5.87 ERA in six starts in the month of May...the losses tied for second in the AL...it is the first time he has lost four games in a month in his career

RUN SUPPORT: Has received three runs of support or fewer in each of his 10 starts this year, including no runs three times and one run three times...his season run support average of 2.55 (15 rs in 53.0 ip) is the lowest among American League starting pitchers with at least 40 innings pitched (Keuchel, HOU 2.63)...is 0-5 in six starts with two runs of support or fewer, 2-1 in four starts with three runs of support or more...is now 1-14 in 19 career starts with two runs of support or fewer, 7-1 in 12 starts with three runs of support or more.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-3 with a 7.23 ERA (19 er in 23.2 ip) in five starts on the road compared to 1-3 with a 3.38 ERA (11 er in 29.1 ip) in five starts at home...has surrendered nine home runs in 23.2 innings on the road but just one in 29.1 innings at home...is tied for the American League lead in home runs allowed on the road.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .266 (33-for-124) opponents batting average to left-handed hitters compared to .337 (29-for-86) against right-handers...however, has issued 17 of his 22 walks to lefties...last year he issued 24 of his 38 walks to lefties...has a .300 (24-for-80) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .188 (15-for-80) the second time and .460 (23-for-50) after that...the opponents one through four hitters are batting a combined .340 (34-for-100) off him while the five through nine hitters are batting .255 (28-for-110).

THIS AND THAT: Allowed a career-high 10 hits in back-to-back starts on April 25 at Detroit and May 2 against Seattle and is the first A's pitcher with at least 10 hits in back-to-back starts since Brandon McCarthy (April 16-21, 2012)...allowed four hits or fewer in each of his first three starts, joining John Odom (1969) and Mike Norris (1980) as the only pitchers in Oakland history on an Opening Day roster to allow four hits or fewer while tossing five innings or more in each of their first three starts.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-1 loss to Chicago (AL) April 7 in Oakland...shutout the White Sox on two hits over the first five innings, but Mat Latos blanked the A's on one hit over the first six innings...the scored was tied at 0-0 when he walked Cabrera to lead off the sixth...Abreau followed with a two-run home run and Graveman left after 5.1 innings trailing 2-0.

SECOND START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on April 12 in Oakland...allowed just one run in 6.0 innings and it came in the second inning...walked Pujols to start the inning and Calhoun singled him over to third...Simmons then grounded into a double play and Graveman was relived by Axford to start the seventh with the A's leading 3-1...Oakland built a 4-1 lead before Madson allowed two runs in the eighth and Doolittle surrendered two in the ninth.

THIRD START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-2 win at New York (AL) on April 20...it was his first win since July 4, 2015 against Seattle... struck out a career-high eight batters on a career-high tying 111 pitches... allowed a one-out solo home run to Gregorius in the second inning, but that was the only run he would surrender in 6.1 innings of work...struck out in the fifth inning in his first professional at bat.

FOURTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-3 loss at Detroit April 25...allowed a career-high 10 hits...surrendered single runs in each of the first two innings on a Cabrera home run in the first and an Aviles RBI single in the second...then yielded a three-run home run to Cabrera followed by a solo home run by Victory Martinez in the fifth and left after 4.2 innings trailing 6-0.

FIFTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-3 loss to Seattle last Monday in Oakland...allowed a career-high tying 10 hits for the second consecutive start...the A's scored a run in the second inning and he blanked the Mariners on a hit and a walk over the first three innings...then allowed a RBI single to Lind in the fourth and two more runs in the sixth on a Seager RBI double and an lanetta RBI single...yielded a one-out double to Aoki in the seventh and was relieved by Rzepczynski who allowed Aoki to score.

SIXTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 11-3 loss at Baltimore on May 8...yielded a career-high four home runs, which are the most allowed by an A's starting pitcher since May 6, 2013 at Cleveland when Jarrod Parker also allowed four home runs...the A's scored three times in the first but he allowed a two-run home run to Machado in the bottom of the first...allowed back-to-back home runs to Alvarez and Schoop in the second and a two-run home run to Trumbo in the third...left after 2.2 innings trailing 6-2.

SEVENTH START: He lost his fourth consecutive start in the A's 6-0 loss at Tampa Bay May 14...allowed a two-run home run to Miller in the third inning...also yielded two runs in the sixth inning on a Pearce sacrifice fly and a Kiermaier RBI single...Andriese shut out the A's on two hits, no walks and a hit batter.

EIGHTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-1 to New York (AL) in Oakland on May 19...allowed a RBI double to Beltran in the third inning but the A's came back to tie the game in the fourth...then allowed a RBI double to Hicks in the sixth inning and was relieved by Rzepczynski after allowing two runs in 4.2 innings.

NINTH START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-5 loss at Seattle May 24...tossed just 4.2 innings and allowed two runs...yielded a RBI double to Cano in the first and a RBI single to Cruz in the third...was relieved Coulombe with one out in the fifth inning and runners on first and second with the A's trailing 2-1...the A's scored four times in the fifth to get him off the hook but the Mariners scored twice in the eighth and ninth for the win.

LAST START: He picked up his second win of the season in the A's 3-2 win over Minnesota last Monday in Oakland...the A's scored a run in the first but he allowed a RBI single to Centeno in the second...also allowed a Dozier sacrifice fly in the fifth inning, but the A's tied the game in the bottom of the fifth and took the lead for good in the sixth.
