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OAKLAND ATHLETICS (25-31) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (27-30)

SUNDAY, JUNE 5, 2016 — MINUTE MAID PARK — 1:10 P.M. CDT RHP SONNY GRAY (3-5, 6.19) VS. RHP LANCE MCCULLERS (2-1, 4.79) CSNCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost the past two games after winning five consecutive contests, which was one short of matching the longest winning streak this year (6, April 16-22)...are now 6-9 over the last 15 games and 11-10 over the last 21...are 25-31 (.446) for the season and are in sole possession of last place in the American League West for the second consecutive day...trail first place Texas by 8½ games, which is a ½ game short of the season-high of nine...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 14 days in fourth, nine days tied for fourth and two days in fifth...have three winning streaks of four or more games this year and four losing streaks of four or more games.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's reinstated Sonny Gray from the disabled list today and now have 10 players on the DL (H. Alvarez, R.J. Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doubront, Fuld, Hendriks, Parker, Reddick, Sogard)...R.J. Alvarez, Bassitt, Doubront, Fuld, Parker and Sogard are on the 60-day DL...have used the disabled list a total of 14 times this year and the 14 players have combined to miss 488 games (34.9 games per stint)...have had at least 10 players on the DL every day since May 10 and at least six players on the DL all year...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's lost a one-run game to the Astros in extra innings yesterday, 6-5 in 12 innings...it was just the A's third extra inning game of the season and first since a 3-2 win in 11 innings on April 19 at New York... are now 2-1 in extra inning games and are tied for the fifth fewest extra inning games in the American League...are now 7-9 in one-run games and have dropped six of their last eight one-run decisions after winning five of the first eight...are 7-4 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied for second in the majors in last at bat wins (Seattle, 8) and have the fifth best winning percentage.

OFFENSE: The A's are 77-for-246 (.313) over their last seven games, which has boosted their batting average to a season-high .251...are hitting .269 (261-for-972) and are averaging 4.6 runs per game (129 runs) over the last 28 games dating back to May 4...batted .234 and averaged 3.4 runs per game over the first 28 contests...have a .301 on-base percentage, which is second lowest in the American League...have the second fewest walks in the AL (129) but are tied with Boston and Houston for the most intentional walks (12)...have the third fewest doubles (83) and fifth fewest runs scored (225).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have a season-high six-game errorless streak and have committed just one error over their last 11 games...how-ever, have 37 errors for the season, which is the most in the American League and sixth most in the majors...rank second in the AL in double plays (61).

PITCHING: The A's have allowed 18 runs over the first two games of the road trip (19.1 ip, 8.38 ERA) after yielding a total of 16 runs in six games on the last homestand (2.67 ERA)...did not allow a home run in their final four games of the homestand, matching their longest streak of consecutive games without a home run over the last three years...have a 5.85 ERA (143 er in 220.0 ip), .289 (254-for-880) opponents batting average and 34 home runs allowed over the last 25 games dating back to May 8...posted a 3.91 ERA, .253 opponents average and 32 home runs over the first 31 contests...now have a 4.77 ERA for the season, which is the second highest in the American League...have the second highest opponents on-base percentage (.336) and slugging percentage (.436) and third highest opponents batting average (.269)...have issued the third most walks (183) and hit batters (22).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 0-1 with a 21.60 ERA (12 er in 5.0 ip) over the past two games after going 4-0 with a 3.41 ERA over the previous five games...the four-game winning streak by starters matched their longest of the season (April 16-22)...are 11-21 with a 6.53 ERA (145 er in 200.0 ip) over the last 39 games dating back to April 23... that includes 6-1 with a 1.80 ERA (9 er in 45.0 ip) in seven starts by Rich Hill and 5-20 with a 7.90 ERA (136 er in 155.0 ip) in 32 starts by everyone else...starters are 17-26 with a 5.33 ERA (176 er in 297.0 ip) overall...the losses are tied for second in the majors (Minnesota, 27)...the ERA is second highest in the American League (Minnesota, 5.38) and third highest in the majors (Colorado, 5.75).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-2 on this eight-game road trip to Houston (0-2), Milwaukee (two games) and Cincinnati (three games)...had the day off on Thursday and have off days in Milwaukee on Monday and Cincinnati on Thursday...went 1-2 on the last road trip to Seattle and are 12-15 (.444) on the road...went 5-1 on the last homestand against Detroit (2-1) and Minnesota (3-0) and are 13-16 (.448) at home, which is the fourth worst home record in the American League...have a season-high five-game home winning streak...have a 6.01 ERA (157 er in 235.0 ip) on the road compared to 3.66 (106 er in 261.0 ip) at home...have the highest road ERA in the AL and second highest in the majors (Cincinnati, 6.52)...are batting .262 (254-for-968) and are averaging 4.30 runs per game (116 runs in 27 games) on the road compared to .240 (227-for-946) with an average of 3.76 runs per game (109 runs in 29 games) at home.

THIS AND THAT: A's pinch hitters are tied for second in the American League in hits (9) and RBI (6) and are third in plate appearances (43)...the A's are averaging 2 hours and 58 minutes per game, which is tied for fourth fastest in the majors...have been successful in 7-of-10 (70.0%) replay challenges, which is the best percentage in the majors...the 10 challenges are tied for third fewest in the majors...are 7-5 (.583) in games started by a left-handed pitcher compared to 18-26 (.409) against righties...are hitting .247 against lefties, .253 against righties.

ONE-THIRD OF THE SEASON: The A's played their 54th game of the season Wednesday, which is the one-third mark of the season...have a .301 on-base percentage, which is on pace to break the Oakland record for lowest on-base percentage in a season (.302 in 1979)...have 129 walks and are on pace for 373...the fewest walks in Oakland history in a nonstrike season is 433 in 1978...have 84 doubles for a pace of 243, which would be the A's fewest doubles in a non-strike season since 1992 (219)... the pitching staff has allowed 66 home runs and is on pace for 191...have allowed more than 180 home runs in a season twice in Oakland history (205 in 1996, 197 in 1997)...have a 4.77 ERA and have not finished with an ERA above 4.58 since 1999 (4.69)...Khris Davis leads the A's with 14 home runs and Oakland has not had a player with 40 home runs since Jason Giambi hit 43 in 2000...Rich Hill has eight wins and the A's have not had a 20-game winner since Barry Zito won 23 in 2002...Hill has 74 strikeouts, which puts him on pace for 214...the only pitcher in Oakland history to fan more than 205 batters in a season is Vida Blue (301 in 1971).

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's trail the season series, 2-3...have dropped the first two games of this series in Houston after winning two of three in Oakland April 30-May 1 to open the season series...lost the season series to the Astros for the first time last year...went 9-10 last year, including 5-5 in Oakland and 4-5 in Houston...the A's lead the all-time series 42-26 (.618), which is the third best record by a Major League club

against another club among teams that have played each other 40 or more times...14 of the A's 26 losses to Houston have been by one run...are 23-12 in Oakland and 19-14 in Houston.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Sean Doolittle has not yielded a run in 11 of his last 12 contests (1 er in 11.1 ip, 0.79 ERA) and has struck out 20 and walked just two (one intentional) over that span...Ryan Dull has stranded all 21 of his inherited runners and opponents are 0-for-32 with runners in scoring position... Danny Valencia is 14-for-25 (.560) over his last seven games and is now batting .371 (33-for-89) with 20 runs, nine home runs and 20 RBI in 24 games since he was reinstated from the 15-day disabled list May 6...Stephen Vogt has hit safely in each of his last 10 games (14-for-41, .341) and has reached base safely in each of his last 14...is 18-for-51 (.353) with two walks and two hit by pitches during the reaching base streak (.400 on-base percentage).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1983 Rickey Henderson homers off Cleveland's Bud Anderson in the second game of a double header for the 2000th home run in Oakland A's history...in 2004 Tim Hudson tosses a complete game eight-hit shutout in the A's 4-0 win against Toronto, snapping the A's major league record tying streak of seven consecutive no decisions by a starter.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (3-5, 6.19 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was reinstated from the 15day disabled list today...was placed on the DL May 22 retroactive to May 21 with a strained right trapezius...was 3-5 with a 6.19 ERA in nine starts at the time of the injury...the ERA is fifth highest in the American League among pitchers with 40 or more innings pitched.

FOUR-GAME LOSING STREAK: Is 0-4 with a 10.38 ERA (25 er in 21.2 ip) and .337 (33for-98) opponents batting average over his last five starts...the four-game losing streak matches his career high (Aug. 1-16, 2014)... has allowed at least four runs in each start, the first time in his career he has allowed four or more runs in more than two consecutive starts...has allowed at least five runs in each of his last four starts, matching the longest such streak by an A's pitcher over the last 17 years (Cory Lidle, May 2-31, 2002; Vin Mazzaro, July 18-Aug. 2, 2009)...went 3-1 with a 2.73 ERA and .232 opponents batting average over his first four starts.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has faced 104 right-handed hitters and 118 left-handed hit-

ters...has issued 15 of his 24 walks and allowed six of his eight home runs to righties...has a 1.026 OPS against righties, .748 against lefties... opponents are batting .326 (15-for-46) with five walks (.392 on-base percentage), three doubles, a triple and three home runs (.630 slugging percentage) when leading off an inning...has yielded a .333 (17-for-51) batting average with runners in scoring position...opponents are 15-for-28 (.536) with three doubles and four home runs (1.071) slugging percentage when putting the first pitch in play...has allowed a .487 (19-for-39) combined batting average to the opponents eight and nine hitters...has a .239 (17for-71) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .284 (19-for-67) the second time and .345 (19-for-55) after that.

WILD PITCHES: Had three wild pitches in his last start May 20 against New York and is the first A's pitcher with three wild pitches in a game since Doug John on Sept. 6, 1995 at Boston...has nine wild pitches for the season, which is the most in the majors...has 39 career wild pitches, which is tied for seventh most in Oakland history (Mike Norris is 6th with 53).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-3 with a 4.85 ERA (16 er in 29.2 ip) in five starts at home compared to 1-2 with an 8.35 ERA (17 er in 18.1 ip) in four starts on the road...last year, he went 8-3 with a 2.63 ERA and five home runs in 16 starts on the road...the road ERA was eighth lowest in Oakland history... it was second lowest over the last 34 years to his mark of 2.51 in 2014.

THE FOURTH INNING: Has allowed 14 of his 38 runs this year in the fourth inning...has a 15.43 ERA (12 er in 7.0 ip) and .444 (16-for-36) opponents batting average in the fourth inning compared to a 4.61 ERÁ (21 er in 41.0 ip) and .248 (39-for-157) opponents average in all other innings.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received no run support twice this year and two runs or fewer five times...is 2-1 in four starts with three runs of support or more compared to 1-4 in five starts with two runs or fewer...last year, he was 12-1 in 20 starts with three runs of support or more and is now 31-3 in 46

MONTH BY MONTH: Went 0-3 with a 9.61 ERA in four starts in May...allowed 25 runs, which were his most ever in a month (21, Aug. 2014)...surrendered five home runs, which match his most in a month (Aug. 2015). went 3-2 with a 3.81 ERA in five starts in April...is now 10-3 with a 2.53 ERA in 15 career starts in April...the 10 wins are his most in any month

FIRST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 2-1 victory over Chicago (AL) April 6 in Oakland, the A's third game of the season...was scratched from his scheduled Opening Day start April 4 due to food poisoning...allowed his only run in the third inning when Jackson led off with a double, went to third on an Eaton ground out and scored on a Rollins sacrifice fly...left after seven innings with a 2-1 lead.

SECOND START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-1 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on April 11 in Oakland...tossed 6.1 innings to go over the 500 innings pitched mark in his career...shut out the Angels on two hits and two walks over the first five innings but Tropeano blanked the A's on six hits and two walks in five innings...allowed three runs in the sixth inning on a Nava RBI single and a Trout two-run home run.

THIRD START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-3 win over Kansas City April 16 in Oakland...allowed a RBI single to Cain in the top of the first but the A's came back with three in the bottom of the first to give him the lead for good...also yielded a RBI single to Fuentes in the fourth inning.

FOURTH START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's 8-5 win at Toronto April 22...struck out five of the first six batters he faced and had a 4-0 lead when he allowed a solo home run to Barney in the third inning. the A's increased their lead to 6-1 before he allowed a Bautista sacrifice fly in the sixth and a Barney RBI single in the seventh.

FIFTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-4 loss at Detroit April 27...tossed 65 pitches in 2.0 innings...matched the shortest outing of his career and it was his shortest outing as a starter (pitched 2.0 innings in his first two career outings, both in relief)...allowed four runs in the second inning...Castellanos tripled to lead off the inning and scored on a Gose fielders choice...J.D. Martinez hit a three-run home run later in the inning.

SIXTH START: He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 8-2 loss to Seattle in Oakland on May 3...matched his career highs by allowing seven runs on 11 hits...allowed a two-run home run to Martin in the third and a solo home run by Cano to start the fourth...a RBI single by Marte in the seventh inning increased the Mariners lead to 4-1 and Lind added a RBI single in the eighth...was relieved by Rzepczynski with runners on first and second and no outs in the eighth and he allowed a three-run home run to

SEVENTH START: He lost his third straight start in the A's 14-7 loss at Boston May 9...allowed a career-high tying seven runs for the second consecutive start...had a 3-0 lead when he allowed a run to score in the second inning on wild pitch...the A's increased the lead to 4-1 before he yielded six runs in the fourth inning...allowed a RBI double to Shaw, a two-run single to Bradley Jr., a RBI double to Betts and a RBI single to Pedroia...was relieved with two outs and two runners on by Rodriguez, who allowed one of the runs to score.

EIGHTH START: He had a no decision in the A's 7-6 win at Tampa Bay May 15...allowed a career-high tying three home runs (also Aug. 22, 2015 vs. Tampa Bay)...had a 1-0 lead when he surrendered a leadoff home run to Guyer in the bottom of the first...Guyer added a three-run home run in the second and a sacrifice fly in the fourth...surrendered a leadoff home run to Longoria in the fifth and left with two outs in the sixth and the A's trailing 6-4.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-3 loss to New York May 20 to extend his losing streak to a career-high tying four games... allowed five runs in 3.1 innings and tossed 98 pitches...had three wild pitches and is the first A's pitcher with three wild pitches in a game since Doug John on Sept. 6, 1995 at Boston...yielded all five runs in the fourth inning...allowed a two-run double to Torreyes, who scored on a wild pitch... also allowed a two-run double to Beltran and was relieved with one out and one runner on by Dull.

- Has a 2.16 ERA (8 er in 33.1 ip) and .193 (23-for-119) opponents batting average over its last eight games dating back to May 27...posted a 6.75 ERA and .291 opponents batting average over its previous 20 contests...now has a 3.93 ERA for the season, which is the sixth highest in the AL.
- Has allowed just 17-of-91 (18.7%) inherited runners to score, which is the best percentage in the majors.
