### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (25-32) VS. MILWAUKEE BREWERS (26-31)

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Were swept in a three-game series at Houston over the weekend to snap a five-game winning streak...this is the A's fifth losing streak of three or more games since the start of May...also have a four-game winning streak and a five-game winning streak over that span...are 6-6 over the last 12 games and 11-11 over the last 22...are 25-32 (.439) overall, which is the second worst record in the American League...trail first place Texas in the AL West by a season-high 10 games...are in fifth place in the West for the fourth consecutive day, marking the A's only days in sole possession of last place this year...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 14 days in fourth, nine days tied for fourth and four days in fifth.

**INTERLEAGUE PLAY:** The A's will play their first interleague game of the season tonight...the only other team that has not played an interleague game is Baltimore...will continue interleague play this weekend at Cincinnati (three games) and also play at San Francisco (June 27-28) and St. Louis (Aug. 26-28)...will host Milwaukee (June 21-22), San Francisco (June 29-30), Pittsburgh (July 1-3) and Chicago (Aug. 5-7)...went 11-9 (.550) against the National League last year...it marked the fourth consecutive season and 12th time in 19 years the A's finished with a winning record in interleague play...are now 191-153 (.555) all-time in interleague play, which is fifth best in Major League history.

**PITCHERS HITTING:** A's pitchers are 0-for-1 with a strikeout this year as Kendall Graveman batted at New York (AL) on April 20 after the A's designated hitter (Lowrie) entered the game following an injury to Valencia...A's pitchers went 3-for-19 (.158) with a run, RBI, 11 strikeouts and two sacrifice hits last year...now have a .083 (29-for-350) average with four doubles, 11 RBI, 10 walks and 163 strikeouts since interleague play began in 1997...the batting average is the lowest in the majors over that span (New York-AL, .088)...the last triple by an A's pitcher was by Blue Moon Odom on Aug. 22, 1971 against Boston...Odom also hit the last home run on Sept. 4, 1972 against California...the last extra base hit was by Joe Kennedy, a double on June 12, 2007 at Houston.

**PITCHING:** The A's have allowed 23 runs over the first three games of the road trip (21 er in 27.1 ip, 6.91 ERA) after yielding a total of 16 runs in six games on the last homestand (2.67 ERA)...have a 5.76 ERA (146 er in 228.0 ip), .287 (263-for-915) opponents batting average and 36 home runs allowed over the last 26 games dating back to May 8...posted a 3.91 ERA, .253 opponents average and 32 home runs over the first 31 contests...now have a 4.75 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...also have the second highest opponents batting average (.269), on-base percentage (.337) and slugging percentage (.437)...have issued the third most walks (189) and are tied for third in hit batters (22).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 11-21 with a 6.41 ERA (146 er in 205.0 ip) over the last 40 games dating back to April 23...that includes 6-1 with a 1.80 ERA (9 er in 45.0 ip) in seven starts by Rich Hill and 5-20 with a 7.71 ERA (137 er in 160.0 ip) in 33 starts by everyone else...starters are 17-26 with a 5.27 ERA (177 er in 302.0 ip) overall...have the second most losses and second highest ERA in the American League to Minnesota (8-27, 5.39 ERA).

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .302 (85-for-281) over the last eight games, which has boosted their batting average to a season-high .251...are hitting .267 (269-for-1007) and are averaging 4.5 runs per game (131 runs) over the last 29 games dating back to May 4...batted .234 and averaged 3.4 runs per game over the first 28 contests...the A's have the second fewest walks in the American League (133) but are tied for the second most intentional walks (12)...have the second lowest on-base percentage (.301), the third fewest doubles (86) and the fourth fewest runs scored (227).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's committed a season-high tying three errors on Sunday to snap a season-high six-game errorless streak...had committed just one error over their previous 11 games...now have 40 errors for the season, which is the most in the American League and fifth most in the majors...are tied for second in the AL in double plays (61).

**IN THE PINCH:** A's pinch hitters are 1 for their last 13 and are batting .205 (9-for-44) for the season...are tied for second in the American League in hits (9) and RBI (6), rank third in plate appearances (45) and tied for third in extra base hits (3)...the A's are one of three teams without a pinch walk (Baltimore and Cleveland).

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's have lost each of their last five road games, which matches their longest road losing streak of the season (May 7-11)...are 0-3 on this eight-game road trip to Houston (0-3), Milwaukee (two games) and Cincinnati (three games)...had days off yesterday and last Thursday and have another day off this Thursday...went 1-2 on the last road trip to Seattle and are 12-16 (.429) on the road...went 5-1 on the last homestand against Detroit (2-1) and Minnesota (3-0) and are 13-16 (.448) at home...have a season-high five-game home winning streak...have a 5.93 ERA (160 er in 243.0 ip) on the road compared to 3.66 (106 er in 261.0 ip) at home...have the highest road ERA in the American League and second highest in the majors (Cincinnati, 6.52)...are batting .261 (262-for-1003) on the road compared to .240 (227-for-946) at home.

**CLOSE CALLS:** The A's lost a one-run game to the Astros in extra innings Saturday, 6-5 in 12 innings...it was just the A's third extra inning game of the season and first since a 3-2 win in 11 innings on April 19 at New York...are now 2-1 in extra inning games...are 7-9 in one-run games and have dropped six of their last eight one-run decisions after winning five of the first eight...are 7-4 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied for third in the majors in last at bat wins (Baltimore and Seattle, 8) and have the fifth best winning percentage.

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's have been successful in 7-of-10 (70.0%) replay challenges, which is the best percentage in the majors...the 10 challenges are tied for second fewest in the majors...only the Yankees (9) have made fewer challenges...are averaging 2 hours and 58 minutes per game, which is fifth fastest in the majors...are 7-5 (.583) in games started by a left-handed pitcher compared to 18-27 (.400) against righties.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have used the disabled list 14 times this year and currently have 10 players on the DL (H. Alvarez, R.J. Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doubront, Fuld, Hendriks, Parker, Reddick, Sogard)...R.J. Alvarez, Bassitt, Doubront, Fuld, Parker and Sogard are on the 60-day DL...the 14 players have combined to miss 498 games (35.6 games per stint)...have had at least 10 players on the DL every day since May 10 and at least six players on the DL all year...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

**A's vs. BREWERS:** The A's and Brewers meet for the first time since 2013 and just the second time in interleague play...the A's won two of three at Milwaukee in 2013 and swept a three-game series in Oakland in 2002...have won five of six interleague games after going 173-154 against the Brewers while they were in the American League...are 178-155 all-time against the Brewers, including 103-64 in Oakland and 75-91 in Milwaukee...are 2-1 at Miller Park.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Ryan Dull** has stranded all 22 of his inherited runners and opponents are 1-for-35 (.029) with runners in scoring position...**Danny Valencia** is 15-for-28 (.536) with 10 runs, three doubles, three home runs, five RBI and five multiple hit games over his last eight games...**Stephen Vogt** extended his hitting streak to 11 games on Sunday, which matches the A's season high and is one short of his career high (12, June 30 to July 12, 2014)...is 17-for-46 (.370) during his current streak.

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1994** Rickey Henderson steals second base against Milwaukee for the 1100th steal of his career...in **2001** the A's set an Oakland record when they are hit by a pitch five times in a 6-4 loss to Anaheim...Frank Menechino is hit by a pitch twice...in **2008** Carlos Gonzalez doubles twice against Los Angeles, giving him seven career hits, all doubles...he is the first player in major league history to produce extra base hits for each of his first seven hits since Johnny Mize in 1936.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (2-3, 6.16 ERA)

**LAST FOUR, FIRST THREE:** Is 2-2 with a 3.55 ERA (10 er in 25.1 ip) and .250 (24-for-96) opponents batting average over his last four starts after going 0-1 with a 11.37 ERA and .382 opponents average over his first three starts...has allowed one home run over his last four starts after surrendering four over his first three...yielded at least four runs in each of his first three starts to become the second pitcher in Oakland history to allow at least four runs in each of his first three Major League appearances...the other is Vida Blue (July 20-Aug. 3, 1969).

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has held left-handed hitters to a .138 (4-for-29) batting average...right-handers are batting .336 (41-for-122) with all five of his home runs and 11 of his 13 walks...has a .936 OPS against righties, .366 against lefties...has a .233 (14-for-60) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .296 (16-for-54) the second time and .405 (15-for-37) after that...opponents are 15-for-28 (.536) with five doubles, two home runs and 12 RBI when putting the first pitch in play...the opponents clean-up hitter is 10-for-19 (.526) with three home runs and seven RBI...has surrendered three of his five home runs in his first 15 pitches of a game.

**INTERLEAGUE PLAY AND BATTING:** Will be making his first career interleague start...has never batted as a professional.

**THIS AND THAT:** Was selected from Triple-A Nashville April 29 and is scheduled to make his eighth start of the season and his career...the eight starts will be tied for second among American League rookies...it will be just his second start on the road...allowed eight runs on 10 hits in 2.2 innings for the loss in his only other road start May 10 at Boston...has a 2.57 ERA (4 er in 14.0 ip) in the first two innings compared to an 8.25 ERA (22 er in 24.0 ip) from the third inning on.

**FIRST START:** He had a no decision in his Major League debut, a 7-4 A's win over Houston April 29 in Oakland...had just 42 minor league appearances, all starts, in three professional seasons...became the 45th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut, the first since Dan Straily on Aug. 3, 2012 against Toronto...allowed a leadoff home run to Gattis in the second inning but the A's came back with two in the bottom of the second...allowed a RBI single to Gattis in the sixth to tie the game and was relieved by Doolittle with no outs and runners on first and second...Doolittle allowed both runs to score but the A's tied the game in the eighth and won it on a three-run home run by Alonso in the ninth.

**SECOND START:** He had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 9-8 loss to Seattle in Oakland on May 4...shutout the Mariners on two hits and a walk over the first four innings and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed four runs in the fifth inning...Marte had a RBI double, Cano a RBI single and Cruz a two-run home run...the A's then scored six times in the bottom of the fifth to give him an 8-4 lead but the bullpen allowed two runs in the sixth inning and three more in the seventh for the blown save (Axford).

**THIRD START:** He had the first decision of his career, a loss in the A's 13-5 loss at Boston May 10...allowed a lead-off home run to Betts in the first inning and Ramirez added a two-run homer...retired the side in order in the second but then allowed five runs in the third inning while recording just two outs...Pedroia had a RBI double, Bogaerts and Young had RBI singles and Shaw chased him from the game with a two-run double.

**FOURTH START:** He picked up his first Major League win in the A's 3-1 victory over Texas May 16 in Oakland...shutout the Rangers on two hits and a walk over the first six innings...had a 2-0 lead with runners on second and third and one out in the seventh inning...allowed a sacrifice fly to Stubbs and was relieved by Doolittle who got the final out of the inning.

**FIFTH START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-1 loss to New York (AL) in Oakland on May 21...retired each of the first nine batters he faced before allowing the first four batters to reach base in the fourth inning...yielded four runs in the fourth on a Beltrna RBI single, a Hicks sacrifice fly and a Refsnyder two-run double...also allowed a RBI double to Castro in the seventh.

**SIXTH START:** He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 4-1 loss to Detroit May 27 in Oakland...shutout the Tigers on three hits over the first three innings but then allowed two runs in the fourth on a RBI double by Maybin and a RBI single by McCann...also allowed a leadoff home run to Castellanos in the sixth...left after six innings trailing 3-0 as the A's were shutout on three hits over the first eight innings.

**LAST START:** He picked up the second win of his career in the A's 5-1 win over Minnesota last Wednesday in Oakland...shut out the Twins on four hits and a walk over the first five innings...had a 4-0 lead when he allowed his only run in the sixth inning...loaded the bases with no outs but got a

sacrifice fly from Escobar before striking out Kepler and Centeno...was relieved by Dull to start the seventh inning with the A's leading 5-2.

**2015 RECAP:** Was acquired by the A's from Kansas City in the Ben Zobrist deal at the trading deadline and went 6-0 with a 1.90 ERA in seven starts with Double-A Midland...began the year in extended spring training with the Royals and combined for a 1-1 record and a 3.69 ERA in seven starts with the Royals affiliate in the Arizona Rookie League, Single-A Wilmington and Double-A Northwest Arkansas...was 7-1 with a 2.66 ERA in 14 starts overall...struck out 90 batters in 74.1 innings (10.90 per nine innings).

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Allowed a .243 opponents batting average, including .198 (36-for-182) against right-handed hitters compared to .330 (31-for-94) against left-handers...surrendered three of his five home runs to lefties for a .511 slugging percentage...held righties to a mark of .275...opponents batted .323 with a .421 on-base percentage when leading off an inning.

**THIS AND THAT:** Compiled a 1.29 ERA in the first inning, a 4.20 ERA in innings two through four and a 0.46 ERA from the fifth inning on...his teams were 10-4 (.714) in his starting assignments, including 7-0 at Midland...allowed one run or fewer in eight of his 14 starts, including no runs four times.

<b>RHP Jesse Hahn (2-3, 6.10 ERA):</b> Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville May 17 for his second stint with the A's this year and is 1-2 with an 8.05 ERA and .342 opponents batting average in four starts since his return...has allowed six home runs in 31.0 innings this year (1.74 per nine innings) after surrendering nine home runs in 170.0 innings over his first two seasons (0.48 per nine innings)...is 2-1 with a 3.44 ERA and .219 opponents batting average in three starts during the day compared to 0-2 with a 9.95 ERA and .407 opponents average in three starts at night...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 12-2 A's loss at Houston last Friday (0.2 ip, 6 h, 7 r, 7 er, 2 bb, 1 so)...has never faced the Brewers in his career...is 3-1 with a 1.78 ERA and .156 opponents batting average in four career interleague starts...is 2-for-25 (.080) with a run, RBI, two sacrifice hits and 14 strikeouts as a hitter...was 1-1 with a 1.93 ERA in five starts with Nashville.

- The A's bullpen has a 2.48 ERA (10 er in 36.1 ip) and .201 (27-for-134) opponents batting average over its last nine games dating back to May 27...posted a 6.75 ERA and .291 opponents batting average over its previous 20 contests...now has a 3.97 ERA for the season, which is the sixth highest in the American League.
- Has allowed just 17-of-93 (18.3%) inherited runners to score, which is the best percentage in the majors.
- Tossed 7.0 innings on Saturday after pitching 7.1 innings on Friday...has now tossed 202.0 innings for the season, which are the second most in the AL (Houston, 205.0) and fourth most in the majors.
- Is 16-for-22 (72.7%) in save opportunities...the save percentage is tied for fifth in the AL.
