OAKLAND ATHLETICS (25-33) VS. MILWAUKEE BREWERS (27-31)

WEDNESDAY, JUNE 8, 2016 — MILLER PARK — 7:10 P.M. CDT RHP JESSE HAHN (2-3, 6.10) VS. RHP CHASE ANDERSON (3-6, 4.68) CSNCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost each of the last four games, which is one short of the longest losing streak of the season (5, May 7-11)...the losing streak snaps a five-game winning streak...the A's have five losing streaks of four or more games this year and three winning streaks of four or more games...are 11-12 over the last 23 games and 12-21 over the last 33...are eight games under .500, which is one short of the season low of nine (20-29 on May 27)...are 25-33 (.431), which is the second worst record in the American League and sixth worst in the majors...are in fifth place in the AL West for the fifth consecutive day and trail first place Texas by a season-high 11 games...last year, the A's were 23-35 after 58 games and were 11½ games out of first place (lost game 59, remained 11½ back)...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days ited for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 14 days in fourth, nine days tied for fourth and five days in fifth.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's lost their first interleague game of the season last night...only Baltimore, with zero, has played fewer interleague games...will continue interleague play this weekend at Cincinnati (three games) and also play at San Francisco (June 27-28) and St. Louis (Aug. 26-28)...will host Milwaukee (June 21-22), San Francisco (June 29-30), Pittsburgh (July 1-3) and Chicago (Aug. 5-7)...went 11-9

(.550) against the National League last year...it marked the fourth consecutive season and 12th time in 19 years the A's finished with a winning record in interleague play...are now 191-154 (.554) all-time in interleague play, which is fifth best in Major League history.

PITCHERS HITTING: Sean Manaea went 0-for-2 with a strikeout last night and A's pitchers are 0-for-3 with two strikeouts this year...went 3-for-19 (.158) with a run, RBI, 11 strikeouts and two sacrifice hits last year...now have a .082 (29-for-352) average with four doubles, 11 RBI, 10 walks and 164 strikeouts since interleague play began in 1997...the batting average is the lowest in the majors over that span (New York-AL, .088)...the last triple by an A's pitcher was by Blue Moon Odom on Aug. 22, 1971 against Boston...Odom also hit the last home run on Sept. 4, 1972 against California...the last extra base hit was by Joe Kennedy, a double on June 12, 2007 at Houston.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed 28 runs over the first four games of the road trip (26 er in 35.1 ip, 6.62 ERA) after yielding a total of 16 runs in six games on the last homestand (2.67 ERA)...have a 5.76 ERA (151 er in 236.0 ip), .285 (269-for-945) opponents batting average and 38 home runs allowed over the last 27 games dating back to May 8...posted a 3.91 ERA, .253 opponents average and 32 home runs over the first 31 contests...now have a 4.76 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...also have the second highest opponents batting average (.268), on-base percentage (.336) and slugging percentage (.437)...have issued the third most walks (191) and hit the fourth most batters (22).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 11-22 with a 6.41 ERA (151 er in 212.0 ip) over the last 41 games dating back to April 23...that includes 6-1 with a 1.80 ERA (9 er in 45.0 ip) in seven starts by Rich Hill and 5-21 with a 7.65 ERA (142 er in 167.0 ip) in 34 starts by everyone else...starters are 17-27 with a 5.30 ERA (182 er in 309.0 ip) overall...are tied with Minnesota for the most losses in the American League and have the second highest ERA to the Twins (5.44 ERA).

OFFENSE: The A's are hitting .264 (274-for-1039) and are averaging 4.5 runs per game (135 runs) over the last 30 games dating back to May 4... batted .234 and averaged 3.4 runs per game over the first 28 contests... have the lowest on-base percentage in the American League (.300)...are tied for the fewest walks (136) but are tied for the third most intentional walks (12)...are tied for the third fewest doubles (88) and have the fourth fewest runs scored (231).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's committed a season-high tying three errors on Sunday to snap a season-high six-game errorless streak...had committed just one error over their previous 11 games...now have 40 errors for the season, which is the most in the American League and fifth most in the majors...rank third in the AL in double plays (61). **IN THE PINCH:** A's pinch hitters are 1 for their last 14 and are batting .200 (9-for-45) for the season...are tied for second in the American League in hits (9) and RBI (6), rank third in plate appearances (46) and tied for third in extra base hits (3)...the A's are one of three teams without a pinch walk (Baltimore and Cleveland).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's extended their road losing streak to a seasonhigh six games last night...are 0-4 on this eight-game road trip to Houston (0-3), Milwaukee (0-1) and Cincinnati (three games)...had days off Monday and last Thursday and have another day off tomorrow...went 1-2 on the last road trip to Seattle and are 12-17 (.414) on the road...went 5-1 on the last homestand against Detroit (2-1) and Minnesota (3-0) and are 13-16 (.448) at home...have a season-high five-game home winning streak... have a 5.92 ERA (165 er in 251.0 ip) on the road compared to 3.66 (106 er in 261.0 ip) at home...have the highest road ERA in the American League and second highest in the majors (Cincinnati, 6.52)...are batting .258 (267for-1035) on the road compared to .240 (227-for-946) at home.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's lost by one run for the second time in the last three games last night and are now 7-10 in one-run games...have dropped seven of their last nine one-run decisions after winning five of the first eight...are 7-4 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied for third in the American League in last at bat wins (Baltimore and Seattle, 8) and have the fourth best winning percentage...are 2-1 in extra inning games.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have been successful in 7-of-10 (70.0%) replay challenges, which is the best percentage in the majors...the 10 challenges are tied for second fewest in the majors...only the Yankees (9) have made fewer challenges...are averaging 2 hours and 57 minutes per game, which is fourth fastest in the majors...are 7-5 (.583) in games started by a left-handed pitcher compared to 18-28 (.391) against righties...the 12 games against left-handed starters are tied for third fewest in the American League.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 14 times this year and currently have 10 players on the DL (H. Alvarez, R.J. Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doubront, Fuld, Hendriks, Parker, Reddick, Sogard)...R.J. Alvarez and Hendriks are currently on rehab assignments...R.J. Alvarez, Bassitt, Doubront, Fuld, Parker and Sogard are on the 60-day DL...the 14 players have combined to miss 508 games (36.3 games per stint)...have had at least 10 players on the DL every day since May 10 and at least six players on the DL all year...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. BREWERS: The A's lost the first meeting of 2016 last night and are now 5-2 against the Brewers in interleague play...won two of three at Mil-waukee in 2013 and swept a three-game series in Oakland in 2002...went 173-154 against the Brewers while they were in the American League... are 178-156 all-time against the Brewers, including 103-64 in Oakland and 75-92 in Milwaukee...are 2-2 at Miller Park.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Billy Butler has two home runs and 10 RBI over his last eight games after tallying no home runs and six RBI over his first 29 contests... **Ryan Dull** has stranded all 22 of his inherited runners and opponents are 1-for-35 (.029) with runners in scoring position...**Jed Lowrie** was reinstated from the 15-day disabled list May 25 and has reached base safely and started each of the A's 11 games at second base since then... is batting .326 (14-for-43) since his return...**Danny Valencia** is 15-for-28 (.536) with 10 runs, three doubles, three home runs, five RBI and five multiple hit games over his last eight games.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1933** Jimmie Foxx homers in his first three at bats in the A's 14-10 win over New York...he had homered in his last at bat the day before to give him four consecutive home runs...in **1965** Rick Monday is chosen by the Kansas City A's as the first player ever taken in baseball's free agent draft...in **1975** Ken Holtzman one-hits the Detroit Tigers in the A's 4-0 win...Claudell Washington homers twice and drives in all four Oakland runs...in **2008** Mark Ellis hits the fifth walk-off grand slam in Oakland history to lift the A's to a 7-3 win over Los Angeles in 12 innings.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Hahn (2-3, 6.10 ERA)

FOR OPENERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville May 17 for his second stint with the A's this year and is 1-2 with an 8.05 ERA (17 er in 19.0 ip) and .342 (27-for-79) opponents batting average in four starts since his return...was recalled for the first time April 30 and went 1-1 with a 3.00 ERA and .250 opponents average in two starts before he was optioned to Nashville May 8...the two starts were his first since July 1, 2015 against Colorado as he spent the final three months of the 2015 season on the disabled list with a strained right forearm.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed six home runs in 31.0 innings this year (1.74 per nine innings) after surrendering nine home runs in 170.0 innings over his first two seasons (0.48 per nine innings)...the six home runs are a career high...four of the six home runs he has allowed this year have been solo shots...six of his nine home runs entering the season came with runners on base...five of his six home runs this year and 12 of 15 in his career have been hit by left-handed hitters.

INTERLEAGUE: Did not pitch in an interleague game last year...went 2-0 with a 1.42 ERA in two starts in 2015 and is 3-1 with a 1.78 ERA (25.1 ip, 16 h, 6 r, 5 er, 10 bb, 20 so, 1 hr) and .156 (7-for-45) opponents batting average in four career interleague starts.

WITH THE BAT: Is 2-for-25 (.080) with a run, RBI, two sacrifice hits and 14 strikeouts as a hitter...that includes 0-for-3 with two strikeouts in 2015 with Oakland...had a RBI single off the Mets Zack Wheeler in the fourth inning June 14, 2014 for his first hit and RBI.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .419 (13-for-31) batting average, .455 (2 bb) on-base percentage and .677 (2 2b, 2 hr) slugging percentage to hitters leading off an inning...last year, he yielded a .215 batting average, .277 on-base percentage and .290 slugging percentage to batters leading off an inning...opponents are 6-for-12 (.500) with runners in scoring position and two outs...has a .245 (12-for-49) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup this year, .351 (26-for-74) after that.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 2-1 with a 3.44 ERA (7 er in 18.1 ip) and .219 (14for-64) opponents batting average in three starts during the day compared to 0-2 with a 9.95 ERA (14 er in 12.2 ip) and .407 (24-for-59) opponents average in three starts at night...last year, he went 4-1 with a 1.52 ERA and .169 opponents batting average in six starts during the day compared to 2-5 with a 4.72 ERA and .284 opponents average in 10 starts at night...his career numbers are 8-3 with a 1.98 ERA (18 er in 81.2 ip) during the day, 7-10 with a 4.83 ERA (64 er in 119.1 ip) at night.

FIRST START: He combined with Axford and Madson on a four-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win over Houston April 30 in Oakland...tossed 6.2 innings and allowed three of the hits...faced the minimum over the first five innings as the only two base runners were erased on double plays...allowed only one base runner past first base when Correa doubled and went to third on a ground out in the seventh.

SECOND START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-2 loss in the night game of the day/night doubleheader at Baltimore May 7...walked a career-high tying four batters...retired six of the seven batters he faced over the first two innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 10.2 innings...then allowed four runs in the third on a Kim RBI ground out, a Jones a RBI single and a Davis a two-run home run...allowed another run in the fourth inning when Schoop scored on a grounded into double play.

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 8-5 win over Texas in Oakland on May 17...allowed a career-high tying 10 hits...blanked the Rangers on two hits and a walk over the first three innings and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed back-to-back home runs to Mazara and Beltre to start the fourth...surrendered one more run in the inning when Fielder scored on a double play...left after 6.2 innings with a 4-3 lead but Madson allowed two runs in the ninth before Davis hit a walk-off grand slam in the bottom of the ninth for the win.

FOURTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-4 loss to New York (AL) May 22 in Oakland...the A's scored a run in the first but he allowed solo home runs to McCann in the second and Ellsbury in the third... Oakland scored twice in the fifth to take a 3-2 lead and he was relieved by Axford with runners on first and second and two outs in the sixth...Axford allowed both of the inherited runners to score for the blown save.

FIFTH START: He picked up his second win of the season in the A's 12-3 victory over Detroit May 28 in Oakland...issued a career-high tying four walks...blanked the Tigers on three hits and a walk over the first three innings and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a run to score on a wild pitch in the fifth inning...Oakland increased its lead to 3-1 before he allowed a two-run home run to V.Martinez in the sixth...the A's then scored five times in the bottom of the sixth for the win.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 12-2 loss at Houston last Friday...allowed seven runs in just two-thirds of an inning...the runs were a career high and the innings pitched were a career low...became the eighth starting pitcher in Oakland history to allow seven or more runs in less than an inning, the first since Joe Blanton allowed eight runs in 0.1 innings against Tampa Bay on May 25, 2005...yielded a RBI single to Rasmus, a RBI ground out to Gattis, a RBI single to White, a two-run triple to Kemp and RBI singles to Marisnick and Springer.

2015 RECAP: Went 6-6 with a 3.35 ERA in 16 starts in his first season with Oakland, a campaign that was cut short due to an injury...got off to a slow start as he went 1-4 with a 4.43 ERA over his first eight starts through May 20...then tossed a four-hit shutout May 25 against Detroit and went 5-2 with a 2.42 ERA over his final eight starts...was placed on the disabled list July 11 retroactive to July 6 with a right forearm strain and missed the remainder of the season...yielded just five home runs in 96.2 innings, an average of 0.47 per nine innings...that was the lowest mark in the American League among pitchers with 90 or more innings pitched...using the same minimum, he also ranked third in the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.324) and fifth in OPS (.623)...opponents reached base on an error 14 times, which was the most in the majors, despite missing half of the season...it tied for second most by an A's pitcher over the last 29 years to Tim Hudson's 15 in 2001...tied for fifth in the AL in uncarned runs allowed (10).

FRIDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Sonny Gray (3-5, 5.77 ERA): Was reinstated from the 15-day disabled list last Sunday and had a no decision that day at Houston in a 5-2 A's loss (5.0 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 5 so)...was placed on the DL May 22 retroactive to May 21 with a strained right trapezius...was 3-5 with a 6.19 ERA in nine starts at the time of the injury...is 0-4 with an 8.78 ERA and .322 opponents batting average over his last six starts...the four-game losing streak matches his career high (Aug. 1-16, 2014)...has allowed a .208 opponents batting average over the first three innings of a game compared to .355 from the fourth inning on...has received no run support twice this year and two runs or fewer six times...has never faced the Reds in his career...is 3-2 with a 3.21 ERA in eight career interleague appearances, including seven starts...is 1-for-8 (.125) with five strikeouts and two sacrifice hits in 10 career plate appearances.

- Has allowed just 17-of-93 (18.3%) inherited runners to score, which is the best percentage in the majors.
- Tossed 7.0 innings on Saturday after pitching 7.1 innings on Friday...has now tossed 203.0 innings for the season, which are the second most in the AL (Houston, 205.2) and fourth most in the majors.
