OAKLAND ATHLETICS (25-34) VS. CINCINNATI REDS (22-38)

ABOUT THE A'S: Extended their losing streak to a season-high tying five games on Wednesday (also May 7-11)...the losing streak snaps a five-game winning streak...the A's have five losing streaks of four or more games this year and three winning streaks of four or more games...are now 1-5 in the month of June, which is the second worst record in the majors (Kansas City, 1-7)...are 12-22 since the start of May after going 13-12 in April...are 25-34 (.424) overall, which is the second worst record in the American League and sixth worst in the majors...are nine games under .500, which matches the season low (20-29 on May 27)...are in fifth place in the AL West for the seventh consecutive day and trail first place Texas by a season-high 11½ games...last year, the A's were 23-36 after 59 games and were also 11½ games out of first place (lost game 60 and were 11 back)...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 14 days in fourth, nine days tied for fourth and seven days in fifth.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's lost their first two interleague games of the season on Tuesday and Wednesday at Milwaukee...the two interleague games are tied with the Cubs for second fewest in the majors (Baltimore, 0)...continue interleague play with this three game series at Cincinnati...also play at San Francisco (June 27-28) and St. Louis (Aug. 26-28)...will host Milwaukee (June 21-22), San Francisco (June 29-30), Pittsburgh (July 1-3) and Chicago (Aug. 5-7)...went 11-9 (.550) against the National League last year...it marked the fourth consecutive season and 12th time in 19 years the A's finished with a winning record in interleague play...are now 191-155 (.554) all-time in interleague play, which is fifth best in Major League history.

PITCHERS HITTING: A's pitchers are 0-for-4 with three strikeouts this year...went 3-for-19 (.158) with a run, RBI, 11 strikeouts and two sacrifice hits last year...now have a .082 (29-for-353) average with four doubles, 11 RBI, 10 walks and 165 strikeouts since interleague play began in 1997...the batting average is the lowest in the majors over that span (New York-AL, .088)...the last triple by an A's pitcher was by Blue Moon Odom on Aug. 22, 1971 against Boston...Odom also hit the last home run on Sept. 4, 1972 against California...the last extra base hit was by Joe Kennedy, a double on June 12, 2007 at Houston.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's have a season-high seven-game road losing streak...have lost more than seven straight road games just once over the last eight years (8, July 29-Aug. 17, 2015)...are 0-5 on this eight-game road trip to Houston (0-3), Milwaukee (0-2) and Cincinnati (three games) and are 12-18 (.400) on the road, which is the fourth worst road record in the American League...return home following the game Sunday for a nine-game homestand against Texas (four games), Los Angeles-AL (three games) and Milwaukee (two games)...went 5-1 on the last homestand against Detroit (2-1) and Minnesota (3-0) and are 13-16 (.448) at home...have a season-high five-game home winning streak...have a 5.87 ERA (169 er in 259.0 ip) on the road compared to 3.66 (106 er in 261.0 ip) at home...have the highest road ERA in the American League and second highest in the majors (Cincinnati, 6.52)...are batting .254 (270-for-1065) on the road compared to .240 (227-for-946) at home.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed 32 runs over the first five games of the road trip (30 er in 43.1 ip, 6.23 ERA) after yielding a total of 16 runs in six games on the last homestand (2.67 ERA)...have a 5.72 ERA (155 er in 244.0 ip), .285 (278-for-975) opponents batting average and 38 home runs allowed over the last 28 games dating back to May 8...posted a 3.91 ERA, .253 opponents average and 32 home runs over the first 31 contests...now have a 4.76 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...also have the second highest opponents batting average (.268) and on-base percentage (.336) and third highest slugging percentage (.435).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 11-23 with a 6.47 ERA (155 er in 215.2 ip) over the last 42 games dating back to April 23...that includes 6-1 with a 1.80 ERA (9 er in 45.0 ip) in seven starts by Rich Hill and 5-22 with a 7.70 ERA (146 er in 170.2 ip) in 35 starts by everyone else...

starters are 17-28 with a 5.35 ERA (186 er in 312.2 ip) overall...are tied for the most losses in the majors and have the third highest ERA.

OFFENSE: The A's were shutout for just the second time this year on Wednesday, which is tied with Boston and Chicago for the fewest in the American League...however, have scored 231 runs, which is third fewest in the AL...have the lowest on-base percentage (.297) and the second lowest slugging percentage (.391)...have the fewest walks (136) but have the fourth most intentional walks (12)...are tied for the second fewest doubles (89)...are hitting .259 (277-for-1069) and are averaging 4.4 runs per game (135 runs) over the last 31 games dating back to May 4...batted .234 and averaged 3.4 runs per game over the first 28 contests.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have not committed an error in 12 of the last 14 games (four errors total)...have 40 errors for the season, which is the most in the American League and fifth most in the majors...rank third in the AL in double plays (62).

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 2 for their last 16 (.125) and are batting .213 (10-for-47) for the season...rank second in the American League in hits (10), third in plate appearances (48) and tied for third in RBI (6) and extra base hits (3)...are one of three teams without a pinch walk (Baltimore and Cleveland).

THIS AND THAT: This three-game series at Cincinnati marks the A's penultimate series in the Eastern Time Zone (July 29-31 at Cleveland)...return home following the game Sunday for a stretch of 20 consecutive games in California (14 at home, four at Los Angeles, two at San Francisco)...the A's have been successful in 7-of-10 (70.0%) replay challenges, which is the best percentage in the majors...the 10 challenges are tied for second fewest in the majors...only the Yankees (9) have made fewer challenges...are averaging 2 hours and 57 minutes per game, which is fifth fastest in the majors...are 7-5 (.583) in games started by a left-handed pitcher compared to 18-29 (.383) against righties...the 12 games against left-handed starters are third fewest in the American League...have lost seven of their last nine one-run games after winning five of the first eight.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's placed Rich Hill on the 15-day disabled list yesterday and have now used the DL 15 times this year...currently have 11 players on the DL (H. Alvarez, R.J. Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doubront, Fuld, Hendriks, Hill, Parker, Reddick, Sogard)...R.J. Alvarez and Hendriks are currently on rehab assignments...R.J. Alvarez, Bassitt, Doubront, Fuld, Parker and Sogard are on the 60-day DL...the 15 players have combined to miss 526 games (35.1 games per stint)...have had at least 11 players on the DL every day since May 10 and at least six players on the DL all year...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. REDS: The A's and Reds meet for the first time since 2013 when each club swept a two-game series in its home ballpark...Oakland has lost five of the last seven games after winning eight of the first nine...lead the all-time series, 10-6...are 7-4 in Oakland and 3-2 in Cincinnati...including 0-2 at Great American Ballpark...have met twice in the World Series with the A's winning in seven games in 1972 and the Reds sweeping in four games in 1990.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Ryan Dull has stranded all 24 of his inherited runners and opponents are 1-for-36 (.028) with runners in scoring position...**Jed Lowrie** was reinstated from the 15-day disabled list May 25 and has reached base safely and started each of the A's 12 games at second base since then...is batting .319 (15-for-47) since his return...**Danny Valencia** is 15-for-28 (.536) with 10 runs, three doubles, three home runs, five RBI and five multiple hit games over his last eight games.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1979** Jim Essian hits an inside-the-park grand slam in the A's 12-1 win against Toronto...in **1992** Mark McGwire hits his 200th career home run off Chris Bosio in the A's 5-2 win at Milwaukee...he becomes the third Oakland Athletic to reach the 200 mark, joining Reggie Jackson and Jose Canseco...in **1997** Damon Mashore has three assists at Detroit to set an Oakland record for assists by an outfielder.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (3-5, 5.77 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was reinstated from the 15-day disabled list last Sunday and had a no decision that day at Houston (1 er in 5.0 ip, 1.80 ERA)...was placed on the DL May 22 retroactive to May 21 with a strained right trapezius...was 3-5 with a 6.19 ERA in nine starts at the time of the injury.

FOUR-GAME LOSING STREAK: Is 0-4 with an 8.78 ERA (26 er in 26.2 ip) and .322 (38-for-118) opponents batting average over his last six starts...the four-game losing streak matches his career high (Aug. 1-16, 2014)...allowed at least four runs in each of his first five starts during the streak marking the first time in his career he has allowed four or more runs in more than two consecutive starts...went 3-1 with a 2.73 ERA and .232 opponents batting average over his first four starts.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Is scheduled to make his first interleague start of the season...went 2-1 with a 1.69 ERA in three interleague starts last year...is now 3-2 with a 3.21 ERA (17 er in 47.2 ip) in eight career interleague appearances, including seven starts.

WITH THE BAT: Went 1-for-6 (.167) with four strikeouts last year...singled off Pedro Baez July 28 at Los Angeles for his first Major League hit...is now 1-for-8 (.125) with five strikeouts and two sacrifice hits in 10 career plate appearances...never batted as a minor leaguer.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .208 (22-for-106) opponents batting average over the first three innings of a game compared to .355 (38-for-107) from the fourth inning on...has yielded a .488 (21-for-43) combined batting average to the opponents eight and nine hitters...has faced 119 right-handed hitters and 124 left-handed hitters...has issued 15 of his 25 walks and allowed seven of his nine home runs to righties...has a .968 OPS against righties, .756 against lefties...opponents are batting .333 (17-for-51) with five walks (.393 on-base percentage), three doubles, a triple and four home runs (.667 slugging percentage) when leading off an inning...has yielded a .321 (17-for-53) batting average with runners in scoring position...opponents are 15-for-32 (.469) with three doubles and four home runs (.938 slugging percentage) when putting the first pitch in play.

WILD PITCHES: Leads the majors with nine wild pitches...had three wild pitches May 20 against New York and is the first A's pitcher with three wild pitches in a game since Doug John on Sept. 6, 1995 at Boston...has 39 career wild pitches, which is tied for seventh most in Oakland history (Mike Norris is 6th with 53).

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 1-0 with a 2.70 ERA (5 er in 16.2 ip) in three starts during the day compared to 2-5 with a 7.18 ERA (29 er in 36.1 ip) in seven starts at night...last year, he went 5-2 with a 1.78 ERA in nine starts during the day...it was the sixth lowest day ERA in Oakland history among pitchers with 50 or more day innings.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-3 with a 4.85 ERA (16 er in 29.2 ip) in five starts at home compared to 1-2 with a 6.94 ERA (18 er in 23.1 ip) in five starts on the road...last year, he went 8-3 with a 2.63 ERA and five home runs in 16 starts on the road...the road ERA was eighth lowest in Oakland history...it was second lowest over the last 34 years to his mark of 2.51 in 2014.

THE FOURTH INNING: Has allowed 14 of his 39 runs this year in the fourth inning...has a 13.50 ERA (12 er in 8.0 ip) and .410 (16-for-39) opponents batting average in the fourth inning compared to a 4.40 ERA (22 er in 45.0 ip) and .253 (44-for-174) opponents average in all other innings.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received no run support twice this year and two runs or fewer six times...is 2-1 in four starts with three runs of support or more compared to 1-4 in six starts with two runs or fewer...last year, he was 12-1 in 20 starts with three runs of support or more and is now 31-3 in 46 such starts in his career.

MONTH BY MONTH: Went 0-3 with a 9.61 ERA in four starts in May...allowed 25 runs, which were his most ever in a month (21, Aug. 2014)...surrendered five home runs, which match his most in a month (Aug. 2015)...went 3-2 with a 3.81 ERA in five starts in April...is now 10-3 with a 2.53 ERA in 15 career starts in April...the 10 wins are his most in any month.

START-BY-START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 2-1 victory over Chicago (AL) **April 6** in Oakland, the A's third game of the season...was scratched from his scheduled Opening Day start April 4 due to food poison-

ing...allowed his only run in the third inning when Jackson led off with a double, went to third on an Eaton ground out and scored on a Rollins sacrifice fly...left after seven innings with a 2-1 lead...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-1 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on **April 11** in Oakland...tossed 6.1 innings to go over the 500 innings pitched mark in his career...shut out the Angels on two hits and two walks over the first five innings but Tropeano blanked the A's on six hits and two walks in five innings...allowed three runs in the sixth inning on a Nava RBI single and a Trout two-run home run...was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-3 win over Kansas City **April 16** in Oakland...allowed a RBI single to Cain in the top of the first but the A's came back with three in the bottom of the first to give him the lead for good...also yielded a RBI single to Fuentes in the fourth inning...won his second consecutive start in the A's 8-5 win at Toronto **April 22**...struck out five of the first six batters he faced and had a 4-0 lead when he allowed a solo home run to Barney in the third inning...the A's increased their lead to 6-1 before he allowed a Bautista sacrifice fly in the sixth and a Barney RBI single in the seventh...was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-4 loss at Detroit **April 27**...tossed 65 pitches in 2.0 innings...matched the shortest outing of his career and it was his shortest outing as a starter (pitched 2.0 innings in his first two career outings, both in relief)...allowed four runs in the second inning...Castellanos tripled to lead off the inning and scored on a Gose fielders choice...J.D. Martinez hit a three-run home run later in the inning...lost his second consecutive start in the A's 8-2 loss to Seattle in Oakland on **May 3**...matched his career highs by allowing seven runs on 11 hits...allowed a two-run home run to Martin in the third and a solo home run by Cano to start the fourth...a RBI single by Marte in the seventh inning increased the Mariners lead to 4-1 and Lind added a RBI single in the eighth...was relieved by Rzepczynski with runners on first and second and no outs in the eighth and he allowed a three-run home run to Seager...lost his third straight start in the A's 14-7 loss at Boston **May 9**...allowed a career-high tying seven runs for the second consecutive start...had a 3-0 lead when he allowed a run to score in the second inning on wild pitch...the A's increased the lead to 4-1 before he yielded six runs in the fourth inning...allowed a RBI double to Shaw, a two-run single to Bradley Jr., a RBI double to Betts and a RBI single to Pedroia...was relieved with two outs and two runners on by Rodriguez, who allowed one of the runs to score...had a no decision in the A's 7-6 win at Tampa Bay **May 15**...allowed a career-high tying three home runs (also Aug. 22, 2015 vs. Tampa Bay)...had a 1-0 lead when he surrendered a leadoff home run to Guyer in the bottom of the first...Guyer added a three-run home run in the second and a sacrifice fly in the fourth...surrendered a leadoff home run to Longoria in the fifth and left with two outs in the sixth and the A's trailing 6-4...was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-3 loss to New York (AL) on **May 20**...shut out the Yankees on three hits and three walks over the first three innings and had a 1-0 lead when he allowed five runs in the fourth inning...Torreyes had a two-run triple and scored on a wild pitch and Beltran had a two-run double...was relieved by Dull after 3.1 innings

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-2 loss at Houston last Sunday...the A's scored twice in the first inning and he blanked the Astros on three hits and a walk over the first four innings...then allowed a leadoff home run to Gomez in the fifth and was relieved by Coulombe to start the sixth with the A's leading 2-1...Coulombe allowed a run in the sixth for the blown save and Dull allowed a run in the seventh for the loss.

RHP Kendall Graveman (2-6, 5.49 ERA): Is 1-5 with a 7.03 ERA and .358 opponents batting average over his last eight starts after going 1-1 with a 2.04 ERA and .159 opponents average over his first three starts...has a .322 opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .182 the second time and .472 after that...the opponents one through four hitters are batting a combined .355 off him while the five through nine hitters are batting .254...has received three runs of support or fewer in each of his 11 starts...had a no decision in his last start, a 6-5 A's loss in 12 innings at Houston on June 4 (4.1 ip, 7 h, 5 r, 5 er, 1 bb, 1 so)...has never faced the Reds in his career...is making his first interleague start of the season...is 1-2 with a 3.52 ERA (15.1 ip, 17 h, 6 r, 6 er, 6 bb, 11 so, 3 hr) in three career interleague appearances, all starts last year...struck out in his first and only professional at bat earlier this year at New York (AL) on April 20.

- Has allowed just 17-of-95 (17.9%) inherited runners to score, which is the best percentage in the majors.
- Has tossed 207.1 innings, which are the second most in the AL (Houston, 213.0) and fifth most in the majors.
