OAKLAND ATHLETICS (25-35) VS. CINCINNATI REDS (23-38)

SATURDAY, JUNE 11, 2016 — GREAT AMERICAN BALL PARK — 4:10 P.M. EDT RHP DANIEL MENGDEN (MAJOR LEAGUE DEBUT) VS. RHP DAN STRAILY (3-2, 3.34) CSNCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Extended their losing streak to a season-high six games last night, which is the A's longest losing streak since Aug. 11-17 of last year when the lost seven straight...the losing streak snaps a five-game winning streak...the A's have five losing streaks of four or more games this year and three winning streaks of four or more games...are now 1-6 in the month of June, which is the second worst record in the majors (Kansas City, 1-8)...are 12-23 since the start of May after going 13-12 in April... are 25-35 (.417) overall, which is the second worst record in the American League and fifth worst in the majors...are a season-high 10 games under .500...are in fifth place in the AL West for the eighth consecutive day and trail first place Texas by a season-high 11½ games for the second day in a row...last year, the A's were 23-37 after 60 games and were 11 games out of first place (won game 61 and were 10 back)...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 14 days in fourth, nine days tied for fourth and eight days in fifth.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's have lost their first three interleague games of the season...dropped the first of three games at Cincinnati last night after losing on Tuesday and Wednesday at Milwaukee...the three interleague games tied for third fewest in the majors...also play at San Francisco (June 27-28) and St. Louis (Aug. 26-28)...will host Milwaukee (June 21-22), San Francisco (June 29-30), Pittsburgh (July 1-3) and Chi-

Milwaukee (June 21-22), San Francisco (June 29-30), Pittsburgh (July 1-3) and Chicago (Aug. 5-7)...went 11-9 (.550) against the National League last year... it marked the fourth consecutive season and 12th time in 19 years the A's finished with a winning record in interleague play...are now 191-156 (.550) all-time in interleague play, which is fifth best in Major League history.

PITCHERS HITTING: A's pitchers are 0-for-6 with four strikeouts and a sacrifice hit this year...went 3-for-19 (.158) with a run, RBI, 11 strikeouts and two sacrifice hits last year...now have a .082 (29-for-355) average with four doubles, 11 RBI, 10 walks and 166 strikeouts since interleague play began in 1997...the batting average is the lowest in the majors over that span (New York-AL, .088)...the last triple by an A's pitcher was by Blue Moon Odom on Aug. 22, 1971 against Boston...Odom also hit the last home run on Sept. 4, 1972 against California...the last extra base hit was by Joe Kennedy, a double on June 12, 2007 at Houston.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's have a season-high eight-game road losing streak, which matches the longest road losing streak over the last eight years (July 29-Aug. 17, 2015)...have not lost more than eight consecutive road games since May 21-June 9, 2005 when they lost 11 straight...are 0-6 on this eight-game road trip to Houston (0-3), Milwaukee (0-2) and Cincinnati (0-1) and are 12-19 (.387) on the road, which is the fourth worst road record in the American League...return home following the game Sunday for a nine-game homestand against Texas (four games), Los Angeles-AL (three games) and Milwaukee (two games)...went 5-1 on the last homestand against Detroit (2-1) and Minnesota (3-0) and are 13-16 (.448) at home...have a season-high five-game home winning streak...have a 5.76 ERA (171 er in 267.0 ip) on the road compared to 3.66 (106 er in 261.0 ip) at home...have the highest road ERA in the American League and second highest in the majors (Cincinnati, 6.52)...are batting .255 (279-for-1096) on the road compared to .240 (227-for-946) at home.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed 34 runs over the first six games of the road trip (32 er in 51.1 ip, 5.61 ERA) after yielding a total of 16 runs in six games on the last homestand (2.67 ERA)...have a 5.61 ERA (157 er in 252.0 ip), .282 (283-for-1003) opponents batting average and 38 home runs allowed over the last 28 games dating back to May 8...posted a 3.91 ERA, .253 opponents average and 32 home runs over the first 31 contests...now have a 4.72 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...also have the second highest opponents batting average (.267) and on-base percentage (.334) and third highest slugging percentage (.432).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 11-24 with a 6.33 ERA (157 er in 223.1 ip) over the last 43 games dating back to April 23...that includes 6-1 with a 1.80 ERA (9 er in 45.0 ip) in seven starts by Rich Hill and 5-23 with a 7.47 ERA (148 er in 178.1 ip) in 36 starts by everyone else... starters are 17-29 with a 5.28 ERA (188 er in 320.1 ip) overall...are tied for the most losses in the majors and have the third highest ERA.

OFFENSE: The A's have scored 232 runs, which is third fewest in the American League...have the lowest on-base percentage (.299) and the second lowest slugging percentage (.392)...have the second fewest walks (140) but are tied for the second most intentional walks (13)...are tied for the second fewest doubles (90)...are hitting .260 (286-for-1100) and are averaging 4.3 runs per game (136 runs) over the last 32 games dating back to May 4...batted .234 and averaged 3.4 runs per game over the first 28 contests.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have not committed an error in 13 of the last 15 games (four errors total)...have 40 errors for the season, which is the most in the American League and fifth most in the majors...rank third in the AL in double plays (63).

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 3 for their last 18 (.167) and are batting .224 (11-for-49) for the season...rank second in the American League in hits (11), tied for second in plate appearances (50) and tied for third in RBI (6) and extra base hits (3)...are one of three teams without a pinch walk (Baltimore and Cleveland).

THIS AND THAT: This three-game series at Cincinnati marks the A's penultimate series in the Eastern Time Zone (July 29-31 at Cleveland)...return home following the game Sunday for a stretch of 20 consecutive games in California (14 at home, four at Los Angeles, two at San Francisco)...the A's have been successful in 7-of-10 (70.0%) replay challenges, which is the best percentage in the majors...the 10 challenges are tied for the fewest in the majors...are averaging 2 hours and 57 minutes per game, which is fifth fastest in the majors...are 7-5 (.583) in games started by a left-handed pitcher compared to 18-30 (.375) against righties...have lost eight of their last 10 one-run games after winning five of the first eight.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's placed Rich Hill on the 15-day disabled list on Thursday and have now used the DL 15 times this year...currently have 11 players on the DL (H. Alvarez, R.J. Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doubront, Fuld, Hendriks, Hill, Parker, Reddick, Sogard)...R.J. Alvarez and Hendriks are currently on rehab assignments...R.J. Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doubront, Fuld, Parker and Sogard are on the 60-day DL...the 15 players have combined to miss 537 games (35.8 games per stint)...have had at least 11 players on the DL every day since May 10 and at least six players on the DL all year...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. REDS: The A's dropped the first of three games at Cincinnati last night...this is the first time the A's and Reds have meet since 2013 when each club swept a two-game series in its home ballpark...Oakland has lost six of the last eight games after winning eight of the first nine...lead the all-time series, 10-7...are 7-4 in Oakland and 3-3 in Cincinnati...including 0-3 at Great American Ballpark...have met twice in the World Series with the A's winning in seven games in 1972 and the Reds sweeping in four games in 1990.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Ryan Dull has stranded all 24 of his inherited runners and his opponents are 1-for-36 (.028) with runners in scoring position...**Jed Lowrie** was reinstated from the 15-day disabled list May 25 and has reached base safely and started each of the A's 13 games at second base since then... is batting .300 (15-for-50) since his return...**Danny Valencia** is 16-for-32 (.500) with 10 runs, four doubles, three home runs, five RBI and five multiple hit games over his last nine games...is hitting .340 overall, which is the second best batting average in the American League and fourth best in the majors among players with 100 or more plate appearances.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1978**, at the age of 18 years, 246 days, Mike Morgan becomes the youngest pitcher to start a game for the Oakland A's...he goes the distance, allowing 10 hits against Baltimore but takes the loss as Scott McGregor shuts out the A's 3-0...Morgan's honor is short lived as Tim Conroy, at the age of 18 years, 81 days, gets a start 12 days later... in **1995** Mark McGwire hits three home runs in the A's 8-1 win at Boston after hitting two home runs the day before...his five home runs in consecutive games tied a major league record which he already shared.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Daniel Mengden (Major League Debut)

FOR STARTERS: Was selected from Triple-A Nashville today and will be making his Major League debut after just 43 minor league appearances, including 34 starts, in three professional seasons...had not pitched above Single-A prior to this year...will become the 46th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut, the second this year (Sean Manaea, April 29)... prior to that, the last A's pitcher to start in his debut was tonight's Reds starter Dan Straily on Aug. 3, 2012 against Toronto...the last to win was Bobby Cramer on September 13, 2010 at Kansas City...the last complete game was by Mike Morgan June 11, 1978 against Baltimore and the only shutout is by Mike Norris April 10, 1975 against Chicago...the previous 45 have combined for a 13-14 record and a 3.74 ERA.

MINORS: Began the season at Double-A Midland and went 2-0 with a 0.78 ERA in four starts before he was promoted to Triple-A Nashville May 1... went 3-1 with a 1.39 ERA in seven starts with the Sounds and combined for a 5-1 record and a 1.19 ERA in 11 minor league starts overall...the ERA was sixth lowest in all of the minor leagues at the time of his promotion... allowed just three home runs in 68.1 innings, an average of 0.40 per nine innings...yielded no home runs in 23.0 innings with Midland...went 4-0 with a 0.79 ERA over his first nine starts and was 1-1 with a 3.18 ERA over his final two starts.

THIS AND THAT: The RockHounds were 4-0 in his starting assignments and the Sounds were 5-2...his teams combined for a 9-2 (.818) record in his 11 starts...had five starts where he did not allow a run but had just two wins and three no decisions in those games...tossed at least five innings in each of his 11 starts, including seven or more four times...allowed six hits or fewer in all 11 starts and allowed more than two runs just once...did not allow a run in the first or second inning...had a 0.41 ERA over the first four innings of a game and a 2.59 ERA from the fifth inning on.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: Was originally drafted by Houston in the fourth round of the 2014 First-Year Player Draft...was traded to Oakland with catcher Jacob Nottingham for left-handed pitcher Scott Kazmir on July 23, 2015...has compiled a 15-5 record and a 2.87 ERA (67 er in 210.0 ip) in 43 games, including 34 starts, in three professional seasons...has 209 strikeouts in 210.0 innings...has allowed just 14 home runs, an average of 0.60 per nine innings.

RHP Kendall Graveman (2-6, 5.49 ERA): Is 1-5 with a 7.03 ERA and .358 opponents batting average over his last eight starts after going 1-1 with a 2.04 ERA and .159 opponents average over his first three starts...has a .322 opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .182 the second time and .472 after that...the opponents one through four hitters are batting a combined .355 off him while the five through nine hitters are batting .254...has received three runs of support or fewer in each of his 11 starts...had a no decision in his last start, a 6-5 A's loss in 12 innings at Houston on June 4 (4.1 ip, 7 h, 5 r, 5 er, 1 bb, 1 so)...has never faced the Reds in his career...is making his first interleague start of the season... is 1-2 with a 3.52 ERA (15.1 ip, 17 h, 6 r, 6 er, 6 bb, 11 so, 3 hr) in three career interleague appearances, all starts last year...struck out in his first and only professional at bat earlier this year at New York (AL) on April 20.
