OAKLAND ATHLETICS (25-36) VS. CINCINNATI REDS (24-38)

SUNDAY, JUNE 12, 2016 — GREAT AMERICAN BALL PARK — 1:10 P.M. EDT RHP KENDALL GRAVEMAN (2-6, 5.49) VS. LHP JOHN LAMB (1-3, 4.74) CSNCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Extended their losing streak to seven games yesterday, which is an ongoing season high and the longest losing streak since Aug. 11-17 of last year when they also lost seven straight...have not had a losing streak longer than seven games since May 22-June 1, 2012 when they dropped nine straight...the current seven-game losing streak snaps a five-game winning streak...the A's have five losing streaks of four or more games this year and three winning streaks of four or more games...are now 1-7 in the month of June, which is the worst record in the majors (Kansas City, 2-8)...are 12-24 since the start of May after going 13-12 in April... are 25-36 (.410) overall, which is the second worst record in the American League and fourth worst in the majors...are a season-high 11 games under .500...are in fifth place in the AL West for the ninth consecutive day and now trail first place Texas by a season-high 12½ games...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 14 days in fourth, nine days tied for fourth and nine days in fifth.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-7 on this eight-game road trip to Houston (0-3), Milwaukee (0-2) and Cincinnati (0-2)...with a loss today, the A's would finish just the fourth winless road trip of eight or more games in Oakland history...posted a 0-9 record Sept. 22-Oct. 1, 1995 (Seattle 3, Texas 2, California 4) and 0-8 marks April 19-26, 1994 (Boston 3, New York 3, Baltimore 2) and May 17-23, 1976 (Minnesota 2, Kansas City 2, Chicago 4)...now have a season-high nine-game road losing streak dating back to May 24, which is the longest road losing streak since May 21-June 9, 2005 when they lost 11 consecutive road games...are 12-20 (.375) on the road for the season, which is the third worst road record in the American League...return home following the game today for a nine-game homestand against Texas (four games), Los Angeles-AL (three games) and Milwaukee (two games)...went 5-1 on the last homestand against Detroit (2-1) and Minnesota (3-0) and are 13-16 (.448) at home...have a season-high five-game home winning streak...have a 5.66 ERA (173 er in 275.0 ip) on the road compared to 3.66 (106 er in 261.0 ip) at home...have the highest road ERA in the American League and second highest in the majors (Cincinnati, 6.52)...are batting .253 (286-for-1129) on the road compared to .240 (227-for-946) at home.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's have lost their first four interleague games of the season...have dropped the first two of three games at Cincinnati after losing two games at Milwaukee on Tuesday and Wednesday... also play at San Francisco (June 27-28) and St. Louis (Aug. 26-28)...will host Milwaukee (June 21-22), San Francisco (June 29-30), Pittsburgh (July 1-3) and Chicago (Aug. 5-7)...went 11-9 (.550) against the National

League last year...it marked the fourth consecutive season and 12th time in 19 years the A's finished with a winning record in interleague play...are now 191-157 (.549) all-time in interleague play, which is fifth best in Major League history.

PITCHERS HITTING: A's pitchers are 0-for-8 with five strikeouts and a sacrifice hit this year...went 3-for-21 (.143) with a run, RBI, 12 strikeouts and two sacrifice hits last year...now have a .081 (29-for-357) average with four doubles, 11 RBI, 10 walks and 167 strikeouts since interleague play began in 1997...the batting average is the lowest in the majors over that span (New York-AL, .088)...the last triple by an A's pitcher was by Blue Moon Odom on Aug. 22, 1971 against Boston...Odom also hit the last home run on Sept. 4, 1972 against California...the last extra base hit was by Joe Kennedy, a double on June 12, 2007 at Houston.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed 36 runs over the first seven games of the road trip (34 er in 59.1 ip, 5.16 ERA) after yielding a total of 16 runs in six games on the last homestand (2.67 ERA)...have a 5.50 ERA (159 er in 260.0 ip), .280 (289-for-1032) opponents batting average and 39 home runs allowed over the last 30 games dating back to May 8...posted a 3.91 ERA, .253 opponents average and 32 home runs over the first 31 contests...now have a 4.68 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...also have the second highest opponents batting average (.266) and on-base percentage (.334) and third highest slugging percentage (.431).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 11-25 with a 6.25 ERA (159 er in 229.0 ip) over the last 44 games dating back to April 23...that includes 6-1 with a 1.80 ERA (9 er in 45.0 ip) in seven starts by Rich Hill and 5-24 with a 7.34 ERA (150 er in 184.0 ip) in 37 starts by everyone else... starters are 17-30 with a 5.25 ERA (190 er in 326.0 ip) overall...are tied for the most losses in the majors and have the third highest ERA.

OFFENSE: The A's have scored 233 runs, which is tied for the second fewest in the American League (Minnesota, 230)...have the lowest on-base percentage (.298) and the second lowest slugging percentage (.390)... have the second fewest walks (143) but are tied for the second most intentional walks (13)...have the third fewest doubles (92)...are hitting .259 (293-for-1133) and are averaging 4.2 runs per game (137 runs) over the last 33 games dating back to May 4...batted .234 and averaged 3.4 runs per game over the first 28 contests

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have not committed an error in 14 of the last 16 games (four errors total)...have 40 errors for the season, which is the most in the American League and tied for fifth most in the majors...rank third in the AL in double plays (63).

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are batting .235 (12-for-51) with a home run and six RBI...rank second in the American League in hits and plate appearances (52) and tied for third in RBI and extra base hits (3)...are the only team in the majors without a pinch walk.

THIS AND THAT: This three-game series at Cincinnati marks the A's penultimate series in the Eastern Time Zone (July 29-31 at Cleveland)...return home following the game today for a stretch of 20 consecutive games in California (14 at home, four at Los Angeles, two at San Francisco)...the A's have been successful in 7-of-10 (70.0%) replay challenges, which is the best percentage in the majors...the 10 challenges are tied for the fewest in the majors...are averaging 2 hours and 57 minutes per game, which is fifth fastest in the majors...are 7-5 (.583) in games started by a left-handed pitcher compared to 18-31 (.367) against righties...have lost nine of their last 11 one-run games after winning five of the first eight.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's placed Rich Hill on the 15-day disabled list on Thursday and have now used the DL 15 times this year...currently have 11 players on the DL (H. Alvarez, R.J. Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doubront, Fuld, Hendriks, Hill, Parker, Reddick, Sogard)...R.J. Alvarez and Hendriks are currently on rehab assignments...R.J. Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doubront, Fuld, Parker and Sogard are on the 60-day DL...the 15 players have combined to miss 548 games (36.5 games per stint)...have had at least 11 players on the DL every day since May 10 and at least six players on the DL all year...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. REDS: The A's have dropped the first two of three games at Cincinnati...this is the first time the A's and Reds have meet since 2013 when each club swept a two-game series in its home ballpark...Oakland has lost seven of the last nine games after winning eight of the first nine...lead the all-time series, 10-8...are 7-4 in Oakland and 3-4 in Cincinnati...including 0-4 at Great American Ballpark...have met twice in the World Series with the A's winning in seven games in 1972 and the Reds sweeping in four games in 1990.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Ryan Dull has stranded all 26 of his inherited runners and his opponents are 1-for-37 (.027) with runners in scoring position, including 0-for-20 with RISP and two outs...**Danny Valencia** is 17-for-36 (.472) with 10 runs, four doubles, three home runs, six RBI and five multiple hit games over his last 10 games.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1990** Rickey Henderson steals third base against Texas, his 900th career steal...in that game, Dennis Eckersley walks his first batter of the season, snapping a string of 52.0 innings and 186 hitters without a walk...in **2009** Jack Hannahan commits his first error of the season, snapping a 72-game errorless streak dating back to August 10, 2008, which is an Oakland record for a third baseman.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Kendall Graveman (2-6, 5.49 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 1-5 with a 7.03 ERA (31 er in 39.2 ip) and .358 (59for-165) opponents batting average over his last eight starts after going 1-1 with a 2.04 ERA and .159 opponents average over his first three starts... is now 2-11 with a 5.63 ERA (60 er in 96.0 ip) and .299 (116-for-388) opponents average over his last 19 starts dating back to July 10, 2015.

LOSSES: Is tied for seventh in the American League with six losses...went 1-4 with a 5.87 ERA in six starts in the month of May...the losses tied for second in the AL...it is the first time he has lost four games in a month in his career.

INTERLEAGUE: Is making his first interleague start of the season...is 1-2 with a 3.52 ERA (15.1 ip, 17 h, 6 r, 6 er, 6 bb, 11 so, 3 hr) in three career interleague appearances, all starts last year.

WITH THE BAT: Struck out in his first and only professional at bat earlier this year at New York (AL) on April 20...batted in the fifth inning after the A's designated hitter (Lowrie) entered the game following an injury to Valencia...hit in the four spot in the order to become just the second A's pitcher with a plate appearance in the clean-up spot in the designated hitter era (Ron Flores, June 29, 2006 vs. San Diego).

RUN SUPPORT: Has received three runs of support or fewer in each of his 11 starts, including no runs three times and one run three times...his season run support average of 2.83 (18 rs in 57.1 ip) is second lowest in the American League among pitchers with at least 50 innings pitched... is 0-5 in six starts with two runs of support or fewer, 2-1 in five starts with three runs of support or more...is now 1-14 in 19 career starts with two runs of support or more.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .275 (36-for-131) opponents batting average to left-handed hitters compared to .340 (33-for-97) against right-handers...however, has issued 18 of his 23 walks to lefties...last year he issued 24 of his 38 walks to lefties...has a .322 (28-for-87) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .182 (16-for-88) the second time and .472 (25-for-53) after that...the opponents one through four hitters are batting a combined .355 (39-for-110) off him while the five through nine hitters are batting .254 (30-for-118).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-3 with a 7.71 ERA (24 er in 28.0 ip) in six starts on the road compared to 1-3 with a 3.38 ERA (11 er in 29.1 ip) in five starts at home...has surrendered 10 home runs in 28.0 innings on the road but just one in 29.1 innings at home...is tied for third in the American League in home runs allowed on the road.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 1-2 with a 7.36 ERA (15 er in 18.1 ip) in four starts during the day compared to 1-4 with a 4.62 ERA (20 er in 39.0 ip) in seven starts at night...has surrendered six home runs in 18.1 innings during the day, five in 39.0 innings at night.

LOSING STREAKS SNAPPED: Defeated Minnesota May 30 to snap his losing streak at five games...had a 7.92 ERA and .361 opponents batting average during the losing streak, which spanned five starts from April 25 to May 19...the losing streak fell one short of his career high of six, which he ended with his first win of the season this year on April 20...compiled a 5.52 ERA and .276 opponents batting average during that losing streak, which spanned nine starts from July 10, 2015 to April 7, 2016...it was the longest losing streak by an A's pitcher since Tyson Ross lost eight straight from May 19 to Sept. 24, 2012.

THIS AND THAT: Allowed a career-high 10 hits in back-to-back starts on April 25 at Detroit and May 2 against Seattle and is the first A's pitcher with at least 10 hits in back-to-back starts since Brandon McCarthy (April 16-21, 2012)...allowed four hits or fewer in each of his first three starts, joining John Odom (1969) and Mike Norris (1980) as the only pitchers in Oakland history on an Opening Day roster to allow four hits or fewer while tossing five innings or more in each of their first three starts.

START-BY-START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-1 loss to Chicago (AL) *April* **7** in Oakland...shutout the White Sox on two hits over the first five innings, but Mat Latos blanked the A's on one hit over the first six innings...the scored was tied at 0-0 when he walked Cabrera to lead off the sixth...Abreau followed with a two-run home run and Graveman left after 5.1 innings trailing 2-0...had a no decision in the A's 5-4 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on *April* **12** in Oakland...allowed just one run in 6.0 innings and it came in the second inning...walked Pujols to start the inning and Calhoun singled him over to third...Simmons then grounded into a double play and Graveman was relived by Axford to start the seventh with the A's in the eighth and Doolittle surrendered two in the ninth...was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-2 win at New York (AL) on *April* **20**...it was his first win since July 4, 2015 against Seattle...struck out a career-high eight batters

on a career-high tying 111 pitches...allowed a one-out solo home run to Gregorius in the second inning, but that was the only run he would surrender in 6.1 innings of work...struck out in the fifth inning in his first professional at bat...was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-3 loss at Detroit April 25...allowed a career-high 10 hits...surrendered single runs in each of the first two innings on a Cabrera home run in the first and an Aviles RBI single in the second...then yielded a three-run home run to Cabrera followed by a solo home run by Victory Martinez in the fifth and left after 4.2 innings trailing 6-0...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-3 loss to Seattle May 2 in Oakland...allowed a career-high tying 10 hits for the second consecutive start...the A's scored a run in the second inning and he blanked the Mariners on a hit and a walk over the first three innings...then allowed a RBI single to Lind in the fourth and two more runs in the sixth on a Seager RBI double and an lanetta RBI single ... yielded a one-out double to Aoki in the seventh and was relieved by Rzepczynski who allowed Aoki to score... was the losing pitcher in the A's 11-3 loss at Baltimore on May 8 ... yielded a career-high four home runs, which are the most allowed by an A's starting pitcher since May 6, 2013 at Cleveland when Jarrod Parker also allowed four home runs...the A's scored three times in the first but he allowed a two-run home run to Machado in the bottom of the first ... allowed back-toback home runs to Alvarez and Schoop in the second and a two-run home run to Trumbo in the third...left after 2.2 innings trailing 6-2...lost his fourth consecutive start in the A's 6-0 loss at Tampa Bay May 14 ... allowed a tworun home run to Miller in the third inning...also yielded two runs in the sixth inning on a Pearce sacrifice fly and a Kiermaier RBI single...Andriese shut out the A's on two hits, no walks and a hit batter...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-1 to New York (AL) in Oakland on May 19 ... allowed a RBI double to Beltran in the third inning but the A's came back to tie the game in the fourth...then allowed a RBI double to Hicks in the sixth inning and was relieved by Rzepczynski after allowing two runs in 4.2 innings...had a no decision in the A's 6-5 loss at Seattle May 24...tossed just 4.2 innings and allowed two runs...yielded a RBI double to Cano in the first and a RBI single to Cruz in the third...was relieved Coulombe with one out in the fifth inning and runners on first and second with the A's trailing 2-1...the A's scored four times in the fifth to get him off the hook but the Mariners scored twice in the eighth and ninth for the win...picked up his second win of the season in the A's 3-2 win over Minnesota May 30 in Oakland...the A's scored a run in the first but he allowed a RBI single to Centeno in the second...also allowed a Dozier sacrifice fly in the fifth inning, but the A's tied the game in the bottom of the fifth and took the lead for good in the sixth.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-5 loss at Houston in 12 innings on June 4...the A's scored three times in the second but he allowed three in the bottom of the second on a two-run home run by Gattis and a Marisnick sacrifice fly...also allowed a Rasmus RBI double in the third and a Correa RBI single in the fifth and left after 4.1 innings trailing 5-3...the A's scored single runs in the sixth and ninth innings to get him off the hook.
