OAKLAND ATHLETICS (26-36) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (39-24)

ABOUT THE A'S: Snapped their season-high seven-game losing streak yesterday with a 6-1 win at Cincinnati...the losing streak matched the A's longest over the last four years...are now 2-7 (.222) in the month of June, which is the worst record in the majors (Pittsburgh, 3-9)...are 13-24 since the start of May after going 13-12 in April...are 26-36 (.419) overall, which is the second worst record in the American League and fifth worst in the majors...it matches the third worst record in Oakland history after 62 games...were also 25-37 after 62 games last year (lost game 63)...are 10 games under .500, which is one short of the season low (25-36 on June 11)...are in fifth place in the AL West for the 10th consecutive day and trail first place Texas by a season-high 12½ games for the second consecutive day...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 14 days in fourth, nine days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth...have five losing streaks of four or more games this year and three winning streaks of four or more games.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's snapped their season-high nine-game road losing streak yesterday, which matched the seventh longest road losing streak in Oakland history...it was the longest since an 11-game streak from May 21-June 9, 2005...currently have a season-high five-game home winning streak...begin a nine-game homestand tonight against Texas (four games), Los Angeles-AL (three games) and Milwaukee (two games)...it is the first of four homestands of nine or more games...went 5-1 on the last homestand against Detroit (2-1) and Minnesota (3-0) and are 13-16 (.448) at home...went 1-7 on the last road trip to Houston (0-3), Milwaukee (0-2) and Cincinnati (1-2) and are 13-20 (.394) on the road, which is the fourth worst road record in the American League...have a 3.66 ERA (106 er in 261.0 ip) at home compared to 5.51 (174 er in 284.0 ip) on the road...have the second highest road ERA in the majors (Cincinnati, 6.52)...are batting .240 (227-for-946) at home compared to .258 (301-for-1167) on the road.

LEFT AND RIGHT: Today is game two in a four-game stretch where the A's are scheduled to face a left-handed starting pitcher in each game...have faced just 13 left-handed starters for the season, which is tied for second fewest in the American League...are 8-5 (.615) in games started by a lefty compared to 18-31 (.367) against righties.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 3.73 ERA (47 er in 113.1 ip) over the last 13 games and are 6-7 over that span...that has dropped the season ERA to 4.62, which is the lowest it has been since it was 4.47 on May 9...however, have a 5.35 ERA (160 er in 269.0 ip) over the last 31 games dating back to May 8 after posting a 3.91 ERA over the first 31 contests...the A's 4.62 ERA is second highest in the American League...also have the second highest opponents on-base percentage (.333) and the third highest opponents batting average (.266) and slugging percentage (.428).

STARTING PITCHING: The A's have used eight different starting pitchers over the last 15 games and nine for the season, which matches Los Angeles and Minnesota for the most in the American League...starters have tossed fewer than five innings 20 times, which is the most in the majors (Minnesota, 18)...are 11-25 with a 6.18 ERA (160 er in 233.0 ip) over the last 45 games dating back to April 23...that includes 6-1 with a 1.80 ERA (9 er in 45.0 ip) in seven starts by Rich Hill and 5-24 with a 7.23 ERA (151 er in 188.0 ip) in 35 starts by everyone else...are 17-30 with a 5.21 ERA (191 er in 333.0 ip) overall...are tied for the most losses in the majors and have the third highest ERA.

OFFENSE: The A's scored just 21 runs in eight games on the last road trip, an average of 2.6 per game...have 239 runs for the season, which is third fewest in the American League...however, are hitting .263 (308-for-1171) and are averaging 4.2 runs per game (143 runs) over the last 34 games dating back to May 4 after batting .234 and averaging 3.4 runs per game over the first 28 contests...have the lowest on-base percentage in the AL (.300) and the second fewest walks (145)...however, are tied for the second most intentional walks (13)...are tied for the second fewest doubles (93)...have been shutout just twice, which is tied with Boston and Chicago for the fewest in the AL.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have not committed an error in 15 of the last 17 games (four errors total)...have 40 errors for the season, which is second most in the American League...are tied for second in the AL in double plays (66).

DESIGNATED HITTERS: The A's designated hitter is batting .181 (39-for-215) with seven home runs and 25 RBI...have the second lowest batting average in the AL and are tied for the third fewest home runs and RBI...the A's DH has entered the game defensively seven times this year...from 1996-2015, the A's had the DH enter the game on defense a total of 11 times...this is the most times the A's DH has entered the game since 1995 when they also did it seven times.

ONE-RUN GAMES CLOSE CALLS: Each of the A's last two losses, three of the last four and four of the last six have been by one run...have now dropped nine of their last 11 one-run decisions after winning five of the first eight...are 7-12 (.368) in one-run games for the season, which is the second worst record in the AL (Tampa Bay, 5-9)...are tied for second in most losses...are 7-4 (.636) in games decided in the last at bat, which is the fourth best record in the majors...are 2-1 in extra inning games...all three extra inning games have come on the road and the A's now have a streak of 48 consecutive home games since their last extra inning game in the Coliseum (Aug. 18, 2015 vs. Los Angeles-NL)...that is the longest such streak by an A's team since a 55-game streak from Sept. 25, 1983-July 20, 1984).

THIS AND THAT: Today's game begins a stretch of 20 consecutive games in California...after this nine-game homestand, the A's travel to Los Angeles-AL (four games) and San Francisco (two games) before returning home for a five-game homestand...A's pinch hitters rank second in the American League in hits (12) and plate appearances (54) and tied for third in RBI (6) and extra base hits (3)...the A's have been successful in 7-of-10 (70.0%) replay challenges, which is the best percentage in the majors...the 10 challenges are tied with New York (AL) and Minnesota for the fewest in the majors...are averaging 2 hours and 56 minutes per game, which is tied with Toronto for the quickest in the majors

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 15 times this year and currently have 10 players on the DL (Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doubront, Fuld, Hendriks, Hill, Parker, Reddick, Sogard)...Hendriks is currently on a rehab assignment...Bassitt, Canha, Doubront, Fuld, Parker and Sogard are on the 60-day DL...the 15 players have combined to miss 558 games (37.2 games per stint)...have had at least 10 players on the DL every day since May 10 and at least six players on the DL all year...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's lead the season series 3-0 after sweeping a three-game series in Oakland May 16-18...will not make their first trip to Arlington until July 25 and will play 12 of 28 road games from July 25 to Sept. 18 in the state of Texas (including Aug. 29-31 at Houston)...have one visit to Texas on each of their four road trips over that span...have won three of the previous four season series and are 43-36 against Texas over the last five years...are 335-343 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 176-164 in Oakland and 159-179 in Texas...have an all-time record of 432-425 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Sean Doolittle has a 0.68 ERA (1 er in 13.1 ip) over his last 15 games...
Ryan Dull has stranded all 26 of his inherited runners and opponents are 1-for-37 (.027) with runners in scoring position...
Jed Lowrie leads the American League and ranks second in the majors with a .438 batting average with runners in scoring position...
Danny Valencia is hitting .356 (37-for-104) with 10 home runs and 22 RBI in 28 games since he was reinstated from the disabled list May 6...the batting average is fourth best in the AL over that span and the home runs are tied for fourth.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1931** George Earnshaw goes 4 for 5 with a home run and three RBI and tosses a complete game five-hitter in the A's 14-1 win over St. Louis in the second game of a doubleheader...in **1968** Jim Nash, Paul Lindblad and Ed Sprague combine to shutout the Cleveland Indians 1-0 in 11 innings...it is the A's third straight shutout...in **1992** Carney Lansford homers off Texas pitcher Bobby Witt for the 2000th hit of his major league career.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (2-4, 6.20 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 2-3 with a 4.18 ERA (15 er in 32.1 ip) and .244 (30-for-123) opponents batting average over his last five starts after going 0-1 with a 11.37 ERA and .382 opponents average over his first three starts... has a 6.20 ERA overall, which is fifth highest in the American League among pitchers with 40 or more innings pitched.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has held left-handed hitters to a .152 (5-for-33) batting average and one extra base hit (double)...right-handers are batting .317 (46-for-145) with all seven of his home runs and 13 of his 15 walks...has a .908 OPS against righties, .382 against lefties...has a .221 (15-for-68) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .274 (17-for-62) the second time and .396 (19-for-48) after that...opponents are 18-for-36 (.500) with five doubles, three home runs and 14 RBI when putting the first pitch in play...has allowed a .475 (19-for-40) batting average, six home runs and 14 RBI to the opponents four and five hitters compared to .232 (32-for-138) with one home run and 15 RBI to all other spots in the order.

INNING BY INNING: Has a 3.38 ERA (6 er in 16.0 ip) over the first two innings of a game, a 6.23 ERA (15 er in 21.2 ip) over innings three through five and a 12.27 ERA (10 er in 7.1 ip) from the sixth inning on.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-2 with a 4.58 ERA (18 er in 35.1 ip) and .259 (35-for-135) opponents batting average in six starts at home compared to 0-2 with a 12.10 ERA (13 er in 9.2 ip) and .372 (16-for-43) opponents average in two starts on the road...has surrendered three home runs in 35.1 innings in Oakland, four in 9.2 innings on the road.

THIS AND THAT: Was selected from Triple-A Nashville April 29 and is scheduled to make his ninth start of the season and his career...the nine starts will be tied for second among American League rookies...yielded at least four runs in each of his first three starts to become the second pitcher in Oakland history to allow at least four runs in each of his first three Major League appearances...the other is Vida Blue (July 20-Aug. 3, 1969).

FIRST START: He had a no decision in his Major League debut, a 7-4 A's win over Houston April 29 in Oakland...had just 42 minor league appearances, all starts, in three professional seasons...became the 45th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut, the first since Dan Straily on Aug. 3, 2012 against Toronto...issued a career-high four walks...allowed a leadoff home run to Gattis in the second inning but the A's came back with two in the bottom of the second...allowed a RBI single to Gattis in the sixth to tie the game and was relieved by Doolittle with no outs and runners on first and second...Doolittle allowed both runs to score but the A's tied the game in the eighth and won it on a three-run home run by Alonso in the ninth.

SECOND START: He had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 9-8 loss to Seattle in Oakland on May 4...shutout the Mariners on two hits and a walk over the first four innings and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed four runs in the fifth inning...Marte had a RBI double, Cano a RBI single and Cruz a two-run home run...the A's then scored six times in the bottom of the fifth to give him an 8-4 lead but the bullpen allowed two runs in the sixth inning and three more in the seventh for the blown save (Axford).

THIRD START: He had the first decision of his career, a loss in the A's 13-5 loss at Boston May 10...yielded a career-high eight runs on a career-high 10 hits in a career-low 2.2 innings...allowed a lead-off home run to Betts in the first inning and Ramirez added a two-run homer...retired the side in order in the second but then allowed five runs in the third inning while recording just two outs...Pedroia had a RBI double, Bogaerts and Young had RBI singles and Shaw chased him from the game with a two-run double.

FOURTH START: He picked up his first Major League win in the A's 3-1 victory over Texas May 16 in Oakland...shutout the Rangers on two hits and a walk over the first six innings...had a 2-0 lead with runners on second and third and one out in the seventh inning...allowed a sacrifice fly to Stubbs and was relieved by Doolittle who got the final out of the inning.

FIFTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-1 loss to New York (AL) in Oakland on May 21...retired each of the first nine batters he faced before allowing the first four batters to reach base in the fourth inning...yielded four runs in the fourth on a Beltran RBI single, a Hicks sacrifice fly and a Refsnyder two-run double...also allowed a RBI double to Castro in the seventh.

SIXTH START: He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 4-1 loss to Detroit May 27 in Oakland...shutout the Tigers on three hits over the first three innings but then allowed two runs in the fourth on a RBI double by Maybin and a RBI single by McCann...also allowed a leadoff home run to Castellanos in the sixth...left after six innings trailing 3-0 as the A's were shutout on three hits over the first eight innings.

SEVENTH START: He picked up the second win of his career in the A's 5-1 win over Minnesota June 1 in Oakland...struck out a career-high eight batters...shut out the Twins on four hits and a walk over the first five innings...had a 4-0 lead when he allowed his only run in the sixth inning...loaded the bases with no outs but got a sacrifice fly from Escobar before striking out Kepler and Centeno...was relieved by Dull to start the seventh inning with the A's leading 5-2.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-4 loss at Milwaukee last Tuesday...allowed five runs in a career-high 7.0 innings...surrendered a two-run home run to Carter in the second inning and a three-run home run to Carter in the sixth...the A's were no-hit by Davies over the first six innings before Butler hit a two-run home run in the seventh inning...was relieved by Rodriguez to start the eighth with the A's trailing 5-2.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 1-1 with a 4.40 ERA (14.1 ip, 14 h, 8 r, 7 er, 7 bb, 16 so, 2 hr) in five games, including three starts...struck out 16 batters in 14.1 innings...allowed a .241 (14-for-58) opponents batting average...surrendered just one run in his first three appearances (1 er in 6.2 ip, 1.35 ERA)...then yielded seven in his final two, both starts (6 er in 7.2 ip, 7.04 ERA).

LHP Eric Surkamp (0-3, 6.41 ERA): Will be recalled from Triple-A Nashville tomorrow for his fourth stint with the A's this year (April 8-24, May 11-16, May 31-June 1)...has walked 15 and struck out just 14 in 26.2 innings...has tossed fewer than five innings in five of his six starts this year and nine of 13 starts in his career...has a .375 batting average with the abses empty compared to .271 with runners on base...had a no decision in his last Major League start, a 7-4 A's win over Minnesota on May 31 (4.2 ip, 8 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 2 so)...has faced the Rangers once in his career and it came in relief on Aug. 5, 2014 at Chicago-AL (1.0 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb)...is 3-1 with a 3.07 ERA and .206 opponents batting average in five starts with Nashville...has 34 strikeouts in 29.1 innings...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 3-1 Nashville win at Omaha a week ago today (6.1 ip, 5 h, 0 r, 2 bb, 6 so).
