OAKLAND NOTES

- The **Oakland A's** have won two straight to snap a season-high seven-game losing streak...set a season-high in runs (14) while tying season-highs in hits (17) and margin of victory (9)...the 14 runs are the most since scoring 12 times on May 28 vs. Detroit and is only the second time the A's have scored in double-digits...increased their season-high home winning streak to six games...have not lost to Texas in 2016 (4-0) and are 44-36 against the Rangers over the last five years...improved to 9-5 (.643) against opposing left-handed starters...are 1-0 on this nine-game homestand against Texas (1-0), Los Angeles-AL (three games), and Milwaukee (two games).
- Sean Manaea left the game in the fifth inning with a left pronator muscle strain...is 1-1 with a 4.15 ERA (8 er in 17.1 ip) in his last three starts, all in June...is 2-2 with a 4.54 ERA (20 er in 39.2 ip) in seven starts at home...is 1-0 with a 2.45 ERA (3 er in 11.0 ip) in two career starts against Texas.
- Daniel Coulombe recorded his first Major League win while Zach Neal recorded his first Major League Save.
- Khris Davis (2-for-4, 3 r, hr, 5 rbi, bb, so) snapped a 10-game homerless streak with a three-run homer in the third inning...it was his longest such streak since a season-opening 13-game streak...is 7-for-13 (.538) with eight runs, five home runs and 13 RBI in four games against the Rangers...is 8-for-17 (.471) in five career games against Texas...has 35 home runs and 83 RBI over his last 111 games dating back to Aug. 6, 2015...had five RBI, his most since May 17 vs. Texas (6).
- **Josh Phegley** (2-for-5, r, hr, 3 rbi, gidp) is 7-for-18 (.389) in five starts at catcher since being reinstated from the disabled list May 27...is a .333 (13-for-39) career hitter against Texas with four home runs and 11 RBI in 14 games...the home runs are his most against any team.
- Marcus Semien (3-for-5, r, rbi, 2 so) and Jake Smolinski (3-for-4, 2 rbi, bb) each recorded their first three-hit game of the season.
- Danny Valencia (2-for-5, 3 r, rbi) has hit safely in six straight games (8-for-25, .320)...is batting .444 (20-for-45) with 14 runs, eight RBI and six multiple hit games over his last 12 games...is now hitting .358 (39-for-109) with 23 RBI in 29 games since he was reinstated from the disabled list May 6...is a .309 (106-for-343) hitter with 62 RBI in 90 games with the A's since being claimed off waivers Aug. 3, 2015.

TEXAS NOTES

- The **Texas Rangers** are 3-3 over their last six games...fell to 39-25 on the year...however, that matches the second-best record after 64 games in Texas history (also: 1998)...fell to 15-15 (.500) on the road...are 0-4 against Oakland this season, and are 9-14 against the A's dating back to the start of last year... allowed their first two home runs in the month of June...are 2-2 on this 10-game road trip to Seattle (2-1), Oakland (0-1), and St. Louis (three games).
- Cesar Ramos is 1-2 with a 4.95 ERA (11 er in 20.0 ip) in four starts this season...made his first career start against Oakland...is 0-1 with a 7.45 ERA (8 er in 9.2 ip) in eight career appearances against the A's.
- Elvis Andrus (2-for-4, 2b, rbi) is 6-for-9 (.667) after an 0-for-13 hitless streak...recorded his 16th multi-hit game of the year.
- Shin-soo Choo (1-for-4, r, hr, rbi, bb, gidp) was activated off the disabled list prior to the game.
- Ryan Rua (2-for-4, 2 r, hr, 2 rbi, so) is 18-for-51 (.353) with three home runs and nine RBI over his last 17 games...recorded his 11th multi-hit game this year.
