LET THE RECORDS PLAY: The Rangers beat the Mariners yesterday, 6-4, and team is 2-1 to begin this 10-game, 10-day trip to Seattle (2-1), Oakland (4 G), and St. Louis (3 G)...Tex as is 3-2 in last 5 G after having lost just 2 times in previous 13 G...have won 8 of 10, 12 of 15, 14 of 18, 17 of 22, and 24 of 34...have gone 29-14 since 4/26, tied w/ Cubs (29-13) for most wins in MLB in that span... Texas has the best record in the A.L. at 39-24 (.619), T2nd-best record in the majors (also WAS) to CHC (.705, 43-18)...current record matches best 63-game start in club history (see chart)... club is currently season-high 15 games above .500 for the 1st time, matching high-water mark at any point in any of the last 3 seasons (also twice in Sept. 2015)...last time more than 15-over was at end of 2013 season (19-over at 91-72)... this is just 4th time team has reached 15-over by June 12 in a season (also 1996, 1998, 2013)...team was 33-30 after 63 G in 2015...since 5/1/15, Rangers have best record and most wins in A.L. STANDINGS: The Rangers have a season-high 5.0-game lead in the A.L. West, team's largest lead in the A.L. West since 5/25/13 (+5.5 GA)...2nd-place Seattle is idle today... have gained ground in the division on 8 of last 11 days... current 5.0-G lead is largest in A.L. and T2nd-best in MLB (Giants also +5.0 GA in N.L. West) to only the Cubs (+9.0 GA in N.L. ON THE ROAD: This 10-game road trip for Texas matches longest of the year (also 10 G, 6/27-7/6 and 9/5-14)...Texas is 15-14 (.517) away from home, 5th-highest among A.L. clubs in road winning percentage...club has won 7 of 9 and 10 of 15 after a 5-9 start to season in away tilts...of team's 14 road defeats in '16, 9 have been one or 2-run losses, and club has lost MLB-high 7 times on walkoffs.

VS. OAKLAND: Rangers went 0-3 in only other series vs. A's in '16 from 5/16-18...this series will be last between the clubs before the All-Star break...A's visit Arlington for a series in each of season's final 3 months...Texas was 9-10 vs. A's in 2015, as season series has been decided by a 10-9 margin in each of the last 3 years...Rangers have won 4 of 7 and 5 of 9...have gone 13-9 at Coliseum since start of '14, 18-13 since start of '13...Texas leads all-time series, 343-335, and A's have 176-164 edge here at the Coliseum.

VS. A.L. WEST: Rangers are 23-12 (.657) vs. the West in '16, winning 10 of 12 and 13 of last 16 since the 3 losses here in Oakland in May...it is the 3rd-best intradivision record in ML to only CHC (18-6, .750 vs. N.L. Central) and CLE (18-7, .720 vs. A.L. Central).

HAMELS REACHES 2000 K'S: Cole Hamels whiffed Leonys Martin in the 3rd inning yesterday for his 2000th career strike-out...Hamels reached 2000 K's in his 320th career game, joining a short list of pitcher since 1913 to reach the milestone in so few games...the other 7 to do it so quickly in that span: Sam McDowell (game no. 309 in 1971), Tom Seaver (305 in '75), Nolan Ryan (287 in '76), Roger Clemens (294 in '93), Randy Johnson (262 in '97), Pedro Martinez (300 in '02), Felix Hernandez (310 in '15).

STARTERS ROLLING: After Hamels allowed one run over 7.0 innings in yesterday's win, Texas starters now have a 3.01 ERA (58 ER/173.1 IP) over the last 28 games beginning 5/13 to drop season figure from 3.69 to 3.38, lowest in the A.L. and 4th-lowest in MLB to the Cubs (2.30), Mets (3.22) and Nationals (3.29)...the staff has quality starts in 7 of 9 and 11 of 14, and team's A.L.-high 43 QS are tied for ML lead (also Cubs), also the most QS in club history thru the 1st 63 games of a season...starters are 14-4 in the team's last 23 games, and staff's .711 win pct. (27-11) is 2nd to only Cubs (.735, 36-13).

DON'T TRY IT: Yesterday's game ended when Nomar Mazara threw out Robinson Cano at 2nd base trying to stretch a single to double...research indicates it was the 1st Texas win to end on a play involving a hit since 6/20/13 vs. OAK...in that strange ending, Josh Donaldson attempted to score from 1st base when a Seth Smith single bounced off the chest of CF Craig Gentry, which began the game-ending sequence of 8-6-2 to retire Donaldson at the plate, with A.J. Pierzynski applying the tag.

 \bullet Mazara's 4 OF assists are tied with Ian Desmond for the team lead.

SPOT START: Yu Darvish (right neck/shoulder stiffness) was scratched from tonight's start on Saturday and is back in Texas today for an examination with Rangers Team Physician Dr. Keith Meister...Cesar Ramos is slated to make his 4th start of the year tonight in Darvish's spot...Ramos in 3 starts in '16: 1-1, 2.76 (5 ER/16.1 IP)...has pitched twice out of the bullpen since last start on 5/21 at HOU.

SO FAR, SO GOOD: Texas is in the middle of a span of playing games for 20 straight days (including makeup game next Mon. vs. BAL), having gone 8-2 to begin that stretch.

IAN DESMOND had 2 hits and 2 RBI yesterday, and he leads all Rangers in hits (76), runs (44), total bases (121), RBI (42), and stolen bases (12)...he is one of 8 ML players with at least 26 XBH, 42 RBI, and 44 R...the others: COL's Nolan Arenado, BOS' Mookie Betts and Xander Bogaerts, CHC's Kris Bryant, SEA's Robinson Cano, STL's Matt Carpenter, and DET's Ian Kinsler...Desmond is the only player on that list with as many as 12 stolen bases.

ELVIS DELIVERS: Elvis Andrus had 2 hits with RISP yesterday, each producing a run...Elias Sports Bureau notes it is only the 2nd time in the last 3 seasons beg. 2014 for Andrus to have multiple hits w/ RISP in a game (also 6/23/15 vs. OAK)...Andrus is 7th on the club with 23 RBI, and his current 9.09 AB/RBI ratio would be a career best (9.25 in 2013).

NOTHING BIG: Despite allowing 3 runs yesterday, the Texas bullpen has still not allowed a home run in the month of June (11 G/31.1 IP), working 33.1 homerless innings since Lonnie Chisenhall's HR off Tony Barnette on 5/31 at CLE... Detroit relievers are only other bullpen without a HR allowed in June...the 11 straight without a HR allowed is longest since 12 in a row, 9/11 - 9/23/14.

GOING DEEP: Texas hit 7 HR in the 3-G series at Safeco over the weekend, most HR ever by the club in a 3-game series at Safeco, and 2nd-most HR in any 3-G set in '16 (8 HR from 5/6-8 at DET)...Rangers' 25 HR since 5/28 are 6th-most in MLB.

TONIGHT: Pronounced SEE-zer RAH-mohs...the 31-year-old left-hander is scheduled to make his 4th start and 8th appearance of the season tonight in the opener of a 4-game series against the Athletics here in Oakland...was named tonight's starter following yesterday afternoon's game in Seattle and will be starting in place of Yu Darvish, who was scratched on Saturday due to neck and shoulder tightness...will be his 14th career start...last pitched out of the bullpen in Rangers' 10-4 win vs. SEA on 6/4 in Arlington...will be pitching on extended 8 days rest for the 2nd time (also 5/30 at CLE)...last start was on 5/21 at HOU for his 1st win of the year, a Rangers' 2-1 win...is 1-1, 2.76 (5 ER/16.1 IP) over 3 starts this year...contract purchased on 4/25 for spot start that night vs. NYY...was moved to the bullpen after that start and had 2 relief outings (4 R-ER/6.1 IP) before making start on 5/15 vs. TOR...Rangers are 2-1 in his starts, and 4-3 in all appearances, including wins in each of his last 4...a non-roster invitee to Rangers camp this spring, Ramos went 0-1 with a 3.18 ERA (4 ER/11.1 IP) in 3 games/starts for Round Rock (AAA) to begin the season...was stretched out in spring training as a starter, but accepted an assignment to Triple-A at the end of the spring schedule...signed a minor league contract with the Rangers on 1/5/16 after setting a career high with 65 appearances in his lone season with the Angels in 2015... prior to his call to the Rangers this season, had spent time in his big league career with San Diego (2009-10), Tampa Bay (2011-14), and Los Angeles-AL (2015).

LAST APPEARANCE: Last made an appearance out of the Rangers' bullpen on 6/4 vs. SEA in a 10-4 Rangers' win in Arlington (2.0 IP, 2 H, 1 R-ER, 0 BB, 1 SO, 26 pitches/16 strikes)...took over for Martin Perez to start the 7th inning...allowed a lead-off double to Franklin Gutierrez, who scored 2 batters later on Nelson Cruz' RBI groundout, but the score was still 9-4...worked a scoreless 8th inning, despite allowing another double to Chris lannetta...struck out former Ranger Luis Sardinas to end the inning

<u>LAST START:</u> Earned his 1st win of the year on 5/21 at HOU in the Rangers' 2-1 win (6.0 IP, 2 H, 1 R-ER, 1 BB, 4 SO, HR, 80 pitches/51 strikes)...was his 2nd quality start of the season...allowed only 3 of 19 batters faced to reach base...did not allow a baserunner to reach scoring position...his only blemish was a leadoff HR in the 3rd to Marwin Gonzalez...had retired the game's 1st 6 batters until Gonzalez' HR...faced the minimum 12 batters over his last 4 frames...allowed a lead-off single to George Springer in the 4th, but was picked off by Ramos (1-3-6)...issued a lead-off walk to Colby Rasmus in the 5th, but got Gonzalez to ground into a double play to end the inning.
