OAKLAND ATHLETICS (27-36) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (39-25)

TUESDAY, JUNE 14, 2016 — OAKLAND ALAMEDA COLISEUM — 7:05 P.M. PDT LHP ERIC SURKAMP (0-3, 6.41) VS. LHP MARTIN PEREZ (5-4, 3.22) CSNCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME) — EN ESPAÑOL (KIQI 1010 AM)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won two straight after a season-high seven-game losing streak...the losing streak matched the A's longest over the last four years...are now 3-7 (.300) in the month of June, which is the second worst record in the American League (Los Angeles, 2-9)...are 7-7 over the last 14 games...are 14-24 since the start of May after going 13-12 in April... are 27-36 (.419) overall, which is the third worst record in the AL...are in fourth place in the AL West after 10 consecutive days alone in fifth...trail first place Texas by 11½ games, which is one game short of the season-high of 12½ (June 11 and 12)...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 15 days in fourth, nine days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth...have five losing streaks of four or more games this year and three winning streaks of four or more games.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's extended their home winning streak to six games last night, which is their longest home winning streak over the last two years...are 1-0 on this nine-game homestand against Texas (1-0), Los Angeles-AL (three games) and Milwaukee (two games)...it is the first of four homestands of nine or more games...went 5-1 on the last homestand against Detroit (2-1) and Minnesota (3-0) and are 14-16 (.467) at home for the season...snapped a season-high nine-game road losing streak Sunday, which matched the seventh longest road losing streak in Oakland history...it was the longest since an 11-game streak from May 21-June 9, 2005...went 1-7 on the last road trip to Houston (0-3), Milwaukee (0-2) and Cincinnati (1-2) and are 13-20 (.394) on the road, which is the fourth worst road record in the American League...have a 3.70 ERA (111 er in 270.0 ip) at home compared to 5.51 (174 er in 284.0 ip) on the road...have the second highest road ERA in the majors (Cincinnati, 6.50)...are batting .248 (244-for-984) at home compared to .258 (301-for-1167) on the road.

LEFT AND RIGHT: Today is game three in a four-game stretch where the A's are scheduled to face a left-handed starting pitcher in each game... have won each of the first two games during the stretch and are now 9-5 (.643) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher, which is the best record in the American League...however, the A's 14 games against lefties are third fewest in the AL...have an 18-31 (.367) record against righties.

OFFENSE: The A's scored a season-high 14 runs on a season-high tying 17 hits last night...scored just 21 runs in eight games on the last road trip...have 253 runs for the season, which is fourth fewest in the American League...have 32 hits in the last two games, which has boosted their overall batting average six points to a season-high .253...are hitting .269 (325-for-1209) and are averaging 4.5 runs per game (157 runs) over the last 35 games dating back to May 4 after batting .234 and averaging 3.4 runs per game over the first 28 contests...have the lowest on-base percentage in the AL (.304) and the second fewest walks (150)...however, are tied for the second most intentional walks (13)...are tied for the second fewest doubles (93)...have been shutout just twice, which is tied with Boston and Chicago for the fewest in the AL

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 3.83 ERA (52 er in 122.1 ip) over the last 14 games and are 7-7 over that span...however, have a 5.34 ERA (165 er in 278.0 ip) over the last 32 games dating back to May 8 after posting a 3.91 ERA over the first 31 contests...have a 4.63 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...also have the second highest opponents on-base percentage (.333) and the third highest opponents batting average (.265) and slugging percentage (.430)...have allowed 74 home runs...40 of those have come with runners on base, which is second most in the majors (Cincinnati, 48).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have the fewest innings pitched in the majors (334.1), are tied for the lead in losses (30) and have the third highest ERA (5.20)...Sean Manaea tossed 4.1 innings last night after Kendall Graveman tossed 4.0 innings Sunday...it marks the seventh time this year A's starting pitchers have tossed fewer than five innings in at least two straight games...have a Major League leading 21 starts of fewer than five innings...have gone 114 consecutive games without a complete game, which is the second longest streak in Athletics history (151, July 9, 2008-July 5, 2009)...have used eight different starting pitchers over the last 16 games and nine for the season, which matches Los Angeles and Minnesota for the most in the American League...are 11-25 with a 6.14 ERA (162 er in 237.1 ip) over the last 46 games dating back to April 23... that includes 6-1 with a 1.80 ERA (9 er in 45.0 ip) in seven starts by Rich

Hill and 5-24 with a 7.16 ERA (153 er in 192.1 ip) in 39 starts by everyone

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's committed a season-high tying three errors last night...have not committed an error in 15 of the last 18 games but have seven errors total over that span...have 43 errors for the season, which is the most in the American League and fourth most in the majors...rank second in the AL in double plays (67).

ONE-RUN GAMES CLOSE CALLS: Each of the A's last two losses, three of the last four and four of the last six have been by one run...have now dropped nine of their last 11 one-run decisions after winning five of the first eight...are 7-12 (.368) in one-run games for the season, which is the second worst record in the American League (Tampa Bay, 5-9)...are tied for second in most losses...are 7-4 (.636) in games decided in the last at bat, which is tied for the third best record in the AL...are 2-1 in extra inning games...all three extra inning games have come on the road and the A's now have a streak of 49 consecutive home games since their last extra inning game in the Coliseum (Aug. 18, 2015 vs. Los Angeles-NL)...that is the longest such streak by an A's team since a 55-game streak from Sept. 25, 1983-July 20, 1984).

THIS AND THAT: Yesterday's game began a stretch of 20 consecutive games in California...after this nine-game homestand, the A's travel to Los Angeles-AL (four games) and San Francisco (two games) before returning home for a five-game homestand...A's pinch hitters rank second in the American League in hits (12) and plate appearances (55) and tied for third in RBI (6) and extra base hits (3)...the A's have been successful in 7-of-10 (70.0%) replay challenges, which is the best percentage in the majors... the 10 challenges are tied with New York (AL) and Minnesota for the fewest in the majors...are averaging 2 hours and 56 minutes per game, which is tied with Toronto for the quickest in the majors.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's placed Sean Manaea on the disabled list today and have now used the DL 16 times this year...currently have 11 players on the DL (Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doubront, Fuld, Hendriks, Hill, Manaea, Parker, Reddick, Sogard)...Alvarez and Hendriks are currently on rehab assignments...Bassitt, Cahna, Doubront, Fuld, Parker and Sogard are on the 60-day DL...the 16 players have combined to miss 568 games (35.5 games per stint)...have had at least 10 players on the DL every day since May 10 and at least six players on the DL all year...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's lead the season series 4-0...won the first game of this series last night after sweeping a three-game series in Oakland May 16-18...have won three of the previous four season series and are 44-36 against Texas over the last five years...are 336-343 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 177-164 in Oakland and 159-179 in Texas...have an all-time record of 433-425 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis is 7-for-13 (.538) with eight runs scored, five home runs, 13 RBI and three walks in four games against Texas... Sean Doolittle has a 0.68 ERA (1 er in 13.1 ip) over his last 15 games... Ryan Dull has stranded all 26 of his inherited runners and opponents are 1-for-37 (.027) with runners in scoring position... Danny Valencia is hitting .358 (39-for-109) with 10 home runs and 23 RBI in 29 games since he was reinstated from the disabled list May 6...the batting average is second best in the AL over that span and the home runs are tied for fifth...has a .338 batting average overall, which ranks fourth in the AL among players with 150 or more plate appearances.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1964** Jim Gentile drives in four runs, including the game winning home run in the top of the 10^{th} inning in a 6-5 win at Cleveland...in **1969** the A's defeat the Boston Red Sox 21-7, setting what was then a club record for most runs in a game...Oakland scores five times in the fifth, seventh and eighth innings...Reggie Jackson is 5 for 6 with two doubles, two homers and a club record 10 RBI...in **1975** Campy Campaneris steals his 500th career base in the A's 3-2 loss at Detroit.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Eric Surkamp (0-3, 6.41 ERA)

FOR OPENERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville today for his fourth stint with the A's this year...will be making his seventh start, which is a new career high, surpassing his six with San Francisco in 2011...was called up the first time April 8 and went 0-2 with a 5.59 ERA in four starts before he was optioned April 25...made just one start in each of his next two stints (May 11-16 and May 31-June 1) and is 0-3 with a 6.41 ERA overall...the ERA is sixth highest in the American League among pitchers with 25 or more innings pitched...the three-game losing streak matches his career high (Sept. 24, 2011-July 23, 2013).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has issued 13 of his 15 walks to right-handed hitters...has allowed a .375 (21-for-56) batting average with the bases empty compared to .271 (16-for-59) with runners on base...has yielded a .239 (11-for-46) average the first time through the lineup, .377 (26-for-69) after that...the opponents clean-up hitter is 0-for-10 with six walks...opponents are batting .439 (18-for-41) with two outs.

THIS AND THAT: Has walked 15 batters while striking out just 14 in 26.2 innings (5.06 walks per nine innings)...now has 46 career walks against 51 strikeouts in 83.2 innings (4.95 walks per nine innings)...has tossed fewer than five innings in five of his five starts this year and nine of 13 starts in his career...this will be his 14th career start...his only career win as a starter came on Sept. 12, 2011 against San Diego while pitching for San Francisco

FIRST START: He had a no decision in the A's 3-2 win at Seattle April 8... it was his first start since July 23, 2013 against Cincinnati...blanked the Mariners on two hits and a walk over the first four innings and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a lead-off home run to Lee in the fifth...hit the next batter (Martin) and was relieved by Rodriguez, who allowed him to score, tying the game at 2-2.

SECOND START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-1 loss to Los Angeles (AL) in Oakland April 13...allowed at least two base runners in every inning except the fourth when he retired the side in order...yielded two runs on RBI singles by Calhoun in the third and fifth innings...left trailing 2-0.

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 3-2, 11-inning win at New York (AL) on April 19...tossed a career-high 99 pitches...allowed a RBI single to Rodriguez in the bottom of the first but the A's tied the game with a run in the second...then yielded a Beltran sacrifice fly in the fifth inning but the A's came back to tie the game in the sixth...was relieved by Rzepczynski with two outs in the sixth inning and the scored tied 2-2.

FOURTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-3 loss at Toronto April 24...allowed a career-high tying nine hits...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed four runs in the third inning on a Carrera home run and three straight RBI singles by Smoak, Pillar and Barney...also surrendered a tworun home run to Bautista in the fourth and left after 4.2 innings with the A's trailing 6-1.

FIFTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 13-3 loss at Boston on May 11...the A's scored a run in the second inning but he allowed a three-run home run to Bradley in the bottom of the second...Oakland tied the game with a two-run third inning but he allowed a RBI double to Young in the bottom of the third...was relieved by Dull with two outs in the third and runners on second and third, but Dull got the final out of the inning.

LAST MAJOR LEAGUE START: He had a no decision in the A's 7-4 win over Minnesota on May 31 in Oakland...allowed a RBI double to Park in the second but the A's tied the game in the bottom of the second...allowed another run to score on a Sano fielders choice in the third but the A's scored twice in the bottom of the third...had a 3-2 lead when he allowed a two-out RBI double to Grossman in the fifth...left after 4.2 innings with the scored tied 2-2.

WITH NASHVILLE: Is 3-1 with a 3.07 ERA and .206 opponents batting average in five starts with Triple-A Nashville...has 34 strikeouts in 29.1 innings (10.43 per nine innings)...has held left-handed hitters to a .125 (3-for-24) batting average while right-handers are hitting .229 (19-for-83)... has surrendered two of his three home runs to lefties...opponents are batting .192 (5-for-26) with runners in scoring position, including .083 (1-for-12) with RISP and two outs.

LAST MINOR LEAGUE START: He made his only start with Nashville following his June 2 option on June 6 at Omaha...was the winning pitcher in the Sounds 3-1 win...tossed 6.1 innings and did not allow a run...allowed just three base runners to advance as far as second base...had retired 11 straight before walked Villegas with one out in the seventh...was relieved by Kurcz following the walk.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 2-1 with a 3.60 ERA in six games, including two starts...tied for seventh in the Cactus League in wins...led the A's with 19 strikeouts...surrendered just one home run in 20.0 innings... opponents hit .239 (17-for-81)...had a 6.75 ERA in his two starts but did not allow a run in three of his four relief appearances (5 er in 16.0 ip, 2.81 ERA)...including his last outing April 2 against San Francisco...relieved an injured Doubront to start the second inning and tossed 7.0 scoreless innings while allowing just two hits...picked up the win in the A's 4-1 victory in the final game of the spring...was optioned to Nashville following the game but returned to Oakland April 8 when Doubront went on the DL.

2015 RECAP: Began the season at Triple-A Charlotte in the Chicago White Sox organization and finished it with Triple-A Oklahoma City in the Los Angeles Dodgers farm system...in between, he made one appearance for the Dodgers in July...was selected July 6, pitched that day against Philadelphia (3.1 ip, 4 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 4 so), and was designated for assignment the next day.

MINORS: Pitched mostly in relief at Charlotte, going 3-0 with a save and 2.81 ERA in 10 relief appearances and one start...then made 15 starts and one relief appearance with Oklahoma City where he was 9-3 with a 3.57 ERA...combined at Triple-A to post a 12-3 record and a 3.39 ERA in 27 games, including 16 starts...the 12 wins were his most as a minor leaguer, as were his 11 home runs allowed...tied for third among all Triple-A pitchers in wins

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .264 opponents batting average, including .244 (73-for-299) against right-handed hitters compared to .305 (43-for-141) against left-handers...10 of the 11 home runs he allowed were solo shots...yielded a .257 batting average with runners in scoring position, but that dropped to .136 with RISP and two outs.

SPLITS: Was 7-2 with a 3.77 ERA in 18 games before the Triple-A All-Star Break, 5-1 with a 2.98 ERA in nine starts after the break...was 8-3 with a 3.40 ERA in his 16 starts compared to 4-0 with a 3.38 ERA in 11 relief appearances...stranded both of his inherited runners.

THIS AND THAT: Went 3-for-16 (.188) with a double, three RBI, three walks and seven strikeouts as a hitter...tossed at least one inning in each of his 11 relief appearances, including two or more eight times...walked two batters or fewer in 14 of his 16 starts.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Sonny Gray (3-6, 5.34 ERA): Was reinstated from the 15-day disabled list June 5 and is 0-1 with a 2.13 ERA in two starts since his return... was placed on the DL May 22 retroactive to May 21 with a strained right trapezius...was 3-5 with a 6.19 ERA in nine starts before going on the DL... is 0-5 with a 7.34 ERA and .297 opponents batting average over his last seven starts...the five-game losing streak is a career high and matches the A's season high...leads the majors with 11 wild pitches, which matches the most in Athletics history before the All-Star Break...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 2-1 A's loss at Cincinnati last Friday (7.2 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 4 so)...is 7-3 with a 1.92 ERA (70.1 ip, 54 h, 16 r, 15 er, 23 bb, 61 so, 3 hr) in 10 career starts against Texas...the ERA is third lowest by any pitcher against the Texas Rangers with a minimum of 60 innings pitched... went 3-1 with a 0.87 ERA in four starts last year.
