# OAKLAND ATHLETICS (27-37) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (40-25)

WEDNESDAY, JUNE 15, 2016 — OAKLAND ALAMEDA COLISEUM — 7:05 P.M. PDT RHP SONNY GRAY (3-6, 5.34) VS. LHP DEREK HOLLAND (5-5, 4.87) CSNCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME) — EN ESPAÑOL (KIQI 1010 AM)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost eight of their last 10 games and are now 3-8 (.273) in June, which is the second worst record in the majors (Atlanta, 3-10)...are 14-25 (.359) since the start of May after going 13-12 (.520) in April...are 27-37 (.422) overall, which is the second worst record in the American League and fifth worst in the majors...are 10 games under .500, which is one short of the season low (25-36 on June 11)...are in fifth place in the AL West for the 11th time in the last 12 days and trail first place Texas by a season-high tying 12½ games for the third time in the last four days...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 15 days in fourth, nine days tied for fourth and 11 days in fifth...had their season-high seven-game losing streak snapped on Sunday in Cincinnati...have five losing streaks of four or more games and three winning streaks of four or more games.

**LEFT AND RIGHT:** Today is game four in a four-game stretch where the A's are scheduled to face a left-handed starting pitcher in each game... have won two of the first three games during the stretch and are now 9-6 (.600) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher, which is the second best record in the American League (Kansas City, 8-5)... however, the A's 15 games against lefties are tied for third fewest in the AL...have an 18-31 (.367) record against righties.

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .384 (43-for-112) with 26 runs scored over the last three games after hitting .219 with 15 runs scored during the seven-game losing streak...have boosted their overall batting average seven points over the last three games to a season high .254...are hitting .270 (336-for-1245) and are averaging 4.5 runs per game (163 runs) over the last 36 games dating back to May 4 after batting .234 and averaging 3.4 runs per game over the first 28 contests...have the lowest on-base percentage in the American League (.304) and the second fewest walks (150)...however, are tied for the second most intentional walks (13)...have the third fewest doubles (97) and the fourth fewest runs scored (259)... have been shutout just twice, which is tied with Boston and Chicago for the fewest in the AL.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have tossed fewer than five innings in three consecutive games, which is their second longest such streak of the season (4, May 8-11)...have 22 games this year with fewer than five innings, which is the most in the majors...have the fewest innings pitched in the majors (336.2), are tied for the most losses (31) and have the second highest ERA (5.58)...are 11-26 with a 6.35 ERA (169 er in 239.2 ip) over the last 47 games dating back to April 23...that includes 6-1 with a 1.80 ERA (9 er in 45.0 ip) in seven starts by Rich Hill and 5-25 with a 7.40 ERA (160 er in 194.2 ip) in 40 starts by everyone else...have gone 115 consecutive games without a complete game, which is the second longest streak in Athletics history (151, July 9, 2008-July 5, 2009)...have used eight different starting pitchers over the last 17 games and nine for the season, which matches Los Angeles and Minnesota for the most in the American League.

**PITCHING:** The A's have compiled a 5.49 ERA (175 er in 287.0 ip) over the last 33 games dating back to May 8 after posting a 3.91 ERA over the first 31 contests...have a 4.72 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...also have the second highest opponents batting average (.267) and on-base percentage (.334) and the third highest opponents slugging percentage (.433)...have allowed 77 home runs...41 of those have come with runners on base, which is second most in the majors (Cincinnati, 48).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed four errors in the last three games and seven in the last eight...now have 44 errors for the season, which is the most in the American League and tied for fourth most in the majors...rank second in the AL in double plays (68)...have the fewest outfield assists in the AL (7).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's had their season-high six-game home winning streak snapped last night...are 1-1 on this nine-game homestand against Texas (1-1), Los Angeles-AL (three games) and Milwaukee (two games)... it is the first of four homestands of nine or more games...went 5-1 on the last homestand against Detroit (2-1) and Minnesota (3-0) and are 14-17 (.452) at home for the season...that is the third worst home record in the

American League...went 1-7 on the last road trip to Houston (0-3), Milwaukee (0-2) and Cincinnati (1-2) and are 13-20 (.394) on the road, which is the third worst road record in the AL...have a 3.90 ERA (121 er in 279.0 ip) at home compared to 5.51 (174 er in 284.0 ip) on the road...have the second highest road ERA in the majors (Cincinnati, 6.30).

**ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS:** Four of the A's last seven losses have been by one run...have now dropped nine of their last 11 one-run decisions after winning five of the first eight...are 7-12 (.368) in one-run games for the season, which is the third worst record in the American League...are tied for second in most losses...are 7-4 (.636) in games decided in the last at bat and 2-1 in extra inning games...all three extra inning games have come on the road and the A's now have a streak of 50 consecutive home games since their last extra inning game in the Coliseum (Aug. 18, 2015 vs. Los Angeles-NL)...that is the longest such streak by an A's team since a 55-game streak from Sept. 25, 1983-July 20, 1984.

THIS AND THAT: The A's were successful in a replay challenge last night and have now been successful in 8-of-11 (72.7%) challenges for the season, which is the best percentage in the majors...the 11 challenges are tied for third fewest in the majors...Monday's game began a stretch of 20 consecutive games in California...after this nine-game homestand, the A's travel to Los Angeles-AL (four games) and San Francisco (two games) before returning home for a five-game homestand...A's pinch hitters rank second in the American League in hits (12) and plate appearances (55) and tied for third in RBI (6) and extra base hits (3)...the A's are averaging 2 hours and 57 minutes per game, which is tied for second quickest in the majors (Toronto, 2:56).

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's placed Sean Manaea on the disabled list yesterday and have now used the DL 16 times this year...currently have 11 players on the DL (Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doubront, Fuld, Hendriks, Hill, Manaea, Parker, Reddick, Sogard)...Alvarez and Hendriks are currently on rehab assignments...Bassitt, Cahna, Doubront, Fuld, Parker and Sogard are on the 60-day DL...the 16 players have combined to miss 579 games (36.1 games per stint)...have had at least 10 players on the DL every day since May 10 and at least six players on the DL all year...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's lead the season series 4-1...have split the first two games of this series after sweeping a three-game series in Oakland May 16-18...have won three of the previous four season series and are 44-37 against Texas over the last five years...are 336-344 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 177-165 in Oakland and 159-179 in Texas...have an all-time record of 433-426 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis is 9-for-17 (.529) with nine runs scored, five home runs, 15 RBI and three walks in five games against Texas...Sean Doolittle has a 0.68 ERA (1 er in 13.1 ip) over his last 15 games...Ryan Dull has stranded all 26 of his inherited runners and opponents are 1-for-37 (.027) with runners in scoring position...Josh Smolinski has hit safely in each of his last five games (7-for-14, .500), which is one short of the longest hitting streak of his career (6, July 20-Sept. 19, 2014)...Danny Valencia is hitting .354 (40-for-113) with 10 home runs and 23 RBI in 30 games since he was reinstated from the disabled list May 6...the batting average ranks third in the American League over that span and the home runs are tied for sixth...has a .335 batting average overall, which ranks fifth in the AL among players with 150 or more plate appearances.

### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1925** the A's trail 15-3 entering the bottom of the seventh inning before scoring once in the seventh and 13 times in the eighth inning to defeat Cleveland 17-15...the 12 run deficit overcome to win sets a Major League record...in **1983** Davey Lopes drives in seven runs and is a single short of the cycle in the A's 10-1 win at Toronto...in **2002** the A's go errorless for the 12<sup>th</sup> consecutive game, breaking the Oakland record of 11.

# **TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (3-6, 5.34 ERA)**

FOR STARTERS: Was reinstated from the 15-day disabled list June 5 and is 0-1 with a 2.13 ERA (3 er in 12.2 ip) and .213 (10-for-47) opponents batting average in two starts since his return...was placed on the DL May 22 retroactive to May 21 with a strained right trapezius...was 3-5 with a 6.19 ERA and .285 opponents batting average in nine starts before going on the DL.

**FIVE-GAME LOSING STREAK:** Is 0-5 with a 7.34 ERA (28 er in 34.1 ip) and .297 (43-for-145) opponents batting average over his last seven starts...the five-game losing streak

is a career high (previous: 4, Aug. 1-16, 2014), matches the A's season high and is tied for the third longest active losing streak in the American League...allowed at least four runs in each of his first five starts during the streak marking the first time in his career he has allowed four or more runs in more than two consecutive starts...went 3-1 with a 2.73 ERA and .232 opponents batting average over his first four starts.

WILD PITCHES: Leads the majors with 11 wild pitches, which matches the most in Athletics history before the All-Star Break (Cahill, 2011; Darling, 1992)...had three wild pitches May 20 against New York and is the first A's pitcher with three wild pitches in a game since Doug John on Sept. 6, 1995 at Boston...has 41 career wild pitches, which is seventh most in Oakland history (Mike Norris is 6th with 53).

**RUN SUPPORT:** Has received no run support twice this year and two runs or fewer in seven of his 11 starts...is 2-1 in four starts with three runs of support or more compared to 1-5 in seven starts with two runs or fewer... his season run support average is 3.71 (25 rs in 60.2 ip)...last year, he was 12-1 in 20 starts with three runs of support or more and is now 31-3 in 46 such starts in his career.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has allowed a .191 (22-for-115) opponents batting average over the first three innings of a game compared to .344 (43-for-125) from the fourth inning on...has allowed seven of his nine home runs to right-handed hitters and has a .542 opponents slugging percentage against righties compared to .400 against lefties...has yielded a .339 (19-for-56) batting average with runners in scoring position...has yielded a .469 (23-for-49) combined batting average to the opponents eight and nine hitters...opponents are 17-for-37 (.459) with three doubles and four home runs (.865 slugging percentage) when putting the first pitch in play.

**THE FOURTH INNING:** Has allowed 14 of his 41 runs this year in the fourth inning...has a 12.00 ERA (12 er in 9.0 ip) and .390 (16-for-41) opponents batting average in the fourth inning compared to a 4.18 ERA (24 er in 51.2 ip) and .246 (49-for-199) opponents average in all other innings.

**NIGHT AND DAY:** Is 1-0 with a 2.70 ERA (5 er in 16.2 ip) in three starts during the day compared to 2-6 with a 6.34 ERA (31 er in 44.0 ip) in eight starts at night...last year, he went 5-2 with a 1.78 ERA in nine starts during the day...it was the sixth lowest day ERA in Oakland history among pitchers with 50 or more day innings.

**MONTH BY MONTH:** Is 0-1 with a 2.13 ERA (3 er in 12.2 ip) in two starts in June...went 0-3 with a 9.61 ERA in four starts in May...allowed 25 runs, which were his most ever in a month (21, Aug. 2014)...surrendered five home runs, which match his most in a month (Aug. 2015)...went 3-2 with a 3.81 ERA in five starts in April...is now 10-3 with a 2.53 ERA in 15 career starts in April...the 10 wins are his most in any month.

START-BY-START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 2-1 victory over Chicago (AL) April 6 in Oakland, the A's third game of the season...was scratched from his scheduled Opening Day start April 4 due to food poisoning...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-1 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on April 11 in Oakland...tossed 6.1 innings to go over the 500 innings pitched mark in his career...was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-3 win over Kansas City April 16 in Oakland...allowed a RBI single to Cain in the top of the first and a RBI single to Fuentes in the fourth inning...won his second consecutive start in the A's 8-5 win at Toronto April 22...allowed a solo home run to Barney in the third inning, a Bautista sacrifice fly in the sixth and a Barney RBI single in the seventh...was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-4 loss at Detroit April 27...tossed 65 pitches in 2.0 innings...matched the shortest outing of his career and it was his shortest outing as a starter (pitched 2.0 innings in his first two career outings, both in relief)...lost his second consecutive start in the A's 8-2 loss to Seattle in Oakland on May 3...matched his career highs by allowing seven runs on 11 hits...lost his third straight start in the A's 14-7 loss at Boston May 9...allowed a career-high tying seven runs for the second consecutive start...had a no decision in the A's 7-6 win at Tampa Bay May 15...allowed a career-high tying three home

runs (also Aug. 22, 2015 vs. Tampa Bay)...was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-3 loss to New York (AL) on *May 20*...shut out the Yankees on three hits and three walks over the first three innings and had a 1-0 lead when he allowed five runs in the fourth inning...Torreyes had a two-run triple and scored on a wild pitch and Beltran had a two-run double...was relieved by Dull after 3.1 innings...had a no decision in the A's 5-2 loss at Houston *June 5*...the A's scored twice in the first inning and he blanked the Astros on three hits and a walk over the first four innings...then allowed a leadoff home run to Gomez in the fifth and was relieved by Coulombe to start the sixth with the A's leading 2-1...Coulombe allowed a run in the sixth for the blown save and Dull allowed a run in the seventh for the loss.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-1 loss at Cincinnati last Friday...it was his sixth loss of the season, which is one short of his season total of seven from last year...the A's scored a run in the third and he retired each of the first 10 batters before walking Votto with one out in the fourth...did not allow a hit until Barnhart singled with one out in the sixth...allowed two runs in the seventh inning when Duvall had a RBI double and later scored on a wild pitch.

GRAY vs. TEXAS: Is 7-3 with a 1.92 ERA (70.1 ip, 54 h, 16 r, 15 er, 23 bb, 61 so, 3 hr) in 10 career starts... has not allowed a run in four of those starts and his 1.92 ERA is third lowest by any pitcher against the Texas Rangers with a minimum of 60 innings pitched (Dick Woodson, 1.69; Pedro Martinez, 1.87)...his seven career wins are his most against any team...is 5-0 with a 0.96 ERA (4 er in 37.1 ip) in five starts in Texas and 2-3 with a 3.00 ERA (11 er in 33.0 ip) in

five starts in Oakland...his ERA at Globe Life Park is second lowest by any pitcher with a minimum of 15 innings (Sam Dyson, 0.92)...went 3-1 with a 0.87 ERA (26.2 ip, 20 h, 5 r, 5 er, 10 bb, 26 so, 2 hr) in four starts last year...combined with Evan Scribner on a one-hit shutout in the A's 8-0 win on Opening Day April 6...tossed eight innings and allowed the only hit on a Ryan Rua single to lead off the eighth inning...also picked up the win at Texas May 3 in a 7-1 decision...tossed 6.2 shutout innings and struck out 10 while walking a career-high seven batters...it was his second career game with 10 or more strikeouts (12, Sept. 23, 2014 vs. Los Angeles-AL)... tossed a career-high 119 pitches...then took the loss in a 201 decision in Oakland on June 9...allowed a RBI single to Fielder in the third inning to snap a 25.2-inning scoreless streak against Texas, which is the longest in Oakland history against the Rangers...then picked up the win in a 6-3 decision at Texas June 25...blanked the Rangers on three hits and a walk over the first three innings before allowing a Moreland leadoff home run and a Chirinos RBI single in the fourth and a Moreland RBI single in the fifth.

# TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Daniel Mengden (0-1, 3.18 ERA): Was selected from Triple-A Nashville last Saturday and made his Major League debut that day at Cincinnati after just 43 minor league appearances, including 34 starts, in three professional seasons...had not pitched above Single-A prior to this year... was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-1 loss (5.2 ip, 6 h, 2 r, 2 er, 4 bb, 5 so)... began the season at Double-A Midland and went 2-0 with a 0.78 ERA in four starts before he was promoted to Triple-A Nashville May 1...went 3-1 with a 1.39 ERA in seven starts with the Sounds and combined for a 5-1 record and a 1.19 ERA in 11 minor league starts overall...the ERA was sixth lowest in all of the minor leagues at the time of his promotion...was originally drafted by Houston in the fourth round of the 2014 First-Year Player Draft...was traded to Oakland with catcher Jacob Nottingham for left-handed pitcher Scott Kazmir on July 23, 2015.

10-6, 3.78 ERA (95 er in 226.1 ip) Saves/Opportunities: 17-for-23 (73.9%)

- The A's bullpen has a 2.37 ERA (16 er in 60.2 ip) and .181 (39-for-216) opponents batting average over its last 16 games dating back to May 27 after posting a 6.75 ERA and .291 batting average over its previous 20 contests.
