WINS AND LOSSES: The Rangers beat the A's last night, 10-6, and team is 3-2 on this 10-game, 10-day trip to Seattle (2-1), Oakland (1-1), and St. Louis (3 G)...Texas is 4-3 in last 7 G after having lost just 2 times in previous 13 G...have won 3 of 4, 9 of 12, 13 of 17, 15 of 20, and 25 of 36...have gone 30-15 since 4/26, tied w/ Cubs (30-14) and Giants (30-15) for most wins in MLB in that span...**Texas has the best record in the A.L. at 40-25 (.615)**, T2nd-best record in the majors (also WAS) to only CHC (.698, 44-19)...**current record matches best 65-game start in club history** (see chart)...club is **season-high 15 games** above .500 for the 2nd time (also after Sunday's win)...last time more than 15-over was at end of 2013 season (19-over at 91-72)...this year is just 4th time team has reached 15-over by June 12 in a season (also 1996, 1998, 2013)...team was 35-30 after 65 G in 2015...**since 5/1/15, Rangers have best record and most wins in A.L. (121-85, .585), 2nd-best in MLB** in both categories to only the Cubs (129-76, .587).

STANDINGS: The Rangers have a season-best 5.5-game lead over Seattle in the A.L. West, largest lead in the division for Texas since 5/25/13 (+5.5 GA)...last larger lead was +6.5 GA on 5/19/13...have gained ground in the division on 9 of last 13 days...current 5.5-G lead is largest in A.L., and 3rd-largest in MLB to the Cubs (+9.5 GA in N.L. Central) and Giants (+6.0 GA in N.L. West)...have been in sole possession of 1st place for 12 straight and 16 of the last 17 days...from 5/3-28, Texas spent 24 of 26 days in 2nd place...team has had at least a share of 1st place for 39 days this season, including sole possession of 1st for 30 different days.

SERIES STUFF: The Rangers are 6-2-1 in series this season after losing the series opener, but would need to win 3 straight to finish this series in Oakland to extend club's current run of 7 consecutive series wins (see chart)...team has won 10 of its last 11 series overall (only loss was 0-3 from 5/16-18 at OAK) and is 15-4-1 in 2016, tied w/ Cubs for most series wins in MLB...have won 3 straight and 4 of last 5 road series, going 5-3-1 in away series overall in 2016.

ON THE ROAD: This 10-game road trip for Texas matches longest of the year (also 10 G, 6/27-7/6 and 9/5-14)...Texas is 16-15 (.516) away from home, 4th-highest among A.L. clubs in road winning percentage...club has won 3 of 4, 8 of 11, and 11 of 17 after a 5-9 start to season in away tilts...of team's 15 road defeats in '16, 9 have been one or 2-run losses, and club has lost MLB-high 7 times on walkoffs.

VS. OAKLAND / WEST: Rangers are 1-4 vs. A's in '16, with last night's win snapping an 0-4 start, all here at the Coliseum...Texas has won 5 of 9 and 6 of 11 dating to 2015...this series will be last between the clubs before the All-Star break...A's visit Arlington for a series in each of season's final 3 months...Texas was 9-10 vs. A's in 2015, as season series has been decided by a 10-9 margin in each of the last 3 years...Rangers have gone 14-10 at Coliseum since start of '14, 19-14 since start of '13...Texas leads all-time series, 344-336, and A's have 177-165 edge here at the Coliseum.
 • Rangers are 24-13 (.649) vs. the West in '16, tied w/ WAS and SF for 3rd-best intradivision record in ML to only CHC (.750, 18-6) and CLE (.667, 18-9)...have won 11 of 14 and 14 of last 18 since the 3 losses here in Oakland in May.

POWER RANGERS: Texas has hit 13 HR in the 1st 5 games of this trip, most in any 5-G span since 6/27-7/1 last season (back-to-back 4-HR games in Baltimore 6/29-30)...also ties most in any 5-G span at any point in the last 4 seasons (2013-16) - the other instance from 5/10-14/13.
 • Have 23 HR in June, 2nd in MLB (BAL-32), and team ranks 4th in majors in HR since 5/7 with 54 (BAL-65, SEA/TB-57).
 • Texas has hit at least 3 HR in consecutive games at the Coliseum for the 1st time since 7/25-26/08, in what was Ron Washington's 2nd year as manager.

SOME OFFENSE: Texas scored 10 runs last night, most since 6/4 vs. SEA (10), and the 6th game of 10-or-more this season, 3rd in the A.L. and T5th in MLB (11-STL, 9-COL, 8-BOS, 7-SEA, 6-TEX/ARI/PIT).
 • Last night's 7 ER against Eric Surkamp matched the most off an opposing starter this season, the 5th instance and 2nd this month (also 7 R-ER off Nate Karns, 6/4 vs. SEA).

IN THE MARGINS: Texas won by 4 runs last night after leading 7-1 thru 3 innings...30 of club's 40 wins in '16 have come by 4-or-fewer runs, including 8 of team's 9 wins this month.

RUA CLEANS UP: Ryan Rua homered last night in his 1st start in the cleanup spot this season, HR in 2 straight for 2nd time in his career, the 4th Ranger to HR in a start batting 4th in '16 (also Beltre, Desmond, Odor)...in his last 19 games/16 starts since 5/22, Rua is batting .370/.462/.685/1.147 (20-54) with 4 HR, 5 2B, 12 RBI, and 15 runs...owns highest OBP, SLG, and OPS among Rangers in that period, most runs, 2nd-best avg. (Desmond-.379).
 • Rua leads all Rangers with 6 RBI and 7 runs on this trip, and his 3 HR rank 2nd to only Mitch Moreland (4).

MAGIC 8-BALL: Last night's long ball by Elvis Andrus gave the Rangers HR from the 8th spot in the batting order in 3 straight and 4 of the 1st 5 games on this road trip, as the 8-hole has accounted for 5 of the club's 13 HR on the trip (Moreland-4, Andrus-1)...the 12 HR from the 8-spot in the order this season are tied for most in majors (also SEA)...also tied for the team high from any spot in the order (also 12 HR from 5-hole), 7 of which have come in June.

PEREZ ON THE BOARD: Martin Perez earned the win last night to snap a 9-game road losing streak, 2nd-longest streak by a starter in club history, his 1st away victory since 4/23/14, also a win here at the Coliseum...Perez now has wins in 5 consecutive starts., longest such single-season streak (streaks excluding no-decisions) by a Texas pitcher since Perez's own career-best 6 consecutive winning starts from Aug. 5 - Sept. 3, 2013...Perez is now tied with Cole Hamels for the team lead in wins (6) after going 1-4 over his 1st 9 starts.

CATCHERS AT THE PLATE: With Robinson Chirinos' 2nd HR last night, Texas now has 4 catchers with multiple HR in 2016, no other team has more than 2...Texas backstops rank 5th in MLB in both SLG (.456) and OPS (.774), and the 36 RBI from catchers are 3rd-most of any position for the Rangers this season (42 by 3B, 37 by 1B).

THIS IS THE PLACE: Texas is just 3-7 when facing Sonny Gray in his career: 0-5 in Arlington, but 3-2 at the Coliseum...his only non-quality start in 10 outings vs. the Rangers also came in this park: 9/18/14, a 7-2 Texas win (5.0 IP, 5 R-4 ER).

SHORTS: Rangers are now 25-5 (.867) in games in which Andrus homers in his career...last night was 4th game of '16 for pitchers to issue no walks...team is 12-1 when allowing one-or-zero BB, 4-0 with no BB...Rangers radio announcer Matt Hicks has been selected into the El Paso Baseball Hall of Fame...Hicks was the voice of the El Paso Diablos from 1995-2004...happy birthday to Rangers Sr. Dir. Medical Operations, Jamie Reed.

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER

#45 Derek Holland, LHP (5-5, 4.87)

TONIGHT: The 29-year-old left-hander will be making his 13th start of the season tonight in game 3 of 4 vs. the A's here at the Coliseum...has a 3.52 ERA (12 ER/30.2 IP) over his last 5 starts to drop season ERA from 6.09 to 4.87...had a streak of 4 straight quality starts snapped in a 7-5 loss on Friday in Seattle...

LAST START: Had a 2-game win streak end in a 7-5 loss on Friday in Seattle (5.0 IP, 5 H, 5 R-ER, 2 BB, 3 SO, 3 HR, 95 pitches/57 strikes)...exited the game after 5 innings and trailing 5-1...all 5 runs came on a 3 home runs, including 2 by Dae-Ho Lee...

VS. OAKLAND: Is 5-5, 3.24 (34/94.1 IP) over 19 games/14 starts in his career vs. the Athletics...is winless in his last 5 games/4 starts dating back to 9/2/13, going 0-3, 5.16 (13 ER/22.2 IP) with 11 strikeouts and 10 walks in that stretch...

ON THE ROAD: Is 2-4, 5.97 (25 ER/37.2 IP) over 7 starts away from Arlington this season...opponents are batting .260/.329/.445 on the road compared to .257/.291/.410 at home...11 of 25 runs allowed on the road this season came in start on 5/5 at TOR, as he has permitted just 14 ER over 35.0 IP (3.60 ERA) in his other 6 road outings...

2016: Opponents are batting .386 (17-44) with RISP, including .542 (13-24) in last 6 outings...batters leading off an inning are hitting .180 (11-61) w/ 6 BB... opponent average by PA: .231 (24-104) in 1st PA; .311 (28-90) in 2nd PA; .228 (13-57) in 3rd PA...ERA by catcher: Nicholas (2.60 in 3 GS), Holaday (8.15 ERA in 4 GS), Chirinos (7.20 in 2 GS), and Wilson (2.75 in 3 GS)...

TOUGH ON LEFTIES: Over his last 34 G/33 GS in the regular season beginning 8/27/13, has allowed just 2 HR in 152 PA's against left-handed batters: a Robinson Cano 3-R HR on 9/20/15 vs. SEA in Arlington and a Kyle Seager HR in his last start on Friday at Safeco Field...left-handed batters are 10-for-49 (.204) with just one XBH (Seager HR).

SUPPORT SYSTEM: Since entering the league in 2009, Holland's 5.59 run support average is 2nd-highest among all qualifiers (5.86 for COL's Jorge De La Rosa)...Holland is 50-3, 3.25 ERA (160 ER/443.0 IP) in 68 career starts when he is supported by more than 3 runs...is 8-41, 5.37 (269 ER/451.0 IP) in the other 82 starts...

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks among the Rangers' all-time career pitching leaders in shutouts (T5th, 8), strikeouts (7th, 759), starts (9th, 150), and wins (T9th, 60)...with next win, would pass Darren Oliver for sole possession of 9th in club history...his 2 K's on 4/10 vs. CWS passed Kevin Brown (742) for 7th place in club history behind 6th-place Fergie Jenkins (895)...

TEAM PITCHING: A's are batting .378 (28-74) with 20 R-18 ER in 1st 2 games of this series to raise Texas season ERA from 3.87 to 4.03, 6th in A.L. and highest since 5/28 (4.07)...allowed season highs in hits (17) and runs/ER (14 R/12 ER) Mon. at OAK...also have 3.65 ERA (88 ER/217.0 IP) last 24 G beg. 5/20 to drop season figure from 4.26...staff's 81 HR are 4th-most in A.L...no BB last night for 4th time in '16, but 207 BB in '16 are T4th-most in A.L... have 2nd-fewest strikeouts in MLB w/ 442 (CIN-440)...have induced MLB-high 77 GDP's...lone SHO: 4/12 at SEA...staff's 3.83 away ERA is 3rd-lowest in A.L. (TOR-3.23; CLE-3.39).

STARTERS: Starters have 7.0+ IP in 3 of last 4 G...have 12 R/10 ER allowed in 10.2 IP in this series to raise season rotation ERA from 3.38 to **3.52, still lowest in the A.L.** and 6th in MLB, but highest since 5/27 (3.53)...rotation has a 3.33 ERA (68 ER/184.0 IP) in last 30 G since 5/13 to drop from 3.69... quality starts in just 3 of last 7, but **43 QS are tied for A.L. lead** (also TOR) and T2nd in MLB (CHC-44), also most in club history thru 1st 65 G of a season...rank among A.L. leaders in win pct. (1st, .700, 28-12), wins (T1st, 28), opp. avg. (2nd, .244)...starters are 15-5 last 25 G after going 1-4 in 1st 17 G in May...rotation has won 11 of last 13 decisions, and 8-G win streak from 5/28-6/9 was longest single-season run since opening 2012 at 10-0.

RELIEVERS: Bullpen has allowed 11 R-ER in 8.1 IP last 3 G to rise from 4.73 to A.L.-high 5.03, 2nd-highest in ML (CIN-6.30)...bullpen has allowed runs in 8 of 9, 9 of 11, and 12 of 15...still have a 4.22 ERA (33 ER/70.1 IP) in last 24 contests to drop season mark from 5.47...relievers have worked 3+ innings in 16 of last 20 G...bullpen's 13 losses are T2nd-most in A.L. (TOR-16, MIN-13)...Texas is 2nd in A.L. with 23 saves (also BAL-24) and tied for A.L. lead w/ 47 holds...2nd-most relief HR allowed (32) in A.L. (MIN-35)...have converted 23 of 30 save chances, including 10-for-last-10 since blown save on 5/17 at OAK.

43 TONY BARNETTE 3-2-0, 3.81 vs. LHB: 18-for-48 (.375) vs. RHB: 16-for-58 (.276)
 • Has allowed 6 R-ER in 4.2 IP last 5 G, opponents batting .478 (11-23) in that span, to rise from 2.11 to 3.81, highest since 4/23 (4.15)...has allowed runs in 7 of 26 outings in 2016, including 3 straight and 4 of last 5 appearances.
 • Is T5th in A.L. in relief wins (3), all in May to match Lewis in team high for wins in the month...has allowed 3 of 19 IR (15.8%) to score, entering w/ bases loaded 3x...has entered in 7th-or-later in 21 of 26 G...issued walk-off 1B to R. Martin in 9th 5/4 at TOR for 2nd loss...earned his 1st ML win on 5/2 at TOR.
 • Barnette was 32 years, 148 days old for his ML debut, 2nd-oldest in Rangers history (RHP Yoshinori Tateyama - 35.149 on 5/24/11 vs. CWS).

 • Perfect 8th last night...has 16 K's and just 3 BB in 1st 15 ML outings...opponents **1-for-15 w/ 7 K last 5 G**, just .218 (12-55) w/ 2 XBH (both 2B) for season...posted 2nd win Sat. at SEA, escaping bases-loaded jam in 10th...career-high 3 K's Thurs. vs. HOU, 3rd TEX reliever with a 3-SO inning in '16... has allowed 2 R last 10 G/8.2 IP after 5.2 scoreless IP over 1st 5 appearances.
 • Had K's in each of 1st 5 ML outings, 1st Ranger reliever to do that since Yoshinori Tateyama (1st 5 in 2011) and Neftali Feliz (1st 5 in 2009).
 • Earned win 5/15 vs. TOR in 2nd ML game, just 10th reliever in club history to win within 1st 2 games (last Seth Rosin in 2nd outing, 4/2/14 vs. PHI).
 • Pitched perfect 9th in ML debut 5/13 vs. TOR...former no. 1 overall pick (Padres in 2004) made ML debut at age 30.095.
 • Contract purchased from Frisco (AA) 5/13...0-2, 2.65 ERA (5 ER/17.0 IP) and 0.765 WHIP in 12 relief app. w/ Frisco, 5-for-5 in saves, 1st reg. season action since 2011...held opponents to .158 (9-57) avg. w/ 4 BB/18 SO, 2 HR...had 13.3 SO/9 (131 SO/88.2 IP) in minors career, whiffing 35.5% of BF (131-369).

 • Has pitched in both games this series (2 R-ER in 1.1 IP) after being recalled Monday for 3rd stint w/ TEX in '16 (also 4/13-5/6 and 5/8-6/2)...Monday was 1st outing w/ TEX since 6/1 at CLE (walkoff loss in 11th)...has allowed baserunners in 10 of 12 G, and has permitted 6 of 12 inherited runners to score.
