OAKLAND ATHLETICS (27-38) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (41-25)

THURSDAY, JUNE 16, 2016 — OAKLAND ALAMEDA COLISEUM — 12:35 P.M. PDT RHP DANIEL MENGDEN (0-1, 3.18) VS. RHP COLBY LEWIS (5-0, 3.00) MLB NETWORK — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME) — EN ESPAÑOL (KIQI 1010 AM)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost two straight and nine of the last 11 games and are a season-low tying 11 games under .500 (also 25-36 on June 11)... are 3-9 (.250) in June, which is the worst record in the majors...are 14-26 (.350) since the start of May after going 13-12 (.520) in April...are 27-38 (.415) overall, which is the second worst record in the American League and fifth worst in the majors...are in fifth place in the AL West for the 12th time in the last 13 days and trail first place Texas by a season-high 13¹/₂ games...since divisional play began in 1969, this is the fourth time in Oakland history the A's have trailed by at least 13¹/₂ games through 65 games or fewer (1979, 2001, 2015)...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 15 days in fourth, nine days tied for fourth and 12 days in fifth...had their season-high seven-game losing streak snapped last Sunday in Cincinnati...have five losing streaks of four or more games and three winning streaks of four or more games.

THE LONG BALL: The A's allowed four home runs last night after surrendering three in each of the previous two games...the streak of three consecutive games with three or more home runs allowed matches the longest such streak in Oakland history (sixth time, last: Aug. 14-16, 2015)... have allowed 10 home runs in the first three games of this series and the Oakland record for home runs allowed in a four-game series is 12 from Sept. 19-22, 1997 against Seattle...have allowed 81 home runs for the season...42 of those have come with runners on base, which is second most in the majors (Cincinnati, 48).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .342 (50-for-146) with 31 runs scored over the last four games after hitting .219 with 15 runs scored during the seven-game losing streak...are hitting .268 (343-for-1279) and are averaging 4.5 runs per game (168 runs) over the last 37 games dating back to May 4 after batting .234 and averaging 3.4 runs per game over the first 28 contests...have the lowest on-base percentage in the American League (.304) and the second fewest walks (153)...however, are tied for the third most intentional walks (13)...have the third fewest doubles (100) and the fourth fewest runs scored (264)...have been shutout just twice, which is tied with Boston and Chicago for the fewest in the AL.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have the fewest innings pitched in the majors (342.2), the second highest ERA (5.38) and are tied for the second most losses (31)...are 11-26 with a 6.37 ERA (174 er in 245.2 ip) over the last 48 games dating back to April 23...that includes 6-1 with a 1.80 ERA (9 er in 45.0 ip) in seven starts by Rich Hill and 5-25 with a 7.40 ERA (165 er in 200.2 ip) in 40 starts by everyone else...have 22 games this year with fewer than five innings, which is the most in the majors...have gone 116 consecutive games without a complete game, which is the second longest streak in Athletics history (151, July 9, 2008-July 5, 2009)...have used eight different starting pitchers over the last 19 games and nine for the season, which matches Los Angeles and Minnesota for the most in the American League.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.53 ERA (182 er in 296.0 ip) over the last 34 games dating back to May 8 after posting a 3.91 ERA over the first 31 contests...have a 4.75 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...also have the second highest opponents batting average (.267), on-base percentage (.334) and slugging percentage (.437)

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed four errors in the last four games and seven in the last nine...have 44 errors for the season, which is the most in the American League and sixth most in the majors...rank second in the AL in double plays (69)...have the fewest outfield assists in the AL (7).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-2 on this nine-game homestand against Texas (1-2), Los Angeles-AL (three games) and Milwaukee (two games)... it is the first of four homestands of nine or more games...went 5-1 on the last homestand against Detroit (2-1) and Minnesota (3-0) and are 14-18 (.438) at home for the season...that is the third worst home record in the American League...had their season-high six-game home winning streak snapped Tuesday night...went 1-7 on the last road trip to Houston (0-3), Milwaukee (0-2) and Cincinnati (1-2) and are 13-20 (.394) on the road, which is tied for the third worst road record in the AL...have a 4.00 ERA (128 er in 288.0 ip) at home compared to 5.51 (174 er in 284.0 ip) on the road...have the second highest road ERA in the majors (Cincinnati, 6.21).

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: Four of the A's last eight losses have been by one run...have dropped nine of their last 11 one-run decisions after winning five of the first eight...are 7-12 (.368) in one-run games for the season, which is the third worst record in the American League...are tied for second in most losses...are 7-4 (.636) in games decided in the last at bat and 2-1 in extra inning games...all three extra inning games have come on the road and the A's now have a streak of 51 consecutive home games since their last extra inning game in the Coliseum (Aug. 18, 2015 vs. Los Angeles-NL)...that is the longest such streak by an A's team since a 55-game streak from Sept. 25, 1983-July 20, 1984.

DESIGNATED HITTER: The A's designated hitter is batting .187 (42-for-225) with seven home runs and 27 RBI...have the second lowest batting average in the American League (Houston, .164), are tied for the third fewest home runs and have the fourth fewest RBI...the A's DH has entered the game defensively seven times this year, which is the most times that has happened since 1995 when they also did it seven times.

THIS AND THAT: The have been successful in 8-of-11 (72.7%) replay challenges, which is the best percentage in the majors...the 11 challenges are tied for third fewest in the majors...Monday's game began a stretch of 20 consecutive games in California...after this nine-game homestand, the A's travel to Los Angeles-AL (four games) and San Francisco (two games) before returning home for a five-game homestand...A's pinch hitters rank second in the American League in hits (12) and plate appearances (56) and tied for third in RBI (6) and extra base hits (3)...the A's are averaging 2 hours and 57 minutes per game, which is tied for third quickest in the majors...are 9-7 (.563) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 18-31 (.367) against righties.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 16 times this year and currently have 11 players on the DL (Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doubront, Fuld, Hendriks, Hill, Manaea, Parker, Reddick, Sogard)...Alvarez and Hendriks are currently on rehab assignments...Bassitt, Cahna, Doubront, Fuld, Parker and Sogard are on the 60-day DL...the 16 players have combined to miss 590 games (36.9 games per stint)...have had at least 10 players on the DL every day since May 10 and at least six players on the DL all year...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's lead the season series 4-2...have lost two of the first three games of this series after sweeping a three-game series in Oakland May 16-18...have won three of the previous four season series and are 44-38 against Texas over the last five years...are 336-345 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 177-166 in Oakland and 159-179 in Texas...have an all-time record of 433-427 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis is 9-for-21 (.429) with nine runs scored, five home runs, 15 RBI and three walks in six games against Texas...*Ryan Dull* has stranded all 26 of his inherited runners and opponents are 1-for-37 (.027) with runners in scoring position...*Jake Smolinski* extended his hitting streak to six games last night, which matches his career high... is 8-for-16 (.500) with two home runs, six RBI and two walks during his current hitting streak...*Danny Valencia* is hitting .350 (41-for-117) with 10 home runs and 24 RBI in 31 games since he was reinstated from the disabled list May 6...the batting average ranks sixth in the American League over that span and the home runs are tied for eighth.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1934** Bob Johnson collects six hits in the second game of a doubleheader against Chicago...in **1938** Jimmie Foxx sets an American League record by walking six times in a nine-inning game against Boston...in **1971** Mike Epstein homers in his first two at bats after homering in his final two at bats the day before to give him four home runs in four at bats, tying a major league record for consecutive home runs...in **1996** Mark McGwire ties an Oakland record with three doubles at Milwaukee and drives in his 790th career run, breaking Sal Bando's Oakland career RBI record.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Daniel Mengden (0-1, 3.18 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was selected from Triple-A Nashville last Saturday and made his Major League debut that day at Cincinnati after just 43 minor league appearances, including 34 starts, in three professional seasons... had not pitched above Single-A prior to this year...became the 46th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut, the second this year (Sean Manaea, April 29)...the last of those 46 to take the loss was Brett Anderson on April 10, 2009 against Seattle.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in his Major League debut, a 2-1 A's loss at Cincinnati last Saturday...at the age of 23 years, 113 days, he became the youngest A's pitcher to start a game since Trevor Cahill on June 19, 2011 (23 years, 110 days)...tossed 104 pitches, which tied for second most by an A's pitcher in his ML debut since pitch counts were tracked beginning in 1988 (Mazzaro, 105 on June 2, 2009)...the A's scored a run in the first and he blanked the Reds on three hits and a walk over the first two innings...struck out the first batter he faced (Cozart)...allowed his only runs in the third inning on a two-run home run by Bruce...was relieved by Dull after 5.2 innings with the A's trailing 2-1.

allowed just three home runs in 68.1 innings, an average of 0.40 per nine innings...yielded no home runs in 23.0 innings with Midland...went 4-0 with a 0.79 ERA over his first nine starts and was 1-1 with a 3.18 ERA over his final two starts.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .179 opponents batting average, including .177 (23-for-130) against right-handed hitters compared to .182 (20-for-110) against left-handers...surrendered all three of his home runs to righties...yielded a .068 batting average with runners in scoring position, including .077 with RISP and two outs...opponents were 8-for-64 (.125) with four walks and a hit by pitch (.188 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning.

THIS AND THAT: The RockHounds were 4-0 in his starting assignments and the Sounds were 5-2...his teams combined for a 9-2 (.818) record in his 11 starts...had five starts where he did not allow a run but had just two wins and three no decisions in those games...tossed at least five innings in each of his 11 starts, including seven or more four times...allowed six hits or fewer in all 11 starts and allowed more than two runs just once...did not allow a run in the first or second inning...had a 0.41 ERA over the first four innings of a game and a 2.59 ERA from the fifth inning on.

2016 HIGHLIGHTS: Struck out a season-high eight batters and walked a season-high three but allowed just two hits in 6.0 scoreless innings in his first start April 9 at Arkansas...ended up with a no decision in a 4-1 win... posted an identical line in his next start April 15 against Arkansas but had another no decision in a 1-0 win...matched his season high in strikeouts and walks in his final Double-A start, a 2-0 win at Corpus Christi April 26... did not allow a run in either of his first two starts at Nashville after not allowing a run in three of his four starts with Midland...was 3-0 over that seasonopening six-start stretch and allowed just two earned runs in 36.0 ip for a 0.50 ERA...capped that streak by fanning a season-high tying eight in a season-high 7.0 innings May 8 against Memphis, but had a no decision in a 3-2 win... extended his scoreless streak to 24.0 innings before allowing a run in the seventh inning May 13 at Iowa...that was the only run he allowed in seven innings but he had a no decision in a 3-2 loss...tossed 6.0 innings in four consecutive starts from May 8 to 25...allowed a season-high three runs on a season-high tying six hits but picked up the win May 30 at Salt Lake...was charged with his only loss in his final start on June 5 at Omaha, a 6-4 Sounds loss

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: Was originally drafted by Houston in the fourth round of the 2014 First-Year Player Draft...was traded to Oakland with catcher Jacob Nottingham for left-handed pitcher Scott Kazmir on July 23, 2015...has compiled a 15-5 record and a 2.87 ERA (67 er in 210.0 ip) in 43 games, including 34 starts, in three professional seasons...has 209 strikeouts in 210.0 innings...has allowed just 14 home runs, an average of 0.60 per nine innings.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Kendall Graveman (2-6, 5.28 ERA): Went 1-1 with a 2.04 ERA over his first three starts, 0-4 with a 9.31 ERA over his next four starts from April 25 to May 14, and is 1-1 with a 4.44 ERA over his last five starts...has tossed fewer than five innings in each of his last two starts, three of his last four and five of 12 for the season...is 1-3 with a 3.38 ERA and .274 opponents batting average in five starts at home compared to 1-3 with a 7.03 ERA and .338 opponents batting average in seven starts on the road...has surrendered just one home run in 29.1 innings at home compared to 10 in 32.0 innings on the road...had a no decision in his last start, a 6-1 A's win at Cincinnati on Sunday (4.0 ip, 7 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 5 so)...is 0-1 with a 2.12 ERA (17.0 ip, 16 h, 5 r, 4 er, 5 bb, 12 so, 1 hr) in three career starts against Los Angeles (AL)...had a no decision in his only start this year, a 5-4 A's loss in Oakland on April 12 (6.0 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 3 so).

- Has allowed just 19-of-102 (18.6%) inherited runners to score, which is the second best percentage in the majors (Houston, 17.5%).
