WINS AND LOSSES: The Rangers beat the A's last night, 7-5, and team is 4-2 to on this 10-game, 10-day trip to Seattle (2-1), Oakland (2-1), and St. Louis (3 G)...Texas is 5-3 in last 8 G after having lost just 2 times in previous 13 G...have won 2 straight, 4 of 5, 10 of 13, 14 of 18, 16 of 21, and 26 of 37...have gone 30-15 since 4/26, tied w/ Giants (31-15, .674) for most wins and best win pct. in MLB in that span... Texas has the best record in the A.L. at 41-25 (.615), T2nd-best record in the majors (also WAS) to only CHC (.688, 44-20)... current record is best 66-game start in club history (see chart)...club is season-high 16 games above .500 for the 1st time since the end of 2013 season (19-over at 91-72)... this year is just 2nd time team has reached 16-over by June 15 in a season, having previously gotten there as early on 6/10/96 (39-23)...team was 36-30 after 66 G in 2015...since 5/1/15, Rangers have best record and most wins in A.L. STANDINGS: The Rangers have a season-best 6.5-game lead in the A.L. West, largest lead in the division for Texas since 5/19/13 (+6.5 GA)...largest lead in 2013 was 7.0 games (last on 5/16/13), and have not led by 7.5 games since winning the division by 10.0 games in 2012...in fact, have not led by at least 7.5 games before the All-Star break in club history...have gained ground in the division on 10 of last 14 days...current 6.5-G lead is largest in A.L., and 2nd-largest in MLB to the Cubs (+9.5 GA in N.L. Central)...have been in sole possession of 1st place for 13 straight and 17 of the last 18 days...from 5/3-28, Texas spent 24 of 26 days in 2nd place...team has had at least a share of 1st place for 40 days in '16, including sole possession of 1st for 31 different days.

ON THE ROAD: This 10-game road trip for Texas matches longest of the year (also 10 G, 6/27-7/6 and 9/5-14)...Texas is 17-15 (.531) away from home, 4th-highest among A.L. clubs in road winning percentage...club has won 4 of 5, 9 of 12, and 12 of 18 after a 5-9 start to season in away tilts...of team's 15 road defeats in '16, 9 have been one or 2-run losses, and club has lost MLB-high 7 times on walkoffs.

<u>VS. OAKLAND / WEST:</u> Rangers are 2-4 vs. A's in '16, winning 2 straight, 6 of 10 and 7 of 12 dating to 2015...Rangers have gone 15-10 at Coliseum since start of '14, 20-14 since start of '13.

• Rangers are 25-13 (.658) vs. the West in '16, 2nd-best intradivision record in ML to only CHC (.750, 18-6)....have won 12 of 15 and 15 of last 19 vs. West.

BIG COMEBACK: Last night's win was Rangers' 20th comefrom-behind win in 2016, tied with BAL for most in MLB...it 5-run deficit matched largest in any Texas win this year (also 5/10 vs. CWS), and was the largest road comeback win in nearly 8 years, since another victory in Oakland on 7/25/08 (club trailed 5-0 in 4th, won 14-6)...credit STATS LLC.

THE LONG BALL: Texas hit 4 HR last night, 3rd game with 4+ HR in '16...club has hit 3+ HR in 3 straight for the 1st time since May 10-12, 2013 (all at HOU), and club record is 4 in a row done 3 times (last Aug. 4-7, 2005)...4 of the Rangers' 7 games with 3+ HR this season have come on this road trip, and 4 of the 7 in 2016 have come at the Coliseum.

- Texas has hit 17 HR over the 1st 6 games of this road trip, most in a 6-G span for club since Aug. 2-7, 2005 (17) all home games...last time to have such a streak over 6 straight, all on the road, was July 3-8, 2004 at HOU and CLE.
- Have 27 HR in June, 2nd in MLB (BAL-33), and team ranks T2nd in majors in HR since 5/7 with 58 (BAL-66, SEA-58)... club's 82 HR for the season are now 5th in the A.L.

<u>UNPRECEDENTED POWER AT COLISEUM:</u> According to baseball-reference.com, the Rangers are the only visitor to ever hit 3+ HR in 3 straight games at the Coliseum in a season (or one series)...Baltimore did it in 3 in a row spanning the 1985-86 seasons, only other visitor to pull the trick...A's have done it 3 times in park history, last in 2006 (5/30-6/1).

WITH LOVE FROM VENEZUELA: All 4 Texas HR last night were hit by Robinson Chirinos and Rougned Odor (both w/ 2 HR)...according to Elias Sports Bureau, it was the 1st time 2 Venezuelan-born players had ever hit multiple HR in a single MLB game (whether teammates or not)...it was the 15th game in club history in which 2 players hit multiple HR, 1st since the club's record-setting 30-3 win on Aug. 22, 2007 at BAL (G1)...Ramon Vazquez and Jarrod Saltalamacchia both hit 2 HR in that game...it was the 1st instance at the Coliseum since Oakland's John Jaha (2) and Randy Velarde (2) pulled the trick on 8/24/99 vs. CLE, and just the 3rd time 2 visiting teammates have done it...the others: TOR's Carlos Delgado and John Olerud on 4/11/94 and MIN's Kirby Puckett and Bernardo Brito on 8/15/93.

• It was Odor's 1st career multi-HR game, 2nd for Chirinos (also 8/5/14 at CWS)...Chirinos' effort was 1st multi-HR game from 9-hole for TEX since Leonys Martin, 2 on 6/25/13 vs. NYY.

ODOR IN LEAD: Rougned Odor has a team-high 12 HR after his 1st career multi-HR effort last night...his 24 HR since the 2015 All-Star break also lead all Rangers, 3 more than Beltre.

HARD SUN: Texas has an 11-7 record in day games entering today's tilt, winning 6 straight and 10 of 11 after opening with a 1-6 mark...club is 4-3 in away day contests, winning 4 of 5...the 11-7 (.611) record is best in the A.L.

CAPTAIN'S ORDERS: Adrian Beltre has missed 7 consecutive games since leaving contest last Wed. vs. HOU due to a mild left hamstring strain, but could play today...the 7 straight games missed marks longest such span in his Rangers career without a disabled list stint...previous longest span was 3 straight from April 21-23, 2012 (left hamstring strain)...he also did not start 5 in a row, May 1-6, 2012, with that hamstring injury, but pinch hit 4 times...had played 151 consecutive games before his current injury.

MEET ME IN ST. LOUIS: Texas is scheduled for a 3-game weekend series in St. Louis...marks 1st meetings between the clubs since Rangers won all 3 games at Busch from June 21-23, 2013, which was the only other time for Texas to play regular season games in St. Louis.

• Texas is 2-1 in Interleague this season, taking last 2 of 3 vs. PIT, 5/27-29...club has won 8 of its last 11 meetings vs. N.L. clubs dating to 2015...Rangers were 6-4 in N.L. parks in 2015, winning 4 of last 5.

TODAY: The 36-year-old right-hander will be making his 14th start of the season in Thursday's finale against the Athletics here in Oakland...ranks among A.L. leaders in quality starts (T1st, 11), pitches per inning (6th, 14.8), BB/9 (6th, 1.82), WHIP (T6th, 1.08), and ERA (7th, 3.00)...is 3-0, 1.35 (6 ER/40.0 IP) in 6 road starts, 2nd-lowest road ERA in the Majors (COL's Tyler Chatwood, 0.65)... has opened a season with a 5-0 start for the 1st time in his career and is seeking the 1st 6-0 start by a member of the season-opening rotation since Alexi Ogando in 2011...has equaled the longest single-season win streak of his career and will look to match the longest win streak of his career with a win today (6, 9/9/11-4/28/12)...opponents batting .202 (39-for-193) in his 8 starts since beginning of May, 5th lowest in A.L. (min. 50 IP)...will be working on regular 4 days rest after taking a no decision in the Rangers' 2-1 win in 11 innings on Sat. at SEA...has left a game in line for the victory 8 times this season, but only has 5 wins in such games...Rangers are 9-4 in his starts, including each of his last 6...earned his 100th career victory between MLB and Nippon Professional Baseball (74-67 in MLB, 26-17 in NPB) on 5/20 at Houston.

LAST START: Took a no decision in the Rangers' 2-1 win in 11 innings on Sat. at SEA (8.0 IP, 3 H, 1 R-ER, 0 BB, 3 SO, 1 HR, 88 pitches/65 strikes)...was 1st TEX pitcher w/ 8.0+ IP, 1-R-or-less to not earn win since Yu Darvish, 4/11/14 vs. HOU...last road instance was Matt Harrison, 9/22/12 at SEA (CG loss in 1-0 defeat)...lone run came on Adam Lind's solo HR in the 5th for just his 2nd HR allowed in last 5 starts after allowing 10 in 1st 8 starts...exited the game trailing 1-0 before Prince Fielder hit a solo HR in the 9th to send the game to extras allowing Rougned Odor to hit the go-ahead HR off Mike Montgomery in the 11th.

VS. OAKLAND/AT THE COLISEUM: Last faced OAK on 9/23/15 at OAK (W, 6.0 IP, 5 H, 2 R-ER, 2 BB, 3 SO, HR, 99 pitches/63 strikes)...has 4 consecutive wins against OAK, including a CG SHO on 9/11/15 in Arlington, which started a 7-game win streak against A.L. West opponents...is 11-4, 2.90 (52 ER/161.1 IP) in 27 G/25 GS with 2 CG against his former team...is 8-2, 2.79 (27 ER/87.0 IP) in 15 G/14 GS at The Coliseum.

 \bullet Is 4-0, 3.20 (16 ER/45.0 IP) in 7 starts against the A.L. West this season... has not lost a divisional game since 9/6/15 at LAA...in his 11 starts since the streak began, is 7-0, 3.21 (25 ER/70.0 IP) with 9 quality starts.

ON THE ROAD: Is 3-0, 1.41 (6 ER/40.0 IP) in 6 road starts, 2nd-lowest road ERA in the Majors (COL's Tyler Chatwood, 0.65)...had a stretch of 18.0 consecutive scoreless road innings snapped in last start on 6/11 at SEA...is 2-0, 0.43 ERA (1 ER/21.0 IP) in his last 3 road starts...opponents are batting .171/.221/.257/.479 on the road compared to .289/.324/.491/.816 in Arlington...has surrendered just 3 of his 12 home runs this season on the road...has won 4 straight road decisions dating back to 9/23/15.

• <u>Is only Texas starter in last 10 seasons (2007-16) to log a quality start in each of 1st 6 road starts of a season</u>...could match Rick Helling's (2000) and Kevin Millwood's (2006) club record for 7 straight road quality starts to begin a season...he and teammate Cole Hamels are the only pair of Ranger teammates to record 6 straight road quality starts to begin the same season...could become only the 2nd pitcher since the start of 2015 (BOS' Steven Wright; 2016) to record 7 straight road QS to start a year.

2016: Rangers are 9-4 in his starts, 2 of the losses coming in games with blown saves...has left with the lead and in position to win in 8 of his 13 starts, recording $5\ \text{wins}...\text{has}$ allowed just 2 HR in his last 5 starts after allowing 10 in his 1st 8starts of the season...is one of 6 A.L. pitchers with at least 3 wins lost (exit in position to win, take L or ND) this season...16 of 27 runs against Lewis this season have come on 12 HR allowed, and 9 of his 12 HR allowed have come in 7 starts in Arlington...opposition batting .271 (29-107) in first PA; .219 (25-114) in 2nd PA; .235 (20-85) in 3rd PA; .000 (0-7) in 4th PA...opponents batting .220 (11-50) with runners in scoring position...leadoff batter has reached in 24 of 85 frames...Bryan Holaday (2.16 ERA) has caught 4 starts, Brett Nicholas (3.75) has caught 2 starts, and Bobby Wilson (3.26) has caught 7 outings...opponents are batting .249 on balls in play, 2nd-lowest in A.L and 8th-lowest in MLB...in start on 4/29 vs. LAA, became the 1st Texas starter to go 7.0 innings in a start with zero strikeouts and walks since Tommy Hunter on 8/22/10 at Baltimore (8.0 IP, 3 R)...pitched at least 7.0 innings in a career-high 5 consecutive starts, 4/29-5/20, matching longest streak by a Ranger in the past 2 seasons (also Hamels, 8/28 - 9/19/15)...completed at least 6.0 innings in each of his first 9 starts, longest streak by a member of the Texas season-opening rotation since Alexi Ogando (12) in 2011...had 6 straight QS, 4/23-5/20, only Ranger since start of 2014 w/ streak of 6-or-more (also 6 straight, 6/2 - 6/30/15).

RANGERS LEADERS: Ranks 5th among Texas' all-time leaders in strikeouts (912) and in starts (188), and 6th in wins (76), and innings (1142.0)...has 11 career games of 10+ K's, T4th in club history...at Globe Life Park in Arlington (1994-2016), ranks 2nd in starts (93), innings (563.2), and strikeouts (426), and is 4th in wins (35)...is one of just 5 pitchers with at least 5 different 10-win seasons for the Rangers: Charlie Hough (9), Kenny Rogers (9), Fergie Jenkins (5), Bobby Witt (5), and Lewis (5)...his 5 career RBI are the most ever by a Rangers pitcher.
