OAKLAND ATHLETICS (27-39) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (29-37)

ABOUT THE A'S: Lost three of four from Texas to start the homestand to fall a season-high 12 games under .500 and a season-high 14½ games out of first place in the American League West...since divisional play began in 1969, this is just the fourth time the A's have been at least 14½ games out of first place before the end of June (1979, 1982, 2001)...are 27-39 (.409), which is the second worst record in the AL and fifth worst in the majors... the A's were also 27-39 after 66 games last year...with a loss tonight, the A's would have their worst record after 67 games since the 1997 club was 27-40...have lost three straight and 10 of the last 12 games...are 3-10 (.231) in June, which is the worst record in the majors...are 14-27 (.341) since the start of May after going 13-12 (.520) in April...are in fifth place in the AL West for the 13th time in the last 14 days...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 15 days in fourth, nine days tied for fourth and 13 days in fifth...had their season-high seven-game losing streak snapped last Sunday in Cincinnati...have five losing streaks of four or more games and three winning streaks of four or more games.

OFFENSE: The A's were held to two hits yesterday, both in the ninth inning...it marked the second time in the last nine games the A's were no-hit over the first six innings (June 7 at Milwaukee)...the A's have a streak of 3,963 consecutive games with one or more hits, which is the longest active streak in the majors and the longest in Athletics history...are hitting .264 (345-for-1308) and are averaging 4.4 runs per game (169 runs) over the last 38 games dating back to May 4 after batting .234 and averaging 3.4 runs per game over the first 28 contests...have the lowest on-base percentage in the American League (.301) and the second fewest walks (154)...however, are tied for the third most intentional walks (13)...have the third fewest doubles (102) and the fourth fewest runs scored (265)... have been shutout just twice, which is tied with Boston and Chicago for the fewest in the AL.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have the fewest innings pitched in the majors (349.0), the second highest ERA (5.31) and are tied for the second most losses (32)...are 11-27 with a 6.25 ERA (175 er in 252.0 ip) over the last 49 games dating back to April 23...that includes 6-1 with a 1.80 ERA (9 er in 45.0 ip) in seven starts by Rich Hill and 5-26 with a 7.22 ERA (166 er in 207.0 ip) in 41 starts by everyone else...have 22 games this year with fewer than five innings, which is the most in the majors...have gone 117 consecutive games without a complete game, which is the second longest streak in Athletics history (151, July 9, 2008-July 5, 2009)...have used eight different starting pitchers over the last 20 games and nine for the season, which matches Los Angeles and Minnesota for the most in the American League.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.49 ERA (186 er in 305.0 ip) over the last 35 games dating back to May 8 after posting a 3.91 ERA over the first 31 contests...have a 4.74 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...also have the second highest opponents batting average (.267) and on-base percentage (.334) and third highest opponents slugging percentage (.437)...have allowed 11 home runs in the last four games and 82 for the season...42 of those 82 home runs have come with runners on base, which is second most in the majors (Cincinnati, 48).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed five errors in the last four games and eight in the last 10...have 45 errors for the season, which is the most in the American League and sixth most in the majors...are tied for second in the AL in double plays (69)...have the fewest outfield assists in the AL (7).

DESIGNATED HITTER: The A's designated hitter is batting .184 (42-for-228) with seven home runs and 27 RBI...have the second lowest batting average in the American League (Houston, .164) and are tied for the third fewest home runs and RBI...the A's DH has entered the game defensively seven times this year, which is the most times that has happened since 1995 when they also did it seven times.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-3 on this nine-game homestand against Texas (1-3), Los Angeles-AL (three games) and Milwaukee (two games)... it is the first of four homestands of nine or more games...went 5-1 on the last homestand against Detroit (2-1) and Minnesota (3-0) and are 14-19 (.424) at home for the season...that is the third worst home record in the American League...had their season-high six-game home winning streak

snapped Tuesday night...went 1-7 on the last road trip to Houston (0-3), Milwaukee (0-2) and Cincinnati (1-2) and are 13-20 (.394) on the road, which is the third worst road record in the AL...have a 4.00 ERA (132 er in 297.0 ip) at home compared to 5.51 (174 er in 284.0 ip) on the road...have the second highest road ERA in the majors (Cincinnati, 6.23).

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's have dropped nine of their last 11 one-run decisions after winning five of the first eight... are 7-12 (.368) in one-run games for the season, which is the third worst record in the American League...are tied for second in most losses... are 7-4 (.636) in games decided in the last at bat and 2-1 in extra inning games...all three extra inning games have come on the road and the A's now have a streak of 52 consecutive home games since their last extra inning game in the Coliseum (Aug. 18, 2015 vs. Los Angeles-NL)...that is the longest such streak by an A's team since a 55-game streak from Sept. 25, 1983-July 20, 1984.

THIS AND THAT: The have been successful in 8-of-11 (72.7%) replay challenges, which is the best percentage in the majors...the 11 challenges are tied for third fewest in the majors...Monday's game began a stretch of 20 consecutive games in California...after this nine-game homestand, the A's travel to Los Angeles-AL (four games) and San Francisco (two games) before returning home for a five-game homestand...A's pinch hitters rank second in the American League in hits (12) and plate appearances (56) and tied for third in RBI (6) and extra base hits (3)...the A's are averaging 2 hours and 57 minutes per game, which is tied for second quickest in the majors (Toronto, 2:56)...are 9-7 (.563) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 18-32 (.360) against righties.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 16 times this year and currently have 11 players on the DL (Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doubront, Fuld, Hendriks, Hill, Manaea, Parker, Reddick, Sogard)...Alvarez and Hendriks are currently on rehab assignments...Bassitt, Cahna, Doubront, Fuld, Parker and Sogard are on the 60-day DL...the 16 players have combined to miss 601 games (37.6 games per stint)...have had at least 10 players on the DL every day since May 10 and at least six players on the DL all year...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's will face the Angels in seven of their next nine games...are 0-3 against Los Angeles this year as they were swept in a three-game series in Oakland April 11-13...have now lost seven of their last eight games against the Angels, including five straight in Oakland... have lost the season series in each of the previous two seasons after winning three straight prior to that...are 49-49 against the Angels since the start of the 2011 season...including 40-11 when scoring four or more runs...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 414-345 against the Angels...that includes 215-164 in Oakland and 199-181 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 463-422 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis has 42 home runs and 107 RBI over his last 162 games... Ryan Dull has stranded all 29 of his inherited runners and opponents are 1-for-39 (.026) with runners in scoring position...first batters faced are 1-for-28 with two walks...Jake Smolinski extended his hitting streak to six games Wednesday, which matches his career high...is 8-for-16 (.500) with two home runs, six RBI and two walks during his current hitting streak...Danny Valencia is batting .342 (41-for-120) with 10 home runs and 24 RBI in 32 games since he was reinstated from the disabled list May 6...the batting average ranks sixth in the American League over that span and the home runs are tied for ninth.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1967 the A's and Tigers set an American League record for longest doubleheader with a combined time of nine hours and five minutes...the first game includes a rain delay and the second goes 19 innings before Dave Duncan homers for a 6-5 win...in 1988 Stan Javier's RBI single in the bottom of the 14th inning leads the A's to a 7-6 win over Texas...the A's would play three extra inning games in the three game series with the Rangers...in 1996 Terry Steinbach hits a grand slam in the 10th inning as the A's defeat Detroit, 8-4.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Kendall Graveman (2-6, 5.28 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Went 1-1 with a 2.04 ERA over his first three starts, 0-4 with a 9.31 ERA over his next four starts from April 25 to May 14, and is 1-1 with a 4.44 ERA (12 er in 24.1 ip) over his last five starts...has tossed fewer than five innings in each of his last two starts, three of his last four and five of 12 for the season...is 2-11 with a 5.49 ERA (61 er in 100.0 ip) and .303 (123-for-406) opponents average over his last 20 starts dating back to July 10, 2015...was 6-4 with a 3.20 ERA and .264 opponents average over the first 18 games of his career.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-3 with a 3.38 ERA (11 er in 29.1 ip) and .274 (31-for-113) opponents batting average in five starts at home compared to 1-3 with a 7.03 ERA (25 er in 32.0 ip) and .338 (45-for-133) opponents batting average in seven starts on the road...has surrendered just one home run in 29.1 innings at home compared to 10 in 32.0 innings on the road...is tied for third in the American League in home runs allowed on the road.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .288 (40-for-139) opponents batting average to left-handed hitters compared to .336 (36-for-107) against right-handers...however, has issued 19 of his 25 walks to lefties...last year he issued 24 of his 38 walks to lefties...has a .323 (31-for-96) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .200 (19-for-95) the second time and .472 (26-for-55) after that...the opponents one through four hitters are batting a combined .358 (43-for-120) off him while the five through nine hitters are batting .262 (33-for-126).

RUN SUPPORT: Received four runs of support in his last start, which was a season-high...has received no runs of support in three of his 12 starts and one run three times...his season run support average of 3.23 (22 rs in 61.1 ip) is sixth lowest in the American League among pitchers with at least 50 innings pitched...is 0-5 in six starts with two runs of support or fewer, 2-1 in six starts with three runs of support or more...is now 1-14 in 19 career starts with two runs of support or fewer, 7-1 in 14 starts with three runs of support or more.

MONTH BY MONTH: His ERA has increased each month of the season... went 1-2 with a 4.03 ERA in four starts in April...then went 1-4 with a 5.87 ERA in six starts in May...his May loss total tied for second in the American League...it was the first time he has lost four games in a month in his career...is currently 0-0 with a 6.48 ERA (6 er in 8.1 ip) in two starts in June.

LOSING STREAKS SNAPPED: Defeated Minnesota May 30 to snap his losing streak at five games...had a 7.92 ERA and .361 opponents batting average during the losing streak, which spanned five starts from April 25 to May 19...the losing streak fell one short of his career high of six, which he ended with his first win of the season this year on April 20...compiled a 5.52 ERA and .276 opponents batting average during that losing streak, which spanned nine starts from July 10, 2015 to April 7, 2016...it was the longest losing streak by an A's pitcher since Tyson Ross lost eight straight from May 19 to Sept. 24, 2012.

THIS AND THAT: Allowed a career-high 10 hits in back-to-back starts on April 25 at Detroit and May 2 against Seattle and is the first A's pitcher with at least 10 hits in back-to-back starts since Brandon McCarthy (April 16-21, 2012)...allowed four hits or fewer in each of his first three starts, joining John Odom (1969) and Mike Norris (1980) as the only pitchers in Oakland history on an Opening Day roster to allow four hits or fewer while tossing five innings or more in each of their first three starts.

START-BY-START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-1 loss to Chicago (AL) April 7 in Oakland...the scored was tied at 0-0 when he walked Cabrera to lead off the sixth...Abreu followed with a two-run home run and Graveman left after 5.1 innings trailing 2-0...had a no decision in the A's 5-4 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on *April* 12 in Oakland...allowed just one run in 6.0 innings and it came in the second inning when Simmons grounded into a double play...left with a 3-1 lead...was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-2 win at New York (AL) on April 20...it was his first win since July 4, 2015 against Seattle...struck out a career-high eight batters on a careerhigh tying 111 pitches...struck out in the fifth inning in his first professional at bat...was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-3 loss at Detroit *April 25*...allowed a career-high 10 hits and left after 4.2 innings trailing 6-0...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-3 loss to Seattle May 2 in Oakland...allowed a career-high tying 10 hits for the second consecutive start...was the losing pitcher in the A's 11-3 loss at Baltimore on May 8...yielded a career-high four home runs, which are the most allowed by an A's starting pitcher since May 6, 2013 at Cleveland when Jarrod Parker also allowed four home runs...the A's scored three times in the first but he allowed a two-run home run to Machado in the bottom of the first...allowed back-to-back home runs to Alvarez and Schoop in the second and a two-run home run to Trumbo in the third...left after 2.2 innings trailing 6-2...lost his fourth consecutive start in the A's 6-0 loss at Tampa Bay May 14...allowed a two-run home run to Miller in the third inning...also yielded two runs in the sixth inning on a

- The A's bullpen has allowed 11 runs over its past four games (17.0 ip, 5.82 ERA) to snap a five-game, 13.0-inning scoreless streak...now has a 2.85 ERA (21 er in 66.1 ip) and .192 (46-for-240) opponents batting average over its last 18 games dating back to May 27.
- Has allowed just 20-of-106 (18.9%) inherited runners to score, which is the second best percentage in the majors (Houston, 17.5%).
- Has tossed 232.0 innings, which is the most in the American League and third most in the majors.
- Has 227 strikeouts and 70 walks...ranks third in the AL in strikeouts per walk (3.24) and walks per nine innings (2.72) and fifth in strikeouts and fewest walks.
