FRIDAY, JUNE 17, 2016 OAKLAND, CA GAME #67 (29-37) ROAD GAME #32 (14-17)

LEADING OFF: Tonight LAA opens a six-game divisional road trip to Oakland (June 17-19) and Houston (June 20-22)... Angels went 3-3 on the six-game homestand vs. Cleveland (1-2) and Minnesota (2-1)...Halos have dropped seven of 10 and 13 of last 21 affairs but have won last two games (first back to back wins since May 30-31)...LAA is 7-12-3 in 22 series in 2016... Club is 5-9 in June (11-13 in April, 13-15 in May)...Angels haven't opened with three consecutive losing months since 2006 (does not include March).

<u>FAST FACTS:</u> Albert Pujols is 4 for 8 (1 HR) in career vs. Graveman...Since 2012, Mike Trout's 11 HRs (38 G) in Oakland Coliseum are most by any visiting player...In the same span (2013-16), Trout has 25 RBI & 33 runs in Oakland.

SHOE SHINES: Matt Shoemaker's streak of consecutive strikeouts without a walk ended at 49 in his last start Saturday night...Streak is tied for third longest in baseball since 1974...Streak was snapped after facing 155 batters before surrendering a walk...Since being recalled from Triple A Salt Lake on May 11, Shoe has pitched to a 2.85 ERA (47.1 IP - 15 ER) with 54 strikeouts and four walks...Saturday marked eighth career game with 10-or-more strikeouts for Shoemaker, third time this season, tied for most in A.L.

TIM TOMORROW: On May 20th, the Angels today signed two-time N.L. Cy Young Award winner Tim Lincecum to a 2016 contract. Tomorrow he will make his first Major League start since June 27, 2015. Lincecum, 32, has pitched nine MLB seasons (all with SF) with a 108-83 record, 10 complete games, seven shutouts and a 3.61 ERA (1643.2 IP – 660 ER). He is one of four pitchers all-time to have won back-to-back NL Cy Young Awards, doing so in 2008 and 2009 and has been named to the N.L. All-Star team four times (2008-11). "The Freak" has tossed two no-hitters: July 13, 2013 at San Diego and June 25, 2014 vs. San Diego.

THIS N' THAT: Angels have used 41 players (21 pitchers, 20 positional) this season (Lincecum will be 42nd)...Club record is 54 players in 2014...Trout leads all A.L. outfielders with 1,812,731 All-Star votes...Halos have hit into 62 double plays (67 G), second-most in MLB...15 pickoffs by Angels' pitching this season leads Majors (no MLB team has more than 9 PO)... Halo batters have fewest strikeouts in all of baseball (399)... Mike Trout is just sixth player since 1901 to log 400 BB and score 500 runs prior to age-25 season: Mel Ott, Mickey Mantle, Ted Williams, Jimmie Foxx and Arky Vaughan... Angels' current active roster features five players from Venezuela (J. Alvarez, J. Chacin, C. Perez, G. Petit and D. Guerra).

West crowns.

<u>WELCOMED ADDITION:</u> Since May, **Yunel Escobar** is batting .329 (49/149)...**His 77 hits in 2016 are second-most among A.L. third basemen**...His 26 multi-hit games lead Angels... **Escobar** has an OBP of .362 the leadoff spot (In 2015, LAA leadoff batters posted .280 OBP).

HOT HALOS: Six of last 12 hits for Jefry Marte are for extrabases (4 HR, 2 2B)...Has three HRs & seven RBI his last seven starts...Gregorio Petit is batting .375 (15/40) with six runs, seven doubles, one HR and six RBI in 13 games this month...Has multiple hits in five of last 10 games and seven doubles over his last 13 affairs...Johnny Giavotella is 10 for 26 (.385) over his last six games (3 2B, 2 HR)...He logged his first career four-hit game Monday night...Kole Calhoun has 27 runs his last 31 games...Has collected 12 RBI his last 14 games.

M*A*S*H* UNIT: Halos currently have nine players on the disabled list...RHP Cory Rasmus (right groin strain), RHP Joe Smith (left hamstring strain), RHP Nick Tropeano (right shoulder tightness), INF Cliff Pennington (left hamstring strain), C Geovany Soto (right meniscus tear; surgery), RHP Garrett Richards (right elbow UCL), LHP Andrew Heaney (left forearm strain), LHP C.J. Wilson (left shoulder inflammation), and OF Craig Gentry (right lumbar spine strain & personal medical condition)...LHP Tyler Skaggs (recovery TJ surgery;) is on disabled list with Salt Lake.

REHAB UPDATES: RHP Nick Tropeano (right shoulder tightness) threw a bullpen session Monday...Tyler Skaggs has ceased throwing and will be evaluated daily at Tempe, AZ (shoulder tightness)...Cliff Pennington will rehab his strained hamstring in Tempe next week...Geovany Soto continues with baseball activities and could begin a rehab assignment next week.

THE MANAGER: **Mike Scioscia** is the longest tenured manager in the Majors (17th season) and the only active manager to collect over 1,000 victories with a single club...His 17 years with the Angels are tied with **Sparky Anderson** (**Detroit**, 1979-95) for second longest tenure with an A.L. team (trailing only **Connie Mack's** 50 seasons with **Philadelphia**)...**Scioscia's** 1,444 wins rank 24th on the MLB all-time list (23rd is **Earl Weaver**; 1,481).

June 18

(1986) Hall of Famer Don Sutton recorded his 300th career win, defeating Texas (5-1; 9 IP, 3 H, 1 ER, 1 HR, 3 SO), becoming the 19th pitcher in MLB history to reach the plateau; (2007) Chone Figgins became the first player in MLB to go 6-for-6 with a walk-off hit since Jim Northrup with Tigers Aug. 18, 1969 (2-run HR in 13th)...His six hits tied an A.L. record for a 9-inning game.

- Making 13th start of the season and sixth on the road...Eighth start since being recalled from Triple-A Salt Lake.
- <u>SHOE SHINING:</u> In last six starts, is 2-2 with a 2.28 ERA (43.1 IP 11 ER)...In first six starts of the year, was 1-5 with a 9.12 ERA (24.2 IP 25 ER).
- <u>RECORD BREAKING STREAK:</u> Had streak of 49 strikeouts without a walk snapped in last start with 7th inning walk to
 Carlos Santana; established a new Angels franchise record (previously Frank Tanana 30 strikeouts without a walk in
 1976)...Since 1974, his streak ties with Pedro Martinez for third longest in the Majors behind only Curt Schilling (56 in
 2002) and Greg Maddux (53 in 2001).
- <u>RETURN TO FORM:</u> In last five starts, has recorded 48 strikeouts with one walk, while pitching to a 1.88 ERA (38.1 IP 8 ER)...Is one of two pitchers in Angels history with no walks in four consecutive starts (also, **Bert Blyleven** in 1990 had eight strikeouts in those starts).
- MORE ELITE COMPANY: Streak of four straight starts with 6+ strikeouts and zero walks is tied for third longest in Major League history and trails only the five game streaks by **Pedro Martinez** in 2000 and **Curt Schilling** in 2002.
- <u>HALO HISTORY:</u> Is first pitcher in Angels history with 10+ strikeouts and zero walks in consecutive starts (May 21 and 27)...Became third Major League pitcher this season with 10+ strikeouts and zero walks in consecutive games (Clayton Kershaw and Noah Syndergaard) (ELIAS).
- LAST TIME OUT: Did not factor in decision in last start Saturday vs. Cleveland after tossing eight shutout innings and allowing just three hits and one walk with 11 strikeouts...Exited game with 3-0 lead after eight innings.
- <u>GOING DEEP</u>: Earned the win May 27 vs. Houston after tossing a career-high 8.1 innings pitched and allowing two earned runs on seven hits...Carried a shutout into 9th inning and exited with one out in ninth and two runners on base (both would ultimately score)...Recorded 11 strikeouts with zero walks.
- <u>BEATING THE BIRDS</u>: Tossed 7.1 scoreless innings in start on May 21 vs. Baltimore...Allowed just three hits and no walks while setting a career-high with 12 strikeouts...Became third pitcher in Angels history with 12+ strikeouts and zero walks in a game, joining Frank Tanana (twice) and Dan Haren...Shoemaker joins Haren (5/24/12 at SEA) as only players in franchise history to post those numbers while also not allowing a run.
- WINNING WAYS: Earned the win on May 16 at Dodger Stadium...Snapped streak of four consecutive losing starts for LAA
- <u>WITH THE BEES:</u> Was optioned to Triple-A on April 30 and made one start for Salt Lake on May 6 vs. Reno...Earned the win after tossing six innings and allowing one earned run on six hits with two walks and eight strikeouts.
- <u>SCORELESS START:</u> Earned first win of the season on April 13 at Oakland after tossing six shutout innings and allowing just one hit and three walks while striking out five...Marked 11th career scoreless start of at least five innings pitched.
- DEFEATING THE DIVISION: Is 12-8 with a 4.45 ERA (141.2 IP 70 ER) in 29 career games (24 starts) against A.L. West foes
- <u>OUT-STANDING</u>: This season, opponents have batted .207 (17/82) against Shoemaker with two outs, .273 (24/88) with one out and .317 (32/101) with no outs.
- <u>SUPPORT ME:</u> Last season, Shoemaker received an average of 3.46 runs of support per nine innings, which was third fewest mark in the American League (min. 125 IP)...In 2014, he led the league with an average of 6.68 runs of support per nine innings (STATS LLC)...In his 12 big league starts this year, Angels have scored just 26 runs while he was in the games.
- VS.OAKLAND: In eight career games (seven starts) against the A's, is 3-2 with a 3.96 ERA (38.2 IP 17 ER)...Earned the win in first start vs. Oakland this season on April 13 after tossing six scoreless innings and allowing one hit and three walks with five strikeouts.
- AT OAKLAND COLISEUM: In four career games at the Coliseum, is 2-0 with a 3.57 ERA (22.2 IP 9 ER)...His two wins in Oakland have come in his last two starts at the ballpark.
- <u>CAREER NOTES:</u> Owns a 26-21 record and 3.89 ERA (344.1 IP 149 ER) in 65 games (57 starts) for Angels...Went 16-4 with a 3.04 ERA (136 IP 46 ER) in 2014 and established a Club record for most wins by a rookie.
