OAKLAND ATHLETICS (28-39) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (29-38)

ABOUT THE A'S: Snapped their three-game losing streak last night and are now 3-3 over the last six games...however, are 4-10 (.231) in June, which is the worst record in the American League and third worst in the majors (Philadelphia and Pittsburgh, 4-12)...are 15-27 (.357) since the start of May after going 13-12 (.520) in April...are 28-39 (.418) overall, which is the second worst record in the AL and fifth worst in the majors...the A's were also 28-39 after 67 games last year (lost game 68)...are 11 games under .500, which is one short of the season-low of 12 (27-39 on June 16)...are in fifth place in the AL West for the 14th time in the last 15 days and trail first place Texas by a season-high 14½ games for the second consecutive day...since divisional play began in 1969, this is just the fourth time the A's have been at least 14½ games out of first place before the end of June (1979, 1982, 2001)...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 15 days in fourth, nine days tied for fourth and 14 days in fifth.

LAST AT BAT WINS AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's had their third walk-off win of the season last night and improved to 8-4 (.667) in games decided in the last at bat...are tied for second in the American League in last at bat wins (Baltimore, 9) and have the third best record...by winning in the bottom of the ninth last night, the A's extended their streak of consecutive home games without an extra inning game to 53, which is the third longest such streak in Oakland history (74, May 29, 1970-May 2, 1971; 55, Sept. 25, 1983-July 20, 1984)...last played an extra inning game in the Coliseum on Aug. 18, 2015 vs. Los Angeles-NL, a 5-4 win in 10 innings...are 2-1 in extra innings this year and the three extra inning games are tied for third fewest in the AL...have dropped nine of their last 12 one-run decisions after winning five of the first eight...are 8-12 (.400) in one-run games for the season, which is tied for the third worst record in the AL...are tied for second in most losses.

STARTING PITCHING: Andrew Triggs will become the A's ninth different starting pitcher in the last 21 games...he will be the 10th to start a game this year and Tim Lincecum will be the 10th to start for the Angels...the A's and the Angels have used the most starting pitchers in the American League...A's starting pitchers have the fewest innings pitched in the majors (356.0), the second highest ERA (5.23) and are tied for the second most losses (32)...are 11-27 with a 6.12 ERA (176 er in 259.0 ip) over the last 50 games dating back to April 23...that includes 6-1 with a 1.80 ERA (9 er in 45.0 ip) in seven starts by Rich Hill and 5-26 with a 7.02 ERA (167 er in 214.0 ip) in 42 starts by everyone else...have 22 games this year with fewer than five innings, which is the most in the majors...have gone 118 consecutive games without a complete game, which is the second longest streak in Athletics history (151, July 9, 2008-July 5, 2009).

OFFENSE: The A's are hitting .265 (355-for-1342) and are averaging 4.4 runs per game (172 runs) over the last 39 games dating back to May 4 after batting .234 and averaging 3.4 runs per game over the first 28 contests...have the lowest on-base percentage in the American League (.302) and the second fewest walks (156)...however, are tied for the third most intentional walks (13)...have the third fewest runs scored (268) and doubles (103)...have been shutout just twice, which is tied with Boston and Chicago for the fewest in the AL.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.39 ERA (188 er in 314.0 ip) over the last 36 games dating back to May 8 after posting a 3.91 ERA over the first 31 contests...have a 4.70 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...also have the second highest opponents batting average (.266) and on-base percentage (.332) and third highest opponents slugging percentage (.435)...have allowed 12 home runs in the last five games and 83 for the season...42 of those 83 home runs have come with runners on base, which is second most in the majors (Cincinnati, 49).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed six errors in the last five games and nine in the last 11...have 46 errors for the season, which is the most in the American League and sixth most in the majors...rank fourth in the AL in double plays (69)...A's outfielders have seventh assists, which is the fewest in the AL and tied for second fewest in the majors.

DESIGNATED HITTER: The A's designated hitter is batting .190 (44-for-232) with eight home runs and 28 RBI...have the second lowest batting average in the American League (Houston, .161) the fourth fewest RBI

and are tied for the four fewest home runs...the A's DH has entered the game defensively seven times this year, which is the most times that has happened since 1995 when they also did it seven times.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-3 on this nine-game homestand against Texas (1-3), Los Angeles-AL (1-0) and Milwaukee (two games)...it is the first of four homestands of nine or more games...went 5-1 on the last homestand and are 15-19 (.441) at home for the season...that is the third worst home record in the American League...had their season-high six-game home winning streak snapped Tuesday night...went 1-7 on the last road trip to Houston (0-3), Milwaukee (0-2) and Cincinnati (1-2) and are 13-20 (.394) on the road, which is the third worst road record in the AL...have a 3.94 ERA (134 er in 306.0 ip) at home compared to 5.51 (174 er in 284.0 ip) on the road...have the second highest road ERA in the majors (Cincinnati, 6.04).

THIS AND THAT: The have been successful in 8-of-11 (72.7%) replay challenges, which is the best percentage in the majors...the 11 challenges are tied for second fewest in the majors...only the Yankees, with 10, have fewer challenges...the A's are averaging 2 hours and 56 minutes per game, which is tied with Toronto for the quickest in the majors...A's pinch hitters rank second in the American League in hits (12) and plate appearances (57) and tied for third in RBI (6) and extra base hits (3)...are 9-7 (.563) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 19-32 (.373) against righties...the 16 games against left-handed starters is fourth fewest in the AL...Monday's game began a stretch of 20 consecutive games in California...after this nine-game homestand, the A's travel to Los Angeles-AL (four games) and San Francisco (two games) before returning home for a five-game homestand.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 16 times this year and currently have 11 players on the DL (Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doubront, Fuld, Hendriks, Hill, Manaea, Parker, Reddick, Sogard)...Alvarez and Hendriks are currently on rehab assignments...Bassitt, Cahna, Doubront, Fuld, Parker and Sogard are on the 60-day DL...the 16 players have combined to miss 612 games (38.3 games per stint)...have had at least 10 players on the DL every day since May 10 and at least six players on the DL all year...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's are 1-3 against Los Angeles this year...won the first game of this series last night after being swept in a three-game series in Oakland April 11-13...the win last night snapped a five-game home losing streak against the Angels...have lost seven of their last nine games overall...have lost the season series in each of the previous two seasons after winning three straight prior to that...are 50-49 against the Angels since the start of the 2011 season...including 40-11 when scoring four or more runs...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 415-345 against the Angels...that includes 216-164 in Oakland and 199-181 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 464-422 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Ryan Dull has stranded all 29 of his inherited runners and opponents are 1-for-39 (.026) with runners in scoring position...first batters faced are 1-for-28 with two walks...**Jake Smolinski** extended his hitting streak to seven games last night, which is a new career high...is 9-for-18 (.500) with two home runs, six RBI and two walks during the streak...**Danny Valencia** is batting .347 (43-for-124) with 10 home runs and 24 RBI in 33 games since he was reinstated from the disabled list May 6...the batting average ranks sixth in the American League over that span.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1984** Davey Lopes hits an inside-the park home run in the A's 10-2 win over the Kansas City Royals...in **1993** the A's overcome a then club record eight-run deficit to defeat the Kansas City Royals 10-9...trailing 8-0 entering the bottom of the second, the A's score twice in the second and six times in the fifth before Craig Paquette's two-run seventh inning homer puts the A's ahead for good...in **1996** Mark McGwire homers in the fifth inning of the A's 8-5 win at Detroit to extend his Oakland record streak of consecutive games reaching base to 62.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Andrew Triggs (0-0, 8.00 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville today for his fifth stint with the A's this year...will be making his first Major League start...has one start in 161 career minor league appearances...it came on May 18, 2014 for Double-A Northwest Arkansas at Tulsa while he was a member of the Kansas City Royals organization...had a no decision in a 6-5 loss (4.0 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 2 so).

WITH OAKLAND: Went 0-0 with an 8.00 ERA and .312 opponents batting average in 10 relief appearances over his first four stints with the A's (April 25-26, April 29, May 7, May 10-June 3)...struck out 18 and walked five in 18.0 innings...tossed at least one inning in each of his 10 relief appearances, including two or more five times...logged a season-high 4.0 innings in his last appearance (see below)...allowed 2-of-6 (33.3%) inherited runners to score and first batters faced were 2-for-9 (.222) with a walk

THIS AND THAT: Has issued four of his five walks to left-handed hitters...has yielded a .263 (15-for-57) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .450 (9-for-20) after that...has a .220 (9-for-41) opponents batting average with the bases empty compared to .417 (15-for-36) with two of his three home runs with runners on base...opponents are 2-for-15 (.133) with a walk and a hit by pitch (.235 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning.

LAST MAJOR LEAGUE APPEARANCE: He pitched 4.0 innings of relief and tossed a career-high 76 pitches June 3 at Houston...the 4.0 innings are a season-high by an A's reliever...relieved Jesse Hahn in the bottom of the first after Hahn allowed seven runs on six hits and two walks while retiring just two batters...allowed a two-run home run to Gattis in the fourth and was charged with three more runs in the fifth...allowed a RBI single to Correa and was relieved by Rzepczynski with runners on first and second and two outs...Rzepczynski allowed both runs to score.

TRIGGS vs. LOS ANGELES: Has never faced the Angels in his career.

NASHVILLE: Was 2-1 with two saves and a 3.48 ERA in nine appearances with Nashville, all in relief...struck out 15 and walked three in 10.1 innings...did not allow a home run...opponents hit .179, including .083 (1-for-12) by left-handed hitters compared to .222 (6-for-27) by right-handers...tossed one or more innings in eight of his nine appearances, including a season-high 2.0 innings April 23 against New Orleans...his most pitches in a game came on April 20 at Colorado Springs (40)...did not allow a run in two outings following his June 4 option (2.1 ip)...picked up the save in his last appearance last Sunday at Oklahoma City (1.0 ip, 2 so, 1 hb).

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: Has a 13-10 record, 52 saves and a 2.08 ERA (57 er in 246.1 ip) in 161 games over five professional seasons...has surrendered just seven home runs in 246.1 career innings (0.26 per nine innings) and has issued just 54 walks (1.97 per nine innings)...converted each of his 17 save opportunities at Double-A Bowie in 2015...led the Texas League with 19 saves at Northwest Arkansas in 2014...was a TL All-Star that year...was drafted three times before signing with Kansas City...spent three seasons in the Royals farm system before he was traded to Baltimore prior to the 2015 season...was claimed off waivers by the A's March 13, 2016.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Eric Surkamp (0-4, 8.07 ERA): Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville on Tuesday for his fourth stint with the A's this year and was the losing pitcher in the A's 10-6 loss to Texas that night (2.1 ip, 7 h, 7 r, 7 er, 2 bb, 1 so)...was called up the first time April 8 and went 0-2 with a 5.59 ERA in four starts before he was optioned April 25...made just one start in each of his next two stints (May 11-16 and May 31-June 1)...is 0-4 with an 8.07 ERA in seven starts...the ERA is the highest in the American League and third highest in the majors among pitchers with 25 or more innings pitched...the four-game losing streak is a career high...was the losing pitcher in his only career appearance against Los Angeles (AL), a start and loss earlier this year on April 13 in Oakland (4.2 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 2 er, 4 bb, 1 so)...was 3-1 with a 3.07 ERA and .206 opponents batting average in five starts with Triple-A Nashville.
