ABOUT THE A'S: The A's have lost four of the last five games and are 4-11 (.267) in June, which is the worst record in the American League and third worst in the majors (Philadelphia and Pittsburgh, 4-13)...are 15-28 (.349) since the start of May after going 13-12 (.520) in April...are 28-40 (.412) overall, which is the second worst record in the AL and fifth worst in the majors...it matches the worst record by an A's team over the last 19 years (2011)...with a loss today, the A's would have their worst record after 69 games since 1997 (28-41)...are in fifth place in the AL West for the 15th time in the last 16 days and trail first place Texas by a season-high 15½ games...since divisional play began in 1969, this is just the third time the A's have been at least 15½ games out of first place before the end of June (1979, 2001)...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 15 days in fourth, nine days tied for fourth and 15 days in fifth.

STARTING PITCHING: Yesterday, Andrew Triggs became the 10th different pitcher to start a game for the A's this year, which is tied with Los Angeles for the most in the American League...the A's have used nine different starters in the last 21 games...A's starting pitchers have the fewest innings pitched in the majors (359.0), the second highest ERA (5.21) and the third most losses (32)...are 11-27 with a 6.08 ERA (177 er in 262.0 ip) over the last 51 games dating back to April 23...that includes 6-1 with a 1.80 ERA (9 er in 45.0 ip) in seven starts by Rich Hill and 5-26 with a 6.97 ERA (168 er in 217.0 ip) in 43 starts by everyone else...have 23 games this year with fewer than five innings, which is the most in the majors...have gone 119 consecutive games without a complete game, which is the second longest streak in Athletics history (151, July 9, 2008-July 5, 2009).

OFFENSE: The A's scored one run yesterday and have been held to one run or fewer five times in the last 10 games...have scored 269 runs for the second, which is second fewest in the American League...however, have been shutout just twice, which is tied with Boston and Chicago for the fewest in the AL...are hitting .262 (360-for-1373) and are averaging 4.3 runs per game (173 runs) over the last 40 games dating back to May 4 after batting .234 and averaging 3.4 runs per game over the first 28 contests...have the lowest on-base percentage in the AL (.301) and the second fewest walks (158)...however, are tied for the third most intentional walks (13)...have the third fewest doubles (105) and strikeouts (468) and the fourth lowest slugging percentage (.394).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.43 ERA (195 er in 323.0 ip) over the last 37 games dating back to May 8 after posting a 3.91 ERA over the first 31 contests...have a 4.73 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...also have the second highest opponents slugging percentage (.438) and the third highest opponents batting average (.267) and on-base percentage (.333)...have allowed 14 home runs in the last six games and 85 for the season...42 of those 85 home runs have come with runners on base, which is second most in the majors (Cincinnati, 51).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed eight errors in the last six games and 11 in the last 12...have 48 errors for the season, which is the most in the American League and tied for fourth most in the majors...rank fourth in the AL in double plays (70)...A's outfielders have seven assists, which is the fewest in the AL and tied for second fewest in the majors.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-4 on this nine-game homestand against Texas (1-3), Los Angeles-AL (1-1) and Milwaukee (two games)...it is the first of four homestands of nine or more games...went 5-1 on the last homestand and are 15-20 (.429) at home for the season...that is tied for the second worst home record in the American League...had their season-high six-game home winning streak snapped Tuesday night...went 1-7 on the last road trip to Houston (0-3), Milwaukee (0-2) and Cincinnati (1-2) and are 13-20 (.394) on the road, which is the third worst road record in the AL...have a 4.03 ERA (141 er in 315.0 ip) at home compared to 5.51 (174 er in 284.0 ip) on the road...have the second highest road ERA in the majors (Cincinnati, 5.98).

LAST AT BAT WINS AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's had their third walk-off win of the season Friday night and improved to 8-4 (.667) in games decided in the last at bat...are tied for second in the American League in last at bat wins (Baltimore, 9) and have the third best record...have dropped nine of their last 12 one-run decisions after winning five of the first eight...are 8-12 (.400) in one-run games for the season, which

is tied for the third worst record in the AL...are tied for second in most losses...are 2-1 in extra innings and the three extra inning games are tied for third fewest in the AL...all three extra inning games have come on the road and the A's now have a streak of 54 consecutive home games without an extra inning game, which is the third longest such streak in Oakland history (74, May 29, 1970-May 2, 1971; 55, Sept. 25, 1983-July 20, 1984)...last played an extra inning game in the Coliseum on Aug. 18, 2015 vs. Los Angeles-NL, a 5-4 win in 10 innings

DESIGNATED HITTER: The A's designated hitter is batting .191 (45-for-235) with eight home runs and 28 RBI...have the second lowest batting average in the American League (Houston, .162) and the fourth fewest home runs and RBI...the A's DH has entered the game defensively seven times this year, which is the most times that has happened since 1995 when they also did it seven times.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have their final day off until the All-Star Break tomorrow...beginning Tuesday, the A's will play 20 consecutive days without a day off...have been successful in 8-of-11 (72.7%) replay challenges, which is the best percentage in the majors...the 11 challenges are tied for second fewest in the majors...only the Yankees, with 10, have fewer challenges...the A's are averaging 2 hours and 57 minutes per game, which is tied for second quickest in the majors (Toronto, 2:56)...A's pinch hitters rank second in the American League in hits (12) and plate appearances (57) and tied for third in RBI (6) and extra base hits (3)...the A's are 9-7 (.563) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 19-33 (.365) against righties...the 16 games against left-handed starters is fourth fewest in the AL.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 16 times this year and currently have 10 players on the DL (Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doubront, Fuld, Hill, Manaea, Parker, Reddick, Sogard)...Alvarez is currently on a rehab assignment...Bassitt, Canha, Doubront, Fuld, Parker and Sogard are on the 60-day DL...the 16 players have combined to miss 623 games (38.9 games per stint)...have had at least 10 players on the DL every day since May 10 and at least six players on the DL all year...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's are 1-4 against Los Angeles this year...have split the first two games of this series after being swept in a three-game series in Oakland April 11-13...have lost each of their last three series to the Angels...have not lost more than three straight since dropping six in a row from Aug. 16, 1985-April 12, 1987...have now lost eight of their last 10 games...have lost the season series in each of the previous two seasons after winning three straight prior to that...are 50-50 against the Angels since the start of the 2011 season...including 40-11 when scoring four or more runs...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 415-346 against the Angels...that includes 216-165 in Oakland and 199-181 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 464-423 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

The A's have a 29-22 record on Father's Day since moving to Oakland in 1968...that includes 17-9 in Oakland and 12-13 on the road...this is the third Father's Day meeting between the A's and Angels...the A's won in Oakland last year (3-2) and the Angels won in Anaheim in 1992 (4-2)...**Ryan Dull** has stranded all 29 of his inherited runners and opponents are 1-for-39 (.026) with runners in scoring position...first batters faced are 1-for-29 with two walks...**Jake Smolinski** extended his hitting streak to seven games Friday night, which is a new career high...is 9-for-18 (.500) with two home runs, six RBI and two walks during the streak...**Danny Valencia** is batting .346 (44-for-127) with 10 home runs and 25 RBI in 34 games since he was reinstated from the disabled list May 6...the batting average ranks sixth in the American League over that span

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1979 Wayne Gross, Dave Revering and Mike Heath hit consecutive homers in the fourth inning of the A's 6-5 win against Kansas City...Gross, Mike Edwards and Revering also turn a triple play, the second of the A's major league recording tying three triple plays in 1979...in 2003 Miguel Tejada ties an Oakland record with five hits as the A's defeat Texas, 9-2.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Eric Surkamp (0-4, 8.07 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville on Tuesday for his fourth stint with the A's this year and allowed seven runs in 2.1 innings that night against Texas for the loss...was called up the first time April 8 and went 0-2 with a 5.59 ERA in four starts before he was optioned April 25...made just one start in each of his next two stints (May 11-16 and May 31-June 1).

FOUR-GAME LOSING STREAK: Is 0-4 with an 8.07 ERA in seven starts this year...the ERA is the highest in the American League and third highest in the majors among pitchers with 25 or more innings pitched...the four-game losing streak is a career high (previous: 3, Sept. 24, 2011-July 23, 2013).

FIRST THREE, LAST FOUR: Went 0-1 with a 3.68 ERA, .267 opponents batting average and one home run allowed in 14.2 innings over his first three starts...is 0-3 with a 12.56 ERA (20 er in 14.1 ip), .412 (28-for-68) opponents batting average and five home runs allowed in 14.1 innings in four starts since then.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .269 (14-for-52) average the first time through the lineup, .395 (30-for-76) after that...has yielded a .393 (24-for-61) batting average with the bases empty compared to .299 (20-for-67) with runners on base...the opponents clean-up hitter is 1-for-11 (.091) with six walks...opponents are batting .432 (19-for-44) with two outs, including .450 (9-for-20) with runners in scoring position and two outs...has allowed a .333 (18-for-54) batting average with two strikes.

THIS AND THAT: Has walked 17 batters while striking out just 15 in 29.0 innings (5.28 walks per nine innings)...now has 48 career walks against 52 strikeouts in 86.0 innings (5.02 walks per nine innings)...has hit five batters, which is tied for sixth in the American League...has made seven starts, which are a new career high (previous: 6 with San Francisco in 2011)...has tossed fewer than five innings in six of his seven starts this year and 10 of 14 starts in his career...this will be his 15th career start...his only career win as a starter came on Sept. 12, 2011 against San Diego while pitching for San Francisco.

FIRST START: He had a no decision in the A's 3-2 win at Seattle April 8...it was his first start since July 23, 2013 against Cincinnati...blanked the Mariners on two hits and a walk over the first four innings and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a lead-off home run to Lee in the fifth...hit the next batter (Martin) and was relieved by Rodriguez, who allowed him to score, tying the game at 2-2.

SECOND START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-1 loss to Los Angeles (AL) in Oakland April 13...allowed at least two base runners in every inning except the fourth when he retired the side in order...yielded two runs on RBI singles by Calhoun in the third and fifth innings...left trailing 2-0.

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 3-2, 11-inning win at New York (AL) on April 19...tossed a career-high 99 pitches...allowed a RBI single to Rodriguez in the bottom of the first but the A's tied the game with a run in the second...then yielded a Beltran sacrifice fly in the fifth inning but the A's came back to tie the game in the sixth...was relieved by Rzepczynski with two outs in the sixth inning and the scored tied 2-2.

FOURTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-3 loss at Toronto April 24...allowed a career-high tying nine hits...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed four runs in the third inning on a Carrera home run and three straight RBI singles by Smoak, Pillar and Barney...also surrendered a two-run home run to Bautista in the fourth and left after 4.2 innings with the A's trailing 6-1.

FIFTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 13-3 loss at Boston on May 11...the A's scored a run in the second inning but he allowed a three-run home run to Bradley in the bottom of the second...Oakland tied the game with a two-run third inning but he allowed a RBI double to Young in the bottom of the third...was relieved by Dull with two outs in the third and runners on second and third, but Dull got the final out of the inning.

SIXTH START: He had a no decision in the A's 7-4 win over Minnesota on May 31 in Oakland...allowed a RBI double to Park in the second but the A's tied the game in the bottom of the second...allowed another run to score on a Sano fielders choice in the third but the A's scored twice in the bottom of the third...had a 3-2 lead when he allowed a two-out RBI double to Grossman in the fifth...left after 4.2 innings with the scored tied 2-2.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 10-6 loss to Texas on Tuesday in Oakland...allowed a career-high tying seven runs in just 2.1 innings...Rua had a sacrifice fly in the first inning, but the A's tied the game in the bottom of the first...he then allowed a three-run home run to Chirinos in the second and was charged with three more runs in the third, including a solo home run by Rua.

WITH NASHVILLE: Is 3-1 with a 3.07 ERA and .206 opponents batting average in five starts with Triple-A Nashville...has 34 strikeouts in 29.1 innings (10.43 per nine innings)...has held left-handed hitters to a .125 (3-for-24) batting average while right-handers are hitting .229 (19-for-83)...has surrendered two of his three home runs to lefties...opponents are batting .192 (5-for-26) with runners in scoring position, including .083 (1-for-12) with RISP and two outs.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 2-1 with a 3.60 ERA (20.0 ip, 17 h, 8 r, 8 er, 7 bb, 19 so) in six games, including two starts...tied for seventh in the Cactus League in wins...led the A's with 19 strikeouts...surrendered just one home run in 20.0 innings...opponents hit .239 (17-for-81)...had a 6.75 ERA in his two starts but did not allow a run in three of his four relief appearances (5 er in 16.0 ip, 2.81 ERA)...including his last outing April 2 against San Francisco...relieved an injured Doubront to start the second inning and tossed 7.0 scoreless innings while allowing just two hits...picked up the win in the A's 4-1 victory in the final game of the spring...was optioned to Nashville following the game but returned to Oakland April 8 when Doubront went on the DL.

2015 IN THE MAJORS: Began the season at Triple-A Charlotte in the Chicago White Sox organization and finished it with Triple-A Oklahoma City in the Los Angeles Dodgers farm system...in between, he made one appearance for the Dodgers in July...was selected July 6, pitched that day against Philadelphia (3.1 ip, 4 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 4 so), and was designated for assignment the next day.

2015 IN THE MINORS: Pitched mostly in relief at Charlotte, going 3-0 with a save and 2.81 ERA in 10 relief appearances and one start...then made 15 starts and one relief appearance with Oklahoma City where he was 9-3 with a 3.57 ERA...combined at Triple-A to post a 12-3 record and a 3.39 ERA in 27 games, including 16 starts...the 12 wins were his most as a minor leaguer, as were his 11 home runs allowed...tied for third among all Triple-A pitchers in wins...allowed a .264 opponents batting average, including .244 against right-handed hitters compared to .305 against left-handers...10 of the 11 home runs he allowed were solo shots...yielded a .257 batting average with runners in scoring position, but that dropped to .136 with RISP and two outs...was 8-3 with a 3.40 ERA in 16 starts compared to 4-0 with a 3.38 ERA in 11 relief appearances...walked two batters or fewer in 14 of his 16 starts.

TUESDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Sonny Gray (3-6, 5.54 ERA): Was reinstated from the 15-day disabled list June 5 and is 0-1 with a 3.86 ERA and .257 opponents batting average in three starts since his return...was placed on the DL May 22 retroactive to May 21 with a strained right trapezius...was 3-5 with a 6.19 ERA and .285 opponents batting average in nine starts before going on the DL...is 0-5 with a 7.36 ERA and .304 opponents batting average over his last eight starts...the five-game losing streak is a career high and is tied for the third longest active losing streak in the American League...had a no decision in his last start, a 7-5 A's loss to Texas on Wednesday here in Oakland (6.0 ip, 8 h, 5 r, 5 er, 1 bb, 3 so)...has never faced the Brewers in his career...was charged with the loss in his only interleague start this year on June 10 at Cincinnati (7.2 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 4 so)...is now 3-3 with a 3.09 ERA in nine career interleague appearances, including eight starts.

- Has tossed 240.0 innings, which is the most in the AL (Minnesota, 237.1) and third most in the majors.
- Has allowed just 22-of-111 (19.8%) inherited runners to score, which is the second best percentage in the AL (Houston, 16.9%) and third best in the majors (San Francisco, 18.6%).
