OAKLAND ATHLETICS (28-41) VS. MILWAUKEE BREWERS (31-39)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's have lost two straight and five of the last six games to fall a season-high 13 games under .500 at 28-41 (.406)...that is the second worst record in the American League and fourth worst in the majors...it is tied for the third worst record after 69 games in Oakland history and is the worst since the 1997 club also started the year 28-41...with a loss tonight, the A's will be off to their worst start since 1994 (25-45)...are 4-12 (.250) in June, which is the second worst record in the majors (Philadelphia, 4-15)...are 15-29 (.341) since the start of May after going 13-12 (.520) in April...are in fifth place in the AL West and trail first place Texas by a season-high 17 games...since divisional play began in 1969, this is just the third time in Oakland history the A's have trailed by 17 or more games before the All-Star Break (1979 and 2001)...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 15 days in fourth, nine days tied for fourth and 17 days in fifth.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 1-4 (.200) in interleague play (1-2 vs. Cincinnati, 0-2 vs. Milwaukee), which is tied with the Yankees for the worst record in the majors... are tied for the fourth fewest games...will also host San Francisco (June 29-30), Pittsburgh (July 1-3) and Chicago (Aug. 5-7) and travel to San Francisco (June 27-28) and St. Louis (Aug. 26-28)...went 11-9 (.550) against the National League last year...it

marked the fourth consecutive season and 12th time in 19 years the A's finished with a winning record in interleague play...are now 192-157 (.550) all-time in interleague play, which is fifth best in Major League history.

OFFENSE: The A's are 20-for-122 (.164) with five runs scored over the last four games...were shutout for the third time this year Sunday, the second time in the last 11 games...have been held to one run or fewer six times over the last 11 games and have scored 269 runs for the season, which is second fewest in the American League and fifth fewest in the majors... have walked 159 times, which is tied with Kansas City for the fewest in the majors...have the lowest on-base percentage in the AL (.299) and the third lowest slugging percentage (.391)...have the third fewest doubles (105) and strikeouts (469) and the fourth fewest home runs (69).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.34 ERA (197 er in 332.0 ip) over the last 38 games dating back to May 8 after posting a 3.91 ERA over the first 31 contests...have a 4.69 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...also have the second highest opponents slugging percentage (.436) and the third highest opponents batting average (.266) and on-base percentage (.332)...have allowed at least one home run in a season-high seven consecutive games (15 home runs total)...42 of the 86 home runs allowed by the A's have come with runners on base, which is second most in the majors (Cincinnati, 51).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have the fewest innings pitched in the majors (365.0), the second highest ERA (5.18) and are tied for the second most losses (32)...the A's have used nine different starters in the last 22 games and 10 for the season, which is tied with Los Angeles for the most in the American League...starters are 11-28 with a 6.01 ERA (179 er in 268.0 ip) over the last 52 games dating back to April 23...that includes 6-1 with a 1.80 ERA (9 er in 45.0 ip) in seven starts by Rich Hill and 5-27 with a 6.86 ERA (170 er in 223.0 ip) in 45 starts by everyone else... have 23 games this year with fewer than five innings, which is the most in the majors...have gone 120 consecutive games without a complete game, which is the second longest streak in Athletics history (151, July 9, 2008-July 5, 2009).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed eight errors in the last seven games and 11 in the last 13...have 48 errors for the season, which is the most in the American League and tied for fifth most in the majors... rank fourth in the AL in double plays (71)...A's outfielders have seven assists, which is the fewest in the AL and tied for second fewest in the majors.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-5 on this nine-game homestand against Texas (1-3), Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and Milwaukee (two games)...it is the

first of four homestands of nine or more games...went 5-1 on the last homestand and are 15-21 (.417) at home for the season, which is the second worst home record in the American League...had their season-high six-game home winning streak snapped a week ago tonight...went 1-7 on the last road trip to Houston (0-3), Milwaukee (0-2) and Cincinnati (1-2) and are 13-20 (.394) on the road, which is the third worst road record in the AL...have a 3.97 ERA (143 er in 324.0 ip) at home compared to 5.51 (174 er in 284.0 ip) on the road...have the second highest road ERA in the majors (Cincinnati, 6.00).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 2-1 in extra innings and the three extra inning games are tied for second fewest in the American League...all three extra inning games have come on the road and the A's now have a streak of 55 consecutive home games without an extra inning game, which is tied for the second longest such streak in Oakland history (74, May 29, 1970-May 2, 1971; 55, Sept. 25, 1983-July 20, 1984)...last played an extra inning game in the Coliseum on Aug. 18, 2015 vs. Los Angeles-NL, a 5-4 win in 10 innings...had their third walk-off win of the season last Friday night to improve to 8-4 (.667) in games decided in the last at bat...have the third best record in the AL in last at bat games and are tied for third in wins... have dropped nine of their last 12 one-run decisions after winning five of the first eight...are 8-12 (.400) in one-run games for the season, which is tied for the second worst record in the AL.

THIS AND THAT: The A's played their fastest game of the season on Sunday (2:19)...are averaging 2 hours and 56 minutes per games, which is tied with Toronto for the fastest in the majors...had their final day off until the All-Star Break yesterday...beginning today, the A's will play 20 consecutive days without a day off...have been successful in 8-of-11 (72.7%) replay challenges, which is the best percentage in the majors...the 11 challenges are second fewest in the majors (New York-AL, 10)...the A's are 9-7 (.563) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 19-34 (.58) against righties...the 16 games against left-handed starters is fourth fewest in the AL.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 16 times this year and currently have 10 players on the DL (Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doubront, Fuld, Hill, Manaea, Parker, Reddick, Sogard)...Reddick is currently on a rehab assignment...Bassitt, Cahna, Doubront, Fuld, Parker and Sogard are on the 60-day DL...the 16 players have combined to miss 633 games (39.6 games per stint)...have had at least 10 players on the DL every day since May 10 and at least six players on the DL all year...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. BREWERS: The A's are 0-2 against the Brewers after being swept in a two-game series at Miller Park two weeks ago...are now 5-3 against the Brewers in interleague play...won two of three at Milwaukee in 2013 and swept a three-game series in Oakland in 2002...went 173-154 against the Brewers while they were in the American League...are 178-157 all-time against the Brewers, including 103-64 in Oakland and 75-93 in Milwaukee.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Ryan Dull has stranded all 29 of his inherited runners and opponents are 1-for-39 (.026) with runners in scoring position...first batters faced are 1-for-29 with two walks...**Danny Valencia** is batting .338 (44-for-130) with 10 home runs and 25 RBI in 35 games since he was reinstated from the disabled list May 6...the batting average ranks sixth in the American League over that span.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1971** Vida Blue improves his record to 15-2 and strikes out 13 as the A's defeat the Twins at Minnesota, 3-2...in **2000** Eric Chavez becomes the first player to hit for the cycle in the Coliseum as the A's defeat Baltimore, 10-3...at the age of 22 years, 197 days, Chavez becomes the eighth youngest player in major league history to hit for the cycle...in **2002** Billy Koch records the save in the A's 5-3 win at Cincinnati, making him the first pitcher in Oakland history with five saves in five consecutive team games.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (3-6, 5.54 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was reinstated from the 15-day disabled list June 5 and is 0-1 with a 3.86 ERA (8 er in 18.2 ip) and .257 (18-for-70) opponents batting average in three starts since his return...was placed on the DL May 22 retroactive to May 21 with a strained right trapezius...was 3-5 with a 6.19 ERA and .285 opponents batting average in nine starts before going on the DL.

FIVE-GAME LOSING STREAK: Is 0-5 with a 7.36 ERA (33 er in 40.1 ip) and .304 (51-for-168) opponents batting average over his last eight starts...the five-game losing streak

is a career high (previous: 4, Aug. 1-16, 2014), matches the A's season high and is tied for the third longest active losing streak in the American League...allowed at least four runs in each of his first five starts during the streak marking the first time in his career he has allowed four or more runs in more than two consecutive starts...went 3-1 with a 2.73 ERA and .232 opponents batting average over his first four starts.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Was charged with the loss in his only interleague start this year on June 10 at Cincinnati (2 er in 7.2 ip, 2.35 ERA)...went 2-1 with a 1.69 ERA in three starts against the National League last year...is now 3-3 with a 3.09 ERA (19 er in 55.1 ip) in nine career interleague appearances, including eight starts.

WILD PITCHES: Leads the majors with 11 wild pitches, which matches the most in Athletics history before the All-Star Break (Cahill, 2011; Darling, 1992)...had three wild pitches May 20 against New York and is the first A's pitcher with three wild pitches in a game since Doug John on Sept. 6, 1995 at Boston...has 41 career wild pitches, which is seventh most in Oakland history (Mike Norris is 6th with 53).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has a .238 (45-for-189) opponents batting average the first two times through the lineup, .379 (28-for-74) after that... has surrendered eight of his 11 home runs to right-handed hitters and has a .563 opponents slugging percentage against righties compared to .422 against lefties...has yielded a .339 (20-for-59) batting average with runners in scoring position...has allowed a .472 (25-for-53) combined batting average to the opponents eight and nine hitters...opponents are 18-for-41 (.439) with four doubles and four home runs (.829 slugging percentage) when putting the first pitch in play.

INNING BY INNING: Has a 2.83 ERA (11 er in 35.0 ip) and .198 (25-for-126) opponents batting average over the first three innings of a starting assignment compared to an 8.53 ERA (30 er in 31.2 ip) and .350 (48-for-137) opponents average from the fourth inning on.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 1-0 with a 2.70 ERA (5 er in 16.2 ip) in three starts during the day compared to 2-6 with a 6.48 ERA (36 er in 50.0 ip) in nine starts at night...last year, he went 5-2 with a 1.78 ERA in nine starts during the day...it was the sixth lowest day ERA in Oakland history among pitchers with 50 or more day innings...over the last two years, he is 6-2 with a 1.98 ERA (17 er in 77.1 ip) in 12 starts during the day, 11-11 with a 3.97 ERA (87 er in 197.1 ip) in 31 starts at night.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received no run support twice this year and two runs or fewer in seven of his 12 starts...is 2-1 in five starts with three runs of support or more compared to 1-5 in seven starts with two runs or fewer... last year, he was 12-1 in 20 starts with three runs of support or more and is now 31-3 in 47 such starts in his career.

MONTH BY MONTH: Is 0-1 with a 3.86 ERA (8 er in 18.2 ip) in three starts in June...went 0-3 with a 9.61 ERA in four starts in May...allowed 25 runs, which were his most ever in a month (21, Aug. 2014)...surrendered five home runs, which match his most in a month (Aug. 2015)...went 3-2 with a 3.81 ERA in five starts in April...is now 10-3 with a 2.53 ERA in 15 career starts in April...the 10 wins are his most in any month.

START-BY-START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 2-1 victory over Chicago (AL) *April 6* in Oakland, the A's third game of the season...was scratched from his scheduled Opening Day start April 4 due to food poisoning...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-1 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on *April 11* in Oakland...tossed 6.1 innings to go over the 500 innings pitched mark in his career...was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-3 win over Kansas City *April 16* in Oakland...allowed a RBI single to Cain in the top of the first and a RBI single to Fuentes in the fourth inning...won his second consecutive start in the A's 8-5 win at Toronto *April 22*...allowed a solo home run to Barney in the third inning, a Bautista sacrifice fly in the sixth and a Barney RBI single in the seventh...was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-4 loss at Detroit *April 27*...tossed 65 pitches in 2.0 innings...matched the shortest

outing of his career and it was his shortest outing as a starter (pitched 2.0 innings in his first two career outings, both in relief)...lost his second consecutive start in the A's 8-2 loss to Seattle in Oakland on May 3...matched his career highs by allowing seven runs on 11 hits...lost his third straight start in the A's 14-7 loss at Boston May 9...allowed a career-high tying seven runs for the second consecutive start...had a no decision in the A's 7-6 win at Tampa Bay May 15 ... allowed a career-high tying three home runs (also Aug. 22, 2015 vs. Tampa Bay)...was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-3 loss to New York (AL) on May 20...shut out the Yankees on three hits and three walks over the first three innings and had a 1-0 lead when he allowed five runs in the fourth inning...Torreyes had a two-run triple and scored on a wild pitch and Beltran had a two-run double...was relieved by Dull after 3.1 innings...had a no decision in the A's 5-2 loss at Houston June 5...the A's scored twice in the first inning and he blanked the Astros on three hits and a walk over the first four innings...then allowed a leadoff home run to Gomez in the fifth and was relieved by Coulombe to start the sixth with the A's leading 2-1...Coulombe allowed a run in the sixth for the blown save and Dull allowed a run in the seventh for the loss...he was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-1 loss at Cincinnati June 10...it was his sixth loss of the season, which is one short of his season total of seven from last year...the A's scored a run in the third and he retired each of the first 10 batters before walking Votto with one out in the fourth...did not allow a hit until Barnhart singled with one out in the sixth...allowed two runs in the seventh inning when Duvall had a RBI double and later scored on a wild pitch

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 7-5 loss to Texas on Wednesday in Oakland...shutout the Rangers on three hits and a walk over the first five innings and took a 5-0 lead into the sixth...allowed a leadoff home run to Chirinos followed by back-to-back doubles from Choo and Desmond... Fielder had a sacrifice fly to make the score 5-3 and Odor tied the game with a two-run home run...was relieved by Axford to start the seventh with the score tied at 5-5 and he allowed a home run to Chirinos for the loss.

RHP Daniel Mengden (0-2, 2.25 ERA): Was selected from Triple-A Nashville June 11 and is scheduled to make his third start of the season and his career...made his Major League debut June 11 at Cincinnati after just 43 minor league appearances, including 34 starts, in three professional seasons...had not pitched above Single-A prior to this year...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 5-1 A's loss to Texas last Thursday here in Oakland (6.1 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 7 so)...is the fifth pitcher in Oakland history to take the loss in each of his first two career games...began the season at Double-A Midland and went 2-0 with a 0.78 ERA in four starts before he was promoted to Triple-A Nashville May 1...went 3-1 with a 1.39 ERA in seven starts with the Sounds and combined for a 5-1 record and a 1.19 ERA in 11 minor league starts overall...the ERA was sixth lowest in all of the minor leagues at the time of his promotion.

- The A's bullpen has allowed 18 runs over its last seven games (28.0 ip, 5.79 ERA) to snap a five-game, 13.0-inning scoreless streak...has a 3.96 ERA for the season, which is fifth highest in the American League.
- Has tossed 243.0 innings, which is the most in the AL (Minnesota, 239.0) and third most in the majors.
- Has allowed just 22-of-111 (19.8%) inherited runners to score, which is the second best percentage in the AL (Houston, 16.4%).
- Has 233 strikeouts and 72 walks...ranks third in the AL in strikeouts per walk (3.24) and walks per nine innings (2.67), fourth in fewest walks and fifth in strikeouts.
