OAKLAND ATHLETICS (29-41) VS. MILWAUKEE BREWERS (31-40)

WEDNESDAY, JUNE 22, 2016 — OAKLAND ALAMEDA COLISEUM — 12:35 P.M. PDT RHP DANIEL MENGDEN (0-2, 2.25) VS. RHP JUNIOR GUERRA (3-1, 3.81) MLB NETWORK — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Are 2-2 over the last four games but are 5-12 (.294) in June, which is the worst record in the American League and third worst in the majors...are 16-29 (.356) since the start of May after going 13-12 (.520) in April...have a 29-41 (.414) record overall, which is second worst in the AL and fourth worst in the majors...it matches the fourth worst record in Oakland history after 70 games (fourth time, last: 2015)...with a loss today, the A's would have their worst record after 71 games since 1994 (26-45)...are 12 games under .500 and 16 games out of first place in the AL West, both of which are one short of the A's season highs...since divisional play began in 1969, this is just the third time in Oakland history the A's have trailed by 16 or more games before the end of June (1979 and 2001)... are in fifth place in the AL West for the 18th time in the last 19 days...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 15 days in fourth, nine days tied for fourth and 18 days in fifth.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 2-4 (.333) in interleague play (1-2 vs. Cincinnati, 1-2 vs. Milwaukee), which is tied for the sixth worst record in the majors...are tied for the fourth fewest games...will also host San Francisco (June 29-30), Pittsburgh (July 1-3) and Chicago (Aug. 5-7) and travel to San Francisco (June 27-28) and St. Louis (Aug. 26-28)...went 11-9 (.550) against the National League last year...it marked the

fourth consecutive season and 12th time in 19 years the A's finished with a winning record in interleague play...are now 193-157 (.551) all-time in interleague play, which is fifth best in Major League history.

OFFENSE: The A's collected five runs on 13 hits last night after tallying five runs on 20 hits over the previous four games...have been held to one run or fewer six times over the last 12 games and have scored 274 runs for the season, which is the fewest in the American League and fourth fewest in the majors...have the lowest on-base percentage in the AL (.301) and the third lowest slugging percentage (.393)...have the second fewest walks (163) and strikeouts (473), the third fewest doubles (107) and the fourth fewest home runs (69).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 4.17 ERA (90 er in 194.1 ip) over the last 22 games...logged a 3.33 ERA over the first 21 games and a 6.12 ERA over the next 27 contests from April 27 to May 25...have a 4.65 ERA for the season, which is third highest in the American League...also have the second highest opponents slugging percentage (.435), the third highest batting average (.267) and fourth highest on-base percentage (.332)... had their season-high streak of seven consecutive games with a home run snapped yesterday...have now allowed 15 home runs over the last eight games...42 of the 86 home runs allowed by the A's have come with runners on base, which is tied for second most in the majors (Cincinnati, 51).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have the fewest innings pitched in the majors (371.0), the second highest ERA (5.12) and are tied for the second most losses (33)...the A's have used nine different starters in the last 23 games and 10 for the season, which is tied with Los Angeles for the most in the American League...starters are 11-28 with a 5.91 ERA (180 er in 274.0 ip) over the last 53 games dating back to April 23...that includes 6-1 with a 1.80 ERA (9 er in 45.0 ip) in seven starts by Rich Hill and 5-27 with a 6.72 ERA (171 er in 229.0 ip) in 46 starts by everyone else... have 23 games this year with fewer than five innings, which is the most in the majors...have gone 121 consecutive games without a complete game, which is the second longest streak in Athletics history (151, July 9, 2008-July 5, 2009).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed nine errors in the last eight games and 12 in the last 14...have 49 errors for the season, which is the most in the American League and fifth most in the majors...rank fourth in the AL in double plays (73)...A's outfielders have seven assists, which is the fewest in the AL and tied for second fewest in the majors.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-5 on this nine-game homestand against Texas (1-3), Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and Milwaukee (1-0)...it is the first of four homestands of nine or more games...went 5-1 on the last homestand

and are 16-21 (.432) at home for the season, which is the fourth worst home record in the American League...leave following the game today for a six-game road trip to Los Angeles-AL (four games) and San Francisco (two games)...went 1-7 on the last road trip to Houston (0-3), Milwaukee (0-2) and Cincinnati (1-2) and are 13-20 (.394) on the road, which is the third worst road record in the AL...have a 3.92 ERA (145 er in 333.0 ip) at home compared to 5.51 (174 er in 284.0 ip) on the road...have the second highest road ERA in the majors (Cincinnati, 5.88).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 2-1 in extra innings and the three extra inning games are tied for second fewest in the American League...all three extra inning games have come on the road and the A's now have a streak of 56 consecutive home games without an extra inning game...that is the second longest such streak in Oakland history to a 74-game streak from May 29, 1970 to May 2, 1971)...last played an extra inning game in the Coliseum on Aug. 18, 2015 vs. Los Angeles-NL, a 5-4 win in 10 innings... had their third walk-off win of the season last Friday night to improve to 8-4 (.667) in games decided in the last at bat...have the third best record in the AL in last at bat games and are tied for third in wins...have dropped nine of their last 12 one-run decisions after winning five of the first eight...are 8-12 (.400) in one-run games for the season, which is tied for the second worst record in the AL.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are averaging 2 hours and 57 minutes per games, which is tied for second fastest in the majors (Toronto, 2:56)... have been successful in 8-of-11 (72.7%) replay challenges, which is the best percentage in the majors...the 11 challenges are second fewest in the majors (New York-AL, 10)...are 9-7 (.563) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 20-34 (.370) against righties... the 16 games against left-handed starters is fourth fewest in the American League...are in day two of a stretch of 20 consecutive days without a day off leading into the All-Star Break...are in game nine of a 20-game stretch in which the A's play all of their games in California.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 16 times this year and currently have 10 players on the DL (Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doubront, Fuld, Hill, Manaea, Parker, Reddick, Sogard)...Reddick is currently on a rehab assignment...Bassitt, Cahna, Doubront, Fuld, Parker and Sogard are on the 60-day DL...the 16 players have combined to miss 643 games (40.2 games per stint)...have had at least 10 players on the DL every day since May 10 and at least six players on the DL all year...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. BREWERS: The A's are 1-2 against the Brewers...won the first game in Oakland last night after being swept in a two-game series at Miller Park two weeks ago...have a three-game winning streak against Milwaukee in the Coliseum and have not lost to the Brewers here since Aug. 10, 1997 in the second game of a doubleheader...are 6-3 against the Brewers in interleague play...won two of three at Milwaukee in 2013 and swept a three-game series in Oakland in 2002...went 173-154 against the Brewers while they were in the American League...are 179-157 all-time against the Brewers, including 104-64 in Oakland and 75-93 in Milwaukee.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Ryan Dull has stranded all 30 of his inherited runners and opponents are 1-for-42 (.024) with runners in scoring position...first batters faced are 1-for-30 with two walks...**Danny Valencia** is batting .343 (46-for-134) with 10 home runs and 25 RBI in 36 games since he was reinstated from the disabled list May 6...the batting average ranks fifth in the American League over that span.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1969** Sal Bando, Ted Kubiak and Reggie Jackson all hit solo homers in the third inning of the A's 7-3 win against Minnesota in the first game of a doubleheader...it is the first three-homer inning in Oakland history...in **1979**, twelve days after Jim Essian's inside-the-park Grand Slam, Larry Murray hits an inside-the-park home run in the A's 6-5 win over the Texas Rangers.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Daniel Mengden (0-2, 2.25 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was selected from Triple-A Nashville June 11 and is scheduled to make his third start of the season and his career...all three starts have come during the day and two have come in interleague play... made his Major League debut June 11 at Cincinnati after just 43 minor league appearances, including 34 starts, in three professional seasons... had not pitched above Single-A prior to this year...became the 46th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut, the second this year (Sean Manaea, April 29)...the last of those 46 to take the loss was Brett Anderson on April 10, 2009 against Seattle.

TWO STARTS, TWO LOSSES: Has taken the loss in each of his first two starts, despite allowing just two runs in each outing...had one run of support in his first start and none in his second start...is the fifth pitcher in Oakland history to take the loss in each of his first two career games... joins Brett Anderson (2009), Brady Rigby (1997), Bobby Chouinard (1996) and Mike Morgan (1978)...only Rigby and Morgan went on to take the loss in their third game...is just the 10th Major League pitcher since 1913 to take the loss in each of his first two career games while allowing two runs or fewer in each game, the first since Sharion Martis with Washington in 2008...is the fifth American League pitcher to do it, but the only other AL pitcher to do it while starting both games is Bill Parsons for Milwaukee in 1971.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in his Major League debut, a 2-1 A's loss at Cincinnati June 11...at the age of 23 years, 113 days, he became the youngest A's pitcher to start a game since Trevor Cahill on June 19, 2011 (23 years, 110 days)...tossed 104 pitches, which tied for second most by an A's pitcher in his ML debut since pitch counts were tracked beginning in 1988 (Mazzaro, 105 on June 2, 2009)...the A's scored a run in the first and he blanked the Reds on three hits and a walk over the first two innings...struck out the first batter he faced (Cozart)...allowed his only runs in the third inning on a two-run home run by Bruce...was relieved by Dull after 5.2 innings with the A's trailing 2-1.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-1 loss to Texas last Thursday in Oakland...shutout the Rangers on a hit and a walk over the first six innings and had retired 15 straight when he allowed a leadoff home run to Desmond in the seventh...an Alonso error contributed to an unearned run later in the inning and he was relieved by Dull with the bases loaded and one out in the seventh and the A's trailing 2-1...Dull struck out the final two batters in the inning...Colby Lewis retired the first 23 Athletics before Alonso walked in the eighth and had a no-hitter until Muncy doubled to lead off the ninth.

MINORS: Began the season at Double-A Midland and went 2-0 with a 0.78 ERA in four starts before he was promoted to Triple-A Nashville May 1... went 3-1 with a 1.39 ERA in seven starts with the Sounds and combined for a 5-1 record and a 1.19 ERA in 11 minor league starts overall...the ERA was sixth lowest in all of the minor leagues at the time of his promotion... allowed just three home runs in 68.1 innings, an average of 0.40 per nine innings...yielded no home runs in 23.0 innings with Midland...went 4-0 with a 0.79 ERA over his first nine starts and was 1-1 with a 3.18 ERA over his final two starts.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .179 opponents batting average, including .177 (23-for-130) against right-handed hitters compared to .182 (20-for-110) against left-handers...surrendered all three of his home runs to righties...yielded a .068 batting average with runners in scoring position, including .077 with RISP and two outs...opponents were 8-for-64 (.125) with four walks and a hit by pitch (.188 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning.

THIS AND THAT: The RockHounds were 4-0 in his starting assignments and the Sounds were 5-2...his teams combined for a 9-2 (.818) record in his 11 starts...had five starts where he did not allow a run but had just two wins and three no decisions in those games...tossed at least five innings in each of his 11 starts, including seven or more four times...allowed six hits or fewer in all 11 starts and allowed more than two runs just once...did not

allow a run in the first or second inning...had a 0.41 ERA over the first four innings of a game and a 2.59 ERA from the fifth inning on.

2016 HIGHLIGHTS: Struck out a season-high eight batters and walked a season-high three but allowed just two hits in 6.0 scoreless innings in his first start April 9 at Arkansas...ended up with a no decision in a 4-1 win... posted an identical line in his next start April 15 against Arkansas but had another no decision in a 1-0 win...matched his season high in strikeouts and walks in his final Double-A start, a 2-0 win at Corpus Christi April 26... did not allow a run in either of his first two starts at Nashville after not allowing a run in three of his four starts with Midland...was 3-0 over that seasonopening six-start stretch and allowed just two earned runs in 36.0 ip for a 0.50 ERA...capped that streak by fanning a season-high tying eight in a season-high 7.0 innings May 8 against Memphis, but had a no decision in a 3-2 win...extended his scoreless streak to 24.0 innings before allowing a run in the seventh inning May 13 at Iowa...that was the only run he allowed in seven innings but he had a no decision in a 3-2 loss...tossed 6.0 innings in four consecutive starts from May 8 to 25...allowed a season-high three runs on a season-high tying six hits but picked up the win May 30 at Salt Lake...was charged with his only loss in his final start on June 5 at Omaha, a 6-4 Sounds loss

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: Was originally drafted by Houston in the fourth round of the 2014 First-Year Player Draft...was traded to Oakland with catcher Jacob Nottingham for left-handed pitcher Scott Kazmir on July 23, 2015...has compiled a 15-5 record and a 2.87 ERA (67 er in 210.0 ip) in 43 games, including 34 starts, in three professional seasons...has 209 strikeouts in 210.0 innings...has allowed just 14 home runs, an average of 0.60 per nine innings.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Kendall Graveman (2-6, 4.87 ERA): Has allowed one run in each of his last two starts and two runs or fewer in five of his last six starts...is 1-1 with a 3.73 ERA over his last six starts...went 1-1 with a 2.04 ERA over his first three starts and was 0-4 with a 9.31 ERA in four starts in between... received two runs of support in his last start and has two runs or support or fewer in seven of his 13 starts this year...his season run support average of 3.16 is fourth lowest in the American League among pitchers with at least 60 innings pitched...had a no decision in his last start, a 3-2 A's win over Los Angeles last Friday in Oakland (7.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 4 so)...is 0-1 with a 1.88 ERA (24.0 ip, 19 h, 6 r, 5 er, 6 bb, 16 so, 2 hr) in four career starts against the Angels...including 0-0 with a 1.38 ERA in two starts this year, both in Oakland...the bullpen has blown the save in each of his two starts this year.

- Has stranded all 30 of his inherited runners, which are the most in the majors among relievers that have not allowed an inherited runner to score and second most overall (Osich, SF 31).
- His opponents are 1-for-42 (.024) with runners in scoring position, including 0-for-22 with RISP and two outs...the 22 at bats with RISP and two outs are the most among all Major League pitchers that have not allowed a hit.
